Finland is a great place. Thank you to all the people who made that a highlight of my summer trip. Anyone traveling out of their country should look into sailing with their Lightning family in the countries they are traveling too.

A couple of things that need mention-

ing:
1. Lots of changes to be voted on at the Worlds: Please read the web site! The biggest change is FOR NON-SANC-TIONED REGATTAS. Regatta organiz-ers and fleets will have the ability to vary from the Lightning Class Governing Documents within limits so that they can tailor the sailing experience to the needs of the venue.

2. Class office: We will be posting a Request for Information on the web site for the class office. We will allow people to propose on running the class office using alternative methods and splitting out services. The intent is not to reduce cost but to look at our options to determine if we can get more value for our dollar. We do have a good class office; we just want to see what our options are.

3. Boat building and international growth: It became apparent to me that one of the keys to growing the class outside the US is to have builders in different countries around the globe that can build a good, reasonably priced boat. In addition, it must be done so that taxes do not become an inhibitor. Brasil has started building. Finland lost its builder and needs new molds. We will dedicate some resources to look at ways of moving this along. Should the class fund the creation of molds and sponsor builders in different countries?

IN MEMORIAM Howard Franklin Lippincott 1919-2005

BOAT BUILDER AND YACHTSMAN Riverton, NJ

Owner and founder of Lippincott Boat Works, his corporation made one-design racing sailboats and cruising sailboats from the mid 1940's to 1985 for sailing enthusiasts all over the world, including presidents, princes and world-class sailors. He was the first boat builder to successfully change from fabrication of wooden built Star boats to fiberglass. Howard also enjoyed the sport and was an avid and world renowned sailor, traveling the globe to different regattas. The last Lippincott Lightnings to come out of the boat works are nearing 35 years old and are still competitive in the circuit. The Lippincott 30 and 36 that were designed by son, Skip (Howard, Jr.) went into production around 1978 and were known for their comfort in although not designed with racing in mind, were also competitive.

His sailing accomplishments include four time winner of the Comet Class Internationals; 1949, 1950, 1954, 1955, Star Class North American Championship winner in 1956, winner of Bacardi Cup Championship in 1963, and a top competitor in the Star Worlds for a number of years. Howard is an Honorary Life Member of the Riverton Yacht Club and the International Comet Class Association and a former member of the Tred Avon Yacht Club in Oxford, MD.

Howard was on the Board of Directors of the Out Island Inn, Georgetown, Exuma, Bahamas during the 1960's and early 1970's. He maintained his small craft pilot's rating and enjoyed flying with his wife, Doris, and the children on trips to the Inn for business and pleasure.

Beloved husband of the late Doris Melcer Lippincott, Howard is survived by his sister, Barbara Lippincott Martin and brother, Raymond Lippincott, his six children, Stephen Melcer Lippincott of St. Petersburg, FL, Ann Lippincott Dunlap of Ft. Myers, FL, Howard Franklin Lippincott, Jr. of Riverton, Elizabeth Ballou Lippincott-Mortgu of Riverton, Carol Lippincott Traetto of Fayetteville, GA and Thomas Miller Lippincott of Chestertown, MD, his 16 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren, and many nieces and nephews

Service will be on Thursday, Sept. 1, 6:00 p.m. at the Calvary Presbyterian Church, 4th and Lippincott Aves., Riverton, NJ. The family will be receiving friends and family at the church between 5:00 pm and 6:00 pm. Interment will be in the Church's Memorial Garden after the service.





Thanks for your attention, and I will keep you posted about the cool new doings at the Southern Circuit as they get finalized.



2005 ACCs

Wrightsville Beach, NC July 29-30, 2005

Lenny Krawcheck dominated the 2005 ACCs with a 2-1-2-2-3 series that earned him a 23 point victory over the nearest competitor.

Mother nature did not cooperate very well and it made for an unusual race weekend in Wrightsville. On Saturday, rain and variable winds delayed racing until mid-afternoon when the AP finally came down and the fleet headed out to race. The race committee set a short windward-leeward once around course. The RC got in two short races and sent the fleet back in as evening was approaching. Krawcheck appeared to have the early lead with a 1-2 finish on the day. Back on land, the results were posted and it became evident to all that OCS calls would play a major roll as a number of the top finishers in each race, including Lenny, found they were OCS once or twice.

On Sunday around 8:30 am, the fleet began launching under sunny skies and hopes were high for a good day of racing. But on the way to the race course, a dark cloud came up sending many skippers into a 180 turn for the docks. However, the RC was on the course and called everyone out seeing no immediate danger from the cloud. Race one of the day was started. As the fleet rounded the windward mark, a huge shift moved in switching the leeward leg to a beat. Spinnakers dropped, jibs were hoisted, and the race committee shortened the race to a finish at the leeward-turned-windward pin. Gary Hurban from NY won the race, but Lenny posted a duece.


As racers contemplated the next start and the RC worked on adjusting the course, a moderate rain shower moved over the course. About half of the fleet dropped sails and set anchors to ride out the rain. The other half cut back to mainsail only and attempted to keep some minimum movement going. Thankfully, there was no lightning or high wind associated with the rain, so when it stopped after 20 minutes, the fleet hoisted sails and the RC moved on to race 2 and 3. SELD's Jim Harris won race 2 and Pierce Barden won race 3.

Back at the docks, a number of protests were filed including redress

for the day one OCS calls by Bob Harkrider and Lenny Krawcheck Bob explained his redress in an email "I think the judges realized that there was a problem when the pin boat observers admitted that they could not see the other end of the line. Lenny and I were both able to demonstrate that we had the time, room and opportunity to duck below the line for a fair start. In my case I was approximately 3 boat lengths from the pin boat at the starting signal. I think the pin was favored about 5 degrees. I had boat speed since I had been accelerating down the line with 10 seconds to go. There were no boats in front or to leeward of me. From this position I still had to luff up to clear the anchor rode on the pin boat. Tom sitting on the seat could see the pin boat observer through the forestay at the gun. I think that is why the committee reinstated me." Bob and Lenny won their hearings and their day one OCS calls were reversed. With actual on course scores now on the books, Krawcheck won the regatta with a score of 10. Bob Harkrider was third and Pierce Barden finished fifth. Congratulations to all skippers.
