FOREWORD

This Year Book, and the others that have preceded it, is a faithful record of the names of sailors, the fleets, the races, regattas, prizes, pennants and cups. Yet it is, at best, only an incomplete memoranda of long summer days, sparkling water, sun, wind and the feel of the tiller in a good boat. Perhaps it may help in recollecting not only winners and champions, but many friends.

There is not much told herein about the long and careful preparation before the races, breaking in sails, polishing bottoms, mysteries of tuning, consulting of "experts", and all the voodoo practiced by ardent devotees. 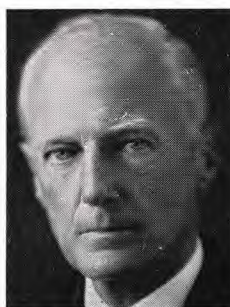
E. GORDON CRONK

Lightning Class Association

OBJECT — POLICY — JURISDICTION

To promote and develop Lightning Class racing under uniform rules, governed by this Association, and to rigidly maintain the one-design features of Lightning Class sloop, as designed by Sparkman and Stephens, Inc., which plans are known as 265.

To cooperate with all other yachting organizations and to demand in return observance of the rules of the Lightning Class.

To keep the Lightning Class within the financial reach of the man of moderate means without handicapping ability or encouraging neglect in conditioning yachts.

To rigidly maintain a strictly one-design Class, in order to positively insure that all Lightning Class races held under the auspices of this Association be to determine the skill of the skipper, and to eliminate all variation in construction of the yachts. Everything in the Constitution, By-Laws and all building restrictions is intended to insure competition between boats of identical design and the spirit of the Constitution, By-Laws and building restrictions is to this end. The Association has jurisdiction over all Lightning activities. Its Class rules govern all sanctioned Lightning races regardless of by whom held. Its Constitution, By-Laws and Rules are binding upon all members and Fleets and all registered Lightning yachts must conform to its official plans and specifications.

ATTENTION OWNERS, BUILDERS AND SAILMAKERS

The Lightning name and emblem as applied to sailboats has been registered with the U. S. Patent office and the Lightning Class Association is granted exclusive use thereof. No boat may properly be sold or entered in any race as a Lightning or at any time display the Lightning emblem upon its sails or otherwise, unless the number tax or royalty on such boat has been paid to the Association by the builder or owner thereof. For the benefit of owners or prospective owners the Association proposes to take whatever steps necessary to protect both the Lightning name and emblem from any unauthorized use.

ROYALTIES AND REGISTRATION

The Association will refuse to issue a number or grant a measurement certificate to any yacht on which the royalty has not been paid or which was not built by a recorded owner of Official Lightning Class plans. *The fee for each and every boat built is \$15.00* which includes the assignment of a registered number.

Every Lightning built is recorded by the Association and a complete registry of owners is maintained. All changes in

ownership or sale of new boats by builders and dealers must be recorded with the Secretary of the Association.

A royalty must be paid by sailmakers on each sail made amounting to 40 cents on jibs, 60 cents on mainsails, and 60 cents on spinnakers. These royalties should be sent to the Secretary-Treasurer promptly and semi-annual reports as sent out by the Association must be returned properly recording all Lightning sails made by each sailmaker for the period indicated.

MEMBERSHIP

Each and every Lightning owner should be an active member of the Association. \$3.00 per year (plus \$1.00 per year for each additional co-owner where more than one person jointly own a Lightning) is a very small amount to pay for the many benefits received from such a membership. You are not only helping to support your own Association that is doing everything possible to enhance and protect your investment in your Lightnings but you will receive numerous publications of great interest and benefit (which alone are worth the investment). Only members are permitted to enter sanctioned Lightning Class races and receive the official Year Book and special Lightning Class publications.

Every crew member or person sailing and interested in Lightnings but is not an owner should be an Associate member at \$3.00 per year, or in the case of crew members regularly sailing and assigned to a boat, \$1.00 per year. The Year Book (which is sent to Associate members as well) alone is worth more than this membership costs, not to mention our other publications.

If you have not already sent in your dues for 1947, do so now.

PLANS

Plans are not transferable. They are sold subject to the terms and conditions of the notice thereon. Plans and specifications are subject to annual revision only as provided in the Constitution and By-Laws. The responsibility of keeping advised as to these annual revisions rests with the purchaser of plans and specifications. Never copy another Lightning.

CONSTITUTION — BY-LAWS — RULES SPECIFICATIONS

The Constitution, By-Laws, Rules, Specifications of the Lightning Class Association are contained in a special pamphlet and is available to all members—builders and yachting organizations.

Report of Committee On Recommended Changes for the International Championship

To the President:

Since your appointment of the above committee, each member has made a study of the problem and has submitted his idea in letter form. There have also been letters from Fleet 63, Wayne Brockett; Fleet 41, Magnus Pedersen; Fleet 20, Peter Urnes; Fleet 56, John Burke; and Fleet 55, Luther Beck; outlining the feelings of these respective fleets in the matter.

The problem given to us was two fold and can be summarized as follows:

1. What is a fair method of controlling the number of entries to the International Championship? The background to this problem is the rapid growth of the class and the formation of new fleets which now, as of December 15th, total 110 with a total of about 2500 boat owners. The possible entries under the present system from such numbers will tax the housing and entertainment capacity of more than 95 percent of the fleets.
2. The second part of the problem is—what racing procedure at the International Championship will produce the real champion.

A committee meeting was held in New York on December 3rd, attended by Jack Orelup, Jim Trenary, Joe Grimmig and Dick Carr.

We recommend that the basis of qualification for entries to the International Championship be the paid active boat owners who are accredited fleet members as of July 15th preceding the Regatta. The same number of entries per fleet to be as approved in the annual meeting of 1946 viz; 1 entry for the first 10 qualified boat owners, a second entry for fleets having 11 to 25 inclusive qualified boat owners, a third entry for fleets having 26-50 inclusive qualified boat owners and a fourth entry for fleets having 51-75 qualified boat owners, etc.

We feel that this is a fair way for fleets to qualify for entry—certainly if an owner is not interested enough to be a member of the Lightning Class Association, he should not be included in the qualifications for the Championships.

Regarding the second part of the problem—namely racing procedure—we recommend that if the entry list is over 35 in number the Executive Committee of the Association is empowered to order elimination races under modified plan "C" using 1 or 2 elimination races, depending on weather and local conditions.

There will be three championship races. The Race Committee will have the right to shorten course in either the elimination races or the championship races.

PLAN "C" (MODIFIED) IS AS FOLLOWS:

All entries will be divided into approximately the same number divisions, preferably by odd or even numbers, with the right of the Executive Committee to seed some of the known good skippers into each division. Each division will start about one hour apart. The top fraction of each division will be combined into the Championship flight and the balance will constitute the "B" division and will race for "B" division prizes.

It is our hope that the adoption of these changes will keep the splendid features of our present regattas—the fun, the social events of the four or five days, the enthusiasm for this regatta by a large number of owners from many sections of the country—and still be a comprehensive test so that the winner will be a real champion.

If this procedure of limiting entries is not practical and does not produce a satisfactory result, we recommend a further study be made of the districting of the country and that entries to the championship be chosen from district elimination races. This would involve radical changes from our present system and would alter completely the flavor of the regattas as now held.

Walt Swindeman Wins International Championship at Skaneateles

The sparkling blue waters of Skaneateles Lake in Skaneateles, New York was an ideal setting for the 8th Annual Internationals. The Skaneateles Country Club was host to the largest group of participants in any Championship Regatta. Fifty-four contestants were at the starting line for the first race. Forty-one Fleets from all over the country were represented.

George Barnes, 1945 International Champion and Commodore of the Skaneateles Country Club, did a masterful job on arrangements for this Regatta, which necessitated housing, feeding and entertaining some 300 persons, comprising skippers, crews and their families. He was capably assisted by Mrs. Winthrop Dennison in charge of housing accommodations, Mrs. Albert James in charge of hospitality at the Club, and Beverly Lapham who kept the visitors entertained. Wescott Barber was in charge of launching, a tremendous responsibility, which was most expertly handled. Arthur Emerick was in charge of measuring and did the impossible in completing the same in time for the first race. Robert Sloan handled publicity and successfully coralled an excellent group of photographers and members of the Press, which included the eminent Bob Rimington, Managing Editor of YACHTING and Marjorie Fidao representing THE RUDDER. Dr. Robert Johnson had charge of Course Patrol which he also handled most efficiently.

An innovation at the Internationals this year was the first "Puff by Puff" and "Tack by Tack" broadcast by Jerry Stagg via short wave over station WSYR. Jerry circled the contending yachts in power boat STATIK and gave an on the spot "Blow by Blow" report as to the action and developments in each race.

On Friday, the second race day, a Clambake was held on the Club lawn overlooking the Lake starting at 1:00 P.M. and lasted until

the last round of beer was served about 10:00 P.M. to the strains of "Beer Barrel Sinatra", Bob Crane's "First in war, first in peace and what have you?"

This and other affairs afforded an opportunity for the newcomers present to become better acquainted with the colorful personalities competing, among whom were Walt Swindeman and his crew, Wm. Gerkins and Jim Fallon from Toledo in their red and white striped "Yankee Doodle" jerseys and blue caps; Wayne Brockett from Branford, Conn. in his red "Flame" shirt; Cal Yaudas from Toledo in his yellow "Zig-Zag" jersey; Karl Smither from Buffalo (former International Winner) in blue coverall "Thermis Twice" jacket; Jack Orelup from Barnegat Bay with inseparable tie and white cap, and many others who have contributed to the interest in Lightning competition.

FIRST RACE—Thursday, 11:00 A.M.

The weather was clear and crisp with a steady southerly of 10 miles force. The sun was glistening on the water when the 54 contenders jockeyed for position before the start. The course set was the "B" triangular course, twice around, for six miles, leaving markers to port. At the starting gun, Paul Ryan, Jr. in "Bonnie Ann" from Larchmont, was first across the line followed closely by Karl Smither, Cal Yaudas, Frank Zurn, George Barnes and Walt Swindeman. The majority of boats got off on port tack, the balance taking to starboard. Swindeman pulled into the lead after emerging from the confusion of so many starters and was in the lead at the first mark followed by Yaudas, Smither and Vogel. Barnes was in 10th place rounding first mark.

On the close-reach to the second mark, the positions of the leaders remained the same. It was a run of a mile and one-quarter on the home leg. Spinnakers filled before the wind presenting a picturesque sight for those ashore. Swindeman increased his lead on the second lap followed by Vogel, Yaudas and Smither. At the first mark, on the second lap, Webb pulled up to 5th place. Barnes was in 7th place. Rounding second mark, Webb was in 4th place. Barnes pulled up to 5th place and Smither dropped into 6th position.

Swindeman was away out in front on the home leg and finished 4 minutes and 22 seconds ahead of Vogel who finished in 2nd position. Barnes kept pulling up on the home leg and succeeded in passing Yaudas and Webb, finishing in 3rd position, with Webb 4th, Yaudas 5th and Smither 6th. The winning time was 1:26:23. Fifty of the 54 starters finished. Brockett, Jones, Cotter and Crunden did not finish. Ringdahl and McIntosh withdrew.

SECOND RACE—Friday, 10:00 A.M.

Weather clear. A strong southerly of from 18 to 25 mile force churned up the lake waters and made a rough test for the competitors. The course set was the same as on the previous day. All boats jockeyed for a starboard tack start. At the gun, Webb was recalled. Ryan was first across again, followed by Dore, Amy and Vogel. The strong wind had boats flying across the Lake on long tacks. The first marker was a lurking booby-trap for many skippers who endeavored to round it approaching on port tack. Young Jim Amy from Larchmont discovered this as he neared it on port tack in 5th position. George Barnes was on starboard tack. Amy cleared Barnes' stern, but was forced into a foul by other oncoming boats on starboard tack and withdrew from the race. Jack Webb of Riverside also met his "waterloo" at this mark as in going about from port to starboard to round same he was forced into a foul by oncoming boats on starboard tack.

Ed Larrabee of Toms River led around the first mark, followed by Swindeman, Straub, McIntosh and Barnes. Positions remained the same at the second mark. Barnes raised his spinnaker on the home leg and passed McIntosh, experiencing plenty of trouble with his spinnaker on home leg near the Club mark, but stuck with it and only his masterful handling prevented him going over. At the half-way mark, Larrabee was still leading Swindeman with Straub in 3rd and Barnes in 4th place. On the second lap, the old booby-trap first

marker caught up with Barnes as he approached on port tack. He had to come about in front of a boat on starboard tack. He, thereupon, withdrew from the race.

Larrabee was still leading Swindeman around first mark with McIntosh and Straub following. Smither was in 8th position rounding first mark. It became a nip and tuck contest between Swindeman and Larrabee as they approached the second mark. Swindeman pulled ahead of Larrabee on the home leg and finished 41 seconds in the lead. McIntosh was 3rd, Straub 4th, Herman J. Holler of Grand Island, N. Y. 5th, Smither taking the 6th position. The winning time was 1:21:45. This was the most exciting race of the series. Of the 54 starters, 46 finished.

Charles H. Judd's and Francis Sutherland's boats capsized. Joe Jova and Richard L. Bennett broke rudders and four boats were forced into fouls by the strong wind. At the end of the Second Race, Swindeman lead with 108 points, Larrabee was 2nd with 99 points and Smither 3rd with 98 points.

THIRD RACE—Saturday, 10:15 A.M.

Weather clear—light southerly of 8 mile force. The windward-leeward course was decided upon for the last race of the series calling for a mile and one-half up and back, twice around. The starting signal was given for the final race after a 15 minute postponement. Joe L. Jova was first across the line followed by John Veenschoten, J. Carl Behler and Jack Webb. Swindeman was back of the fleet on port tack at the start but went into contending position before reaching first mark. Webb was out in the clear on a long starboard tack to shore. Judd, Behler and Swindeman were on port tack approaching the marker. George Barnes was on starboard tack and crossed Swindeman's bow. Swindeman and Barnes switched tacks and Barnes passed the bow of Swindeman on port tack. Swindeman missed the first mark and had to come about to round it. Judd led at first mark but Barnes pulled inside of him rounding the mark followed by Robert C. Griggs, Herman O. Nickels, Jr. and Swindeman. On the home leg, Yaudas pulled ahead of Swindeman and Nickels. At 10:40 the wind dropped to a 4 mile force which slowed up the run home, first time around. Rounding the second mark, Barnes was in the lead followed by Yaudas, Nickels, Swindeman and Smither. At 12:20 P.M. the wind flattened. Barnes led at first mark second time around followed by Nickels, Swindeman and Smither. Yaudas had dropped

back. Magnus Pedersen of Nyack (1946 Atlantic Coast Champion) had been passing boats all the way on the second lap and was in 5th position half-way down the home leg. Webb had also bettered his position passing Vogel, McIntosh and Griggs pulling up to 7th position. It was a nip and tuck contest down the home leg between Barnes and Nickels. Nickels, closer to the east shore, picked up some puffs and slowly edged into the lead of Barnes, 100 yards from the finish line. Yard by yard, the leading boats neared the finish line. Nickels was first across the line with Barnes finishing 43 seconds later. Swindeman finished 3rd annexing the International Championship for 1946 after winning the two previous races. Smither finished 4th which assured him of 2nd place in the Championship. Pedersen was 5th; F. Clark Hamlin, of Chaumont, 6th and Webb finished in 7th position. The winning time was 2:29:55. The remainder of the

fleet drifted without any means of propulsion for 40 minutes after the leaders had finished. Finally a fair breeze from the west permitted the balance of the contenders to close reach home over finish line. The last boat to cross came in at 1:50 P.M.

Walt has proven his ability in former International Competition having the title almost within his grasp on two previous occasions: in 1942 when he was runner-up to Dave Cluett at South Haven, Michigan and in 1945 at Riverside, Conn. when he had two firsts, but had an unlucky break when he rounded the wrong marker in the second race. Swindeman has again displayed, during this series, a rare example of good judgment and sailing skill. He is a very popular champion and has the admiration and respect of all Lightning skippers.

The Toledo Hocus Pocus

At last, Toledo has copped the number one Lightning classic. For five years the Toledo skippers have worked as a team with this purpose in mind. This year, from early March until just before the bang of the gun at Skaneateles, the Toledo slogan was "bring home the bacon."

Our program sounds like a lot of work but I can assure you it was a pleasure to be a part of the congenial bunch of skippers who were "red hot" all season. Almost every night all summer, Lightnings were out in Maumee Bay tuning and racing and trying everything imaginable to make them sail faster. Everything done in the way of tuning I can assure you of being perfectly legal since all of our experiments have been done under the eyes of our Chief Measurer, Art Burtscher, who would be the last Lightning owner to tolerate any cheating. It required lots of team work and patience to carry on such a program but as I said before it was lots of fun and the final results, we think, were worth the effort.

During the season, which was loaded with regattas and fleet races, every skipper who was interested enough and took part in the tuning received invaluable aid in bettering the performance of his boat. Consequently, six boats were tuned about as well as a Lightning could be—making very interesting racing. A fact which bears this out is that the 5th and 6th place boats in our fleet series participated in the big I.L.Y.A. Regatta at Put-in-Bay against a large fleet of Lightnings from all around the Middle West and finished 1st and 2nd with the 6th placer being the Winner. Our 4th place boat won the classic Detroit Sweepstakes Regatta in a field of eighteen. The big Mid-Summer test came with the sailing of the District Regatta in Toledo with forty-two entries. Out of the first ten places, Toledo placed seven boats. Oh yes, we also held down last place, a new skipper with cheese cloth sails.

What I am trying to put over to other fleets is not that we think we are better but that we are working together on the principle of team work at home and that we think it is the best system because so far it has been successful. If we can help that last place skipper to beat us occasionally it keeps his and our interest alive and if he beats us twice in succession we start turning turnbuckles etc. in order to catch him. Just about the time I thought the "Yankee Doodle" was right, someone would pin my ears back and I would have to start working again. I couldn't have done this tuning without the help of other skippers as I think it is almost impossible to say a boat is hot without a brush race with someone equally as good or better. Our chief adjustment in tuning this year was proper setting of fore and back stays and jumpers after making sure the spar was straight sideways. We found out that the spar had to be straight for best results since the crooked ones wouldn't move no matter what was done to the boat. So if you have a kinky stick, chop it up and get a good one if you want to get in the money.

With all the cooperation I have had from the boys here I would say that Toledo won the Internationals—not Swindeman, because without it Swindeman would probably have been just another contestant.

The Skaneateles Country Club conducted one of the finest Regattas that I have ever attended. The most efficient manner in which everything was handled plus the unparalleled hospitality made for a most enjoyable week that will always be a pleasurable memory. Everyone from Toledo who attended is of the same opinion, even including the cat that we brought along for good luck.

If you want to know how we won the Regatta, I will tell you how we did it. We used the following procedure on all regattas during the season with remarkable results. First, it takes about fifteen or twenty lucky pennies in the bilge. A lucky silver dollar from a friend, also in the bilge. The name of the boat besides being on the transom must also be on the topsides near the bow. The "Doodle" just won't sail unless that name is on the bow. By accident, we brought the Club cat—we had good luck so I suppose it is necessary to dig up a cat if you want to win. Two gallons of Lake Erie water sprinkled on the boat deck with a small portion in the bilge also helps. That beautiful southerly breeze was a result of a lot of prayers to Uncle Ed. You will find him in any manhole on main street. A few pennies on the manhole lid, a shot of scotch and chant "Uncle Ed give us some air" ten times is all that it takes to whip up a nice gale. Don't allow anyone to take your picture until the series is over and by then you should be the Champ. I am not a bit superstitious as you, no doubt, realize by now—I just merely did what I mentioned to chase an old jinx that has been following me around for about two years. Brother, he's back in the hills now, way out past left field.

With all of our good luck charms in order, we hit the starting line of the first race in weather position a few seconds late on a starboard tack and in a few minutes found ourselves in 1st place. We managed to hold our lead over Vogel on the beat and on the spinaker run home "Yankee Doodle" just flew to give us a good win. I will never forget that second race when we had another good start and a rip snortin' battle all the way around with No. 1065 who was two boat lengths ahead of us for about five and one-half miles when we finally squeezed by. The third race was a dilly for us as the old pressure was on and the wind on the way out. We were darn lucky to finish behind Herm Nickels and George Barnes who had better smellers than we did and did a better job in the light going. In this race we had a ding-dong battle with Smither and Crane all the way around and they were right on our tail at the finish.

It's great to win and it's great to sail a Lightning even when you lose, when one can attend such a wonderful Regatta as was held at Skaneateles. I hope that we will be able to put on a show next year equally as well. We're certainly going to try.

We Had a Great Time

It all started back on May 30th when we had our first fleet race. From then until August 4th it was one hectic race after another. When the time for the last race rolled around, Swindeman and Vogel had clinched the first two positions and I was in third place, but only two and three-fourths points ahead of Jerry Garinger. What a race that turned out to be with Jerry just nosing me out by one second. It still left me in third and the right to be the third boat to represent Fleet No. 42 at the Internationals. To say that I was pleased is putting it mildly and my crew of Johnny Paterson and Bob Harrison really whooped it up in grand style. I want to say right now that all credit for whatever success I have had this year belongs to Johnny and Bob. They have worked like eager beavers all year and to me they are the greatest crew in the world.

We left Toledo Yacht Club at 11:00 P. M. on September 2nd. I took the lead with Swindeman, Vogel and Bill Girkins following in that order. That was once I made Walt look at the transom of the "Zig Zag" for a long time. We stopped in Cleveland at a gas station so our caravan could fill up and I thought it would be a good time to check the trailer lights and the lashings on the boat. While I was doing so, I was startled by a loud and plaintive "miaow". Glancing inside the boat I discovered we had a stowaway and it was none other than the Yacht Club cat. There he was over a hundred miles from home and letting everyone know about it. He rode with us in the car the rest of the way and fortunately Vogel was assigned to a cabin and that is where he made his home during our stay at Skaneateles.

We arrived at the Country Club about 3:30 P.M. and it took about fifteen minutes for that very efficient launching crew to get our boat in the water and over to the dock. We stepped the spar and as there was a swell breeze we couldn't resist taking a sail even though we were dead tired and hungry. After a good night's rest, we awoke to find the Lake like a sheet of glass but we drifted around with the rest. After we had our sails measured, we discovered some more of our Toledo pals had arrived. So after the Annual Meeting we decided to see if we couldn't do something about whipping up a breeze. Swindeman found a manhole on the main street so we gathered around and offered our devout devotions to Uncle Ed and implored him to send us some wind.

Uncle Ed really came through as everyone who was there will remember the beautiful sailing breeze we had for the first race. What a sight it was with 54 boats jockeying for position at the starting line. We were off to a good start in the center of the fleet with clear air and it wasn't long until we moved up with the leaders. We rounded the first mark in 2nd place and headed into the second leg which was a close reach. We were still 2nd as we headed for home on a spinnaker run but Vogel moved up with us and we rounded the home stake for the second lap together with Smither close behind. We were in third place at the weather mark and also at the end of the fifth leg as we headed for the finish line. Jack Webb had moved up close and we engaged in a luffing match which did neither of us any good as it enabled George Barnes to move up with us. About 300 feet from the finish line, I was in the weather position and a few feet ahead of Webb and he was a few feet ahead of Barnes. Jack then eased out from under my lee and at the last minute Barnes sneaked out from under him and we finished in that order. I was told later that only eight seconds separated the three boats which made it a very exciting finish. We were all thrilled with our 5th place finish and we did a little celebrating that afternoon. That evening we again offered up our devotions to Uncle Ed.

He certainly heard us because Friday morning it was snorting. Our start wasn't very good and for quite a while we were boxed in but once we got into the clear the old packet really started moving. We were in 6th or 7th place as we approached the weather mark on starboard tack but there we found Webb in irons and over-hanging the

mark, just enough that I couldn't squeeze around him. I headed up as high as I could and went in irons myself. The force of the wind and the sea forced me back alongside Webb. We had to lay away off his transom and run down, jibe, come back on port tack and then flop to starboard to round the mark. By that time at least 25 boats had passed us and we were very discouraged at the sudden turn of events. We kept on plugging and when we rounded the stake at the Judge's boat we were in 25th place. We really worked on that second weather leg and the close reach and as we headed for home we had moved up to 9th place. I didn't fly a spinnaker and 3 boats passed us and we finished 13th, which wasn't so bad after the position we were in at one time.

I filed my first protest in fifteen years of racing against Webb and I certainly hated to do it but I had no other choice. The protest was upheld and Jack was disqualified. It was a tough break for him as he sailed three beautiful races and would have had 2nd place in the series without a doubt but for that one tough break. Jack accepted the ruling as a real sailor and a gentleman and I am proud to have had the opportunity to have met and sailed against him.

All of us enjoyed that marvelous Clambake in the afternoon and evening. We again paid our respects to Uncle Ed before retiring. Saturday morning the wind was still holding fresh and the Judges decided on a windward and leeward course. Just before the start, the wind started to drop but it was only a sample of what was to come. We had a fair start on starboard tack and as soon as I could I flopped on port and headed for the west shore. We found some good slants there and we rounded the stake in 4th place. The wind was dropping and becoming more slanting all the time. On the spinnaker run, we picked up Swindeman and Nickels and we rounded the home stake in 2nd place close behind Barnes. I again played the west shore but the best air seemed to be in the center so I headed out there. When we reached the center we realized we should have stayed in shore and we rounded the stake in 6th place. I played the same slot for the run home that I did the first time but the air just wasn't there and half way home we just sat and kept the bugs company and watched 5 boats slowly sail by. After a long wait, the breeze shifted to the north and we had to beat our way to the finish line in 12th place. It didn't take us long to get to the dock and take the spar out and then get the packet loaded for the trip home. They finally posted the results of the first ten places and with Swindeman 1st, myself 5th and Vogel 7th, we all felt damn proud of the efforts of the Toledo Fleet.

The banquet that night was a grand affair with the Toledo crowd singing and whooping it up. Later in the evening, we were treated to some swell singing and squeeze box playing by Bob Seaman and Bob Graf. I hope those boys make Toledo next year.

The trip home was uneventful but when we reached the Club we were greeted with cannon salutes and much hand shaking and back slapping. Tommy, the cat, was sporting a collar of roses and red ribbon but he made a beeline for the kitchen. The trophy bowl was filled and numerous toasts were drunk by the assembled crowd. And so ended my first trip to the Internationals as a skipper and I spent one of the most enjoyable weeks of my life.

Too much praise cannot be given to all the Officers for the way they handled this affair. I have never attended a regatta that ran so smoothly and orchids to all of them. And to George Barnes and his committees I want to extend the "Thanks" of my crew, myself and the other Toledo guests for making our stay one that will always remain vivid in our memory. We will have a tremendous job next year to come even close to equaling the show you put on. A grand job, Gentlemen, and well done! We will be looking forward to seeing you and all the other swell people that we had the pleasure of meeting next year in Toledo. And, until then, smooth sailing.

Just For Laughs

Sailboat racing is fun and I have been doing it for years—well, four or five anyway. A yacht racing association was started in the little resort town of Fair Haven on Lake Ontario. It had a few Comets as a starter. Yachting has long been a family affair on the bay—Comets aren't a family boat—so it wasn't long 'til the Lightning came into use. By the summer of 1946, we had eight Lightnings racing every Saturday and Sunday. We have no race committee and the word spinnaker is used only when referring to other Lightning fleets. The fleet agreed that they would keep their racing as simple as possible—thus, no spinnakers.

With the 1946 Internationals at Skaneateles, only thirty miles away, we felt it a good idea to send our Fleet Champ—"just for laughs." Our elimination was run off with Robert (Chicken) Griggs and Dr. Joseph Riley tied for first place and points. Griggs had more firsts to his credit though so he was chosen for the big race. He had never sailed away from the home fleet but was anxious to test his skill. John Swartz and I were to be his crew. Johnny had sailed in intercollegiate racing at Yale and I at least knew port from starboard.

We began thinking of what we would need to enter the "Jo-Bo" in her first big race. A long list was compiled headed by racing sails, spinnaker and a complete knowledge of our handbook, "Yacht Racing Rules and Tactics." Naturally all these things fell on skipper Griggs.

Sails were ordered. "Sorry, boys, we couldn't possibly have a new set of racing sails ready by September 5th." This was a hard-felt blow—racing in the Internationals with our standard (and only) suit of sails, sounds swell! I'm kidding here. Nothing could be done though. Our spinnaker order was taken and promised by September 4th. Pretty close figuring, but what can one do these days? Maybe we could borrow one. The Fair Haven Fleet had one spinnaker; alas, we measured it and found it too long on the foot and too short on the tack. A quick exchange of telegrams ensued. Larson promised the spinnaker not later than September 3rd. Well, we gained a day anyway.

We set about to rig the "Jo-Bo" with spinnaker pole, halyards, sheets, cleats, guys and all the other gadgets and combinations claimed to be foolproof by the skippers whose minds were responsible. Dr. Riley let us borrow his sails to practice with accompanied with many helpful hints on spinnaker handling. You have heard of "ten second spinnaker crews"—well, ours was unbeatable at ten minutes. Seriously, that thing really gave us a bad time. Griggs sat there with tiller in one hand and stopwatch in the other.

"Up spinnaker," he'd say. Oath after oath followed and finally Johnny and I had her pulling like a charm.

"Good work, boys," he'd exclaim, "Forty-five seconds isn't bad, now let's try again, we've only got today and tomorrow to practice."

We spent our last day on spinnaker drills and starts, which needed a lot of practice. Now all was ready except the boat. Sanding, scraping, and more sanding. Then a few good smooth coats of copper bottom. The boat looked good—we even had our centerboard sharpened. The big day was forty-eight hours off!

Our borrowed Chris-Craft trailer carried the "Jo-Bo" to Skaneateles without a scratch. Launching facilities were the best and we were on the water in no time.

The new spinnaker had arrived and we gave it its initial trial the day before the race which, incidentally, wasn't too much of a trial as the wind was very slight.

Thursday morning, however, we had a beautiful breeze and sailed our first big time race. We were midway at the start, 13th after the first lap and finished a close 8th. Our first race with the spinnaker found us battling for finish position with two other boats. We had decided earlier to keep out of any close matches on the run as we knew that our experience was limited. This is easier said than done—we lost one position on the last leg—I had always thought it funny that one boat could go faster than another in its own class where there was no apparent difference. I know now that there are

a lot of tricks to downwind running learned only through careful study and practice.

Friday was the big wind. On the first lap, none of the first five boats used their spinnakers. We were the 6th with George Barnes right on our tail. He rounded the mark and up went "Junior" (which is the name we soon adopted for the spinnaker). Should we chance it? His was going all right, in fact he was going right by us.

"Up spinnaker." This was it! The next ten minutes of my life were tough. "Junior" would not stay full and when he was full, Johnny, the sheet man, was nearly out of the boat. We soon realized our mistake, but how to get it down was another question. Barnes and crew, by beautiful work, had established quite a lead on us. The sail went down but not without difficulty. We learned later that he had taken on six inches of water. With the defending Champ bogged down—what would happen to us?

We were nearly at the mark and "Junior" was still slatting around like mad. I went forward to pull it in—no luck, it wouldn't come down. We had our difficulties too and almost duplicated Barnes' near catastrophe. Suddenly, as if by magic, "Junior" collapsed in my arms. I think we violated about every rule in the handbooks about dousing spinnakers. Frankly, I'm still amazed at how it happened. We were lucky—that was no place for a bunch of kids to be playing with all that sail. I must have had a feeling that things were going too smoothly. In my mad rush for the cockpit my foot hit the main halyard belaying pin. As if to add to our difficulties, it broke, sending our mainsail down in a shower. Our hearts sank completely. Actually, it wasn't too bad, but none of us seemed to realize that it could be easily remedied. As for myself, I saw weeks of preparation availing nothing. But we soon rigged it to a jury cleat and sailed merrily (?) on. I shall never know how all this happened in such a short time. When we started to take in the spinnaker we were already dangerously close to over-running the mark. Everything is slightly vague, but we must have worked fast. I do know that once settled down on the second lap my throat was parched. In times like those I realized the veracity of the saying, "Water, water everywhere, but not a drop to drink."

Needless to say we didn't use "Junior" again that day. We were in 4th place at the start of the last leg. Half the fleet used their "Juniors" and four boats sailed by us. I don't know whether the wind died down or the skippers just felt like taking a chance; anyway no one seemed to be having much trouble and they were passing us. We wound up with another 8th place. The numerous protests lasted until evening. Finally the score sheet was posted—crash! "Jo-Bo" was 4th. Such jubilation! We had come to the Internationals "just for laughs" and were now in 4th place. Long distance phone calls followed—this was getting exciting. Maybe we could pull into pay dirt tomorrow. We tried to figure out who we would have to beat in order to take 3rd—at least four boats were on our list. Our theme, "just for laughs," had been forgotten. If we can get a 4th, why not a 3rd?

As luck would have it, the third day brought light fluky airs and all we had was that five year old suit of Lightning Standards. We had a pre-gun start and so were among the last ten going over the line. The majority of the boats were on the east shore with little wind so we took a chance on the west side. It was a good chance too as a light draft steadily took us past the fleet. For a few glorious moments we were 1st, but gradually dropped back. Confound these downwind runs! I was turning back flips on the deck trying to keep that sail full. It's tough to see yourself fall back when you are doing everything you know how to in order to hold a position. I guess Fate didn't want us to break a precedent though so we finished 8th. Three 8ths isn't too spectacular, but the fact that we were consistent pulled us up into the coveted 3rd place for the series. We were mighty happy, though somewhat dazed.

I'll never forget my first Internationals. I guess every crew member would rather be sailing his own boat in a race. Johnny and I feel that way anyway and our orders are in now for Lightnings. I plan to try my luck at building one. Although quite inexperienced in carpentry, I have been offered much assistance and feel it should turn out well. We have warned Skipper Griggs of our plans, but he really doesn't have anything to worry about. We hope to give him a few battles and perhaps beat him a few times, "just for laughs."

1947 Lightning Class International Championship

September 9-13 at Toledo, Ohio

The Toledo Lightning Fleet and the Toledo Yacht Club proudly announce the 1947 International Regatta. Enthusiastic skippers and club members are hard at work on various committees making the necessary arrangements and laying plans for the forthcoming event. On either course, in the fall of the year the air is generally good out of any direction affording a true windward leg for championship racing. Spectators may watch the entire race from various vantage points along the shore on the inner course and if the outer course is used, spectator boats will be furnished.



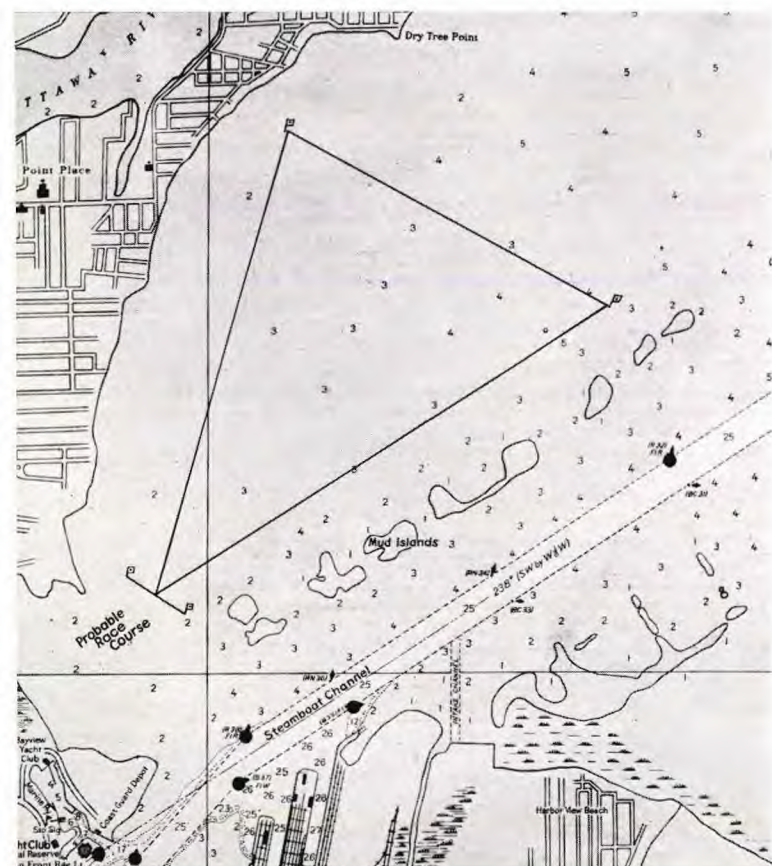

District Organization of the Lightning Class Association

Districts have been established embracing activities within certain geographical areas. District secretaries have been duly elected or appointed for each district and they are in charge of, and responsible for, all inter-fleet activities within their district—for the organization of new fleets and the creation of increased Lightning interest and activity in general.

CALIFORNIA DISTRICT

District Secretary—Frank Watson, 927 Iliff St., Pacific Palisades, California.

Fleets—Santa Monica Bay Fleet (102); Newport-Balboa Lightning Fleet (107); San Diego Bay Fleet (114).

District Report—During the year (1946) I made it a point to write a letter to every person whose name appeared in the California section of the Year Book as well as the names supplied to me by the L.C.A. and others who I thought might be interested. I received quite a few answers to my letters which coupled with personal contacts is the basis for my report. I made three trips to San Diego, over 300 miles each, and four trips to Balboa, 130 miles each, to check on Lightnings, show race films, take photographs, etc. During the year, the 1942 and 1945 race films were shown to the South Coast Corinthian Yacht Club and the 1942 race films to the Balboa Yacht Club. There were showings at my home as well.

Not very many Lightnings were in the water in Southern California during 1946 but the picture is rapidly changing. During the S.C.Y.A. Regatta last August, we expected to have the required three boats so the Lightnings could sail as a Class but after much hard work on the part of Dick Daschner and myself only two boats appeared. These were both local boats—the Ackerman's "Tu Tu" No. 673 and Dick Daschner's "Tantrum" No. 1452. At the Christmas Regatta at Newport Harbor, the only Lightning entry was Dick Daschner again.

To begin with Lightning activities I will start with the northern section of California and work south to San Diego. Up behind Shasta Dam, the Warmoth's "War Moth" No. 1552 and the Lindauer's "Shasti Shastina" No. 1096 were sailing. The Warmoths had an interested third party and they hoped that he would secure a Lightning so a fleet could be organized. As yet I have not heard if the third party found a boat.

At Inverness on Tomales Bay, there were three Lightnings at the start of the season and a fourth joined them later. These were Harold McCarthy's "Scout" No. 343, Dorothy Mel's No. 1908, the one owned by the Tollefsons, and Wm. Nisson's "Elido" No. 342. Wm. Nisson brought his Lightning down from Clear Lake. Howard Charles Mel had been stationed by the Navy at Bremen, Germany for a while but is now attending the University of Geneva. His sister is now the skipper of the boat.

Down in the southern section of San Francisco Bay one would find Mr. Pond sailing his "Dauntless" No. 956 in the handicap races at the Palo Alto Yacht Club. Greydon Weldon, No. 951, has been handicapped by lack of facilities but is still very interested in the Lightning. At Santa Barbara, Fred Udall can be found sailing his "Tradewind", No. 302, nearly every weekend. I tried to make arrangements with him to take some pictures of his boat but he never made a definite date. I did not want to take a chance and drive 100 miles each way and miss him.

In the Los Angeles area, Dr. Reitz sold No. 1084 but as yet has not mentioned to whom he sold it. Mr. Hodgkinson has his No. 1579 ready for the water and is only waiting for sails. He expects to sail at Newport Harbor. Andy Barr and his son have one boat complete and the second one planked. Andy sailed Lightnings at Bay Head in New Jersey. Dr. Sandberg, No. 1134, has run into "material shortages but expects to complete it soon. Ray Cowdery's "Larry Lou", No. 2024, will be ready for the water by Memorial Day, May 30th. Marold Eyestone's "Relampo" (Lightning in Portuguese) No. 1974 is due for the water in April. Frank Predergast, No. 2175, and Harold Stanley, No. 2401, will have their Lightnings in the water this summer. Harold Stanley expects to build a second one next winter. Mr. Montgomery has temporarily struck a snag but hopes to be sailing late this summer. Frank Allen, No. 1967,

is attending Santa Barbara State Teachers College and expects to build his boat in their boat shop. Thomas S. Jones, No. 1021, has shelled his boat until his new home on Lido Island, Newport Harbor, is completed.

Mr. Ridpath is attending a class in boat building in Long Beach where he is building his Lightning. It will probably not be in the water until next Fall. Bill Baum at B. W. Byrne and Sons Lumber Company has his Lightning under way.

At Balboa, I found one of the "lost sheep", boat No. 648, which is owned by R. H. Wattson. He has been in the service for four years and as the boat was launched without sails just before he entered the service, he did not have an opportunity to sail it until he was discharged. Around the Balboa Yacht Club, Mr. Robert C. Boyd really got the ball rolling so that Fleet No. 107 was organized with several members. This will be increased this year by quite a few more. Due to their boat builder, they were only able to get two boats into the water in 1946; now there are five with at least four more to follow shortly.

Around San Diego Bay, there were only two completed boats. A third one, No. 1909, being built by Steve Pennington, was sold to Mr. Turner who will have it in the water by May. Both the Ackermans and Daschner have done a lot toward starting the Class at San Diego. At the present time, Dick has orders for five new Lightnings. Dick has sold No. 1530 to J. W. Potts who has moved it to Balboa.

At Parker Dam, Mr. Gage is now beginning to construct his second Lightning.

In winding up this report, I wish to add that we expect a big turnout for the opening day at the San Diego Yacht Club Regatta on Memorial Day.

I have spent so much time for the Association my boat is not quite ready for the water, but soon I hope.

District Report—The first item of note in the Central Atlantic District is the addition of four new fleets since the publication of the last Yearbook, making a total of twenty fleets. Nine fleets were represented at the International Championship races at Skaneateles with a total of eleven entries and of those competing five finished in the first half. Fleet No. 3 is the largest Lightning Fleet with over 90 members and this in spite of the fact that a number of members withdrew to form new fleets. Barnegat Bay Fleet No. 3 furnishes hot competition for its members as will be noted in their Fleet report. Several fleets which have been inactive during the war years did not have a regular racing schedule in 1946 but all report new additions to their fleets with prospects for a good year in 1947 and in most cases expect to plan fleet races.

The neighboring Fleets No. 11 and 70 find added interest by racing jointly. Little Egg Harbor Fleet No. 26 was one of those represented at the Internationals and also at the open Lightning Regatta for Southern New Jersey. Metedeconk River Fleet No. 34 reports a banner year with several new boats and a regular schedule. Shore Acres Yacht Club Fleet No. 86 had a full season with 23 races. South Shrewsbury River Fleet No. 80 during 1946, which was their first year, held weekly races and also a post season race. They expect five new boats for the coming racing season. Conditions appear favorable in this District for the busiest season the Lightnings have ever had with all fleets showing an increase in membership.

District Report—The resurgence of activity in all yachting areas after the end of the war caught the Central New York District and carried us along on the crest.

Fleets which had been broken up by the call to arms were given a new birth. Fleets which were dormant because the urgency of war work denied their skippers the time to sail came to life and launched a schedule of races. New fleets at Sodus on Lake Ontario, Seneca Falls on Cayuga Lake, Newport on Irondequoit Bay and Lakeville on Conesus Lake have come into being.

Along with this trend of renewed activity, the fleets which had been able to operate throughout the war enjoyed a general expansion.

That the district was really alive was well evidenced by the presence of a goodly number of boats at all the regattas in which Lightnings were allowed to compete.

Seven out of the ten Lightnings which participated in the Lake Ontario Yacht Racing Ass'n. regatta held at Kingston, Canada were from our district and George Barnes of Skaneateles, C. C. Fleet No. 1 took top honors. Five boats from Crescent Y. C. Fleet No. 9 sailed 40 miles to this event.

Dr. John McIntosh of Irondequoit Bay Fleet 46 showed himself to be tops again at the C.N.Y. District Regatta sailed on Irondequoit Bay at Point Pleasant, N. Y., where his "Blue Jacket" No. 79 won both races. Eleven boats sailed in this event.

A fleet of twenty-five boats started at the Central New York Yacht Racing Assn. regatta held at Canandaigua Lake home of Fleet No. 44. Bill Straub with "Cygnus" No. 508 was high scorer of boats from the eastern end of the district.

The big event of the season was of course the Lightning Class Internationals held at Skaneateles, Fleet No. 1 playing host. This is also the birthplace of most of the Lightnings which were entered in the event. District Report—by Frank Pfefferle, past Secretary. Nineteen forty-six was another banner year for Lightnings in the Lake Michigan District. Of the early season events the Ohio Inter-club Yachting Association Regatta at Buckeye Lake on June 22nd and 23rd had the best turnout. Sixty-seven boats of various classes competed, but the Lightnings stole the show with 17 entries. Russ Luchtenberg of Buckeye Lake showed the Toledo skippers how to sail a Lightning on an inland lake, and took the three race series.

The top flight event of the season was the Sixth Annual Lake Michigan District Lightning Regatta. It was held in Maumee Bay on July 12th, 13th, and 14th, with the Toledo Fleet No. 42 as host, and sponsored by the Toledo Yacht Club. Forty-two boats, the largest entry list in the history of the class, answered the starter's gun at 2:30 Friday afternoon. Two more races were sailed on Saturday and all were sailed on a three-mile triangular course twice around.

The first race started out with stakes to starboard in a light breeze. Shortly after the start the wind hauled to the northwest and at first stake we found "Gail" No. 120, skippered by Garinger, "Ramblor Too" No. 949, Walt Vogel; and "Yankee Doodle" No. 800, Walt Swindeman in the lead position. The second leg was a reach and the third leg a spinnaker run, and at the end of which "Ramblor Too" was in the lead, followed by "Yankee Doodle", "Zig Zag", "Gail", "Two Bits" and "Candy". The second lap found the first three boats holding their positions while other boats moved up with the leaders and at the finish we had Vogel in "Ramblor Too" first by twelve seconds over Swindeman in "Yankee Doodle", with Yaudas in "Zig Zag" third. Pfefferle in "Zefr" just nosed out Garinger in "Gail" by two seconds for fourth place, with Nickels in "Two Bits" two seconds behind Garinger.

The second race was sailed in light and baffling air. On the first leg, which was a reach, Spitznaugle in "Sally Ann" was first with McMenemin, in "Butch Too" second, followed by Swindeman, Girkins, Siferd, and Yaudas. Fast spinnaker work put Swindeman in

the lead on the second leg and at the start of the beat home Swindeman was in the lead. The air flattened out on the weather leg and at the start of the second lap Swindeman was still in the lead with Yaudas second and Burtcher third. The second lap turned out to be a sailor's nightmare. The wind was spotty and very fluky, most of it was straight up and down. Swindeman and Yaudas finally got around to the last leg going homeward while the rest of the fleet just sat in groups. Swindeman led the way across the finish line on the starboard tack with Yaudas five minutes behind on a port tack, both boats headed in the same direction while the rest of the fleet were flying spinnakers. Ahrens came in third with Phillips fourth, Nickels fifth and Burtcher sixth.

Due to the fact so many of the skippers were late in getting back to the Club after the morning race, the afternoon race was postponed 'till 3:00 P.M. For awhile it looked like a repetition of the morning race but just before the five minute gun a lovely breeze out of the northeast greeted the starters of the last race. At the start Werkman moved out in front with Ladenburger and Vogel closing in. At the first mark Ladenburger led, followed by Vogel, Krauss, Girkins, Werkman, Pfefferle and Garinger. The second leg was a spinnaker run which saw many boats change positions, as they rounded the second mark for a reach home. At the end of the first lap Vogel led, followed by Ladenburger, Krauss, and Garinger. Swindeman was in eleventh place at the start of the second lap. Positions changed rapidly during the next two legs and as the boats rounded the last mark and headed for home, Vogel had a nice lead over Swindeman who had moved into second place, followed by Garinger, Werkman, Mauerer, and Burtcher. They finished in that order.

Walt Vogel, the defending champion, proved his mettle in this race after being becalmed in the morning and finished 23rd, which ruined his chances of retaining the championship. The final standings of the first ten boats: Walt Swindeman of Toledo Fleet, first; Cal Yaudas 2nd, Art Burtcher 3rd, both of Toledo; Herman Nickels of the Fenton Fleet, 4th, Walt Vogel 5th, Bill Girkins 6th, Jerry Garinger 7th, of the Toledo Fleet; Leo Mauerer of Chicago 8th; Dick Krauss of Toledo 9th, and Bill Phillips of Detroit River Fleet 10th.

Trophies and prizes were awarded at the dance held Saturday night, Clarence Crites being the Master of Ceremonies. Flags were given to the winners of each race and also the first three placers.

Walt Vogel presented the beautiful perpetual trophy to the new champion, Walt Swindeman, who holds the honor of being the first to win the trophy twice.

At the conclusion of the program a big applause was given to Clarence Crites and his entire Committee for their efforts in putting over one of the finest Regattas ever held.

By winning seven of the first ten places, the Toledo boys gave fair warning that they were going to give everyone at the Internationals a run for their money. This certainly proved to be the case, as Walt Swindeman brought home the International Championship Mug from Skaneateles. Cal Yaudas was 5th and Walt Vogel finished 7th. A record that is going to be mighty hard to beat.

The Lake Michigan District sailors don't really ever stop sailing, even though the bay and the lakes are frozen over. Every year they have a winter meeting.

This year the meeting was held on Sunday, January 25, 1947 at The Toledo Yacht Club. Our host was Toledo Fleet No. 42. One of the big drawing cards was Art Burtcher's beautiful new home built Lightning No. 2500.

Over 175 skippers and their friends from twelve different fleets attended the dinner and meeting. Fleet Captain Herron welcomed the membership and introduced Messrs. Ladenburger, McCain, Siferd, Burtcher, Crites, Commodore Boice, and Binkelman. The meeting was then turned over to District Secretary Frank Pfefferle.

After the Fleet Report there was a lively contest for the privilege of holding the 1947 District Regatta. South Haven, Buckeye Lake, and Devil's Lake, all put in strong bids. When all the ballots were in, South Haven came out on top.

Jack Nixon of South Haven was unanimously elected District Secretary for this year.

The 1947 Regatta will be held July 10th, 11th, and 12th and we are sure the South Haven boys will outdo themselves to put on the biggest and best District Regatta in the history of the Association.

"Doc" Miles of High-Tor Fleet No. 4, took 1st honors, with Fred Proven of High-Tor second and Henry Abreu of Chelsea third. The second race of this series was held in July at Grassy Point, with the tables reversed. Henry Abreu of Chelsea winning, with Sutherland of High-Tor second and Irving Kennedy of High-Tor in third place. The third race of the series was held August 11th, at Nyack, with Henry Abreu of Chelsea winning, G. Gilbert Parker of High-Tor second and "Pete" Pederson of Nyack third. Henry Abreu was declared Champion and received a silver cup, sponsored by the Hudson River Squadron, which will become a perpetual Trophy recording winners of the Hudson River Squadron competition.

The entire Chelsea Fleet No. 9 participated in the Newburgh Yacht Club Regatta held August 25th, for the Championship of Newburgh Bay. This event was won by Joe L. Jova of Chelsea in "Candy Kid". The Chelsea Fleet was represented in the Atlantic Coast Championship by Bill Menzler and Henry Abreu and in the Internationals by Joe L. Jova.

Nyack Fleet No. 75 (one of the younger Fleets) formed in 1945 are real proud of their champ, Mangus "Pete" Pedersen, who won the Atlantic Coast Championship, held at Riverside, Conn. on August 3rd and 4th. "Pete" also represented Nyack in the Internationals where he finished 17th out of the 54 competitors.

Active Fleet and Inter-Fleet competition was had by the Hewlett Bay Fleet No. 58. Their full schedule of 12 series races was completed in addition to Inter-Fleet competition with Cedarhurst Fleet No. 2. The competition for Fleet Champion and Runner-Up was very close and was not decided, until after the last race. Bob Grimmig, with his father and Bob Graff as crew in "Sea Spray" won the 1946 Champion Trophy. Leonard Pratt with his wife Florence and Donald Murray as crew, was runner-up in "Bon Joy". Bob Grimmig and Leonard Pratt represented the Fleet in the Atlantic Coast Championship and Leonard Pratt represented the Fleet in the Internationals. Alex Dougan, skipper of "Edna D" who competed in previous Internationals, has been an Official Measurer and active for some time in the Lightning Class Association's affairs. He was justly rewarded at the Annual Meeting, by being elected one of the Vice-Presidents of the Lightning Class Association.

Branford Yacht Club Fleet No. 63 had an active season of Fleet competition. Wayne Brockett in "Flame" held his rating as Fleet Champion and did a swell job in representing the Fleet in the Atlantic Coast Championship, finishing in 6th position out of 24 entries. Wayne also participated in the Internationals, but during the 1st race was forced to withdraw, when the 1st marker crept up on him unawares, causing an unavoidable collision. He carried on nobly in the next two races, finishing 11th in the 3rd race. Grant Biggs, Jr., sailing "Eager Beaver" was runner-up in the Fleet's competition.

Western Long Island Fleet No. 32 at Larchmont, outdid their expectations in season activities. The Fleet numbered 44 boats and their racing schedule comprised two Saturday and Sunday Series, 28 races in all, from early June until late September. Competition was very keen and honors were carried off by the Junior Skippers in the Fleet. Al. Eckhardt Jr. in "Feather", (13 years of age) was Champion, with Jim Amy (14 years of age), in "Frolic", runner-up. Paul Forsman Jr., in "Foose" and Steve Carr, in "Nola", who finished 3rd and 4th in the Fleet Series competition, made the race for Champion and runner-up a real close contest. Steve Carr won the "Caldwell" Trophy, a three series race, held August 31st, September 1st and 2nd, and with Paul Forsman Jr. and Al. Eckhardt Jr. represented the Fleet in the Atlantic Coast Championship. The Fleet's entries in the Internationals were Paul Ryan Jr., in "Bonnie" Anne", Jim Amy in "Frolic" and Ed. Cotter in "Bozo III". Paul Ryan Jr. who was held back by late delivery of his boat, thereby missing earlier competition, did a swell job for the Fleet by finishing 9th at the Internationals out of 54 entries. Watch him next season! Fleet No. 32 participated in its first Long Distance race on June 29th over a 17 mile course for the "Peggy Pick" Trophy. Al. Eckhardt Jr. in "Feather" was the winner with Jim Amy in "Frolic" finishing 2nd. It was a great day of sailing and was enjoyed by the 30 members participating, some of whom were towed home as darkness began to fall.

Fleet No. 32 also participated in the Little Neck Bay Fleet No. 55 Regatta at Douglaston on July 13th and returned the honors by

holding an Invitation Race at Larchmont on August 24th, when entries from Riverside Fleet No. 7, Douglaston Fleet No. 55, Hewlett Bay Fleet No. 41 and Larchmont Fleet No. 58 were represented. Due to the large number of entries in the Larchmont Invitation Race, the boats were divided into two divisions, one of Odd numbers and the other of Even numbers. The winner in the Odd Numbered Division was Jack Webb of Riverside, with Jim Amy of Larchmont in second position, while Paul Ryan Jr. of Larchmont won, with Jim Trenary of Riverside second in the Even Numbered Division. During race week at Larchmont, July 21st to July 28th, 48 Lightnings participated, which was the largest number of one class boats seen on Long Island Sound.

Western Conn. Fleet No. 7 at Riverside, Conn. had a very active season of Fleet Activities and participated in many Inter-Fleet Regattas on Long Island Sound. The Fleet Champ, Jack Webb with his dad "Al" and sister "Jane" as crew in "Rogue" established an excellent record. Besides annexing his Fleet Championship, Jack won the Y.R.A. of L. I. Sound Championship, the Douglaston Regatta, Larchmont Race Week, Fleet No. 32 Invitation Regatta at Larchmont, and N. Y. Yacht Club Junior Regatta. He also was runner-up in the Internationals, where he placed 4th in the 1st race and 7th in the third race; had he not been forced into a foul in 2nd race, he would have finished close to the top. An interesting event was held at Riverside Yacht Club known as the "Board of Governors Race", open to all entries regardless of size or class. Jack Webb sailing in "Ajax" came in second in this event against larger Class boats.

Little Neck Bay Fleet No. 55 at Douglaston, L. I. has been growing as "Russ" Collins keeps building more and more Lightnings. Seawanhaka Fleet No. 88 and Cold Spring Harbor Fleet No. 89 were restricted in activities due to delay in obtaining new Lightnings, but were able to hold a Regatta on August 31st. Thirty-one Lightnings competed, the event was won by Tim Edlund for Riverside Fleet No. 7, with Steve Carr of Larchmont Fleet No. 32 second and Paul Ryan Jr., also of Fleet No. 32 in 3rd position. These Fleets are looking forward to keen racing activity next season.

A number of new fleets have been recently formed. The American Yacht Club at Rye, N. Y. Fleet No. 96 formed late in 1946 participated in a number of events on Long Island Sound. A new Fleet at New Rochelle, N. Y., headed by "Burr" Jenkins as Captain and Ed Cotter, Secretary, known as The Execution Rocks Fleet No. 106, has just received their Charter and a new Fleet at Mamaroneck, N. Y. headed by Franz Pick is in the process of organization. All this activity means more and more Lightnings will be out racing next season.

District Report—The P.I.Y.A. Regatta last year was a big boost for Lightnings in this district. All three fleets were represented, and put in a fine performance. Eric Dowell, owner of "Ariel" No. 1197 and a member of Fleet No. 66, carried off top honors by winning all three races at Vancouver. The 1946 season at Cedarhurst was characterized by greatly expanded activities and a fleet increased to twelve boats by the addition of three new boats; Warren Crunden's "Nigger Joe" No. 1740, Pete Horner's "Puff" No. 1729, and Edward Bentley's "Impo-Lite" No. 1724. The Barnegat Fleet starting with six boats at Bay Head and Mantoloking in 1939 had grown to seventy Lightnings at the beginning of the 1946 season. While acting as a mother fleet, first secured acceptance as a racing Class in the Barnegat Bay Racing Association. Included in the Fleet were boats from all the yacht clubs sailing in the B.B.Y.R.A. series: Bay Head, Mantoloking, Shore Acres, Lavallette, Island Heights, Ocean Gate, Toms River and Seaside. Before the start of the 1946 season, several of these clubs had sufficient boats to form their own fleets. Accordingly, these groups withdrew to form the Shore Acres, Toms River, Lavallette and Seaside Fleets. At this time even after withdrawal of these fleets, new recruits brought the number to over ninety remaining in the No. 3 Fleet, which makes it the largest Fleet in the Association. Reported new boats under construction are expected to bring

this membership still higher by the time the 1947 racing season opens.

The hard fought series of ten races at Bay Head was won by Bud LaFountain in No. 1446 the "Flying Cloud". Second place went to Jack Orelup in "Javelin" No. 882 and third to Dave Berry in "Intrigue" No. 351.

The series of eight races for the championship of Barnegat Bay was won by Carl Behler, Jr. of Shore Acres. The final standings of the first ten boats in this series are given below. This series reached a new high with fifty-six boats competing. Moderate to fair winds prevailed with only one race at Mantoloking scratched because of a finish over the time limit.

The pre-war series of team races held at Beach Haven and on the upper Bay were resumed this year. The forty mile tow down to Beach Haven in the chop and blow and then the dusty going for the race only allowed a few clubs to finish all of their team. Lavalette won at Beach Haven and Shore Acres at Shore Acres. Berry, Van Duyne and Orelup represented the Bay Head Yacht Club. At the open regatta at Shore Acres, Dick Orelup in "Javelin" carried off the silver plate of the B.B.Y.R.A. Trophy. Dave Berry, Louise Cattus, and Jack Orelup represented the Fleet in the Atlantic Coast and International Regattas. The Fleet championship this year has been based on the Bay Head series rather than the B.B.Y.R.A. series due to the inter-fleet entries.

The mid-week series of Junior Lightnings proved very popular with fifteen or sixteen boats competing. Jimmie Wells finished in

first place in this series and also the Junior picnic race to Cattus Island. In view of the interest shown in the Junior Series, plans are underway for an expanded and organized Junior program for the coming year. Although the dates of the main racing schedule have not been set at this time, a full program is planned for the 1947 season, starting at the end of June until Labor Day. The home of Lightning Fleet No. 5 is the Chicago Corinthian Yacht Club, located at Montrose Harbor in Chicago. This harbor is one of the best protected and prettiest harbors on the Chicago Lake front, and is well worth a visit by sailors travelling either by land or by sea. Again we have come to the close of a very successful sailing season. There were more boats of all descriptions in the fleet than ever before, although a great many Lightning owners, did not enter their boats in any of the various scheduled races. As your Fleet Captain, I felt that through each and every series of races, including those sailed by Juniors and Top Juniors, there was keener competition than ever before. There was also marked improvement, especially on the part of "Ginger", skippered by Adam Eby which moved up from eleventh place in the Championship Series of 1945, to fourth place in this season's Championship races, and "Alglo" skippered by General Reif, which moved up from twelfth place in last year's Championship, to fifth place in this season's Championship. My sincere congratulations to both these skippers and their crews.

On July 12th, we had our Annual Clambake and races to Port Colbourne, and for the first time in many years, we had a beautiful day with a strong fifteen to twenty mile an hour southwesterly wind, which brought the first Lightning across the line at Port Colbourne, twenty-two minutes ahead of the first Cruising Class Boat—namely "Whitecap II". With the five minute handicap which the Cruising Class gave the Lightning, this meant that the Lightning beat Cruising Class boats by seventeen minutes in elapsed time.

First place honors were carried off by Cap. Faulkingham in "Sharon", second place honors went to the intrepid Fred Harris, who hauled the "Evelyn" all the way from Spofford Lake, N. H., and third place was a tie between Ross Stevens in "DeDe" and Erskine Baker in "Electron". The winner took possession of the perpetual Regatta Trophy for one year, and cups for the first three places and useful crew prizes were awarded.

We look forward to a very active 1947 season with the addition of eight new boats to the fleet. It is hoped and expected that the Maine Lightning Regatta will be held again this season with many more entries anticipated.

Additional boats at Mere Point, Prout's Neck, and Taylor Pond should lead to the resumption of the interclub races we used to have before the war.

The Club Championship was won by Wilbur Walton in "Nicki-Too" after a hotly contested three race series.

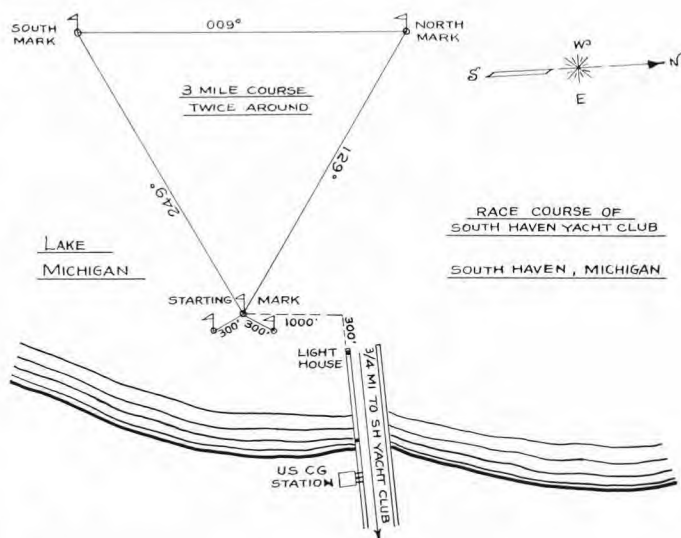

High-Tor Lightning Sailing Fleet No. 41, located at Stony Point on the Hudson, showed continued growth in membership and sailing interest in 1946.

There were a goodly number of races in our home waters, some exclusively among our own members and others in which visiting fleets participated. In addition we entered races at Chelsea and Nyack in which all three fleets participated, and at the Haverstraw Yacht Club which was a free-for-all. The high point skipper in our Fleet for the year was Doc Myles with 50 points; the runner-up was Frankie Sutherland, our 1947 Fleet Captain, with 40 points; third place was taken by Warren Basley with 38 points.

On August 3rd and 4th, two of our members sailed in the Atlantic Coast Championship races at Riverside, Conn., Doc Myles in "Leprecaun II" and Warren Basley in "Warmar II". Doc placed 7th and Warren 20th.

In the Internationals at Skaneateles in September, we were represented by our '47 Fleet Captain Frankie Sutherland. Frankie placed 37th in "Olde Salt", but we think he would have done better had he been able to keep his mast pointing skyward when he tried to raise that spinnaker in the "blow" during the second race.

The Internationals did not bring our racing season to a close. Some of the boys left their boats in the water until December, and a spirited race was held in blustery weather on Thanksgiving Day, three of our boats and one visiting boat participating.

Our Fleet had twelve boats at the start of the season when we were 4 stronger than during the previous year. New boats had been acquired by the 1946 Fleet Captain, Bill Stubbins, by Dave Provan,

The first three were Skaneateles boats; the last two were made respectively by Doc and by Gil, both of whom are master craftsmen and who turned out polished jobs. The only loss for the year was through the sale by Eucy Ganson of his "Irex", but Eucy will be back in the line-up again this year with his own boat. He did much skippering in 1946 in "Krustallos", Doc Myles' old "Leprecaun" purchased by August Miller. Gus was pretty well occupied with his business in New Jersey during the summer and was unable to sail with us regularly.

This report is written in early 1947, and we can report that there will be further growth this year. Four more new Lightnings have been built, three of them at the work-shop of Bill Sutherland at Grassy Point under Bill's supervision and with the help of the men themselves. These new boats are those of Ed McGovern, Larry Ryan and Elmer Jones, all of whom will be sailing with us in 1947. The fourth boat was built by Doc Myles for his daughter, Anita, who will skipper her own boat this year. It will be a great sight to see Stony Point Bay alive with 16 Lightnings.

Competition in 1947 will be keener. Among our most capable skippers are Tim Reilley, (a real veteran as you may perceive from the accompanying photograph which was taken March 1, 1947), Fred Provan and his father Dave Provan, Warren Basley, Eucy Ganson, Frankie Sutherland, Bill Stubbins and Charlie Oldfield. The newer skippers, such as Irv Kennedy with his two sons John and Irving, Gil Parker with his grandfather Olai Knudsen who is over 70 years of age, Gus Miller and the owners of the boats built since the '46 season, are expected to increase their sailing skill and add to the competition.

Our officers in 1946 were Bill Stubbins as Captain, Fred Provan as Secretary and Bud Tostevin as Treasurer. Our Fleet was signally honored during the annual meeting of the International Association at Skaneateles in having our Fleet Captain Bill Stubbins elected as Vice President of the International Association.

During the year one of our new members, Gus Miller, purchased a large undeveloped tract of land at our waterfront. The property has an excellent basin where boats can be safely moored (and has been so used for many years.) That basin will continue to be a center for lively activity among sailing-minded sportsmen. This purchase by Gus is just another indication of the growing interest in sailing in this section.

The Fleet devoted some attention during the season to the need for social contact among the members and their families. Chief among the events of this nature was a clambake at Grassy Point in September on Dr. Banta's picnic grounds and beach. It was a beautiful day, and the Hudson at its best. The boys and their families, including the children, had a swell time playing various games including baseball, ping-pong, horseshoes, and just visiting.

We are happy to report, also, that our Fleet and the Chelsea and Nyack Fleets have completed the organization of the old Mid Hudson River Squadron. At a meeting held in Bear Mountain Inn in January of 1947, by-laws were adopted and officers elected for the Squadron. The Inter-fleet racing will now be conducted by the Squadron officials, patterning the races after the Atlantic Coast and International events. This should add much interest to the inter-fleet events.

The 1947 season should be our banner one, and we look forward to it with great anticipation.

Walter Swindeman of the Toledo Fleet was the winner and the first skipper in the history of the Lake Michigan District Lightning Class Races to win this Regatta twice, Swindeman having held this championship in 1943. Forty-eight entries were received for this Regatta, with forty-two boats starting the first and second race. Forty boats sailed in the third race.

We wish to express our gratitude to the Toledo Yacht Club for its share in making this the most outstanding District Regatta ever held by the Lightning Class Association, even larger than any National Regatta up to that date.

He entered his boat in the Lightning race of the Cleveland Yacht Club Regatta and fully expected to knock this one off with ease. The race turned out to be a windward, leeward affair of about six miles on a glassy sea with very little breeze. To cut a long story short, our friend Hall met the entire Cleveland Yacht Club Lightning Fleet coming back as he was about halfway out on the first leg. A much chastened Hall tucked his tail between his legs and set out for home to read again and again the Manual for Lightning Skippers and resolved to tune and retune the "Restless".

Carl and Gordon Schuller had been heckling Pat Young to get out and sail last year's champion boat, "Ruth M. II" so that he came out a few times and with the Schullers crewing for him he easily beat the rest of the fleet. This seemed to get Pat all steamed up and now he is Lightning "Crazy", even to the extent of forgetting golf, his first love. Anyhow for the rest of the season through the Championship series, Pat consistently took first place with poor Hall "beating his brains out" trying to find the right combination. It wasn't till the last two races of the season that the "Restless" was again able to beat the "Ruth M. II". It must have frightened Pat more than a little for he has lightened his boat this winter, had his sails repaired and cleaned and has the bottom like a piece of satin. He is quite confident though for we hear he is renaming his boat the "Eight Ball" so the rest of the fleet will know where they are.

Edgewater's Fleet turned out en mass for the Greater Cleveland Sesqui-Centennial Regatta in June. There were 17 Lightnings from various clubs along the South Shore of Lake Erie entered in the two day regatta. Both days the wind was very freakish. Often times a contestant would find himself first and then a few minutes later be left in a dead spot and be near the tail end. Pat Young with the Schullers crewing for him in "Ruth M. II" took second place on points for the two days and Al Wendling in "Anna-Ree" and Hal Hall in "Restless" tied for fourth. We understand that the Greater Cleveland Regatta will be an annual event and look forward to many good Lightning races in seasons to come.

In the past, while participating in intra-fleet activities, spinnakers were not used, for some of the skippers didn't have them. However, in 1947, we all expect to have spinnakers and our enjoyment of Lightning racing should be that much greater.

We are all out to take the Club Championship in 1947 for every-one of us would like to be the fleet representative at the Internationals at Toledo.

The 1946 season proved very successful for the Lake Fenton Lightning Fleet, with sixteen races scheduled and raced; five boats entered in the Lake Michigan District Regatta at Toledo; and one boat entered in the Nationals.

Undoubtedly the most spectacular thing that happened in the 1946 season to the Pontiac Yacht Club Lightning Fleet was the way it grew. In 1944 the Fleet numbered twelve boats. The 1945 season saw two new boats added, but it was not until the Spring of 1946 that the real expansion took place. For it was then, with the release of materials to the boat builders, that Fleet No. 54 jumped from a nice sized Fleet of fourteen to the record breaking number of twenty-eight boats! And as this is written there is a strong possibility that two more will be added to the roster by 1947! This certainly is proof that P.Y.C. skippers are among the

most enthusiastic in the Lightning Association, and are staunch supporters and promoters of the Lightning Class.

With such an upsurge of interest in sailing we did not confine our activities to racing one another in our weekly Wednesday evening and Sunday morning series, but branched out and competed with two neighboring clubs. We again raced our rivals from Lake St. Clair, the Detroit River Fleet, in a home and home series and were fortunate to come out on the long end of the score by the skin of our teeth. Then later in the season we invited the newly organized Lightning Fleet from Bayview Yacht Club of Detroit to Pontiac for a race and potluck picnic. The extra ballast they picked up at mealtime must have been the reason for their downfall, for they certainly are a grand bunch of sailors and a tough gang to beat.

There were lighter moments interspersed with the racing schedule. The Pontiac Yacht Club is primarily a place for the whole family to relax and enjoy a day of picnicking and swimming, in addition to sailing. On the fourth of July and once more on Labor Day there was a big party for all the members and their families. There was fun and frolic for children and grownups, and enough icecream and "pop" to satisfy the most ravenous youngster. The afternoons were taken up with sailing and crew races, in which the tables were turned and skippers found out about balky spinners and improperly trimmed jibs.

Fleet No. 54's intra-club racing was divided into two parts. One was an informal series of races held every Wednesday night throughout the summer. The competition in these events was stiff and the sailor with a knowledge of celestial navigation held a distinct advantage, as it was no mean trick to locate that blacked out number 3 buoy on a dark night.

The races that determined the Fleet champion were held every Sunday morning, rain or shine, from April 27th through October 12th. These races were divided into two series—the first running from the start of the season to July 7th—the second, from July 20th through September 28th. The top three skippers of the first series and the top three sailors of the second series raced on October 5th and 12th for the Fleet Championship. When the evening of October 12th arrived and we had wiped the spray from our faces and tallied scores it was found that our club commodore and his crew, sailing "Judy-Kay" were the Fleet Champions. Laird Ahrens in "Quicksilver" was runner-up, and Charles Buck was third in his "Buccaneer".

All told it was a great season for Fleet No. 54. We doubled in size, by increasing the number of Lightnings in our Fleet to twenty-eight boats, had a very active season in racing among ourselves and competing with other clubs, and participated in Lightning Association activities by sending five boats to the District Regatta at Toledo and one to the Internationals at Skaneateles.

These three boats went out without outboards this year, just to make things interesting and enjoyed fine sailing the whole cruise.

Our Lightning skippers were glad to welcome the "Jolly Roger" into the Fleet this year and your Secretary predicts that this is a boat to watch in the 1947 series. Don Butt has reversed the process by

Fleet No. 75 has completed its second year of sailing activities and has increased its fleet from four to eight Lightnings. The Newport Yacht Club Fleet No. 77 has grown from a minimum of three boats to ten during the past year, and with the expectation of at least five boats sailing in competition by the middle of the 1947 season. Besides the original three charter members, four of the new boats, owned by Gene Senn, Doris Ash, Bill Straub and Darwin Smith, have sailed on Irondequoit Bay during the 1945 season under the Algonquin Burgee No. 46. Erwin S. Coy brought in a new boat No. 1958 in July as did Roy Umbehaun No. 2149 in August, and Dr. Morris H. Missal graduated from a Snipe that he sailed

with the N.Y.C. during the summer season, and bought No. 434 which had previously sailed on the bay.

During the year, nineteen official races were run, over a 2 1/2 mile course, twice around. The morning race usually started about 11:00 and the afternoon race at 2:30. Five other fun races were sailed. Bill Straub stood out as the man to beat and wound up winning eighteen out of the nineteen races he entered. Gene Senn was runner-up sailing every race, while Thomas Sullivan was a close third.

During the summer and fall the fleet sailed three races with the Algonquin Fleet No. 46 and Doc McIntosh in "Blue Jacket" won with three firsts, Ernie Hamilton in "Quest" was runner-up and Bill Straub was third.

Bill Straub in "Cygnus" did all the visiting for the fleet at three different regattas. He entered the New York Regatta and in competition with 27 Lightnings won the event in two races. The third being called off because of high winds. He then went to Buffalo for the Labor Day weekend to the Championship and Invitational Regatta held by the B.C.C. and drew a sixth. He then went to the eighth Annual Internationals Championship Regatta at Skaneateles Lake with hopes high, with a large quantity of sleeping pills for

jumpy nerves, Bill entered the International Championship taking for crew Erwin S. Coy and Art Metz. Bill was handicapped at the start having to sail without his best jib, which had stretched during the season to where it would not measure in, and was forced to sail in three races with a flat jib. His best race for the meet was a 4th which he drew in the second race, the breezy one, and finished fourteenth with 108 points, which was at least in the bracket of the first quarter of the fleet.

We ran a Frost-Bite series of fourteen races with a Snipe Fleet of the N.Y.C. who have twenty-seven boats. The event was run on a handicap basis for the odd races and a swap-boat for the even number races. The course was shortened so that two or three races were run on a Sunday. A great deal of interest was created, no doubt because of the fact that nearly every race was won by a Lightning regardless of who the skipper was. The final standing would have favored the Lightning group better had we sailed over two of the races in winds stronger than six to eight miles per hour. As it was, in eight or ten of the races a number of the boats D.N.F., which is not Lightning weather. As it was, the best showing at the Lightning Fleet was "yours truly" in "Ship-A-Coy" with a third, followed by Bill Straub and Gene Senn.

During the winter we plan many rocking chair sessions, sharpening up on racing tactics, as well as instilling keen interest for a successful 1947 season to come.

Gordon Shaw represented the fleet at the Nationals and reported, "Skipper and Crew had a wonderful time."

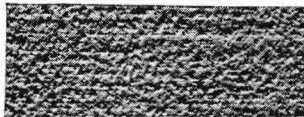
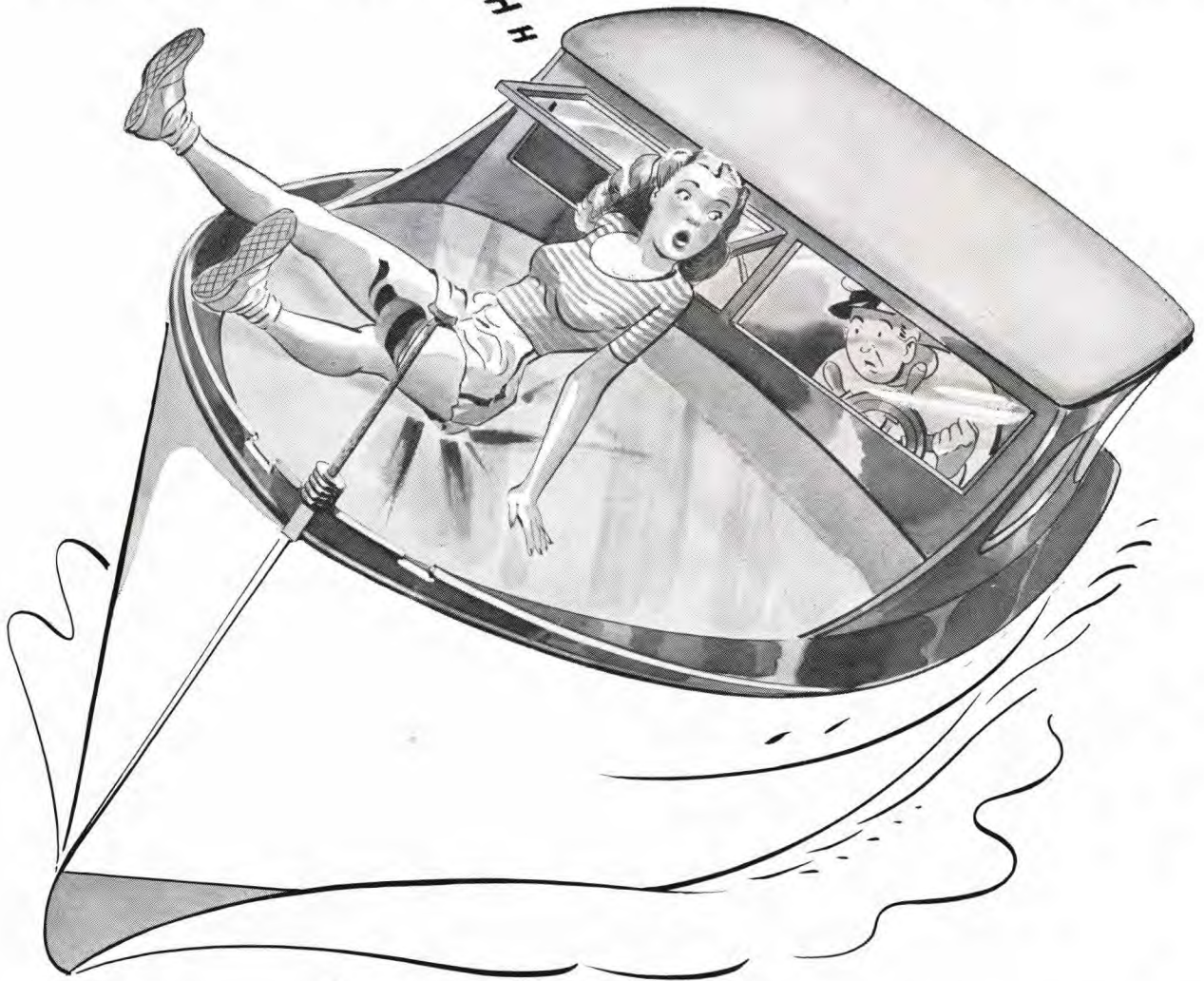

REQUIREMENTS

In addition to payment of a royalty or number tax a yacht, its spars, rigging, and sails, must conform strictly throughout with respect to design, dimensions, construction and material to the official plans and specifications of the Lightning Class Association to be considered a Lightning and be eligible to the Lightning Class.

The Association's measurement certificate is the only recognized proof of eligibility to the Lightning Class.

CHANGES IN OWNERSHIP

Report to the Association Secretary promptly all changes in Lightning Ownership. This is extremely important. If you know of any changes not now recorded, please advise and all members please keep a weather eye peeled for the owners of the boats listed in our Lost Column. We believe our registry of all Lightnings to be better than 90% correct, which is pretty good, but it can be better if all will cooperate and report changes in ownership promptly.

MEASUREMENT CERTIFICATES

A yacht is eligible and considered in the Lightning Class only if it conforms to measurement rules as certified by a Class measurement certificate, has been properly registered, and is owned by a qualified active member recorded at the time as in good standing with the Association. No yacht shall be eligible to enter any sanctioned race for the Lightning Class until measurement certificate has been granted for such yacht.

Attention is directed to Article XIV of the By-Laws: "The enforcement of Class rules is essential to the protection of all owners in a one-design class. Members are required to report to the Association any race held for the Lightning Class as such, wherein Class rules are not respected and enforced by the organization conducting it or where entries of ineligible yachts are knowingly accepted. A member who makes himself a party to such a practice by knowingly and after due warning, entering such outlawed events shall himself be subject to suspension."

MOVIE FILMS

The Lightning Class Association has 16 mm Kodachrome movie films of the 1941, 1942, 1944 Nationals and 1945 and 1946 Internationals. These films are available to fleets, yacht clubs or other interested groups upon application to the Executive Secretary. There is no charge for the use of these films, but the user is expected to handle carefully, return promptly and pay shipping costs and insurance. Requests for these films should be made as far in advance as possible.

ORGANIZE A LIGHTNING FLEET

A fleet organization provides activity and organized competition, thus increasing the enjoyment of owning a Lightning. It adds to the interest in the Class and is a powerful inducement to others to join the class, fleet and club. Yacht Club affiliations for a fleet are not necessary but often found desirable.

Requirements for a Fleet charter are simple. Any three or more owners of Lightnings who are active members of the Association at one location which is not already served by a Lightning Fleet may apply for a charter. Application blank may be obtained from the Executive Secretary. There is no charge for the application or charter.

Upon acceptance of a fleet application, the Association issues an attractive charter printed on parchment paper suitable for framing, containing the names of all charter members.

Write the Association Secretary or your District Secretary if you want any help in organizing a fleet.

MEETINGS — REPORTS — PENALTIES

We quote from the Association By-Laws, Articles I, III, and IV.

ARTICLE I

Fleet Business and Meetings

1. The Annual Meeting of each Fleet shall be held not later than December 1st of each year, and results of election of Fleet officers shall be filed with the Association.

ARTICLE III

Renewal of Charter

1. Each Fleet is required to file an annual report with the Association during January of each year in order to renew its rights and privileges under its charter.

ARTICLE IV

Reports and Returns (Penalties)

1. If the annual report of fleet or annual dues and registrations of members has not been received by the Association on or before March 1st they become automatically suspended. In the case of new fleets the same applies upon demand.

Registry of Lightning Owners

(Corrected to March 15, 1947)

Every effort has been given to making this registration list accurate. Literally hundreds of letters have been written to trace missing owners. While most builders and dealers have been wholly cooperative in advising of sales, we regret to say that some do not respond to inquiries and others have kept no records of the names and addresses of purchasers. In spite of these difficulties we can say with assurance that this registry list is about 90% accurate. With the help and cooperation of members, we can make next year's list even more accurate.

The Executive Secretary, Bank of South Haven Bldg., South Haven, Michigan, should be advised promptly of all changes in owner's names, addresses, sailing locations, fleet affiliations and boat names. Members are urged to obtain the names and addresses of new Lightning sailors in their neighborhoods and report them to the Executive Secretary. In this way, missing owners may be located.

Where a boat is listed as owned by a "builder" or "dealer", it means that the Association office has the name of the builder or dealer who sold the boat, but the name of the purchaser has not been ascertained. When a builder's or dealer's name is used, it means that the boat is actually owned and probably is in use by that individual or concern.

Where boat number is followed by an asterisk (*), it means that there is a measurement certificate on file for this boat. All boats not so marked do not have measurement certificates on file.



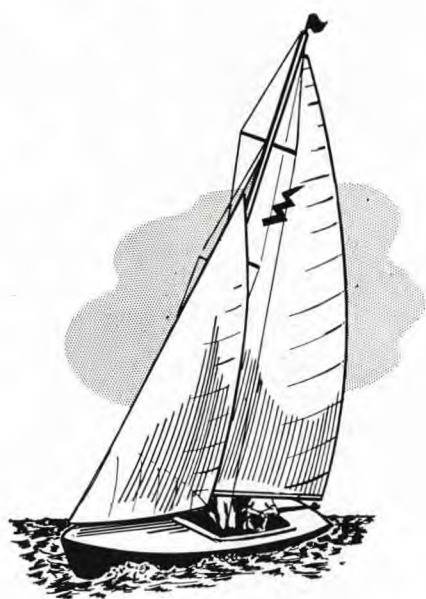

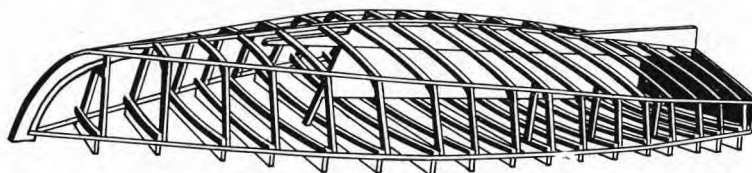

Here is a log of construction of Silver Heels, Lightning No. 982, built by Frederick J. Gottwald and William S. Owen of Fall River, Mass. It is an interesting and careful record that reveals their love of the work and the pride they must feel in the completion of a job well done.

She was then towed to camp at the south end of South Watuppa Lake by Albert Chenard with his outboard motor, arriving there at 8:25 P.M. with William at the tiller.

Fred, William's father and Roland Gagne, who towed the boat on trailer from 88 Kennedy St., to launching site, met Al and and William at the camp when they arrived.

Mooring was put in and she was moored for the night.

Had first sail in her on Saturday, July 1, 1944.

Last sail on October 22, 1944, the day she was hauled out and put in boathouse for the winter.

Took stills and movies of her that day also, ending a very successful season.

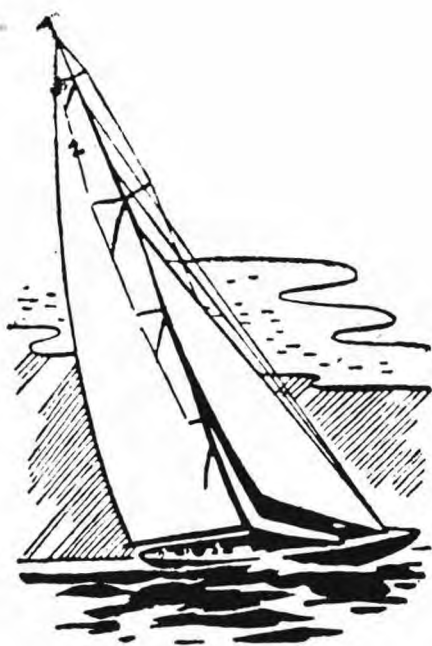
Associate Members and Crew

Also included in this list are members who are not boat owners at the present time, but desire to continue their support of the Association by paying the required non-boat owners dues. The surprise to us is that the list of Associate members is not far bigger than it is—not only because crew members deserve this recognition, but also because no skipper can enter any sanctioned Lightning event unless his crew consists of Associate or Active members from his fleet or locality, properly enrolled on the Association records. (Article VII of Lightning Rules). The names of co-owners of Lightnings do not appear in this list as they are shown in the official Registry List.
