The Susquehanna Yacht Club's Lightning Fleet 253 hosted the Pennsylvania Governor's Cup Regatta October 1st and 2nd for 18 Lightnings that came from 5 different States (NY, NJ, PA, MD, and VA) to race on Lake Clarke on the Susquehanna River.

Winds were from the East but with swings. Several lead changes occurred while the wind provided advantages on the left, right, and center. The first race had a clear winner, Justin Coplan's team dominated. Some of you will recall that Justin and Danielle Prior represented the USA in last years' Pan Am Games, finishing with Silver. The 3rd race had diminishing wind strength but several Teams kept their boats moving fast.

The Constants brothers were closely followed by two Havre de Grace Teams: Kyle Hanson and Pat Phelan.

What became the final race of the regatta probably had the most lead changes. At the 1st mark Carol Park had a ½ boat lead over her twin sister, Mary Keppel. Team Constants had a quick spinnaker set to move into 1st. During the final leg Team Keppel took the lead only to get blindsided by fluky conditions that Pat Phalen took advantage of to quickly move from 4th and finish 1st.

The first 3 races actually had good wind strength. And the wind directional changes kept it challenging. Overall one boat figured out how to stay ahead better than the others, congratulations to Steve, Mike, and Dave Constants from the Annapolis Maryland Fleet.

Just three points behind was Trevor Prior with crew Daniel and Luke. Trevor has family bragging rights (at least until the next regatta) over his daughter and Justin Coplan, who finished 3rd overall.
