Slightly over seven years ago our Lightning Class Association was born. January 12, 1939 is the date of the first organization meeting.

Seven years does not seem like a very long time in the life of an organization such as ours, especially when we consider that four of these seven years were badly disrupted war years. The growth of our Class during this period, to put it mildly, is truly amazing. Over 2100 registered Lightning owners and over 90 fleets is a remarkable record for such a short time.

trend is spreading rapidly from coast to coast and in foreign lands.

Our success as a Class is an accomplished fact. Our success for the future also is assured and we will continue to grow as we have through your enthusiastic ownership of Lightnings and your continued support. You are the Lightning Class Association and each and every one of you contributes immeasurably to its success. By continuing to do as you have done we cannot stop growing.

HONORARY OFFICERS FOR LIFE



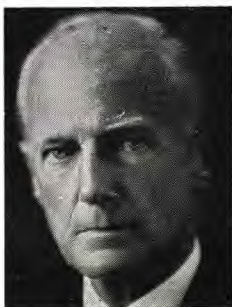
C. L. NICHOLSON — Commodore

OBJECT — POLICY — JURISDICTION

To promote and develop Lightning Class racing under uniform rules, governed by this Association, and to rigidly maintain the one-design features of Lightning Class sloop, as designed by Sparkman and Stephens, Inc., which plans are known as 265.

To cooperate with all other yachting organizations and to demand in return observance of the rules of the Lightning Class.

To keep the Lightning Class within the financial reach of the man of moderate means without handicapping ability or encouraging neglect in conditioning yachts.

To rigidly maintain a strictly one-design Class, in order to positively insure that all Lightning Class races held under the auspices of this Association be to determine the skill of the skipper, and to eliminate all variation in construction of the yachts. Everything in the Constitution, By-Laws and all building restrictions is intended to insure competition between boats of identical design and the spirit of the Constitution, By-Laws and building restrictions is to this end. The Association has jurisdiction over all Lightning activities. Its Class rules govern all sanctioned Lightning races regardless of by whom held. Its Constitution, By-Laws and Rules are binding upon all members and Fleets and all registered Lightning yachts must conform to its official plans and specifications.

ATTENTION OWNERS, BUILDERS AND SAILMAKERS

The Lightning name and emblem as applied to sailboats has been registered with the U. S. Patent office and the Lightning Class Association is granted exclusive use thereof. No boat may properly be sold or entered in any race as a Lightning or at any time display the Lightning emblem upon its sails or otherwise, unless the number tax or royalty on such boat has been paid to the Association by the builder or owner thereof. For the benefit of owners or prospective owners the Association proposes to take whatever steps necessary to protect both the Lightning name and emblem from any unauthorized use.

ROYALTIES AND REGISTRATION

The Association will refuse to issue a number or grant a measurement certificate to any yacht on which the royalty has not been paid or which was not built by a recorded owner of Official Lightning Class plans. *The fee for each and every boat built is \$15.00* which includes the assignment of a registered number.

Every Lightning built is recorded by the Association and a complete registry of owners is maintained. All changes in ownership or sale of new boats by builders and dealers must be recorded with the Secretary of the Association.

A royalty must be paid by sailmakers on each sail made amounting to 40 cents on jibs, 60 cents on mainsails, and 60 cents on spinnakers. These royalties should be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer promptly and semi-annual reports as sent out by the Association must be returned properly recording all Lightning sails made by each sailmaker for the period indicated.

MEMBERSHIP

Each and every Lightning owner should be an active member of the Association. \$3.00 per year (plus \$1.00 per year for each additional co-owner where more than one person jointly own a Lightning) is a very small amount to pay for the many benefits received from such a membership. You are not only helping to support your own Association that is doing everything possible to enhance and protect your investment in your Lightnings but you will receive numerous publications of great interest and benefit (which alone are worth the investment). Only members are permitted to enter sanctioned Lightning Class races and receive the official Year Book and special Lightning Class publications.

Every crew member or person sailing and interested in Lightnings but is not an owner should be an Associate member at \$3.00 per year, or in the case of crew members regularly sailing and assigned to a boat, \$1.00 per year. The Year Book (which is sent to Associate members as well) alone is worth more than this membership costs, not to mention our other publications.

If you have not already sent in your dues for 1946, do so *now*.

PLANS

Plans are not transferable. They are sold subject to the terms and conditions of the notice thereon. Plans and specifications are subject to annual revision only as provided in the Constitution and By-Laws. The responsibility of keeping advised as to these annual revisions rest with the purchaser of plans and specifications. Never copy another Lightning.

CONSTITUTION — BY-LAWS — RULES SPECIFICATIONS

The Constitution, By-Laws, Rules, Specifications of the Lightning Class Association are contained in a special pamphlet and is available to all members — builders and yachting organizations.

OFFICERS

Your duly elected national officers serve you and your Association without pay and have no financial interest directly or indirectly in any firm or corporation building boats, manufacturing boat fittings and equipment, supplies, or making sails. Your Association solicits advertising only from firms we believe to be entirely reputable. We do not, however, assume any responsibility or in any way guarantee these products.

GEORGE BARNES WINS INTERNATIONAL LIGHTNING CLASS CHAMPIONSHIP

The largest Championship regatta ever held by the Association was handled in grand style by the Riverside Yacht Club, Riverside, Connecticut. Thirty-four entries representing 27 Fleets competed in the Seventh Annual Championship Regatta, Sept. 7th, 8th and 9th.

George Barnes, veteran skipper, from Skaneateles, N. Y. Fleet No. 1, took a fifth, a first and a second place, accumulating 97 points to win. Sailing "*Westerly*" No. 1285, and assisted ably by his charming wife, *Catherine Barnes*, and *Robert Waterbury*. *Karl Smither*, former national champion and runner-up in 1944, placed second, with a total of ninety points getting a fourth, fifth and sixth in the three races. *Earl C. Johnson* of Kenmore, N. Y., a newcomer in International competition, placed third with eighty-eight points. The two Riverside entries, *Jack Webb* and *Andrew Scholtz* placed fourth and fifth, respectively.

While this year's championship was outstanding in the fact that there were many newcomers sailing their first races in big-time competition, there were as before a number of well-known names on the entry list making the competition exceedingly tough.

The members of the Riverside Yacht Club were grand hosts and Regatta Chairman, *Russell J. Nall*, ably assisted by his many committee members, carried everything thru in a most efficient manner. Twenty-five of the thirty-four entrants brought their own boats, nine using borrowed local boats which were drawn by lot for use during the three races. The sudden end of gas rationing made it possible to allow anyone so desiring to bring and sail their own boat. While this was still a war-time regatta it did look more like old times, and let us hope this will be the last war-time regatta ever run in Lightning Class History.

THE INTERNATIONALS

This is the log of a fresh water visit to the Big Salt Pond.

On disembarking from a train at the very nice suburban community of Riverside, small white and colored cardboard Lightnings tacked to the trees were soon in evidence marking the road to the RYC Clubhouse. Every detail was beautifully organized. On arrival, before you could say, "ready about," we had drawn our boat and were all set to go to work next morning.

Our draw, the "Zig-Zag", was something of a national celebrity, being that Lightning which recently appeared on the cover of *Life Magazine* as the training boat for the Riverside juniors. Bottom polishing, tuning and such, combined with test sailings, occupied the next day and a half.

Friday afternoon at race time, there was a beautiful breeze blowing out on the Sound. After three 15 minute postponements, however, the wind only lasted for about the first leg. It began to diminish on the second leg which was a reach. By the time the second mark was reached, the air was light and fluky. We rounded the mark several places behind the leaders and started bucking the tide. It seemed that the leading boats who headed inshore were not doing so well, so we tacked fairly soon. Then the wind died completely. We actually anchored during a race for the first time in our lives. On account of the depth, we had to keep on tying one extra piece of line after another,

in order to reach the bottom. While we were wondering what would happen next, a gentle zephyr began to develop from the SW. We got our ground tackle aboard and started wondering again whether we were going ahead or back over the bottom, as there was a considerable head tide. All the boats which were behind came merrily sailing by within a stone's throw, while the leaders were hopelessly becalmed inshore from us. We jockeyed back and forth a long time, gradually creeping up on the starting buoy. The wind started to head us gradually so we tacked, as luck would have it just at the right time to lay the mark and pass it first. As about three hours had elapsed, we hoped the committee would end the race there, making it once around, as they did at South Haven. No gun; so we started on the second lap, but lack of wind made it obviously futile. The race was called at 3½ hours, before we could get to the next mark. We were all towed back to the club, arriving after dark.

Saturday morning provided a gentle breeze. There was a bit of a jam-up at the end of the starting line, which we just barely missed. Then started our struggle with Dalton Myles in No. 1010, which continued for the whole race. We would separate for awhile and have brushes with others, but we came back together again and again. We finished behind him, in fourth place.

Saturday afternoon was a windward leeward race. On the way out to the Sound, we sailed by a marker which was being towed into Captain's Harbor. In this race we continued our tussle with No. 1010. We passed him on the beat but he got through us again at the mark. Coming down the spinnaker run on a beautiful breeze, we followed the leaders toward the red marker which had been anchored dead to leeward. Barnes, who was ahead of us, did not take that course, however, and rounded the starting marker, which was then quite a distance abeam of us. We were in a quandary, but decided on the short course with many misgivings. In fact, on the second beat, we were practically convinced we were wrong and were very discouraged. On the last run we tussled with No. 1010 again, who finally got our wind and passed us a boat length from the finish line to give us a fifth.

Sunday was the race to end all races; light airs and fog on a long windward leeward course. We got off to a pretty good start but had to watch out for Earl Johnson, who kept edging up on our wind. We had to jibe several times as the wind varied slightly. The wash from Sunday stinkpotters bothered us quite a bit as we neared the leeward mark which we finally passed first. By this time Barnes and Swindeman in "Yankee Doodle" were pulling up. We had a tacking match with them both on the entire beat. Just at the mark "Yankee Doodle" nosed us out for what we again hoped was the finish. The committee boat waved us on again, with the sad news that there was no time limit, and, apparently, no lunch, because it was then after one o'clock.

On the second run all were becalmed while boats sailing on the south shore of the Sound scooted along on a nice breeze. The local boats No. 246 and No. 249 kept to the south and picked up the breeze first. They romped up to the mark on a close reach while we struggled for it. The final spinnaker run was a broad reach. No. 1379 who ran much farther down to leeward than we did, just nosed us out, as we got a sixth to give us the runner-up spot for the series.

All through this series, just as with many others, our success was due to my partner Bob Crane and to Reg Pegrum. We had crewed together for six consecutive summers. All work as a unit, with much comment and counter-comment, except in the tight spots, when very little is said—until later!

IMPRESSIONS OF MY FIRST INTERNATIONALS

The joke about this article is on our worthy President. He heard two years ago that I was thirteen and in asking for an article from the youngest skipper, he must have forgotten that the years rush by for the young and old alike. And anyway, who would ever desire an opinion from a skipper who wound up in 21st place and a rather confused skipper who took the wrong course no less, in the second race. But aside from all this, I had a most wonderful time and enjoyed every exciting minute of it.

We started out, my father and friend, Von Ollinger, for Riverside on Friday morning and arrived right in the middle of all the sail measuring and last minute race committee instructions. We soon set sail and arrived at the line in the middle of the largest group of competitors ever assembled at a Lightning National Regatta.

The race began after a short postponement and with the help of a fair breeze and a small chop, we rounded the first mark. But by the time we reached the second leg, the then moderate wind petered out and the boats began a drifting match. Eventually the time limit expired. We knew that we would have to resail the first race again on Saturday.

Saturday dawned dismal and foggy and we were towed to the line. It was a long race, in practically no wind with a fine September sun. We were doing fairly well until the last leg, when we were passed up to windward by five other boats all with spinnakers.

At lunch that day a solemn vow was made to rectify the faulty start made in the previous race. We changed our sails and started out with tremendous visions of what would come out of it. At the start, we decided on a port tack and if we thought we made a poor start in the first race—this one was beyond mention. Well, we started last, or so close to the last that you couldn't tell the difference, then deciding to split tacks with the fleet we went in shore and profited greatly by rounding the first mark 8th or 9th. Then and only then came the terrible disaster. We set our sights on the wrong mark and sailed right out of competition.

However, we had two races behind us, the increased knowledge that "Nola" could stay fairly well up in any wind and hoped fervently for some wind in Sunday's event for our sails were of 6.8 ounce canvas and we could do nothing in light air.

At the starting gun, which, by the way, scheduled at 10:45 came around noon, our boat was in fair position. We drifted down to the first mark and rounded 7th. But then as before, we met our fate. Our heavy sails could not take the light air on a beat and boat after boat sailed by our mournful craft. We actually went from 7th to 15th on one leg. On the next leg we just sat waiting for the long expected southerly and since the Race Committee took off all time limit we knew it might well be dark when we came in, but we kept up our rate of speed at that time. There were two other competitors besides ourselves grouped together in one spot, drifting aimlessly and having a pleasant conversa-

tion. Then came the southerly and it pulled us away as if by magic from the other two. On the last leg, when the four o'clock southerly was refreshing the fleet, we decided to try our luck without the spinnaker since there were no boats near us. We had gone about two thirds of the leg when we noticed No. 513 boiling up a wake with her spinnaker and bearing down on us rapidly. Well you should have seen us fly into action, each yelling at each other as we accomplished a 15 second job. And, as excitement would have it, No. 513 was just creeping through our lee as we raised the spinnaker. We cut off all wind from her sail and everything folded. From then on in we held our own, but not until we had upset the stomachs of all aboard with the gripping excitement.

That being my first National or International Regatta, I need not tell you the thrills encountered. I admired the business-like fashion in which the measuring committee cut off spinnaker poles, booms, etc. I also enjoyed watching the expressions left on the faces of those who had just seen the exquisite costumes of Walt Swindeman & Co., to whom I pay my respects, for some wonderful sailing; also to George Barnes, Karl Smither, Earl Johnson. As has been said by many a skipper, "Wait 'till next year when position 21 shall be changed to 2 or 1."

THE "LEPRACAUN" GOES TO THE INTERNATIONALS

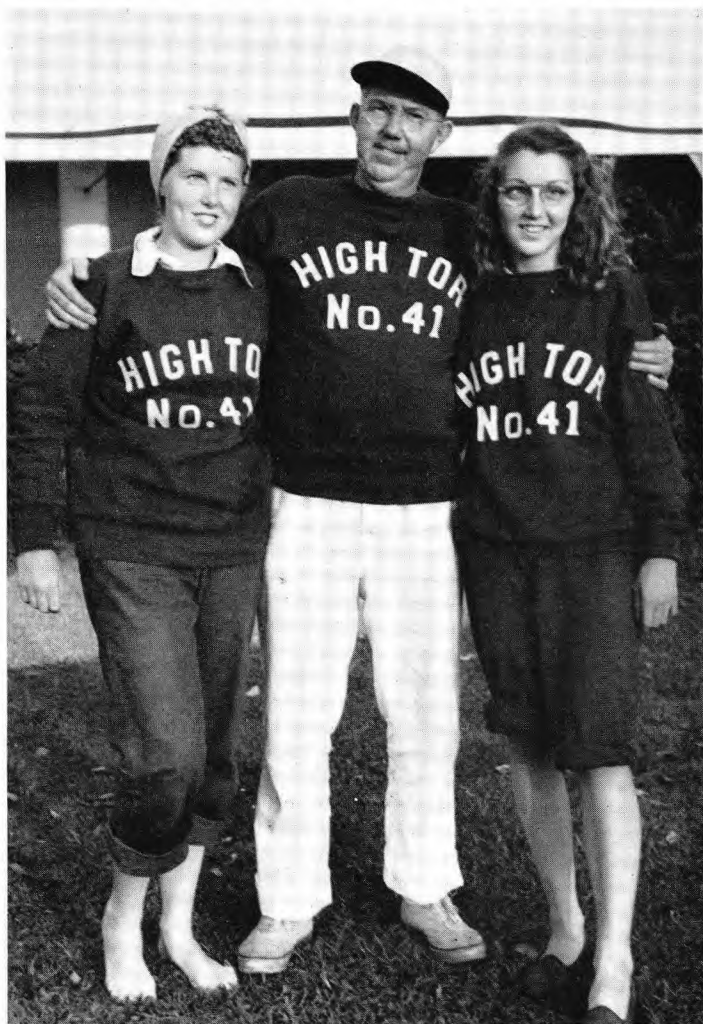
Early on the morning of the Internationals, I set out for Connecticut with my family and sailbags (these are not synonymous). The day before, we had traileed the two boats representing our fleet (High-Tor No. 41) to the Riverside Yacht Club and launched them. I had painted our good ship "Lepracaun" and her trailer a bright blue for the occasion. Driving to the Internationals that day, I thought what an apropos color I had chosen—bright because I was getting an opportunity to race with the best skippers in the country, and my wife and daughters were enthusiastically betting I would place tenth; blue because I had never raced in such stiff competition before and my crew consisted of my fifteen and sixteen year old daughters "Mack" and "Red". I personally planned on placing somewhere around twenty-fifth. Never again shall I under-estimate the sharp wits and endurance of womankind or the powers of Lady Luck, for I managed to place sixth—far beyond my wildest expectations.

In the first race on Friday afternoon, we managed to maneuver into sixth place on the second leg. Shortly after we rounded the second buoy, the wind died down, making it necessary to call off the race. We had had an opportunity for a "dress rehearsal" and were now raring to go.

The next morning we went to work in earnest. By making long, windward tacks, we moved up into fourth position rounding the first buoy. Karl Smither was close behind. George Barnes blanketed our boat and passed us on rounding the second buoy, but the "Lepracaun" repassed him on this leg which was a reach. We followed Swindeman and Berry around the buoy at the end of the first lap. During the windward leg Barnes' excellent maneuvering threatened all the lead boats. However, the last two legs, both reaches, brought about a change in our position. We crossed the finishing line third and chalked up a healthy thirty-two points. The Internationals were really in our blood now.

The start of the afternoon race was disappointing. We worked to windward in the belief that we were to leave buoy to port. By the time we discovered that it should be left to starboard, we had lost consider-

able time and rounded the buoy somewhere near tenth place. The crew had some difficulty in raising the spinnaker for the downwind run. This done, we noticed several of the lead boats going to leeward, which proved later to be disastrous for them. We still maintained our course and started down the last leg of the race in fifth place. Smither, by skillful spinnaker-hoisting, was in fourth place directly ahead of us. Then began a battle royal that highlighted the Internationals for me. We made several attempts to go to windward of Karl, but he prevented

us from blanketing him in this manner. As we approached the finish line, we drew up on his leeward side. In the last few boat lengths, we managed to back-draft his spinnaker and crossed the finish line three seconds ahead of him. O-o-oh! What he said!

That night we were in second place, just one point behind Barnes. What pleased me even more was the fact that we had been able to cross the line a little in front of Karl Smither in both races. I have watched Karl's past sailing achievements and admired not only the sailing skill of his crew, Bob Crane, Reg Pegrum, and Karl himself, but also their grand sportsmanship.

The committee decided that Sunday morning's race should have a spinnaker start (or should I say drift). We drifted from the tail end of the fleet to about the middle on that first leg. On rounding the buoy, a little breeze came up. Ted Siferd gave us a bit of a luffing match, but we finally passed to the windward of him. We then made the error of sailing out into the chop and tide, thereby losing valuable time. We ended the first lap somewhere among the first ten boats. The committee decided to waive the time limit in order to finish the series that day. Again the wind died down. Again we drifted. I drifted toward shore. A brisk breeze finally came in from the Sound. Because we were near shore, we got the breeze last, and five boats had already passed us. On the last leg of the race we used the spinnaker, although most of the others decided against it. We seemed to gain on the boats ahead, but not enough to change our position materially. We finally finished in thirteenth place. This gave us a total of eighty-five points and sixth place in the series.

At sundown Sunday, we set out for home with the "Lepracaun" riding proudly on her trailer. Thanks to her smooth performance, the kindness of the Riverside Yacht Club, the excellent work of the committee, and the grand sportsmanship of the other skippers and crews, we had enjoyed the best weekend in the "Lepracaun's" sailing career.

MEMORIES

Our story has its beginning on Thursday, Sept. 6th, when we loaded "Flame", on a trailer and started for Riverside. The trailer was borrowed and it did not fit the boat so it practically had to be made over. We had quite a time getting to Riverside with it—and a worse one getting back.

However, after a struggle we arrived at Riverside Yacht Club and were greeted by *Commodore Hipkins*. Our first impression of the Club was very favorable. There are facilities for handling boats, a fine dock and floats. We backed up to the hoist, the canvass straps were put around "Flame" and she was gently lowered into the water. A launch towed her around to the dock and I stepped the mast with the able assistance of *Howard Siddons* and *Ed. Cattus*. By this time one of my crew had arrived and we proceeded to rig her. That evening I had the pleasure of meeting the Class officers for the first time.

Early Friday morning we were at the boat doing the many odd jobs that always seem to pop up at the last minute. At eleven o'clock we attended the meeting of the skippers with the International Race Committee. Then out to the harbor to line up at the starting line. I was greatly impressed by the sight as I had never seen so many Lightnings all at one time. Just after we rounded the second mark the wind just dropped, and the drifting match began. The details are too painful to relate here, but after the time limit expired, and we were still drifting

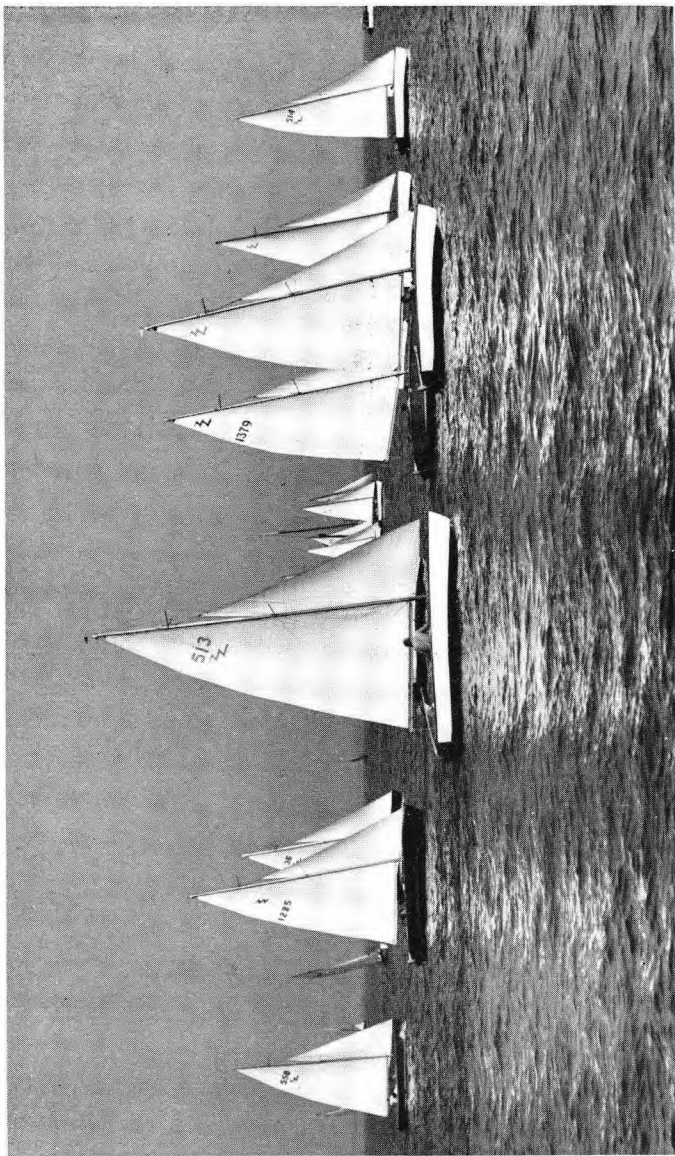

the race was called off. We were all towed to the Club and shown to our moorings with searchlights from the launches.

The cocktail party, and a swell dinner were just what we needed, and after attending the Annual Meeting everyone left to get some sleep.

Saturday morning was very hazy. The wind was very light from the southwest. After a short postponement the race was started. The going was very slow. The fog horn on the island kept moaning at intervals. We finally reached the windward mark and rounded in ninth position. We were passed by two boats on the reach to the next mark. Some of the boats set spinnakers but doused them again in short order as they would not stay filled. We rounded the next mark and again beat to windward. *Ted Siferd* was just astern and pressing all the way. He was still there on the next reach and moving even closer. At the last mark before starting for the finish line we became mixed up with three other boats. Everyone began to set spinnakers. We were running neck and neck with *J. Carl Bebler* in "*Blitzen*". First he would pass us and then we would pass him; this continuing right to the finish line where he did a beautiful bit of sailing by dropping down and blanketing us at precisely the right instant. He crossed the line with his bow about a foot ahead of ours. We finished in eleventh position, and then sailed back to the Club for a hurried lunch.

Back out again for the second race and things looking up as the wind had freshened quite a bit. A windward leeward course was set. All marks were to be left to starboard. We got a fine start at the windward end of the line and held starboard tack. It seemed good to be racing in a fresh breeze after the struggle of the previous day. We were about thirteenth around the mark and set the spinnaker immediately after rounding. During this operation a very amusing incident occurred. My jib sheet man had gone forward with great alacrity, the deck was wet and slippery and he proceeded to keep on going forward to such an extent that he went over the bow and made a big splash. Luckily he grabbed the jibstay as he went by. He proceeded to spring back—like a Jack-in-the-box. This caused great merriment for surrounding crews and it did take a few minutes to get our minds back to racing. We got the spinnakers drawing nicely and passed three boats but about this time we saw some of the boats heading for a stake boat anchored inshore. We held a course for the committee boat, we rounded the leeward mark and then immediately had to get out on the weather rail. When it's blowing we all hang out and I steer with the hiking stick. By this time the fleet was pretty well scattered all over the course and it was very hard to tell what position we were in. Then around the windward mark and another spinnaker run to the finish line. We finished tenth in a very enjoyable race.

The dinner-dance was great. Everyone seemed relaxed and to be having a good time. I noticed that we have jitterbugs in the Lightning Class. Almost everyone stayed up very late in spite of the time set for the race to be sailed next day.

Sunday morning came and it was not beautiful or bright—just heavy fog. Signals were hoisted for a windward leeward course. Progress was very slow—we seemed pretty well out in front but there was a wall of sails astern. We maneuvered around to get clear wind and after some fretting and fuming we rounded the first mark and passed two boats to windward, working up past them in the puffs as the wind had freshened a bit. We again stood inshore and held this tack until time to come about and lay the mark. As we neared the mark the wind was dying; but we rounded in fourth place behind *Swindeman*, *Barnes* and *Smither*. We set the spinnaker in the dying air and passed *Barnes* and *Smither* and moved up very close to *Swindeman*. Then

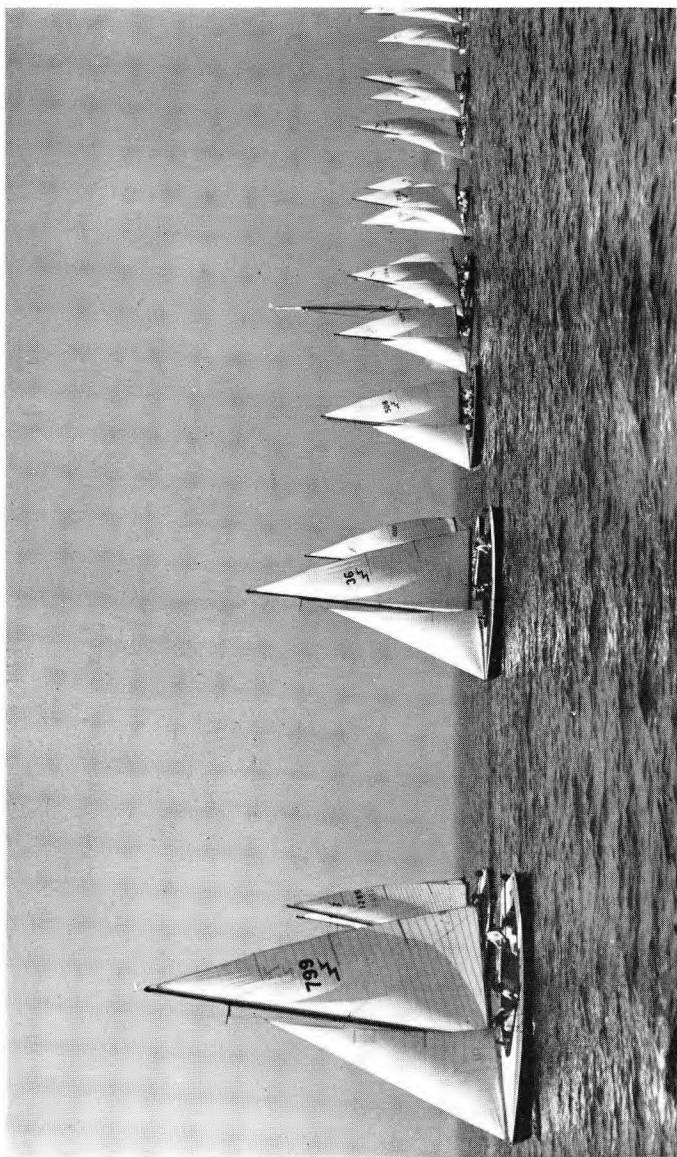

difficulties began, the wind just died out; we drifted and cursed—so did everybody else I guess. No one looked very happy.

When you get into the second spot in the Internationals, and the wind dies, anything can happen. Far ahead and toward the Long Island shore we saw some boats that had been idly drifting about start to heel over and move. Wind was coming at last—the long waited southerly. *Swindeman* got in first and started to go; we followed suit and so did everyone else. *Walt* laid the mark and came around. We could not quite lay it and come about. We then hit a soft spot and almost stood still. At the same time *Walt* in "Yankee Doodle" had rounded and with started sheets went to windward of us and parallel trying to find wind as it was still a bit fluky. *George Barnes*, *Karl Smither* and *Andy Scholtz* passed us and went around the mark. Finally we got some air, came about and rounded the mark. Up went the spinnaker as the wind was freshening every moment. It was practically abeam and the spinnaker was flying out to the side of the boat and drawing like "all get out". She was like a scared cat. We passed *Karl Smither* and started to overtake the other three leaders. The wind then seemed to move a bit forward of the beam and we doused the spinnaker. Not, however, until we had waited a few moments to make sure it would remain in that quadrant. *Karl Smither* also doused his spinnaker. We timed everything just right and away we went for the finish line. *Walt Swindeman* crossed first, then *George Barnes*, closely followed by *Andy Scholtz*, with us in fourth place. We sailed right to the Club and I'll never forget the sight that the fleet made as they came in with spinnakers set. Words cannot do justice to it.

To those skippers who have never competed in the Internationals or Nationals, I would like to offer a few words of advice. Get yourself a good trailer as a good trailer is indispensable. I spoiled part of the fun in preparing for the Regatta by fooling around at the last minute with a trailer that did not fit the boat, and was not in A-1 condition. Also try to allow yourself a few extra days and do not try to adhere to a rigid schedule. It is impossible to forecast the weather—maybe the weather will be right for racing and maybe not. But all in all I can promise you the moments will be happy ones and you'll bring back memories that you'll never forget.

WE'LL TRY AGAIN

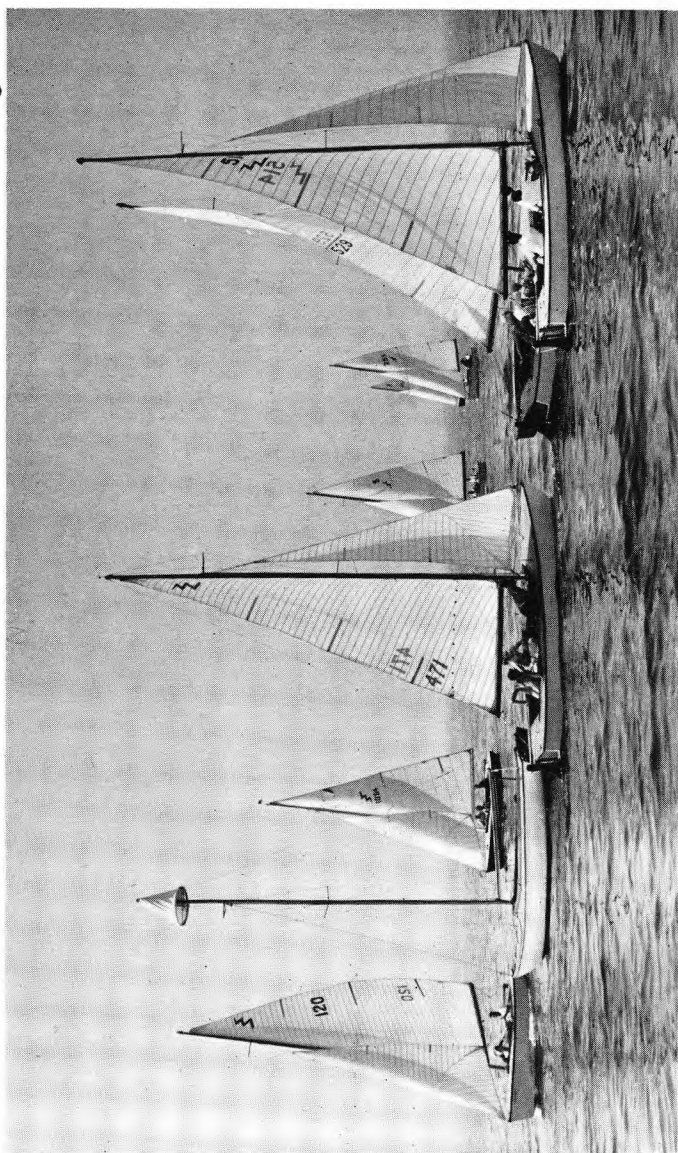

menial tasks to our wives. Walt Vogel and I proceeded to look over the sound as we wanted to find our way around and be sure we knew our directions. After a wonderful sailing afternoon on the sound we were quite happy, and the boat seemed to be tuned about right.

Wednesday and Thursday the sailing was still fine and we made the most of it. Of one thing we were convinced, we would not get lost as we did the year before the first race at Buffalo. We spent most of Thursday watching the arrivals and helping now and then to launch a boat.

At last Friday came and with it, no air. We did have a spirited first leg race with Dave Berry who was always in our hair but we could not manage to catch him. George Barnes, the old master, was right on our tail all the way to the second mark and then he and the rest of the fleet passed us as we hit a dead spot. We sat for three hours until the race was called off. While we were sitting, Vogel decided to find out if the water was salty and jumped overboard for a swim. He couldn't even push us past any of the boats around us!

The Saturday morning race was a thriller. We chose to hit the line on a port tack and got our usual lousy start. We drove the "Doodle" hard, worked clear of the bunched-up fleet and found ourselves behind Barnes and Berry. We managed to work past these boys after rounding the first mark and edged them a little on the second leg. On the fourth leg which was to weather we had a ding dong battle with Dave Berry, who really did a fine job of sailing No. 351, but we couldn't hold him. After he worked past us we split tacks with him. He covered us and we split again. With a bit of luck we just barely edged him at the mark to take the lead again which we held for the remainder of the race.

I don't like to think of that second race but anyhow here is our story. We saw the course signals on the committee boat and knew it to be a windward leeward course. We also saw the two marker cones and figured these to be the correct marks since the first mark seemed close to the starting line. Again we started about last and worked up to second place. Dave Berry was setting the pace and we rounded the first mark after him. He continued to lead us all the way around the long course and we got the worst shellacking of the season from him. We were disappointed, of course, on learning of our error but we decided to chalk it up to experience. George Barnes was on the beam all the way and deserved to win. Champions just don't make mistakes in any class.

The last race found us on Long Island Sound for eight hours. We started out at nine A.M. and docked at five. Before going out for the last race we decided to do something about tuning to see if we couldn't hold Berry better. We checked the spar and it looked as if the back stay was too loose so we tightened it just one-eighth inch. We started in the middle of the fleet and after a long drift rounded the first mark about fifth. Here the breeze picked up and our tuning paid off as we passed Berry to weather. We also had a battle getting around "Frolic", Barnes and Smither. We followed a good slant away from the fleet and worked out a nice lead. The wind shifted putting Smither ahead of us again and we had a private war of our own the rest of the way to the mark. About fifty feet from the mark Smither pulled a boner in not covering us and we slipped past him to take the lead again for the second time around. After a long drift a breeze picked up and we sailed across the finish line with a fair lead.

It certainly was thrilling and a grand experience to finish ahead of a fleet made up of such a fine bunch of skippers.

I forgot to mention that we received eight telegrams from the Tole-

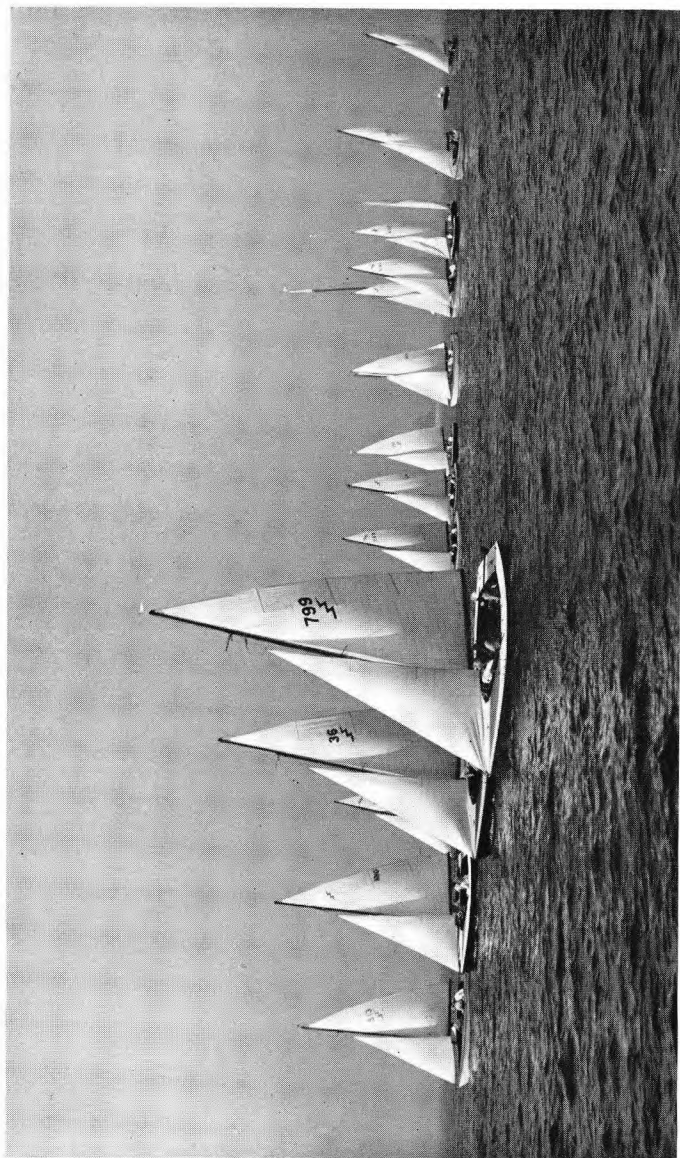

1945 BUFFALO-CHAUTAUQUA INTER-CLUB

Saturday, September 22, a large caravan bearing Lightning sailors journeyed from Buffalo to Chautauqua, arriving in time for dinner. Chautauqua put on an excellent and most enjoyable dinner, continuing their high reputation for hospitality. Sunday morning all were out early for the first race. It had rained during the night, but clearing skies and variable airs were the order of the day.

Hough, Moran, Crocker and Johnson skipped for Chautauqua. Smither, Thompson III, Church and Savage started for Buffalo. B.C.C. took the first race 20 to 16 with Smither, Hough and Phil Savage leading in. Randy Hough again came through with a first for Chautauqua in the second race, followed by Eby and Moran, exactly reversing the score: C.L.Y.C. 20—B.C.C. 16, making it all even for the two races. During the third race the breeze dropped and all hands went wind hunting. In the drifting match which ensued first one boat would sail

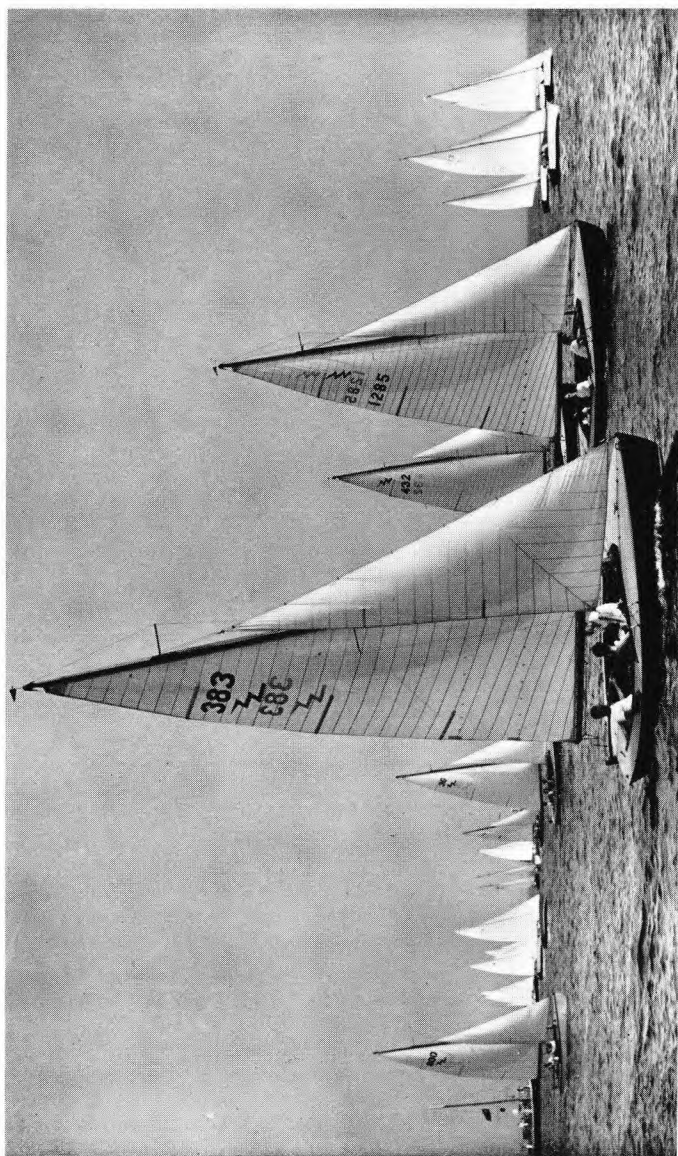

1946 LIGHTNING CLASS INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

September 5, 6, 7, 1946

Three members of Lightning Fleet No. 1 sailing WESTERLY No. 1285 were fortunate in winning the Internationals at Riverside, Conn., last September, thus making it possible to hold another Lightning Championship at Skaneateles in the fall of 1946. Skaneateles is located in Central New York on U.S. Route No. 20 eighteen miles west of Syracuse and seven miles east of Auburn.

The reproduction of the chart of Skaneateles Lake shown on the opposite page has the location of the clubhouse indicated, and some of the probable courses are shown. The club is located one mile south of the village on U.S. Route No. 41-A on the west side of the lake. The mooring area of all contestants' boats is directly in front of the club but a short distance from the starting line. Due to the narrow character of the lake, it is not possible to lay out an equilateral triangle with each leg one mile long—it is usually necessary to have two legs of approximately $1\frac{1}{8}$ miles and the third leg $\frac{3}{4}$ -mile long. The final decision in this and all matters pertaining to the races will, of course, be left in the hands of the International Race Committee.

The Skaneateles fleet is very proud to list among its members the first President and Secretary-Treasurer of the Lightning Class—C. L. Nicholson II and E. Gordon Cronk, now Honorary Commodore and Vice Commodore of the L.C.A. Skaneateles sailors have long been interested in small boat sailing, this club having been one of the charter members of the Central New York Yacht Racing Association composed of sixteen member clubs formed to foster and promote small boat sailing. At the Annual Regattas of the CNYIRA there have frequently been registrations of over 150 boats, this being one of the largest regattas to be held in inland waters.

At the present time, club committees are very busy making the necessary arrangements for the forthcoming Regatta, and every effort is being put forth in an endeavor to see that a successful series is assured.

It is unnecessary to tell old hands at Lightning sailing that Regattas of this nature are the climax to a wonderful season, so in addition to the oldtimers we hope to meet many new skippers and crews here next fall.

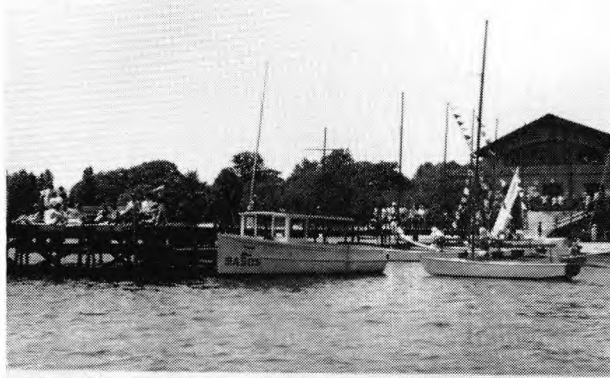

Excellent weather prevailed with the exception of a thunderstorm on Tuesday just as the Freeman Cup Race from Rochester was finishing. Every Regatta needs a thunderstorm just to prove that "singers are sailors."

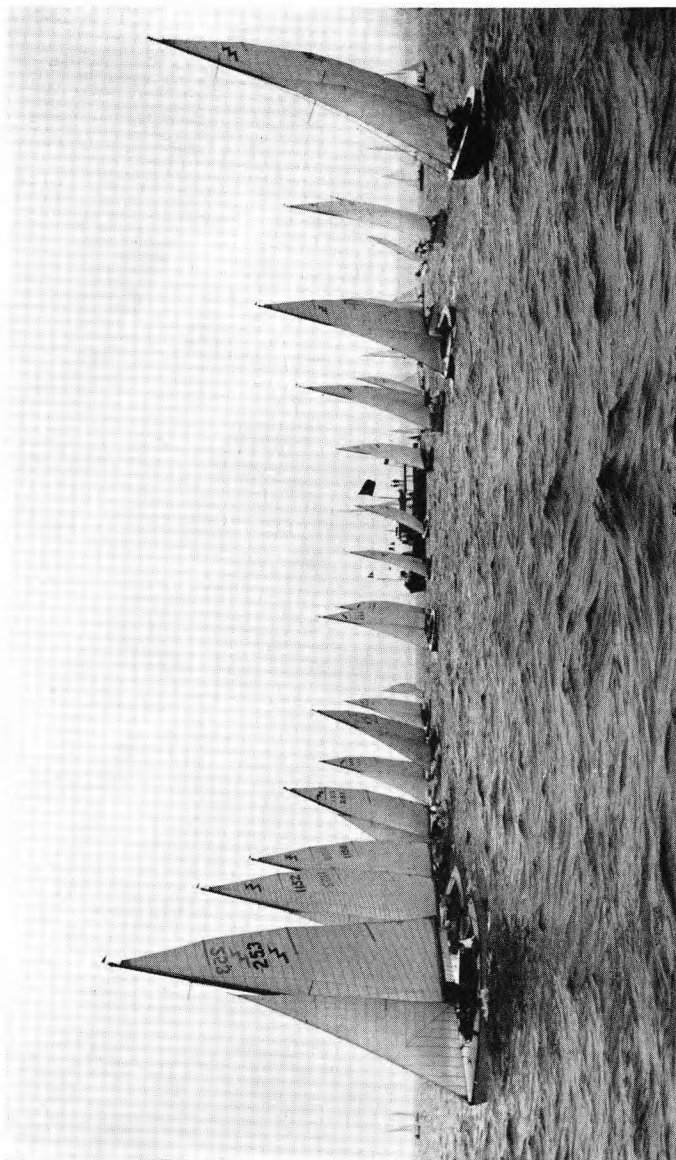

wood Fleet (82); The Niantic Bay Lightning Fleet (85); Seawanhaka Lightning Fleet (88); Cold Spring Harbor Fleet (89).

District Report—Highlight of the 1945 Season was the International Championship held at the Riverside Yacht Club Fleet (7) on September 7th, 8th and 9th, won by *George Barnes* of Skaneateles Country Club Fleet (1), details of which are elsewhere reported.

Enthusiasm in "Lightnings" knows no bounds. Members of High-Tor Fleet (41), at Stony Point, N. Y. wanted additional Lightnings so they took the matter in their own hands and built 4 new boats, supervised by "Specialist" *Doc Myles*. Their Fleet now comprises 14 boats. (These boys would be a big help in the present housing shortage).

The Hudson River Fleets had a very active season, with a Series of Inter-Club Races, which was won by *Pete Pedersen*, with *Doc Myles* runner-up, both of High-Tor Fleet (41), who represented their Fleet in the International Championships at Riverside. A Regatta was held in August by the Chelsea Yacht Club Fleet (39), in which High-Tor Fleet (41) and Nyack Boat Club participated. The climax of their season was the Stony Point Regatta, held the week-end of September 15th by High-Tor Fleet (41), for the Championship of the Hudson River Fleets. There was a Historical Perpetual Trophy donated for this event, which is to record, from this date forward, the History of Yacht Racing on the Hudson. 23 boats competed, from High-Tor Fleet (41), Chelsea Yacht Club Fleet (39) and Nyack Boat Club. The winner and Hudson River Champion was *Doc Myles*, whose name is inscribed on this trophy and it remains with High-Tor Fleet (41), until won by a member of a rival fleet. Their plans for this season, comprise more Inter-Club Series Races, Regattas at Chelsea and Nyack and as a Grand Finale the Hudson River Championship, held by High-Tor Fleet (41), at Stony Point, N. Y.

A remarkable winter meeting was held by the Hudson River Fleets in February, which was attended by *Jim Trenary*, *Jack Orelup*, *Al Webb*, their wives and 298 other Lightning fans. There was a dinner-dance and Movies of the 1945 International Championship Races. This was a grand showing and evidence of the interest Lightning skippers have, in getting together to rehash last season's events and swap plans for next season.

We welcome a new fleet into our District fold. Nyack Boat Club Fleet (75). This fleet now comprises four boats. (But wait 'til these boys start building). Their Captain and Champion is *Magnus (Pete) Pedersen* and *Harry R. Ebbets*, is Fleet Secretary.

Great growth, with corresponding enthusiasm, was evidenced in Western Long Island Sound Fleet (32), based at Larchmont Yacht Club, Larchmont, N. Y. Fleet (32) now has 40 boats as of March 1st, and they expect 4 or 5 more by racing season. (Remember in 1944 when there were only 4 boats in this fleet. How babies grow!).

There was a full season of racing on Long Island Sound and the Yacht Racing Association Lightning Championship was won by *Jack Webb* of Riverside, Western Connecticut Fleet (7), with *Steve Carr* of Larchmont, Western Long Island Sound Fleet (32) runner-up.

Larchmont Race Week was a highly successful series of races, with all kinds of weather! (There is nothing more fickle than a Long Island Sound breeze; it comes and goes and where and when nobody knows). Lightnings constituted the largest class, with 34 at the starting line, on opening day. The series was won by *Jack Webb* with *Andy Scholz* second, both of Riverside, (Western Connecticut Fleet (7)).

One of the most pleasant days of the summer was a Regatta given by Little Neck Bay Fleet (55), at Douglaston, L. I. An invitation to Buffet Luncheon (on the house) was extended and a swell meal was served, which was greatly appreciated by the skippers and crews. Some 31 boats then competed for a set of trophies donated by the home fleet. *Niels Fossum* of Riverside, Western Connecticut Fleet (7) in "Phantom" won the first leg on the Douglaston Trophy, which becomes the permanent possession of the Club winning it three times. This trophy will be put in competition again this summer. Every one in this area has an eye on this race and the competition will be really keen.

Larchmont Race Week, this summer, will be held from July 22nd to July 29th, inclusive. It is expected that 100 Lightnings will participate. This will include a number from the two new fleets now being organized. These are neighboring groups at Seawanhaka and Cold Spring Bath and Beach Clubs in Oyster Bay, where 50 Lightnings have been ordered for June delivery. *Amvas Ames* had done the organizing work there and deserves a big vote of thanks for his splendid effort in getting these fleets under way.

The Atlantic Coast Championship is scheduled to be held at Riverside, Western Connecticut Fleet (7), this summer. Now, with wartime restrictions lifted and a large number of fleets added, there should be the largest group of Lightnings on hand, yet to participate in this event.

The meeting was followed by a preview showing of the movies of the 1945 Internationals at Riverside.

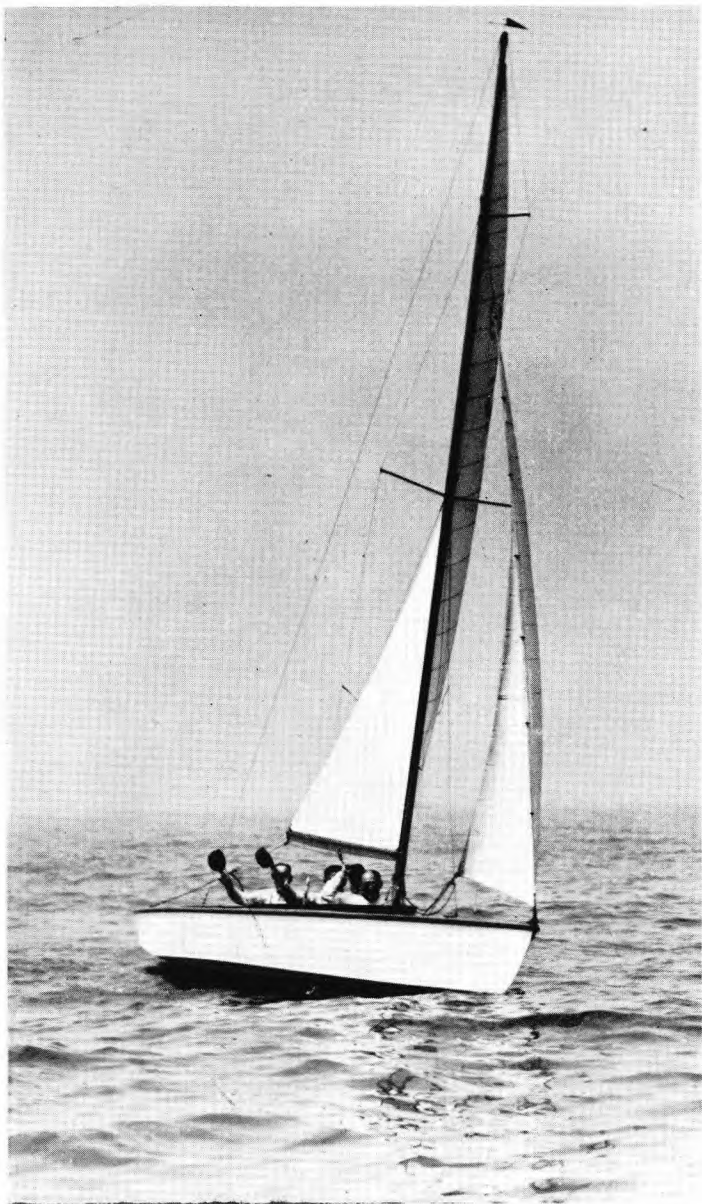
During the meeting "Old Man Winter" turned on a first class snow storm just to let us know we were having a winter meeting.

FIFTH ANNUAL LAKE MICHIGAN DISTRICT REGATTA

Good weather added much to the pleasure and enjoyment of the participants in the Fifth Annual Lake Michigan District Regatta held at the South Haven Yacht Club on July 27th, 28th and 29th. Fleet No. 30 was fortunate in having the opportunity of entertaining the largest District Regatta ever held in the history of the Lightning Class Association. Twenty-three Lightnings entered the races, fifteen of which were trailed to the scene of action.

By noon of the 27th all the boats had their final grooming for the first race of the series scheduled to start at three o'clock that afternoon. A medium northeast wind prevailed. All skippers were out well in advance of the warning flag, practicing on the starting line for a northwest start. One of the committee members made the suggestion to cross them up which would make their first race more eventful. This was agreed upon so a green flag was hoisted indicating the committee had decided to send them off to the southwest with a spinnaker run for the first leg which would result in a long windward beat on the back leg.

The first boat over the starting line was No. 949 "Rambler Too", skippered by *Walt Vogel* of Toledo, who increased his lead continuously on the others to finish well out in front, with recorded time 2.20.32.

Skipper *Gene Howard* of Detroit River Fleet, sailing No. 886 "Thunderbird", in his first Lake Michigan District regatta turned in a fine performance to take second place with recorded time of 2.36.40. *Cal Yaudas*, veteran skipper from Toledo, took third position, time 2.36.53, with *Len Ladenburger*, defending Lake Michigan District champion, coming in fourth, time 2.37.45.

For the morning race Saturday, the skippers had light airs from the southwest and the boats again started southwest with *Walt Vogel* and *Nolan Crall* of Chicago being on the starting line too soon, forcing them to be recalled and starting last. *Vogel* displayed his exceptional ability as a skipper by bringing his boat clear through the Fleet on the first leg to take the lead on the second leg of the first lap and continued to increase it to again win. *Len Ladenburger*, South Haven's defending champion, took second place in the second race and *Russ Luchtenberg*, a crack Columbus skipper, coming in third.

The morning race on Saturday was run in light fog and the boats gradually melted almost out of sight as they left the starting line going to the outer mark, coming back into view again as they started back to the finish line. The wind practically died out completely before most of the boats were in, leaving the rest of the fleet to work their way in very slowly in order to finish and get credit for their position.

The Saturday afternoon race scheduled for 2:30 was called off due to lack of wind so the race committee decided to hold the third race early Sunday morning in order to take advantage of the usually fresh morning breeze on Lake Michigan. Proper notice was posted by the Chairman of the race committee that the third race was to start at 9 o'clock Sunday morning.

The feasibility of the Race Committee decision was proved as Sunday morning weather provided a nice off shore breeze from the east which had a tendency to swing to the northeast and gradually swing around into the northwest before the race was finished, causing the positions in this race to change very rapidly, making the final outcome extremely uncertain until the finish line was crossed. *Walt Vogel*, who was ahead on points at the beginning of this race, managed to again get out in the lead but was becalmed on the fifth leg which presented the opportunity for practically the whole fleet to sail down on him so that as the boats changed positions on the last two legs it placed *Vogel* in fifth position for the third race. *Gene Howard*, who finished second in the first race, managed to smell out the wind properly and crossed the line first, which gave him a standing of third for the Regatta. *Frank Pfefferle* of Cincinnati was also very fortunate in finding wind which enabled him to finish second in this race, giving him a sixth position for the L. M. D. Regatta. *Len Ladenburger* finished third in this race which gave him enough points to take second place; *Walt Vogel's* fifth place in this race still left him with enough points to finish first in the Regatta, making him the Lake Michigan District Champion for 1945, and which takes it back to Toledo next year.

The generally light airs coupled with ground swells in all three races brought out the very best in all the skippers participating and gave them a lot of valuable experience which will stand them in good stead in all their future racing.

The three races brought only two minor protests which were disallowed by the race committee.

The recently organized Ohio Inter-Club Yachting Association will meet in the Mansfield-Leland Hotel, Mansfield, Ohio, April 6, at the call of *Commodore Ted Siferd* of Lima, Ohio, to plan a state-wide regatta and to arrange a program for the coming racing season for Ohio yachtsmen.

The new organization is interested in small-class sailboats on sheltered waters and intends to encourage and sponsor the racing programs of such craft on the 60 small lakes in Ohio.

The Chippewa Yacht Club at Chippewa Lake, Ohio, and the South Shore Yacht Club, at Turkeyfoot Lake, Akron, Ohio, have already extended invitations to the association to hold regattas on their lakes during the coming summer, according to *Vice-Commodore Larry D. Fleet No. 46 outscored the skippers of Pultneyville but the Lake-side hosts turned in a very creditable performance against a bunch who have been sailing Lightnings for some years.

Four of the eight active fleets in the district sent skippers and crews to the Internationals at Riverside. A new fleet has been chartered in the district at Newport Yacht Club on Irondequoit Bay. This makes Rochester the hot-spot of Lightning activity with three fleets sailing out of her ports.

The coming 1946 Internationals at Skaneateles will without doubt be a tremendous shot in the arm for Lightning sailing as Skaneateles Lake is one of the most beautiful spots in the country and the Skaneateles C. C. has a very nice set up for handling such an event.

It is the personal opinion of this writer that the first peacetime sailing season in many years will clearly establish the Lightning Class as the most popular of small racing boat classes. The Central New York District will continue to be heard from and will ever be represented by some of the countries outstanding small boat skippers.

District Report—Lightning-like is the phrase best suited to describe the speed with which Lightning interest is developing in the Wisconsin-Minnesota area. To illustrate this, let it be recalled that two years ago there was only one Lightning boat in Milwaukee Harbor, No. 63 "Naiad", owned by C. W. Valencourt. In the 1945 sailing season the new Lightning Fleet No. 69 made its bow with six Lightnings. The season of 1946 will see not less than twenty Lightnings participating in Milwaukee's first Lightning Regatta. Indications are that there will be ten Lightnings in Fleet No. 69 and ten in Fleet No. 79.

The story of the adoption of the Lightning Class for promotion by the Milwaukee Yacht Club is interesting. Up to and including the season of 1944, "Naiad", being the only Lightning, was compelled to sail in the open class. Whenever and wherever she sailed, "Naiad" always came first, thereby capturing a large number of fine trophies. Her record came to the attention of yachtsmen everywhere, particularly to the attention of Mr. P. C. McNulty and Mr. Harry J. Ziemann of the small boat committee of the Milwaukee Yacht Club. This led to the adoption of the Lightning Class as the Club's official small boat. The rest of the story is known.

Dick Johnson, speaking for the South Shore Fleet No. 79, avers that his fleet will sail away with the honors this summer. Fleet Captain Harry Ziemann of Fleet No. 69 has other ideas. Both are agreed

there will be honor enough for all concerned and that the sailing shall be fair and friendly and high-grade.

Just a word about Milwaukee's first Lightning Regatta. *Mr. P. C. McNulty* has very generously provided an elegant trophy to be known as the P & T Lightning Trophy (P & T stands for the initials of *Patty* and *Tommy Bathke*, two of *Mr. McNulty's* youthful proteges). The legal ownership and home of the trophy will be the Milwaukee Yacht Club, but it will travel perpetually each year to the yachtsman taking first place in the regatta. Those who have seen the trophy tell me that it is one of the finest, and that it will be well worth fighting for. Any registered Lightning from anywhere may enter the Milwaukee Lightning Regatta. Date will be specified later.

Other parts of our district have shown equally intense interest although necessarily not so much activity. At a district meeting held January 25 at the City Club in Milwaukee a group of thirty Lightning sailors discussed the program for the coming year. It is especially noteworthy that four of those attending traveled two hundred miles on a cold, winter night to participate in this meeting. There should be a trophy for those making such a sacrifice of time and convenience.

Mr. Walter Roller of Neenah-Nodaway Fleet No. 67 appeared with *Mrs. Roller* giving us the benefit of their experience. *Mr. Roller* says there will be keen interest in his district this summer. *Mr. Walter Wellman* of Madison also appeared with a guest, *Mr. Cottrell*. *Mr. Wellman* says the only thing that is holding his area back is the fact that new boats are unobtainable at present.

Another meeting was held at the South Shore Yacht Club on February 8, also attended by a large number at which the sailing program and the rules were discussed. *Bob Cunningham* for Fleet No. 69 and *Bill Leptien* for Fleet No. 79 discussion leaders, acquitted themselves with eclat. LOUISIANA-ALABAMA DISTRICT

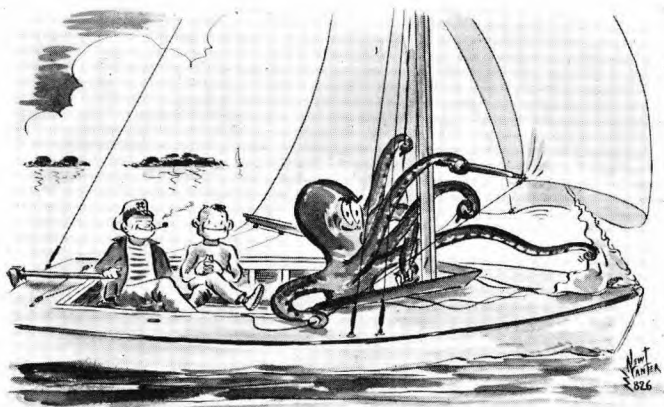

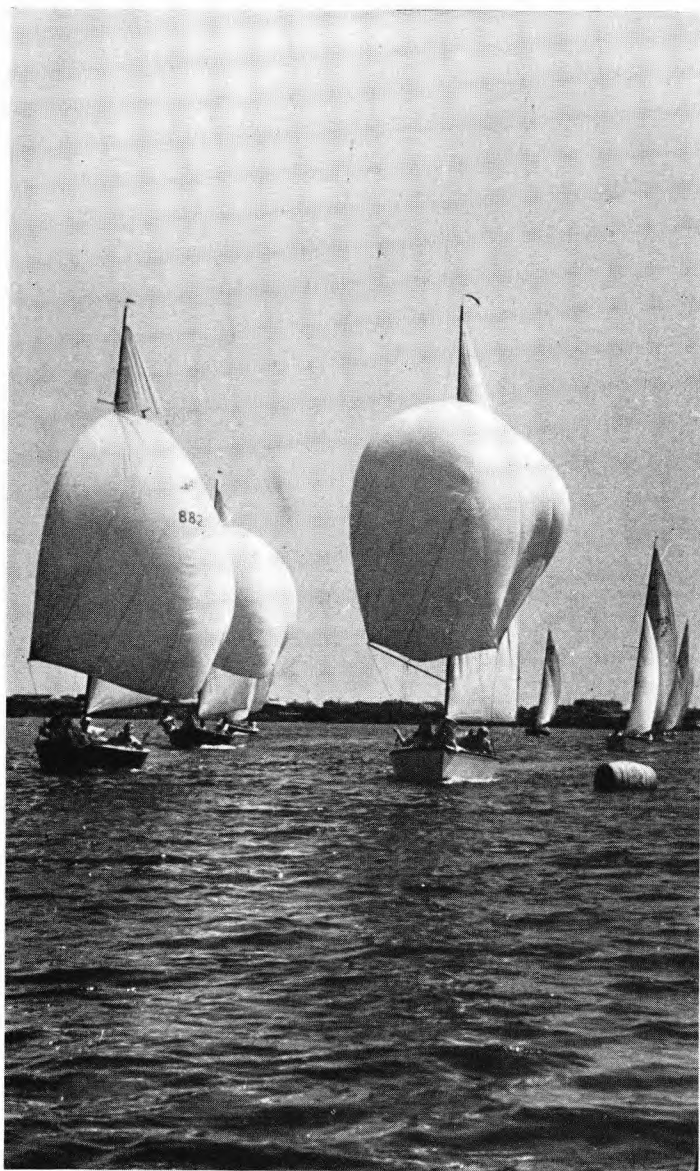

A count of sixty-seven Lightnings in the Barnegat Fleet in the late Fall, showed that it is still by far the largest in the Association and according to all reports will be further increased by the time the starting gun of the first race of 1946 is heard.

Sailing in the northern part of Barnegat Bay, half way between New York and Philadelphia, there is usually plenty of wind even in mid-summer. Winds from the southern quadrant are steadiest and strongest, west and east winds being uncertain and variable.

Eight Yacht Clubs: Bay Head, Mantoloking, Shore Acres, Lavalette, Island Heights, Ocean Gate, Toms River and Seaside comprising the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, compete for the Season's championship of the Fleet. Twenty-nine Lightnings entered this year.

The Shore Acres Yacht Club championship was won by *Carl Behler* with a perfect score. Reports of other club series have not been received at this time.

The Shore Acres Yacht Club as host held the Atlantic Coast Championship over the Shore Acres and Mantoloking courses. Our Fleet representatives, *Carl Behler*, *Louise Wells* and *Jack Orelup* won two firsts and a second but as these scores were split up between boats, the championship went back to Riverside. At the Internationals, *Carl Behler* and *Louise Wells* were unaccustomed to the light airs on the Sound and did not get in the running this year.

The preliminary schedule of races for the 1946 season shows a full program returning to pre-war conditions. Combined with the separate yacht club races, every Saturday and Sunday will be raced. This year, Saturdays will be raced in the B.B.Y.R.A. series leaving Sundays for local races. All information received points to the most interesting and active season for 1946.

In addition to the regular Barnegat Bay Races held at each of the Yacht Clubs associated with the Barnegat Bay Racing Association, there were seven Lightning class races held for the Nelson Trophy; four races were held under the auspices of the Island Heights Yacht Club and the other three under the auspices of the Ocean Gate Club. These races were started in the Spring of 1944 and are sailed at the mouth of Toms River where Toms River empties into Barnegat Bay. This is one of the best sailing spots along the Atlantic Coast. The summer of 1945 witnessed another active season in the annuals of the Riverside Yacht Club. Besides being host for the International Lightning Class Championship Regatta, the Midget Championship Regatta of the Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound, held on July 11th and 12th, was sailed in the fleet Lightnings.

Spring launching found each Lightning with a new mast, every one having been dismasted in the disastrous hurricane of 1944. *Oren M. Ragsdale's* "Rufus II" was not launched until later in the season as it had been so badly damaged in the storm that it was necessary to have it entirely rebuilt.

Scheduled for Decoration Day was the second annual Board of Governors Pierce Trophy race, a handicap event, with more than 30 boats of various types and classes entered. But a northwest wind of near gale force kept all but a few hardy skippers from starting. Again the Lightnings made a good show in the heavy going, *Jack Webb* in "Frolic" crossing the finish line first to win the race.

The regularly scheduled Lightning races were divided into three series with a good number of boats participating in each race. Included in the racing schedule were seven Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound Regattas, in each of which Riverside was well represented.

In the June series, *Andy Scholtz* in "Lord Jeff" and *Jack Webb* in "Frolic" finished in a tie for first place with *Niels Fossum* in "Phantom" placing next. The July series also wound up in a tie for first place, *Jack Webb* and *Niels Fossum* coming out on top with *Andy Scholtz* next. *Jack Webb* won a clear cut victory in the August series, with *Andy Scholtz* placing second and *Niels Fossum* third.

Jack Webb and *Andy Scholtz*, having finished in a tie for first place in the eliminations, represented the fleet at the Atlantic Coast Championship Regatta held at the Shore Acres Yacht Club on Barnegat Bay on August 4th and 5th in which they finished in a well earned tie for first place. *Andy Scholtz*, having finished ahead of *Webb* in two of the three races, was acclaimed the winner, giving *Jack Webb* a second.

In the elimination series for the Nationals, *Jack Webb* took first place with *Andy Scholtz* finishing second, thus again winning the right to represent the fleet in the International Lightning Class Championship Regatta held at the Riverside Yacht Club on September 7th, 8th, and 9th.

An all time record of 34 entries, representing 27 fleets, competed in this seventh annual championship regatta. Due to the sudden termination of gasoline rationing, twenty-five entrants brought their own boats, the other nine sailing in borrowed local boats drawn by lot. The results of this regatta were very aptly covered in "Lightning Flashes" of October 1945. The winner was *George R. Barnes*, representing Fleet No. 1 from Skaneateles, N. Y.; *Karl Smith* of Fleet No. 12 from Bay Beach, Ontario, Canada, finished second; *Earl C. Johnson*, representing Fleet No. 59 from Grand Island, New York, took third place. *Jack Webb* and *Andy Scholtz*, the Riverside entries, finished next in a tie again with the same number of points, but *Jack Webb* having finished ahead of *Scholtz* in two of the three races was awarded fourth place, giving *Andy Scholtz* a fifth.

During the 1945 season many of the Riverside Lightnings participated in the Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound Regattas, seven of which had to be sailed in order to qualify for their class championships. Only three boats from Riverside sailed in the necessary seven races to qualify, but of these, *Jack Webb* in "Frolic" won the Yacht Racing Association of Long Island Sound Lightning Class Championship with *Fred Allen* in "Sabrina" taking a third.

Jack Webb also won the Larchmont Race Week championship with six firsts out of seven starts and also won the Larchmont Junior Day Regatta.

In the Midget Championships of Long Island Sound, sailed in Riverside Lightnings, crews representing nine clubs competed, with Stamford Yacht Club winning first place and the American Yacht Club crew placing second.

On August 11th, seven Lightnings from Riverside, towed across the Sound by their "crash boat", participated at Douglaston, Long Island,

for the Douglaston Trophy. The Trenary's have also sold their "Tam" to another Larchmont skipper and are having Lightning No. 1600 built which they will call "Crest".

With a fleet of at least twenty Lightnings, including new owners and new boats, and with the possible return to active competition of Ted Maher, the 1944 Nationals champion, who has been serving in the Navy, racing during the 1946 season should prove mighty interesting with keener competition provided by other skippers through the experience gained during the past year.

The Riverside Yacht Club, whose skippers made such a creditable showing during 1945, has inaugurated a new policy with the formation of a Winter Yacht Club which will provide its members with an all year round rendezvous; and already plans are in the making for the entertainment of the visiting skippers and crews who will be competing in the Atlantic Coast Championship Regatta to be held at Riverside in 1946.

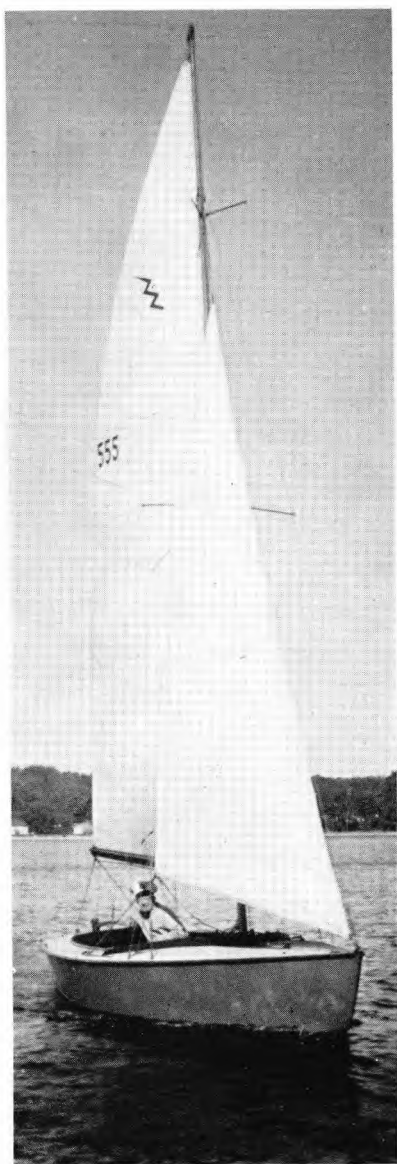

A lot of water has gone under the boats this summer; water of Lakes Erie, Ontario, Chautauqua and Long Island Sound. Wednesdays and week-ends our sailors have been busy, from May through September, sailing 66 races, 50 of them in the Lightning Class, not counting away-from-home regattas at Hamilton, Chautauqua and Riverside.

The Frost Bite Series found four hardy skippers and crews with boats fully rigged and sailing on May 26th; "Rampage", "Hurikan", "Sail-On" and "Thermis Twice". The Fleet Captain felt the weather was a bit rough and cancelled the race, but the four boats went around the course anyway. The next day the same thing happened with "Ginger", "Shine" and "Slalom" augmenting the fleet and sailing an unauthorized race. On Decoration Day with a 22-mile-an-hour wind the race was not cancelled. Four boats did not start. "Rampage" retired with a broken stay, but "Thermis Twice" and "Hurikan" finished the race. Next week-end began the Saturday Series and the Sunday (Handicap) Series. Due to the cold, inclement weather many of the boats with generous time allowances did not get into the series and missed a great opportunity. "Thermis Twice" by consistent sailing in every race, overcame her handicap and won both series, followed by "Rampage" and "Shine".

The Fourth of July Free-For-All was a beautiful sight: west wind at 8 miles per hour, sunny and warm, with twenty-one boats out for the start. Lightnings, "Thermis Twice" and "Slalom", took first and third with *Harry Care's* Knockabout, "Nan" in second place. The Wednesday Evening Series got off to a bad start with too much wind causing the first race to be cancelled. The third race was called off because of a downpour and the following Wednesday a squall hit the fleet as it rounded the Crystal Beach Buoy. Everyone doused their sails in a hurry and no upsets occurred. "Tomahawk" and "Bucko" managed to put up canvass again and finish the race. "Albatross" rode nicely to her 25-lb. anchor but "Ginger" and "Sail-On" were blown in toward shore; all were glad to see the good old Burgee heave in sight and get a line aboard (albeit with some difficulty), for the tow back to moorings.

Originally four week-ends were left open to permit the Lightning sailors to crew on other boats, take the family out for a picnic, play baseball, tennis, etc. Such a condition was not allowed to exist long. Soon a Saturday and a Sunday Stay-At-Home Series were inaugurated. Then *Adam Eby* and *Sheldon Thompson II* offered prizes for two additional series to run concurrently with the last four races of these series, owners to skip one and members (non-owners) the other. When all this mix-up was straightened out it was found that Shelley Thompson III had won the Sunday Stay-At-Home Series and good old "Thermis Twice" who incidentally did not "stay home" had won the other. *Bob Crane* had captured the owner-skipper stop watch prize and *Reg Pegrum*, the member-skipper ditto. So now with three time pieces on board, "Thermis Twice" should do some fancy starting—or maybe they will get all balled up instead, who knows?

Then came the one and only Club Championship Series which is always the supreme effort of all the sailors. Seventeen boats came out with their bottoms newly scrubbed, their gear and rigging all carefully gone over. The old maestro, *Johnny Sterns*, sailed with *Bill Hudson* on the Half Moon. Ex-Champion *Pearson* with two seasoned Knockabout sailors for crew, got "Lively Lady" into the water. Circumnavigator *Daniels* and Light Canvassman *Maythem* sailed with *Roseberry* and, of course, that triumphant trio—*Smither*, *Crane* and *Pegrum* were right on deck. The two winners were to represent B.C.C. at the Lightning Internationals. There were six races scheduled and the first one was a drifter in the broiling sun. At the end of two and one-half hours, without waiting for the Burgee to come after them, sails were dropped and crews dove into the water for that cool, inviting dip they had been longing for. Most of the boats were in tow when the inevitable breeze did come up—too late. The next race was almost a repeat performance but "Tomahawk" managed to cross the line first inside of the time limit.

Gentle winds prevailed the next week-end and "Shine" took the Saturday race. On Sunday protests filled the air; rule books were searched and charges hurled. Noteworthy was the case of "Albatross" and "Hurikan" versus Fleet Captain. After the smoke had cleared away they emerged—one good sea chantey, by name, "Bargin". On the final week-end the wind had a little more stuff in it. On Saturday afternoon when the race was almost over a violent squall hit. The leading boats had reached their moorings but "Lively Lady" and "Bucko" capsized as they were attempting to do so. "Ginger" and "Sail-On", who were within a foot or two of crossing the finish line, were literally blown from the course. The other boats managed to get their sails down and were eventually picked up by the Burgee. The final race was held in a 20-mile blow. Seven boats did not attempt to start. The race committee handed out a 1-2-1-5-1-5-1 course in spite of all the weather. "Rampage", however, found this to her liking and won the race, by four seconds. "Thermis Twice" had a high point score for the series of 76. "Slalom" was next with 65 and "Lively Lady" and "Judith" tied with 58. *Pearson* winning because he had come in ahead of *Roseberry* in three out of five races in the series. Nothing could have been more of a contrast than the weather of the first and last races. Perhaps that unpredictable quality is one of the charms that the sport holds for its devotees.

For extra curricular activities, the Canoe Club sailors went to the L.Y.R.A. at Hamilton and lost—by a dunking, won handily from Chautauqua both here and at the C.L.Y.C., enjoying the wonderful hospitality of the folks down there in September. At the Lightning District Championships "Thermis Twice" took top honors, followed by *Bill Straub's* "Cygnus" from Algonquin Club, Rochester, and *Earl Johnson's* "Olive M." from the Niagara Sailing Club.

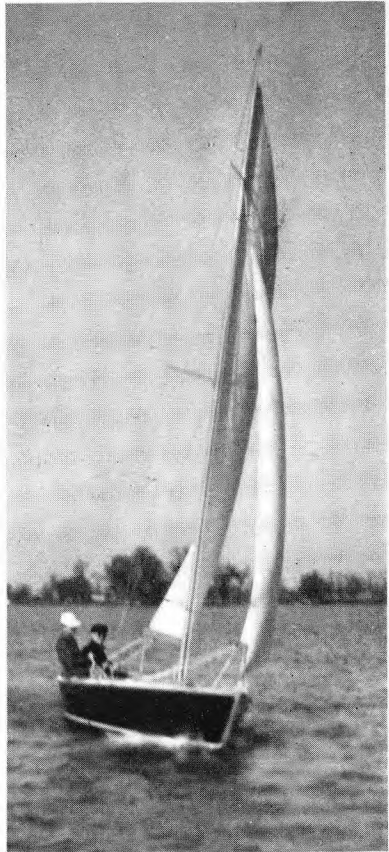

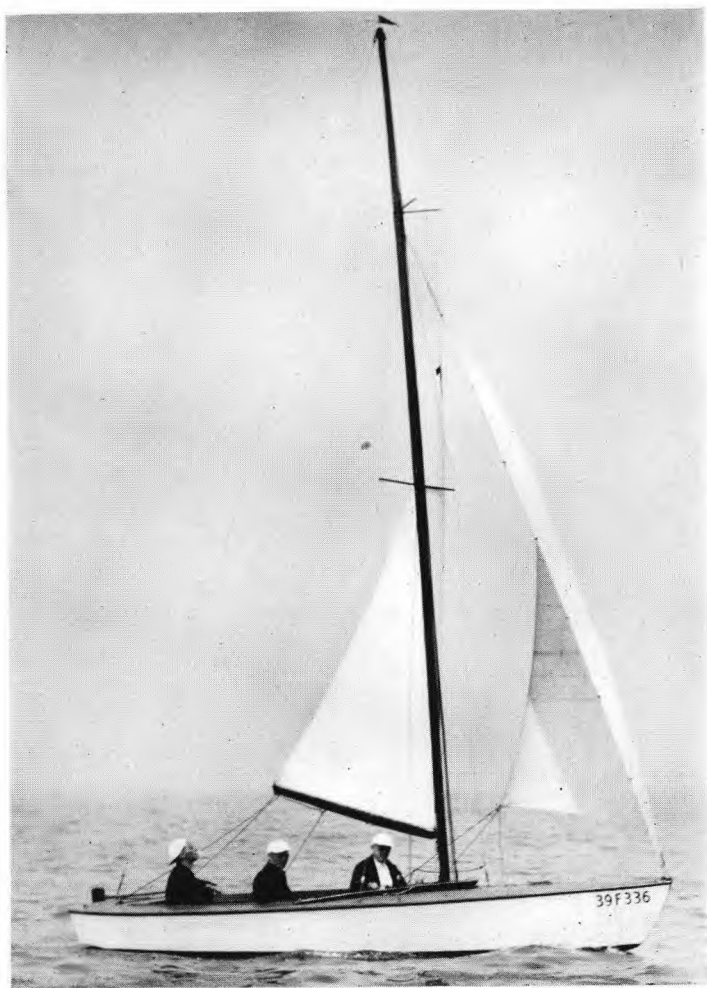

Winston Lawrence and Robert Starr, Dr. M. W. Buckborough and Curtis R. Parker have new boats on order for 1946, and it is reliably reported that other members will purchase the carload lot on order for the South Haven Marine Supply Company.

The South Haven Club takes considerable pride in the progress it has made in the interests of yachting during the short period it has been in existence. Prior to 1940, there were no facilities for boating, or for visiting yachtsmen. It might be said that conditions here gave rise to the old saw: "Any old port in a storm". While the club is resting on no laurels, it has enlarged the facilities of the club house, installed a

hoist capable of handling small boats, acquired a lease on adjoining property for parking facilities, and another lease on 324 feet of river frontage to the West of and adjoining the club house, where it expects to have new revetments built for use this year.

Club membership is now close to 130, and attendance is so enthusiastic that it has become necessary to limit approval of new membership applications to boat owners.

The regular racing schedule for 1945 called for 12 races, divided into two sections of 6 each. The first series was won by the "Joy", followed by the "Chip" and "Dorsey". The second series was again easily won by the "Joy", followed by the "Breeze" and the "Chip". After the points were totaled, it appeared that the "Chip" and "Dorsey" were tied for second, whereupon the "Chip" won the play off, and the "Dorsey" dropped to third. Points were close enough all through the season to make every race interesting. Some of the races this year were sailed in real blows, and only those familiar with the fine performance of Lightnings would believe the extent of punishment they can take.

On June 24th, an exchange race was held at the LaPorte Yacht Club, LaPorte, Indiana. The clubs raced as teams, in boats furnished by the LaPorte club. South Haven was fortunate in taking 1st, 2nd and 4th, winning the event by a comfortable margin. *Bill Hover* and *Len Ladenburger* were 1st and 2nd, *Balsar Ludwig* 3rd, and *Eddie Smith* 4th, by a nose. A return race was attempted at South Haven, but Lake Michigan weather being what it is, a good sunburn was the only result. We have high hopes of a return engagement for next year, and put forth the thought that there is no better way to make new friends or have a better time than in inter-club class racing.

July 27th, 28th and 29th was the highlight of the year, with the Fifth Annual Lake Michigan District Regatta at South Haven. This was the largest district regatta ever held in the history of the Lightning Class Association, with 23 Lightnings entered, fifteen of which were brought in by trailers, representing 12 fleets in all. *Walter Vogel*, of the Toledo Lightning Fleet, sailing "Rambler Too", No. 949, took first with 65 points; *Len Ladenburger*, the defending champion, of South Haven Yacht Club, sailing "Joy", No. 753, took second with 63 points, and *Gene Howard*, of the Detroit River Fleet, sailing "Thunderbolt", No. 886, took third with 59 points. That made it close enough for any one. The annual event will be sailed this year at Toledo again and competition promises to be exciting. A full report of the regatta will be found in the August 1945 issue of LIGHTNING FLASHES.

The Commodore Cup Series was finished September 23rd, with the "Chip", "Dorsey" and "Cassie" placing in the order given. In all fairness, it should be stated that the "Joy" did not enter this series. Incidentally it might also be remarked that the little matter of the "Joy" taking most of the firsts around these parts had caused no little consternation and much dark planning. Watch out this year *Len*!

South Haven has a rather unique series at the end of each year, giving a cup to the skipper who beats his season's average by more points than any other contestant. The series was won this year by Fleet Captain *Jack Nixon*, with the "Lark", No. 336.

The Junior Yacht Club had an intensely active year in 1945. The Club is headed by *Jack Nixon Jr.*, Commodore; *Lester Pond Jr.*, Vice Commodore; *Kathryn Overton*, Rear Commodore, and *Grace Lawrence*, Sec'y.-Treas. One night each week the club is open to junior members only, and no invitations or reminders are ever needed. If the weather permits (it never stopped them yet, although the senior advisers have—SISSIES) they race the local boats with full crews of five or six plus

one adult, and turn in some remarkable performances. Great plans are afoot for the present season, and at least two local boats will be skippered this year by junior members. An instruction course will be given at the beginning of the year.

Our most sincere thanks are again extended to the Local United States Coast Guard. Their constant diligence adds much to the security of sailing in our unprotected waters.

Racing conditions at Devil's Lake this year were practically perfect with only one Sunday on which the time limit had to be extended. Competition was keen, and most of the skippers were on hand for each race, in spite of gas rationing. Fleet No. 32 had a banner year with interest starting in February with the purchase of 12 boats. This "addition to our family" of five boats, which constituted the fleet at the end of the previous season, offered the impetus needed and purchasers were found for most of the second hand Lightnings that came on the market in this area—so that by June 1st, we had a grand fleet of 26 or 27 boats with *Burr Jenkins* still to get delivery of his "Lolo". The infection is still spreading because at this time—February 1st—we have forty boats delivered or on order for May delivery and there is a real possibility of having a class of 75-100 Lightnings at the starting line for Larchmont Race Week. This of course includes entries from Riverside, Oyster Bay, Hewlett and Douglaston. There will certainly be hot competition for that trophy and the Y.R.A. Championship this summer with the field wide open. With several splended skippers from other classes buying Lightnings there will be sharp racing all season with an occasional fleet trip to add general interest to the program that is being arranged by the Race Committee with *Paul Ryan*, Chairman.

Last summer we had racing every Saturday and Sunday from early June until September 24th with the season split into three series. This year we plan two series of eight weekends each with any six races counting in the scoring of each series. In this way a skipper could miss two weekends of each series, without losing his position. A long dis-

tance race is planned about twenty-five miles and some of the hardier skippers are talking about joining the overnight races that are sailed each summer in Long Island Sound.

Fleet Champion was 15 year old *Steve Carr* in "Nola", helped by two years more experience than the other skippers had and he also won very lovely trophies donated by *Drake Sparkman* and *Mr. Caldwell* for a series of three Labor Day weekend races and a Race Week event of special arrangement respectively.

Albert Eckhardt Jr. (age 13) was second in points at the end of the 1st and 2nd series and with *Steve Carr* represented Fleet No. 32 at the Atlantic Coast Championships at Bayhead, New Jersey in August and at the International Championships at Riverside, Conn., in September. *Paul Forsman, Jr.*, also 13, was runner-up in total points for the three series and he also won Manhasset Bay Race Week.

The Fleet is developing a fine group of young skippers—among them the 13 year old veteran of three seasons, *Albert O'Neal Jr.* who finished close to the top last year. Then there is *Mike Smith* who won a trophy for Freshman (first year) sailors, *Paul Ryan Jr.*, *Frank Purcell* and *Barbara Bowler*, all of whom will be well up in future competition.

Junior Racing activity was stepped up last year and members of the Fleet turned their boats over to Skipper *Allen* for use in races held by the Junior Sailing Class, sponsored by the Larchmont Yacht Club. There were 90 youngsters in this class from 9-14 and we are sure their interest in boats of their own will be most favorably directed to Lightnings, because of this program.

Fleet No. 32 has been regally treated in all their contacts with other fleets—we are remembering particularly the hospitality given our entries at Bayhead and Riverside last year and the grand day of racing at Douglaston when our delightful hosts were members of Fleet No. 55. There is nothing we would like more than to win one of these events, so that we might have the opportunity of being hosts to these friends of ours—as well as the fun of looking back as we crossed the finish line. Until then however, we offer a hearty welcome to any skippers who are planning to compete in Larchmont Race Week, and we will be happy to arrange accommodations for them in the homes of members of our fleet.

Winter meetings are being held for the purpose of keeping together, and welcoming new members—hearing talks by such racing experts as *Alex Gest*, *Phil Patton* and *Arthur Knapp*, on Rules of the Road, Racing Rules and Racing Tactics. We had a gala January meeting when pictures of the 1945 International Championships were shown and all signs point to another season of real fun and heady racing competition.

There was more sailing and less racing on the part of the boats of Fleet No. 35 in the season just closed, than ever before down here on White Rock Lake. There were a few "impromptus" which were a lot of fun, but due to the fact the occasions were few when as many as three skippers could hit the line the same day the "official competition" was nil. You see, it requires one hundred percent turn out to furnish the required three boats for legal mayhem! The 1945 season was started on Memorial Day with twelve boats. Races were held every Sunday and holiday through Labor Day. There were 17 races scheduled for the season; due to bad weather six races were cancelled.

Fleet 39 entered two boats in the Atlantic and International Championship regattas. The boats were skippered by *Joe Jova* and *Dr. T. M. Proctor*. During the race on July 8th a thunderstorm hit us, causing two boats skippered by *Fred Roberts* and *Capt. F. Drake* to capsized. Thanks to *Capt. H. Secor* and *Capt. H. Yarrington* who went to the rescue with their cruisers there were no casualties.

On Aug. 26th Fleet 39 was host to High-Tor Fleet 41 who came up the river with seven Lightnings to challenge us for the Hudson River Championship.

The race started with 18 boats with a brisk wind blowing and continued to blow hard during the race. Six boats were disabled and did not finish. The first three boats to cross the line were Chelsea boats piloted by *Joe Jova* 1st, *H. Abreu* 2nd, and *Bob Astone* 3rd.

On Sept. 26th High-Tor played host to Fleet 39 in a return match at Grassy Point. We had to call on the power boat sailors *Capt. H. Secor*, *H. Yarrington*, *Dale Cooper* and *Al Emory*, to tow our Lightnings 30 miles down the river and are grateful to them for the wonderful trip we had.

Fleet 39 entered seven Lightnings and all twenty boats started in perfect sailing weather. High-Tor turned the tables on us by winning. The first three boats to finish were *Doc Myles* "Fleet 41" 1st, *M. Pedersen* "Fleet 41" 2nd, and *Joe Jova* "Fleet 39" 3rd.

At the end of the season four boats changed ownership. The "Aloha" No. 818 was sold to *C. L. Walker*, Beacon, N. Y., the "Green Hornet" No. 569 was sold to *Lee L. Fenbert*, Balmville, Newbergh, N. Y., "Betty" No. 744 to *William Menzler, Jr.*, Glenham, N. Y., and "Tumblin' Weed" No. 1308 to *Edward W. Dacus*, Beacon, N. Y. All four boats will sail with Fleet No. 39.

Plans for the coming season are about the same as previous years with the first race being on Memorial Day and races on Sundays and holidays

through Labor Day. At the present time plans are being made to have a series of three races at Chelsea, Grassy Point, and Haverstraw for the championship of the Hudson Valley.

High-Tor Fleet No. 41, located at Stony Point-on-Hudson, had an active year. Through the medium of our fleet, interest in sailing on the lower Hudson River has greatly increased and there is definite prospect of further immediate and long term gain.

We are very proud that our own "*Doc*" *Myles*, with the help of two (of his four) daughters, took 6th place in the Internationals held at Riverside, Conn. on September 7, 8, and 9, 1945. In the first of the three races "*Doc*" placed a neat third.

Through the winter of 1944-5 six new Lightnings were constructed by six of the Fleet members, and five of those new boats sailed during the season.

It was a poor racing season on the whole, particularly during the month of July when the weather was very stormy. In August, however, real activity commenced and there were then a number of races.

Two of our crews went to Shore Acres for the Atlantic Coast Lightning Class Championships on August 4th and 5th. "*Doc*" *Myles* and his two racing daughters constituted one crew, and the other was *Warren Basley* assisted by *Fred Provan* and *Euclid Ganson*.

The earliest important local race was held on August 19th when the Lightnings and other sailing craft were the guests of the Haverstraw Yacht Club. There was a free-for-all race covering about 6.2 miles in Haverstraw Bay. It was a good racing day and approximately 20 boats competed. Lightning No. 1010, the "*Lepracaun*", owned and skippered by "*Doc*" *Myles*, won this race and Lightning No. 1213, the "*Storm King*", owned and skippered by "*Pete*" *Pedersen*, was second.

On August 26th a number of our Fleet raced at Chelsea. Storm warnings had been posted before the race, and during the race there was wind of moderate gale proportions. Skipper *Jova* of the Chelsea Fleet led all boats over the finish line and *Fred Provan* took the honors among our own Fleet. In spite of the bad weather, our members had an exceedingly good time. One of the high spots was the delicious meal that was served. The Chelsea boys are truly hospitable and entertained us royally.

The next local race of wide-spread interest was that sponsored by one of our Fleet members, "*Bill*" *Sutherland* of Grassy Point, who offered a beautiful trophy made by himself for the winner (three times) of a race from Stony Point to Nyack, a distance of about 13 miles. This race, in which about 18 boats participated, was run on Sunday, September 2.

On Labor Day, September 3, a Regatta at Nyack was sponsored by the Nyack Boat Club. There were approximately 25 boats that competed in the free-for-all that day. On a six-mile triangular course the Lightning "*Storm-King*", skippered by "*Pete*" *Pedersen*, took first place and No. 486, "*We One*", owned and skippered by *Carl Ball*, was second.

The wind-up of the racing season was held at Stony Point on September 16th. Practically all Fleet members participated as well as a number of boats from Chelsea Fleet. There were two free-for-all races. The morning race was around a three-mile triangular course and the afternoon race was twice around the same course. About 20 boats participated in each race. The morning race was won by "*Pete*" *Pedersen* with Skipper *Jova* from Chelsea taking second place. *Fred Provan*, sailing his boat No. 569, "*Hope III*" came in third in the race or second among our own Fleet. In the afternoon race "*Doc*" *Myles*, sailing the "*Lepracaun*" won first place and "*Pete*" *Pedersen* in his "*Storm King*" won second place.

The winner in points for the racing during the entire season was "Pete" Pedersen of Nyack with 38 points and the runner-up was "Doc" Myles from Stony Point with 33 points.

The racing schedule for the 1946 season has not yet been adopted. Already much interest centers in a proposed Hudson River trophy which will stimulate racing among all the River Fleets.

At a meeting of High-Tor Fleet held at Nyack on October 18, 1945, the Fleet gave its approval to the formation of a new Fleet at Nyack with our own Nyack members forming the nucleus. This is evidence of the growing interest in sailing on the Hudson.

(Editor's Note). By this time you will all agree that the High-Tor Fleet holds the record in attendance of having the largest mid-season gathering. Yes, we are referring to the fleet's annual dinner dance held at Bear Mountain Inn on February 2, 1946 with 304 present to participate in the evening's events.

Throughout the winter the Toledo Fleet held monthly meetings at which plans were formulated for the entire sailing season and summer found each skipper literally whizzing through the most rigorous schedule of his remembrance. The official program consisted of 19 series races, two of which were long distance races, one held at night,

and four of which were special regattas held at other clubs in the vicinity. In addition to this treadmill of activities, several of the skippers managed to attend the Michigan District Regatta at South Haven, Michigan, the International Championship Regatta at Riverside, Connecticut, and practically the entire fleet participated in the Inter-Lake Regatta held in August at Put-in-Bay, Ohio.

The official fleet racing started on the second week-end in June, with the Toledo Yacht Club sponsored Frostbite Sweepstakes Regatta. Placing one and two in the Lightning Class of this three race event were *Walt Swindeman* in "Yankee Doodle", *Walt Vogel* in "Rambler Too", while *Art Burtcher* and *Cal Yaudas* tied in points for third place. The races held previous to the Frostbite Sweepstakes were regarded as unofficial or tune-up races in order to give the several new skippers ample time to complete their extensive fitting-out programs.

Official races this season were held in the afternoon with an eye to the possibility that there being a critical shortage of crewmen it might be easier to snag onlookers for crews in the afternoon hours. Even so, there was frequently some scrambling around just before race time to get a complete crew in every boat. The fleet had imposed a stiff penalty upon any skipper racing with fewer than three people in a boat and automatic disqualification was the fate of anyone racing with more than three.

At-home-races were sailed twice around a 3½ mile course laid out in Maumee Bay. Since every week-end and holiday from the Frostbite Sweepstakes in June to the last day of September was reserved for a particular event, there was little opportunity for postponements, the result being that the fleet sailed its races regardless of the weather. Race Committee Chairman *Clarence Crites*, acquired the name of "Simon Legree Twice Around Clarence", for though he had to sit in an open boat perhaps in driving rain, boiling sun or chilling cold, the fleet sailed that course twice around.

The Little Mills Race, the fleet's annual night race, was this year lengthened from a ten mile race to approximately twenty-five miles. Fine weather prevailed and *Walt Swindeman* romped home in "Yankee Doodle" to capture the beautiful new mahogany punch bowl presented this year to the fleet by T. Y. C. member, *Bob Mills*. *Walt Vogel* in "Rambler Too" placed second and *Bob Trost* in "Wahoo" was third.

A new race inaugurated this summer by the Toledo Fleet was the Long Distance Race held on Labor Day and sponsored by T.Y.C. member, *Bud Kraemer*, who presented the fleet with a beautiful silver loving cup for the event. The more than 30 miles sailed for this trophy were for the most part in unsheltered waters, but again the fleet was blessed by fair weather and the new Long Distance Race was pronounced a huge success. *Art Burtcher* in "Nicki Too" captured the honor of holding the cup for the first time while *Vi McMenemin* in "Butch Too" finished second and *Cal Yaudas* in "Zig Zag" struggled to a valiant third with a broken rudder.

Fleet 42 sent two entries to the Michigan District Championship Regatta, one of which returned victorious. *Walt Vogel* in "Rambler Too" brought the trophy to Toledo with two firsts and a fifth, beating out former champion *Len Ladenburger*, who finished second. The other Toledo entry, *Cal Yaudas* in "Zig Zag" finished fourth, but it was generally conceded that the "Zig Zag" had one of the most colorful crews at the regatta and that they could definitely sing the loudest and longest.

The goal of every skipper is to qualify for the International Championship Races and this year *Walt Swindeman* won the honor to repre-

sent Toledo Fleet No. 42. *Walt* selected two other top flight skippers as his crew. *Walt Vogel* and *Art Burtcher*. By the time that this is printed every Lightning skipper in the country will be aware of the good account they gave of themselves and how, but for an unfortunate stroke of fate, they would have copped the championship. Needless to say, those at home were disappointed in the outcome but if anyone cares to start a friendly argument, just try to convince any Toledo skipper that *Walt Swindeman* isn't the best in the country. He was welcomed home with as much acclaim as if he had won the championship. To Fleet 42 he is the uncrowned champion.

The Inter-Lake Yachting Association's Fifty-First Annual Regatta held at Put-In-Bay, Ohio, was attended this year by seven Toledo Lightning skippers and several Lightnings came from other clubs to make a class of twelve. The I.L.Y.A. Regatta is a much looked forward to event by all who have ever attended but this year, much to the disappointment of the small boat sailors, the Monday morning of the first race found them confronted with a whumping northeaster. Most of the Lightning skippers ventured out to the starting line but only four of the hardiest decided to tackle the race. On Tuesday the gale was even stiffer so by mutual agreement and through special arrangements with the Race Committee, the Lightnings all remained at their docks. Two races were sailed on Wednesday, one on the regular 9 mile course and a quick one on the $4\frac{1}{2}$ mile course. The Toledo Fleet representatives captured the honors of the Regatta, *Walt Swindeman* taking first place in his "Yankee Doodle", *Cal Yaudas* second place in "Zig Zag" and *Bob Trost* third place in "Wahoo". The next three places fell also to Toledo Fleet members. As a matter of interest it might be here noted that three of the Lightnings sailing the 9 mile course on Monday beat the established record for that course. On Wednesday morning they beat their own record for the same course and on Wednesday afternoon the Lightnings beat the $4\frac{1}{2}$ mile course record.

Now that the war has ended we hope to greet many more Lightning skippers at future I.L.Y.A. Regattas.

The Fleet's annual meeting and banquet was held on November 10th. We were honored by the attendance of National Association President, *Len Ladenburger* and *Mrs. Ladenburger*, National Association Secretary-Treasurer, *Ed McCain* and *Mrs. McCain*. Honorary Commodore *Ted Siferd* and *Mrs. Siferd* were also invited but were unable to be present. Several of the fleet's benefactors were also invited guests and to them on behalf of the fleet, *Captain Cal Yaudas* extended honorary memberships to Fleet No. 42 for their generosity and help in backing the fleet. The fleet trophies were presented to their winners at this meeting, *Walt Swindeman* receiving the Fleet Championship with 299 points for the series as well as his other triumphs. *Art Burtcher* placed second in fleet standings with 280.75 points and *Walt Vogel* third with 272.75 points.

Election of fleet officers for 1946 was held at this meeting. *Walt Vogel* was made the new Fleet Captain and *Harry Williams* the new Secretary-Treasurer.

Gerry Garinger, who recently purchased the "Jean S" No. 120 from *Ted Siferd* was welcomed into the fleet and it is hoped and expected that some of our fleet members still absent in the Service will be back with us next spring.

Needless to say Fleet 42 is eagerly looking forward to holding the Michigan District Championship Regatta next summer. Plans for this event will be completed at the Annual Michigan District Winter Meeting on January 20th. This will also be held at the Toledo Yacht Club with Lightning Fleet No. 42 acting as hosts.

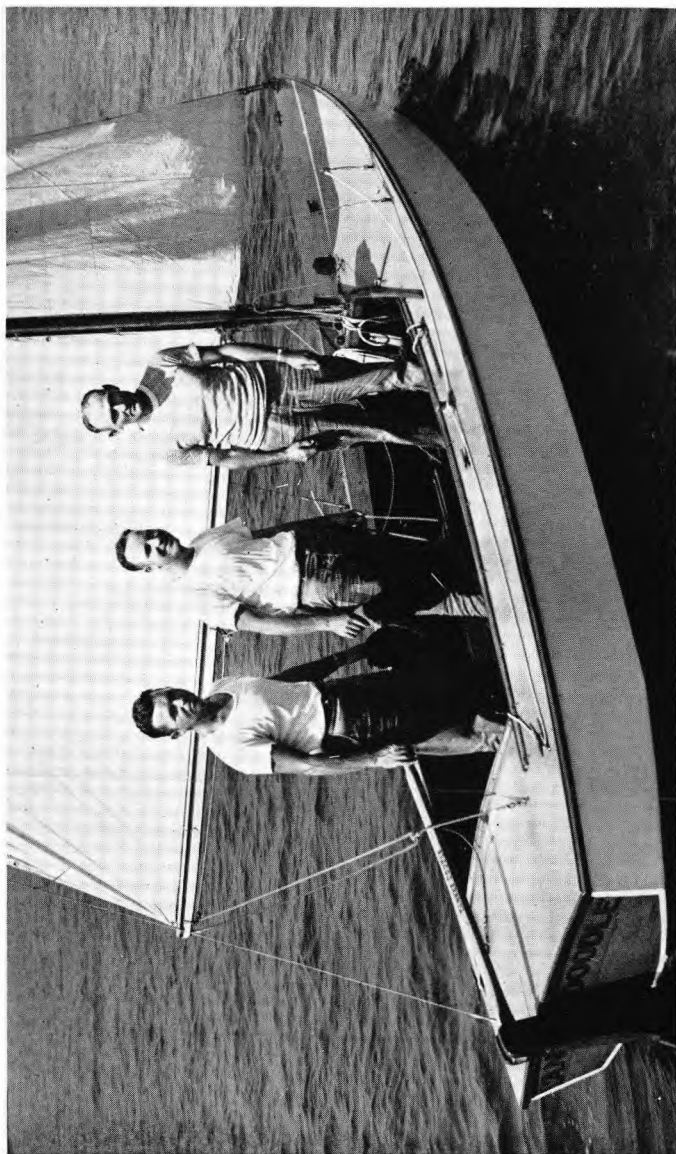

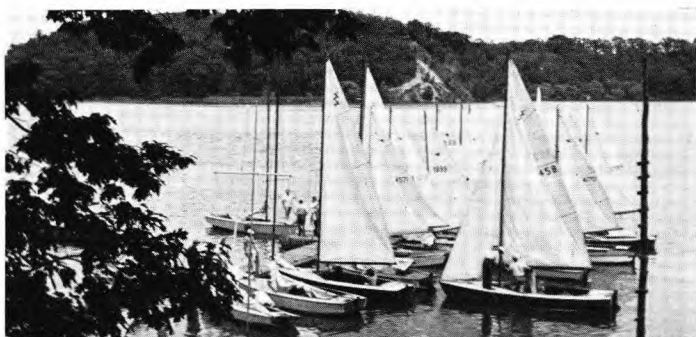

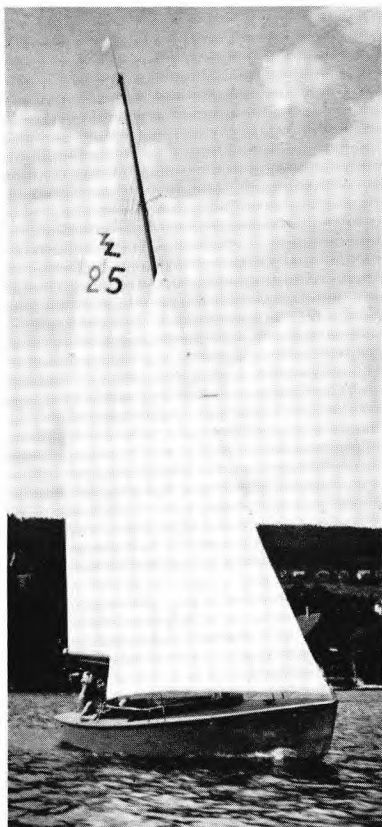

(Editor's Note) Soon after the war was ended we received a letter dated November 26, 1945, signed by *G. 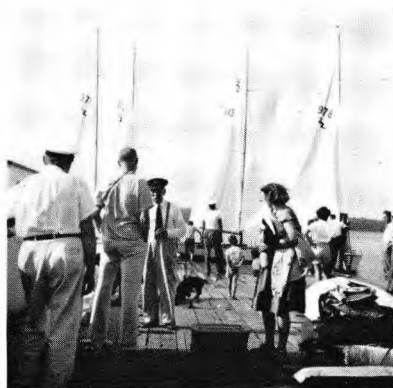

As the breezes on the Ohio are usually best in Spring and in Fall, it was decided to have two series of races during the 1945 Season. Jack Siekmann, one of our younger skippers, with "mom" and "pop" *Siekmann* as crew, stepped out with two firsts and two seconds. *Jack* kept "Heljak" in the lead until he left Cincinnati for the summer. "Pop" *Siekmann* couldn't quite keep up the pace. *Doc Barnes* in "Blue Peter" finally won the series while *Frank Pfefferle* in "Zefr" was runner-up.

Doc Barnes with *Jack Siekmann* and *John Hoge* did a swell job at the Internationals at Riverside, Connecticut, finishing tenth out of thirty-four boats. We are mighty proud of *Doc's* showing at his first try in the "Big Time."

Cincinnati was also represented at the Lake Michigan District Regatta at South Haven by *Doc Barnes* and *Frank Pfefferle*. As gas rationing was still in effect they sailed borrowed boats and made a very creditable showing.

After trying to outsmart the light breezes at South Haven and Riverside, our sailors returned home feeling that the Ohio River with all its difficulties isn't such a bad place to sail after all.

Lightning sailors again demonstrated that they know how to handle a "big" boat. Six of our skippers chartered the 50-foot yawl "Truant" out of Chicago. The first day out light breezes turned into a 50 mile an hour gale. After a 20 hour run the boys pulled into Sheboygan where the Coast Guard was flying storm signals. The real thrill was a three gun salute from the Sheboygan Yacht Club for being the only boat to venture out. During the remainder of the two-week cruise "Truant" logged 900 miles.

Our Fall racing series was not quite up to par because we had some fairly high water with a current of three to five miles an hour. Quite a few of the skippers took cruises 40 to 50 miles up the river. We also had some swell parties on the Club Boat.

Our Club Boat, a 15' by 56' Houseboat, came very close to disappearing beneath the waves of the beautiful Ohio during the winter. The hull was in pretty bad shape so we had a new one built. We were planning to beach the boat during a period of high water and transfer the superstructure to the new hull. On the first rise the river did not get quite high enough and on beaching the boat she came down on a three foot diameter log, punching a six foot hole through the bottom. This called for some wild scrambling to patch the hull from the inside before the next rise of the river. There were some anxious days during the rise, but with three pumps in action we kept her afloat and set her down adjacent to the new hull. Lady Luck was with us as Ole Man River was down for several weeks.

Two weeks of preparation got the boat into shape for moving. Sunday, February 10th, was the crucial day. The job of transferring the 20 ton superstructure to the new hull had to be done in one day. With the help of all club members, families, relatives, and friends, we did it. Monday came the rain. Tuesday, up came the river. Lo and behold! She was afloat. Tuesday nite was the annual club banquet and awarding of trophies. All heaved a sigh of relief and really had a grand time. A fitting climax for an eventful season.

From here the 1946 season looks as though it will be the best ever. We will have three new Lightnings, making a fleet of twelve. With ten active boats racing and former fleet champions, *Paul Manning* and *Truman Young*, back from the Service, we expect some real competition.

Fleet 65 was chartered in February 1945 as soon as materials were assured to complete No. 1387. We had hoped to be the first Canadian Fleet, but understand from *Len Ladenburger* that Maple Bay, B. C. beat us in by a few hours.

We had planned to run in A and B series of midweek and weekend races, but due to unavoidable delays, No. 1387 was not completed until late July, so we had to be content with one series of six races.

On July 20th, boats No. 799 and No. 1020 were trucked to the Pointe Claire Yacht Club on Lake St. Louis where the largest regatta in the Montreal area was held, a total of about 50 boats. SPECIAL REMINDER

Report any unregistered Lightning to the Association immediately and urge the owner of the unnumbered boat to apply for registration at once. Attention is directed to Article XIV of the By-Laws: "The enforcement of Class rules is essential to the protection of all owners in a one-design class. Members are required to report to the Association any race held for the Lightning Class as such, wherein Class rules are not respected and enforced by the organization conducting it or where entries of ineligible yachts are knowingly accepted. A member who makes himself a party to such a practice by knowingly and after due warning, entering such outlawed events shall himself be subject to suspension."

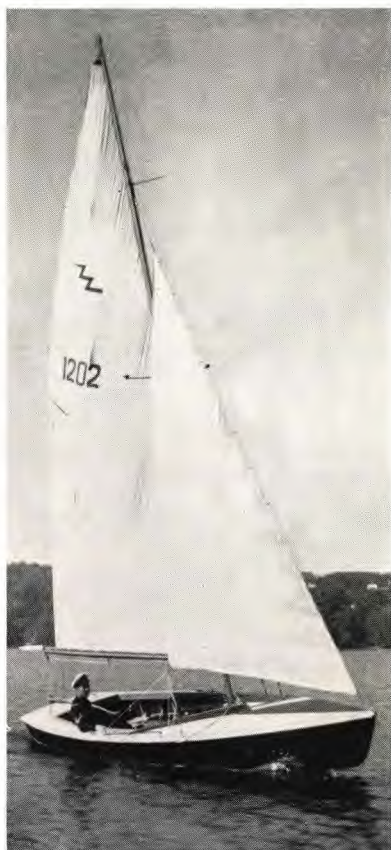

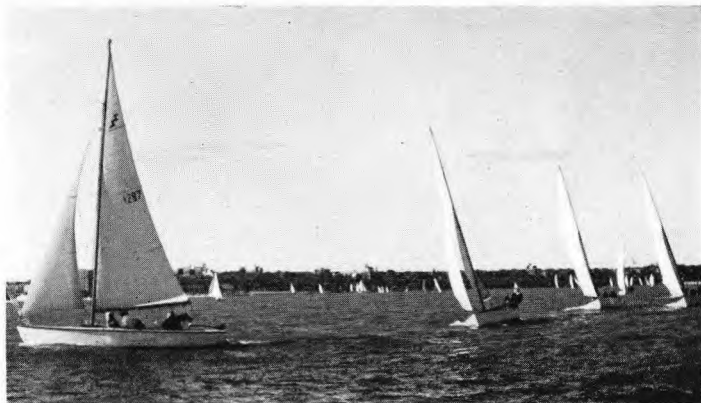

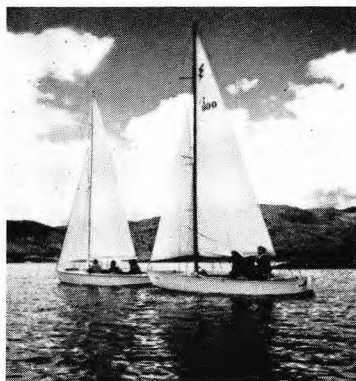

The Decatur Fleet was organized this winter after the sailing season so there are no fleet race results to report for 1945.

The Fleet is associated with Commodore Decatur Yacht Club, made up of the families who own 50 of Decatur's 75 sailboats. 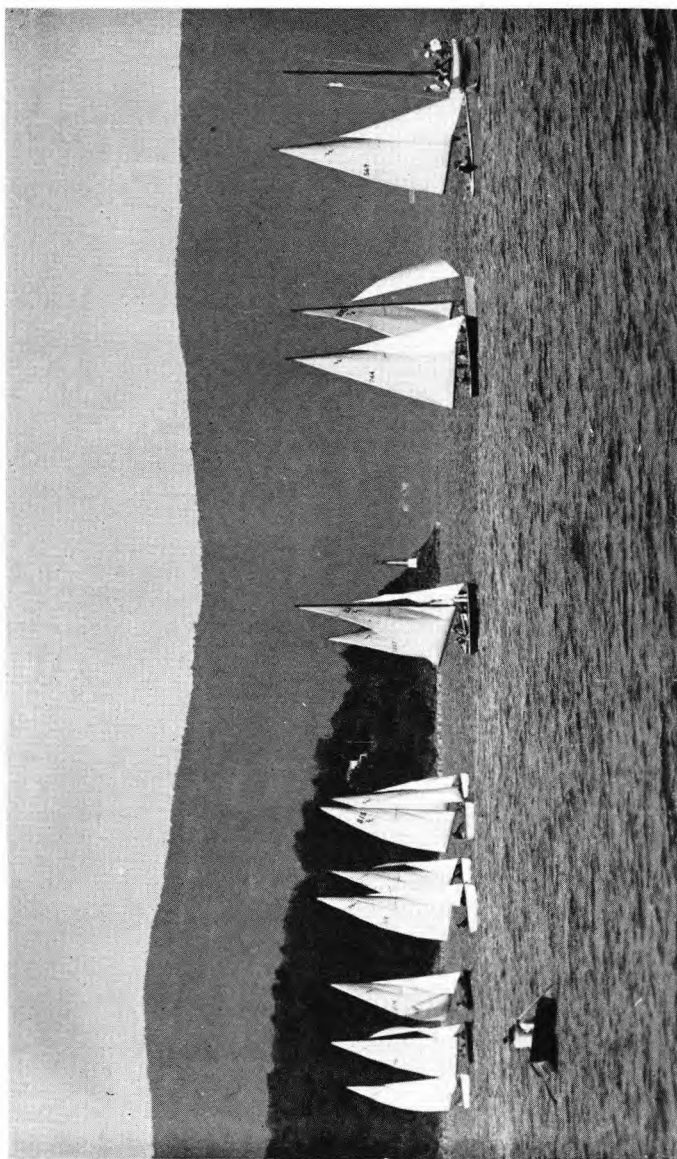

ARTICLE I

Fleet Business and Meetings

1. The Annual Meeting of each Fleet shall be held not later than December 1st of each year, and results of election of Fleet officers shall be filed with the Association.

ARTICLE III

Renewal of Charter

1. Each Fleet is required to file an annual report with the Association during January of each year in order to renew its rights and privileges under its charter.

ARTICLE IV

Reports and Returns (Penalties)

1. If the annual report of fleet or annual dues and registrations of members has not been received by the Association on or before March 1st they become automatically suspended. In the case of new fleets the same applies upon demand.

EAST AFRICA

The following is a letter received from *Michael Helps*, 16-year-old son of *E. H. Helps*, O.B.E. P.O. Box 284, Dar es Salaam, Tanganyika Territory, East Africa, dated January 28th, 1946.

"Dear Parent Lightning:

"A perusal of the 1945 Year Book shows that we are the first Lightning in East Africa, or in all Africa for that matter.

"This new Lightning is No. 1207 and we've called her 'Umeme' which is the East African native (or Ki-Swahili) word for Lightning. (Ki-Swahili is the lingua franca for East Africa and is understood from Port Said to Mozambique). Our craft has only just been completed and we've been sailing her a mere three weeks. But she's beautiful, whether in the protected waters of the Dar es Salaam Harbour or further out in the Indian Ocean. We haven't been able to conform with specifications exactly because of lack of materials, due to war demands in this equatorial hothouse.

"In case you're interested, here is the 'gen' about No. 1207:

"Hull: Maninga (a local hardwood which isn't as bad as it sounds).

"Bottom frames: Teak.

"Mast: Oregon Pine.

"We are at the moment using rope lashings for our stays but are having some copper and brass home-made turnbuckles made within a week or so.

"Sail-cloth is unobtainable so we are using a fairly heavy 'Americani', the local name of coarse calico, until we can get the proper article.

"The stay wire is 1/4" steel rope, which will do us for awhile.

"As yet we have no spinnaker, but that's coming too!

"Now for my opinion of the Lightning, as I find her. I have raced twice in a mixed crowd of boats, ranging from a 27' yawl to an 11' 'Moth' class yacht. Although I am a very inexperienced racing skipper,

I've managed to bring the 'Lightning' in 6th and 5th, respectively, which shows that she is fast, as a good few of the local boats are much larger and carry more sail than we do. The speed, comfort and maneuverability of the Lightning are my main reason for being 'nuts' about her. As yet we have not had time to get her in perfect trim, but she is still the tops. When putting about we have to be careful because she snaps from one tack to the other almost too quickly! Running before the wind, she's the fastest boat in our small Club of 23 mixed yachts. Of course, when the larger boats put up a Genoa jib, we get beaten, but not by much!

"One fault, and only one: in a choppy sea she pounds terribly. She comes off each wave with a nasty thud, and I am wondering when the bottom is going to come through! It's rotten luck for us, this pounding, because we have a very narrow harbour entrance and when the current is against the wind we invariably have a nasty chop. Apart from this fault, the Lightning is an extremely good little boat and we like to spend a Sunday at an island five miles out when we get time to spare.

"This reminds me of a suggestion I wish to make concerning a slight alteration of the plans. We do a lot of work with a fairly heavy (30 lbs.) anchor, which is stowed out of the way under the fore-deck. As a result, every time we want to anchor, some poor bloke has to crawl under the decking to struggle with this cumbersome load. When this has to happen the lucky one is inclined to develop un-Lightning-like feelings toward 'Umeme', so I should like to ask permission to install a small hatch in the fore-deck. The specifications only allow an after hatch for use of an outboard motor. Well, we'll never use an outboard because we hate 'em! So we are wondering if we could move the hatch about 15 feet further forward. It would certainly help us a lot and some other owners of Lightnings might appreciate it too.

"By the way, in this letter I refer to No. 1207 as 'the Lightning'. We call it that because we are the only one around. As a matter of fact, about 4 or 5 other yachtsmen are thinking about building Lightnings, so we may have quite a Fleet here soon."

ENGLAND

H. B. Guppy of Wallasey, Cheshire, England, built his Lightning No. 1376 "Sampan" on board the S. S. Samforth while serving in the British Merchant Navy. It took him exactly six months to build her, and with the help of the Captain they made by hand practically everything needed in the way of fittings, etc. His mainsail and jib were made in Montivideo of suiting material he bought in Bombay. His spinnaker out of an old Ratsey and Lapthorn (of Cowes, England) sail, by a sailmaker and boat builder in Skippergraten, Oslo, who had an old sail stowed away in his loft.

Guppy's letters are always welcome, full of humor; and we praise him for his unbounded determination to own a Lightning.

HAWAII

C. Hutton Smith of Honolulu kept our regatta films "hot" during the time they were in his care. He is the proud owner of No. 1675 and hopes to have a Fleet Charter within a short time. He was instrumental in getting *Jens J. C. Schultz* of Honolulu to purchase plans for No. 1582 and the purchase of plans by *R. M. Southgate*, for No. 1460.

INDIA

W. L. Campbell of Ohio couldn't leave for Calcutta without some project in mind. He believes the time is ripe for starting sailing as a

sport there, so he took along plans for No. 1689 with the promise to send a picture of his boat upon completion, including some Indian background.

ILLINOIS

Charles F. Cooney, Fleet Captain of the Columbia Yacht Club of Chicago has organized a Lightning Fleet. They are awaiting delivery of their Lightnings so as to include the names of all persons participating on the original Fleet charter.

Edgar B. Tolman, Jr., is doing his bit to interest some of the members of the Jackson Park Yacht Club of Chicago, in forming a Lightning Fleet this season.

Wm. C. Agerell, skipper of No. 108 "Annaddy", is also an author. He has written splendid articles on "Cruising in a Lightning" which appeared in the October issue of *Flashes* and under "Saga of the Annaddy" appearing in the March issue of *Lakeland Yachting*.

Dr. Fred M. Meixner, skipper of No. 1191, talks up Lightnings outside and during professional hours to anyone who will listen. It won't be long before you hear that Peoria has a Lightning Fleet.

INDIANA

Good ole "Rufus II" and his skipper, *Oren M. Ragsdale*, will not remain in this category very long. Since their recent transplanting inquiries have been pouring in from around Lake Wawassee, near Syracuse, Indiana, asking, "Where can we get new or used Lightnings?" No. 21 is still doing her "stuff".

IOWA

We are wondering if distance can't be compromised in some way so that *Dr. B. Raymond Weston*, owner of No. 335, and *Dr. Harold W. Morgan*, skipper of No. 615, can form a Fleet on some sheet of water between Mason City and Fort Dodge where *Alre R. Watts*, owner of No. 1571 resides.

Ronald Green of Stormont, Belfast, is building No. 1564 and intends to operate any Lightnings built in Ireland in full membership of the Class Association and his aim is to have it one of the recognized classes of the Strangford Lough Yacht Club resulting in a large fleet in conformity with our rules.

Lawrence C. Bales, 4 Otis Place, Boston, Mass., is most popular among his friends since he has become the proud owner of No. 1863. He believes most of them are genuinely interested and with several Lightning owners in his area he believes a Lightning Fleet is in the making.

S. D. Randall of Kalamazoo is going to have a Lightning Fleet on Gull Lake—or else. The proposed fleet will, no doubt, include skippers *C. F.
