If it wasn't for Lightnings...

...Layline would not be in business!

Everyone has been there, right out of college, trying to get your first used Lightning up to racing snuff. For me it was 1985 and my boat was 9771. The following projects drove me to start Layline.

Floatation Bags: Remember how the older boats seemed to be going straight to the bottom after the gunnells would "gently slip" under and all that water would rush forward kicking the stern in the air? I had this problem and went in search of inflation bags. My local guy tried to sell me big chunks of Styrofoam, the hot catalog at the time was unhelpful and never sent me the catalog I requested. Whiff One.

Cam Cleats and Ball Bearing Bullet Blocks: 9771 came with a fairly new Bryant Aluminum Spar Set, the board was not stainless but was in good shape. All of the controls were antiques and needed replacing.

Harken's "New" cam cleats and Bullet Blocks were the coolest thing since sliced bread. I had been sailing Lightnings with Rick Ferguson. Anybody remember Rick? He was "sick" and had all of the latest go fast toys.

I went to the local store and they tried to sell me stainless cam cleats and those old stainless blocks with the white pulley inside. Aaarrggghhh. Whiff two.

I called a new catalog business that seemed to have everything. (W.M.) I told them what kind of boat I had and what I was looking for. All they could do was take a catalog request, 6 weeks later the catalog arrived. Uuuggghhh. Whiff three.

Validation that Walt has a weak mind accompanied by a low IQ.

The light bulb in my young, innocent and limited mind lit up and I thought, "Hey, here is a market opportunity". I took the big leap. Now, 16 seasons later I'm still selling sailboat parts and racing with friends. Each year, I take the IQ test, scoring low enough that I am allowed to stay in the "business".

If it was not for Lightnings, I might have a real job and actually be able to afford my own boat and the time during the summer to race it.

In the spring, put a little "Vaseline" on the gaskets, keeps things running smoothly. If your bailers are leaking, you can try to replace the gaskets. Over the years, we have found that putting a whole new bailer in properly solves the problem.

THE 2002 LIGHTNING YEARBOOK IS DEDICATED TO ADRIAN IRVING. ADRIAN EMBODIED THE SPIRIT OF THE LIGHTNING CLASS WITH HIS ENTHUSIASM, DEDICATION AND CORINTHIAN NATURE.

Adrian Irving died last August at the Lightning North Americans in Burlington. He was 60.

While the circumstances of his death alone might warrant dedicating this yearbook to him, it is the way Adrian lived his life and loved our beloved square boat that makes us want to honor his memory.

Beyond his considerable gifts as a sailor, Adrian was an incurable Lightning evangelist. He was notorious for bringing people into the class. One Saturday morning he'd introduce you to a new sailor who'd signed on to do the bow on his boat. You'd shake hands...repeat the new name to yourself quietly a couple of times. Later, you might tap them a beer at the keg after racing and not think too much more about it. That is, until you found yourself handing them an open bag of Twizzlers in the back seat of Adrian's regattamobile at 2:30 am, 150 miles South of Chattanooga on the way to St. Pete the following March. These people Adrian picked up on the dock at the boat park became our life long friends. Lots of people might get people to try the Lightning. People stuck to Adrian.

One February in Chicago, I found myself without work, or immediate prospects, going stir crazy with cabin fever. I called Adrian up and asked if he'd meet me to sail Lasers. The next day I found him in the parking lot at noon changing out of his business suit and into a dry suit. We sailed windward-leewards for 2 hours—ice forming on the deck in front of the masts. Climbing into his car he said, "Don't tell Dale. She'll think we've both gone crazy." I asked if he could meet me the next day. I suspect he cancelled a meeting to be there.

He was unique and universal, loud and quiet. He was big and strong and soft. Your feet left the ground when he gave you a bear hug. He went sailing while others talked about liking heavy air. He told us how proud he was of Dale—even when it was just guys standing around talking. He moved the tiller too much. It has been intimated that he was a pretty lousy dancer. Untold numbers of us can say, "he was my friend".

And as we unzip our boats this spring at Pymatuning or North Cape or Devils Lake or Lake Carlyle we are finding that his company is irreplaceable.

The ILCA Fund

The International Lightning Class Association has been granted status as a 501(c)3 charity by the Internal Revenue Service. Just like gifts to the United Fund and the Olympic Committee, gifts to the I.L.C.A. can be deducted from income in computing your taxes. You can make a gift and the I.L.C.A., of course, gets the full value of your gift to use for many worthy projects. A donor may specify a particular use for the donation or allow it to go to the general operating budget. Stock may also be transferred to the I.L.C.A. with added tax advantages.

The I.L.C.A. Fund was formed in 1982 to give some direction and impetus to the solicitation of charitable gifts. The I.L.C.A. Fund is directed by a committee of five I.L.C.A. members who serve staggered three year terms. Each year members send gifts along with their I.L.C.A. dues. Several large gifts have been received, including a 30 acre farm in Mississippi and the funds to purchase the beautiful Masters' Trophy awarded each year at the St. Petersburg Regatta. Income from the I.L.C.A. farm is earmarked for use in promotion of Lightning sailing. Other uses of the fund change each year as the requirements of the Class and office vary.

The long term objective of the Fund is to build an endowment equal to two hundred percent of the I.L.C.A.'s annual budget. This should help guarantee that the Class will remain solvent and to ensure future sailors the opportunity to enjoy the excitement and fellowship of sailing Lightning Class sailboats.

Most sailors who have been members of the I.L.C.A. for several years come to realize that the value they receive from participation in the sport of racing and sailing Lightning Class yachts is much greater than the \$45.00 annual dues. Gifts to the Fund provide a means, with help of the tax deduction, to pay the I.L.C.A. back.

When you pay your membership dues, include something extra as a gift to the Fund. Available in 2002, for an additional \$50, you will receive a gold sticker to place proudly on your boat that will allow others to see you love the class. When you see a gold sticker on someone's boat this summer, say Thank You.

Andy Horton and I had decided to co-skipper the series, with Andy steering St. Pete and me steering in Miami. We both love sailing Savannah so it came to a coin toss which Andy won - so he got the driving nod.

Wind yesterday was out of the NE any where between 5 and 15 knots in true Savannah fashion. It was a good day by Savannah standards - no capsize, no anchoring, no gnats on the water, and the usual great RC work.

Race one started up the Skidaway River and the course was one lap plus one leg to port (that's the best way to describe it). We had a good start in the middle of the line and stayed out of trouble - we were able to consolidate the lead before the first turn and after some close challenges from Dave Peck, Mike Breault, Greg Fisher, and Ched Proctor on the first downwind leg we were able to pull away from the pack.

By the start of race two the breeze had shifted further to the right and the start was not as far up the skidaway. The course was two and 2/3 laps with the finish near the club. We got a decent start about 1/3 of the way up from the left end of the line, but Greg Fisher, Sean Fidler, and Jeff Linton were all able to cross us and at the first mark it was Fidler, Linton, Fisher, Proctor, and us. Very weird and interesting as you sail into the edges of the river and hit bottom in order to stay out of the current. Oh yes did I mention the bugs.

We have 4 Canadian boats sailing. Mine 14&24, Larry MacDonald OCS&3 (Hamilton), Ross Bailey 27&14(Thunder Bay) and Jamie Allen 20&16 from Montreal. Lots of crew from Canada as David Gorman has Valarie Tardiff and Chantel Leger from Montreal and Jess Simpson is with Bill Mauk.

Hector and Hugo had already decided to sail the 2001 Southern Circuit but they didn't have a third crew. They asked me but I was not sure if I could make it because school was about to begin by that time. When they finally found someone to crew for them, he canceled so they called again begging me to go; arguing that we sailed well together and that I was doing a really good job onboard. I said yes.

March 7th was one of the longest days in my life. My parents had let me go and I was very anxious but ready to go. I was ready to jump on the plane that would take me to paradise. The next day we were already in Miami and ready to go to Savannah to sail and have fun. The regatta was actually great and we did have lots of fun, but those bugs were really annoying! They bit me everywhere. Savannah left me speechless for its beauty. I also met a lot of friendly people there. We didn't have good results but it was a great experience and we learned a lot too.

When we got to Miami we stayed at Fay Regan's, a woman very well known for her love of the Lightning Class and for taking good care of friends. We even borrowed her car to travel to Savannah and St. Pete. I would like to publicly thank Fay for all what she did for us during the regatta. We had a lay day in Miami, which helped us relax in paradise, and we also got to sail and got used to the sailing site.

The first day of racing we got out very confident of ourselves and ready to put in practice all that we had learned in our training. We sailed three races with varying intensities of wind and we fared ok. Much like we expected. The next day was blowing harder and we knew we could get better results with these conditions, which we did, helping us get a final 12th for the regatta.

Each day was a new sailing lesson for me and I felt that I was really learning to sail much better, getting to know the boat and most importantly, getting to know more people in the class. Everyone was congratulating me and it felt really great. It felt very good to be sailing with such good sailors as Hector and Hugo who made it all worth being there. Miami was great and the sailing conditions better. Also very important was the camaraderie among sailors which made me feel even better.

Our final destination was St. Pete, a really, really nice place. We didn't have a spare day but we found a good friend who showed us how the wind and current work in the area. This made us more comfortable. We didn't have good finishes the first day because we had the current issue a bit mixed up. The second day we started two very fine races in which we had top spots, helping us recover positions. Only one day was left, one that would be a long one because I would have to travel back to Buenos Aires the same day.

It was cool and windy since very early and we were afraid they might not start the race. But they did. It was blowing hard but we were confident and had a good start. We got to the windward mark fifth and were going very fast. Close to the leeward mark we got very close to capsizing but Hector and Hugo's skills allowed us to recover quickly and keep sailing.

In the last leg the wind favored the side opposite of where we were, making us lose some boats and ending in 11th place.

I can't remember just how many people I met in the circuit. I made good friends like Mike and Valerie from Canada and so many nice people that I would never end naming them all. This trip helped me grow and mature and learn so much. It was wonderful to me both as a life and a sailing experience. I learned to feel the adrenaline of racing and at the same time the friendship on and off the boat.

With this letter I would like to urge people of my age to get closer to the Lightning. I feel it is a very open and warm group off the water while at the same time is very competitive on the water. If you have the opportunity that I had - don't think twice, you owe it to yourself to sail the Southern Circuit because they are really a lot of fun.

I am very grateful for the fabulous hospitality and organization throughout the circuit and sincerely hope they will take me back.

2001 CALIFORNIA CIRCUIT

Coronado Yacht Club and Mission Bay Yacht Club,
San Diego CA, April 8-13

What could be better for a midwestern sailor than spending a week in San Diego in April racing Lightnings? Warm temperatures, sunny skies, definitely better conditions than back home in Michigan right? Wrong! Try temperatures in the fifties and sixties while back home it was in the seventies and eighties-oh well.

I was racing with my long time Lightning skipper, Joel Humphrey. This was our third time out to San Diego for the California Circuit Championship. Last year we chartered a boat from Al Poindexter and finished second overall. Luckily, we were able to get this boat once again, even though Al had sold it to Jeff Coppens. Jeff was part of the winning team last year along with Jim Sears and Dan Moriarty. Jeff and Jim Sears were co-skippering this year in Al's boat, got it? OK.

With the boats all figured out, it was time to go racing. One of the best things about this regatta is the different sailing venues and conditions throughout the week, ranging from very short flat-water courses to lumpy ocean round the buoys races to a long-distance race. A distance race in a dinghy? Yes. This race throws everything at you, including the kelp.

Anyway, the racing started on Sunday April 8, with a regatta in the flat waters of San Diego Bay. We were sailing as part of a multi-class weekend regatta hosted by the Coronado Yacht Club that was supposed to start on Saturday, but due to high winds, was postponed until Sunday. The starts included such boats as the Inter 20, Hobie Fox, 505's, Flying Dutchman's and of course Lightnings. The multi-hulls sailed triangles while we did windward-leeward courses. We did four races Sunday with the last two counting for the Circuit. Generally we started at the pin and went left, picking up a nice geographic shift in the last third of the leg. We finished 5, 1, 2, 2 out of 11 boats for the weekend regatta win and a nice start for the week.

Local ace Scott Finkboner was second with 12 points followed by John DeBenedetti from Oregon in third with 18 points. Monday's racing finished up the Coronado Bay Series with another three races. This time the Lightnings had the bay all to ourselves. Conditions were similar to Sunday's racing with 12-15 knots from the West, so again, the left was favored. The most memorable event had to be Merlin Green's capsize on the last leg of the second race (downwind finish) where he drifted across the finish line turtle for a legal finish!

After three races with finishes of 4, 1, 6 we were in first place with 15 points followed by Jerry Neuberger with 17 points, and Scott Finkboner with 19. This was some very tight racing, with no one winning more than one race each. Unfortunately, after Monday's racing, we lost our ace middle crew, Molly Hopkins, to commitments back home in New Hampshire.

Tuesday, good news! Allison Weber offered to crew with us for the rest of the week. She came down with her dad, Dave, who was crewing with John DeBenedetti. This day was the Marathon, a twenty mile distance race that takes us up San Diego Bay, out into the ocean and around Point Loma, then up the coast to Mission Bay, finishing in front of the Mission Bay Yacht Club. For those who have never done the Circuit, this race alone is worth the trip. Where else can you go distance racing in a Lightning? Anyway, we started in the shadow of the Coronado Bay Bridge, with a downwind, spinnaker start. Our plan was to start to weather of the fleet and cover Jeff and Jim who have a knack at doing really well in this race. John DeBenedetti jumped out in the lead at the start and we spent the next hour trying to pass him as the wind slowly went forward. Our run became a tight reach, and then finally a beat as we worked the left shore up the bay. The leg out the main shipping channel into the ocean was a beat, and the fleet split left and right for each shore. We stayed left and took the lead, making sure we covered Jeff and Jim - and Scott Finkboner, who lives on Point Loma and maps out the kelp beds every year. We rounded the only mark of the course, sea buoy #3, and set our kite for the reach up the coast. Jerry Neuberger rounded a close second, with Jeff and Jim in third. The strategy for this part of the race is to

sail close to shore to stay out of the current. However this is also where the kelp lives. Oh the KELP! The problem with being in front on this race is that you have to find the route through the kelp, and everyone else gets to see where to go and not go. Jerry had outstanding speed on this leg and was slowly grinding us down all the way to the entrance channel at Mission Bay. We entered the channel with about a 100-yard lead on Jerry, and worked on surfing the waves to extend our lead. Then Jerry got the BIG ONE!

A rouge wave right out of the movie "The Perfect Storm", it must have been 30 feet high! We watched in amazement as it picked up Jerry's boat and shot them nearly straight down the face. I thought for sure that they would pitchpole! Luckily they didn't; instead they cut our lead to about four boatlengths with that one wave, which we never got, of course. After that excitement it was just a drag race up Mission Bay to the finish. We finished first, followed by Jerry Neuberger, Jeff and Jim, then Paul Wurtzebach. This was Paul Wurtzebach's first distance race in a Lightning and he said it was "interesting."

After the Marathon the Circuit standings were us with 16 points, Jerry Neuberger with 19 and Jeff & Jim tied for third with Paul Wurtzebach at 25 points. Thursday's racing was back to around the buoys out in the ocean (Wednesday was a day off) for the first day of the Mission Bay Series. Mike Brewer and Paul Wurtzebach both had it turned on today, each winning a race. We won the last race of the day, extending our overall lead a bit. However, Paul Wurtzebach was now tied with Jerry Neuberger for second overall just seven points back and four races to go. Jeff & Jim were now in third just one point behind Paul and Jerry. That

night the fleet was treated to Scott Finkboner's annual world famous grilled Mahi Mahi dinner. Absolutely outstanding!

Friday. Last day. With four races on Mission Bay, the races would be short, fast and intense. Boathandling had to be perfect, no mistakes or the whole fleet would sail by. Our strategy was to cover Jerry Neuberger and Paul Wurtzebach at all costs. Jim Sears seized this opportunity to win the first two races and close the gap on us. Now Jim was in second overall, just four points back, with Paul in third eight points back and Jerry ten points back. Arrghh! Now we had to cover Jim hard! The third race was a classic match race start with Jim where we worked to control him at the Committee Boat. This succeeded and we covered him the whole race, taking a second with Jim getting fourth. Scott Finkboner won this race with Jerry in third. Okay, we could loosen our grip a little; things were looking pretty good. Scott Finkboner won the last race with Paul Wurtzebach second, followed by Jim Sears, and then us in fourth. That's OK, we won the circuit with five points to spare!

The California Circuit is a "must do" for anyone who hasn't done it before. The different sailing venues, conditions and courses make for a truly enjoyable racing experience. Sure, it might seem like a long way to travel, but it really is worth it. The people are great, the sailing is tight, what more could you ask for? Joel Humphrey and I would like to thank our crew, Molly Hopkins and Allison Weber for outstanding work, Coronado Yacht Club and Mission Bay Yacht Club for great race committee work, Jeff Coppens for renting us his boat, and especially Edna Johnson and Al Poindexter for organizing and running a great circuit. See you next year!

*The second International Masters Championship was scored as a subset of the Open European Championship, which was held just prior to the World Championship in Marsala. The racing was very close among the top contestants, but unfortunately there was confusion as to the age requirements. Peter Hall had originally been told by the class that the age eligibility was 50 for the skipper and 120 for the total. This was later corrected and Mr. Hall was told that the age requirements were 55/130. Mr. Hall sailed in the Europeans and was not scored in the Masters, but filed for redress, asking to be retroactively scored. After considerable discussion, and after turning the matter over to a committee appointed by the class, redress was granted with the result that Peter and Dick Hallagan were named co-winners of the Masters.

The racing for the Masters came down to the last race with Dick needing to beat Urs Wyler and put a boat in between to win the tie breaker, which he did, thereby winning the Championship, subject to the protest for redress.

BUILD SPEED, BUILD A FLEET, HAVE FUN

The idea is very simple: you can't get any faster without having someone to sail against. And frankly, when you are spending good money on entry fees at a regatta, you don't really want to try throwing in a couple extra jibes with no special reason. And a regatta is not the time to try roll tacking with some new twist, or take a chance with a different launch-and-douse technique.

The solution: practice sessions. What follows is one way to build speed, build a fleet, and have fun.

Step 1: Surface Preparation.

Start by sending out e-mail to the people in your district or area a couple of weeks or more in advance. Post the date on the electronic and cork bulletin boards. Tell them that you'll be holding a practice weekend, tell them what to expect, and when it will be held. It helps if you focus the practice sessions on an upcoming regatta, so you've all got a goal.

Remind them, then remind them again.

Remind them to tell their spouses. Telephone them to elicit RSVP's and help them find crew if they need it. Tantalize out-of-towners with the shoreside activities available to non-sailing family members (Busch Gardens, antique stores, the Florida Aquarium, the malls, the yacht club pool).

Even if they can't practice, see if local folks are willing to host an out-of-towner if you yourself don't have floor-space. Ask them if they feel saintly enough to the Race Committee plate for you. If not fleet folks, try tapping family members for RC.

Step 2: Never Underestimate the Power of Food

A couple of days before, stock up on Gatorade, water, canned beverages, snacks. Get enough to share. If you're feeling Martha Stewart-ish, cook ahead: something simple and hearty like marinara pasta, chili, or baked ziti.

The ideal practice weekend starts on Friday night, when one or two of the out-of-town crew shows up in time for some late dinner before sacking out on the fold-out couches at our house.

Saturday begins early, when someone gets up to make coffee and banana muffins (the long arm of Martha Stewart strikes again). Then we drive to the yacht club and begin setting up boats.

There's always one person there before us, but before long, cars and boats start trickling into the parking lot, including those saints you drafted for RC duty.

Step 3: A More Level Playing Field

When I first sailed the Southern Circuit and did the NA's, I was a little disappointed — the Lightning class didn't seem like the friendliest or most accessible group of sailors I ever sailed against. But all it takes is one person. Or one Step like the one in the next paragraph.

If you are lucky enough to lure in a new boat or new skipper to your practice session, make the effort: help tune the boat, talk about local conditions if they are unfamiliar to the newbie, and above all, help the person get up to speed. It won't slow you down to have fast competition, and it sure is nice to have friends. Let me repeat: it won't slow you down to have fast competition, and it sure is nice to have friends.

If anyone is sailing with rookie crew, and someone almost always is on a practice weekend, we'll have an impromptu tutorial: Here's one good way to jibe on the deck, here's what to be careful of when you set, this is how you roll tack. I once (and only once) sailed a Thistle in the Midwinters, and a very kind sailor showed me (on day 2) how she jibed the chute. She broke it down like a dance and acted out each step for me: Reach up, unclip, toss, duck, pull, stand, grab, clip, hike. I have been forever grateful and try to share my knowledge the same way. When I can't quite understand what someone is asking or telling me, I have

them show me. It's astonishing. So much for the power of words.

Step 4: A Little More Preparation

Before setting off, we do the sunblock check and make sure everyone has the gear he or she needs, lending or borrowing as needed. Then set the ground rules: If you want to head in, go on in. If you want a break, hang by the RC boat. If you have an emergency, here's the signal. Avoid contact. Ask questions. Have fun.

Step 5: The Solid Gold Race Committee

Our crack Race Committee team has included Joe Linton, Tom Taylor, Ken Batzer, Jay Tyson, and Fisk Hayden (a.k.a. The Dads). They pull a couple of marks from the yacht club shed as we stock the RC boat with ice and beverages to share. If a digital camera is available, this is an excellent time to ask the Dads to get some action shots.

Then, on this practice weekend, we start sailing in (we hope) 8-12 knots and some chop on Upper Tampa Bay or Biscayne Bay. There are two boats or five boats, and we'll sail short (300 yards) windward-leeward courses until lunchtime. After lunch at the yacht club, we go back out and sail until the sun sinks under the yardarm.

A surprising number of people on shore will ask, over lunch, what the heck is going on — a regatta of some sort? Tell them all about it. Invite them to help RC or crew as appropriate. The Lightning class will gain cachet.

On this ideal day, the Dads whistle us a 1-minute starting sequence. If the starting line looks skewed, one of the Lightnings will pick it up and put it where it belongs. Instead of floating a tuna ball behind the committee boat, Fisk Hayden is known to have baby Jeffrey stream a plastic boat on a piece of string twenty feet long. Fisk can reel that boat back in a second.

Step 6: On Your Mark, Get Set, Start Again

Depending on what anyone wants to do, we might practice starts. When it's two boats alone on the starting line, matchracing techniques get a little workout, as one boat forces the other over early, or keeps it away from the starting area. We'll do five starts in a row, and the demonstration of port-starboard roundy-rounds transforms book learning into practical knowledge.

Other times, we'll work on straight-line speed. In these cases, since Steve Hayden (North American Champ for 2001!) is scary fast, we try to match him. Or we'll all work on our roll-jibes. There are a lot of moments between races where the sails are flapping and we're shouting to one another over the noise: How far in are you trimmed in that stuff? Try over-rotating through the roll! Take a slower turn through the tack! Are we too far forward in the boat? What's your headstay look like?

Most times, we just do tight windward-leeward racing. We trade tacks up the short beat, try not to overstand, and work on our roll-tack technique. Downwind is pure scramble: pole up, chute up, outhaul out, main cunningham off, jib down, jibe. Sometimes chute up, jibe, jib down. After one day of practice like this, I have more bruises than the whole week of the Worlds. There's no time to think twice, to wonder if we should go the other way, or brood over errors. I barely have time to sit to leeward and call puffs before we are going around the leeward mark to finish.

Once in a while, we'll shuffle crew around from boat to boat. This way we share the wealth — presumably — of skill and knowledge. I have sailed a lot of years as just another voice on the rail, so I have to admit it's gratifying for me to get on a new boat and command immediate (and unearned!) respect. Fact is, a fresh eye can spot weaknesses on someone else's boat — long habit can make things like the rig tension, helm movement, or jib trim seem right, when they actually do have room for improvement.

Step 7: Talking and Eating, Drinking and Throwing Darts

At the end of the day, we head for the hoists. We buy drinks for the Dads, the whole time talking about what went right, what we might do to go faster, and what to focus on tomorrow. A lot of boat layout questions get answered in this time when the day's sailing is fresh on everybody's mind.

Saturday night, we gather up the rest of the families (the children, the long-suffering spouses, the designated shoppers) and hit one of the local restaurants. Afterwards in Tampa, we retire back to our house. If there's an especially interesting game, we'll have ESPN on and a half-dozen different conversations working in our tiny living room. Children might go on a bear hunt in the back bathroom, and then fall asleep in the middle of the dining room floor. Empty beverage bottles pile up in the kitchen, and there's always a little mine-field of melted ice-cubes to step through.

Eventually, sleeping children are tucked in or carried home, and the remaining grown-ups head to the porch for a fierce darts tournament. Many a pink slip has changed hands over darts in our district. I think we may technically own Bill Mauk's Lightning, his Toyota van, and even his condo.

Step 8: Once More into the Breach

The next morning, the house looks exactly as if we've had a big sleepover. We all know who snores. We get a variety of contact lens cases to choose from. There are a LOT of empty plastic cups — and in some of the most unexpected places, too. We're up and attem early again, although sometimes the wind is light on a Sunday morning in Tampa.

Breakfast at the club, launch the boats, race again and again, and then finish by 2, so almost everyone, ideally, can get home by dark. On a really great weekend, we can have 30, 40 practice races, with maybe 60 starts, plus a pretty darn good time.

Step 9: Document Your Lessons

To finish up the weekend, dash off a complete report to your e-mail list of Lightning folks. Add lots of detail so that people who couldn't make it feel included and will be inclined to come next time.

Remember to send paper copies to those folks without e-mail, and ask your fleet or district website — and even the yacht club site — to post your report. Incorporate the digital photos if possible. If there's an especially good photo, send it to the Flash.

Step 10: Announce the Next Date

Figure out when you'll do it again and start reminding your practice partners early. Best of luck to you and to your whole district!

They kept their word and used all the courses available to them.

Bill Fastiggi and his team of local, fleet, and district volunteers also did a super job of organizing and hosting this event. They managed over 100 boats in a confining area very well. Excellent teams from all over the U.S., Canada, Chile, Ecuador, Columbia, and Argentina made for great competition throughout the event. I want to thank all those who participated for doing so and therefore, supporting the Lightning Class. Congratulations to all of you.

My team consisted of Jean Hallagan, from Syracuse, NY, and Barr Batzer, from Deerfield Beach, FL. I was very fortunate to have these two on the boat. The teamwork and chemistry came together really well as the week went on. We had never sailed together before, but I attribute the cohesiveness to their experience, maturity, and competitiveness. Jean is part of the Hallagan Lightning family and grew up sailing with her dad and brothers and now owns her own boat. Our families have been competing against each other in Central NY since the beginning of Lightnings (it seems). I'm so glad she was available when I called her two weeks before the regatta. Seems like the three of us were meant to sail together in this regatta. Many things came together for all of us at the right time. Barr and I have sailed together for over ten years. Fleet Development

Want to grow your fleet 60% in 5 Years?

What works for one growing fleet might work for yours

Like many Lightning fleets, Fleet 387 sailing on Lake Lansing, was experiencing some decline in participation. In the early 1990s, it was common to see only 3 boats (that's just nine sailors) on a Sunday starting line. Now we have 8 boats on the line on average, we're welcoming 2 more active racers back to our club this season (10 boats is thirty sailors!), and our fleet championship awards are frequently won or lost on the last weekend of racing every season. What things did LSC utilize to build their fleet that you can implement in yours?

Understanding your racing market

Sunday fleet racing in the 1990s was a mixed-fleet event. This meant that sailors had to choose a Sunfish, Laser or Lightning to race. In the mid 1990s, the club went to racing only Lightnings on Sunday, reserving Wednesday evening racing for singlehanders. This greatly increased participation 10-20% because singlehanded racers could now crew on Lightnings and Lightning owners could race more than one kind of boat. We determined people wanted to race on their Sunfish or Laser and they wanted to crew on a bigger boat, or expand their racing skills beyond a singlehander. Our Wednesday racing is followed by dinner at a local Italian restaurant, which is the most popular part of the evening. Do you have more than one fleet 'competing' on the same day? Consider changing days to attract more sailors to your fleet. Focusing on one fleet per day greatly contributed to increased participation in both singlehanders and Lightnings on their respective days.

Offering a variety of racing days and fleets helps keep your club strong. Of the people who race in our singlehanded fleet, almost all race in the Lightnings as well.

Evangelize your fleet

At 5 boats on the line, we still were not where we wanted to be. We embarked on a club-wide program of evangelism, marketing and public relations to increase awareness of sailing in our area. Our mantra became "make one, find one, remind one". If we couldn't find a sailor, we'd create them, or remind one who had gone from the sport how great it was to be a part of the fleet again.

We began hosting a wintertime Learn to Race class. We raced remote control model boats in high school pools. This was highly successful. We 'advertised' our class in the Community Education booklets (they take a percentage of your revenue but have fabulous 'reach' or distribution to households). We had about 10-20 students per class, of which 1-3 of them would become active racers and club members. Except, the fans to create wind were expensive, and our student feedback told us that time on the (big) water was important so we moved it to May in Lightnings. This course continues to provide us with 10-12 students, of which on average 2-3 go on to join as crew.

To find sailors in our area who didn't know that Lake Lansing had racing activities, we sent a mailer to a list of all the registered boats of a particular class from the Secretary of State. You can also purchase this list or others like it. From this, we got a few more interested parties.

We continue to 'remind one' by cultivating a list of potential future Lightning owners. These are crew, who at one point or another have shown interest in their own boats, or former Lightning owners who have gotten out of racing. George Siegle, our fleet captain, keeps a list of these people and whenever he hears of a boat (including on Ebay) that fits the profile of the sailor looking, he emails them.

We learned the art of evangelizing our fleet from Miami Fleet 226's "Florida Fay" Reagan. Evangelism involves identifying potential owners in your pool of crew. Cultivate their interest – invite them to drive in club races when you will be absent or at the end of the season when you're clearly in the lead. Assist them – help them find the perfect boat and keep on top of boats that come up for sale. Ask latent owners to sell. They probably were not actively looking to sell, but when presented with a buyer, they do.

Marketing is important

We take out a full-page photo spread of our fleet in the Yearbook and provide an engaging fleet report. This creates perception that we are an active fleet with lots going on. And Perception = Reality.

We also produce a brochure; available at our club in a brochure rack so 'passers by' can pick one up. If your club has a 'members only' sign out front, how about hanging a covered brochure bin next to it.

The club Website is our main tool of communication – which has our schedule and crew database. We announce weekend's good performers, upcoming District events, and send out a weekly E-Sheet email to members and prospects. Prospects sign up at our website or at the club for more info. The club voice mail lists our URL.

We also held two open houses, one in 2000 at West Marine, one in 2001 at our club. Both were thinly attended, but both yielded new members at each event, including one who became a boat owner. We hosted a winter seminar put on by Colin Park, which also garnered good interest and another, by Mark Spicknall, that generated interest for club members.

A short list of other things you can implement that worked for us:

Beginner Racing Classes

Junior Sailing Classes (new for us in 2001)

Winter Seminars – chalk talks

Social events like moonlight 'dessert and drinks' sails (invite non-Lightning people who just cruise or casually race in your club to come on your Lightning)

Post race dinners

Reformulate racing – 3 races per Sunday, race on weeknights in August, when weekend cottage visiting is popular.

Things that didn't work as well:

Open houses at club or at West Marine

Mailer to registered boats in area (once is nice, more than once is overkill)

Keep improving your program

This year, we plan to introduce several new social events designed to engage our Lightning racers and their families. Judging by the success of post-racing dinners in Wednesday night fleets, we are going to experiment with pre-race or post-race family barbecues once a month during summer Lightning racing season. We're also embarking on a long-term plan, guided by a new mission statement, to help us develop our club and fleets into the future.

We had skippers 'sign up' to attend one or more District regatta and we're working on having a Lansing Sailing Club boat at every District event. We will assist with trailers, crew and support for the boat, and we're paying special attention to 'reciprocal' attendance at District events. The Lightning class is built on the strength of its fleets, and fleets in turn build good districts.

Putting things in perspective

Our participation is now up to about 50% of our club in racing (as

opposed to 40% just 2 years ago). We have 8 boat starts on Sunday (sometimes as many as 10), out of a fleet of 18. Our goal is 25 Lightnings and 15 boats on the line by 2003. Our LSC sailors attend nearly every single Michigan District regatta, sometimes we send up to 3 boats to District regattas.

Is this a lot of work? Yes, but it's been a team effort. The days are gone when a fleet can sit back and hope that people show up. There are too many things competing for people's free time and money. Fleet success requires more than just a personal financial investment in a boat, it also requires a time investment by each person in the club and fleet. A team approach to building the fleet is what works. It can't rest on the back of just one person.

Though 8 boats on the line on Sundays doesn't sound like a lot, that is almost a 60% increase in about 5 years. You can achieve the same success by putting these things into action in your fleet.

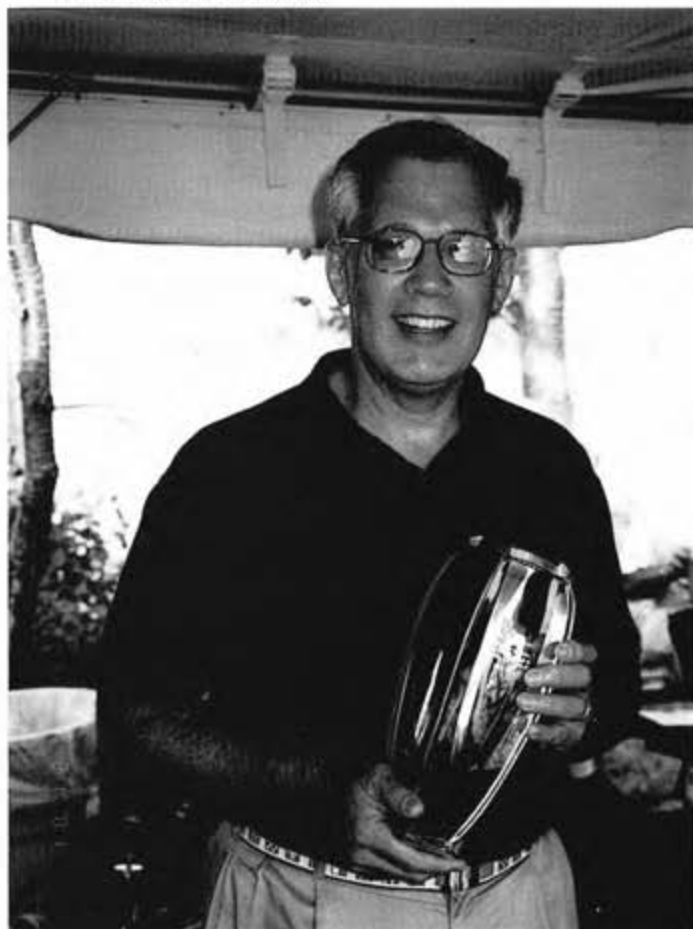
KEUKA LAKE

Sadly, Leatherlips and the Lightning Class lost a founding member in September of 2001 when Ralph (Bucky) Powless passed away. Bucky was a very dynamic personality who was very involved for many years with promoting the art of racing sailboats. Unfortunately I never had the pleasure of meeting him but I spoke with many long time Leatherlips members who were very willing to share their fond memories of Bucky. Bucky served as Commodore of Leatherlips in 1959. It was a difficult year for Leatherlips because a fire had destroyed the club house. Bucky worked night and day building the new club that still stands today. I have heard that his decision to use steel beams instead of wood in the construction was very controversial for it's time. Between the steel beams and concrete floors and walls our fine club will take centuries to tumble again.

Bucky contributed to various sailing and racing programs throughout the club for many years. I was told he could always be counted on do everything from cooking the spaghetti dinner for the junior sailor's banquet to building five wooden dinghies and starting a new fleet of them. Bucky also built a wooden Comet for a club member. Bucky's love of boat building helped pave the path of becoming a Chief Measurer for the International Lightning Class in 1963. He also served many years as the Ohio District chief measurer and measured in Muller boats for many years. Fleet 27 was very appreciative when Bucky helped serve as race committee in 1998 for The Ohio Districts when they were hosted at Leatherlips.

Good Luck Don and Sue, we will miss you.

A long Metedeconk tradition, commitment to Junior sailing, added another laurel in 2001 as Andrew Brennan won the Junior North Americans held at Mallots Bay, Vermont. Metedeconk has been committed to the Junior NAs since its inception in 1975 and usually has an annual presence. Andrew's success follows in the footsteps of other prominent Metedeconk juniors, Jay (1977 champion) and Jody (1980 champion)

Lutz, Keith and Brian Taboada, and Ryan Dunn (first North American in 1996). Andrew's victory qualifies him for the Lightning Youth Worlds to be held in Rochester, New York in July 2002.

Metedeconk also had the honor of holding the prestigious USSA Sears Cup Finals, emblematic of the Junior Triple Handed Championships in 2001. The event, held in August, was sailed in Lightnings and won by Erik Johnson of Mallots Bay Boat Club. Erik defeated among others, Andrew Brennan (finished fourth) of the host club. Within weeks of each other, Erik and Andrew won very prestigious events in the others home waters. Congrats to both. The event was a big hit for club members; even those with junior days are a distant memory. The most prescient memory for all involved will be the comradeship of the Junior sailors who competed hard on the water but made friendships that will live down the road. It was an experience which all Junior sailing, or any sports competition for that matter, should strive for.

The commitment to Lightning sailing obviously extends beyond Junior sailing. Jim Carson made his annual pilgrimage in Florida for the Southern Circuit, finishing 15th along with co skippers Mike Buczkowski and Ryan Dunn. Mitch Hnatt also made the entire Circuit, and finished 20th. One of the major regattas that are held in New Jersey each year is the Long John at Red Bank, in its 40th year. Mitch Hnatt won by a comfortable margin over a tough fleet. In all, 10 Fleet 34 skippers attended the Long John (Brian and Keith Taboada finished in the top ten). Keith Taboada won the Central Atlantic Districts, topping a near Metedeconk sweep of the top five spots (Dave Ruiter, Jim Carson and Mitch Hnatt followed). Besides Andrew's victory at the Junior NAs, Courtney O'Connor led an all girls crew to finish 15th. The state of our fleet is strong. There are all sorts of ways to measure strength, but participation has got to be the bottom line. We had 22 boats race on at least one day last year, roughly 12 that sailed in more than half of our fleet races, and a few more that sailed in regattas. Our success came to the attention of Sailing World magazine. After interviewing Jeff, Joe, and Frank, an article appeared in the "Fleet Building" column in the May issue. This delightful and unexpected honor was sparked by an e-mail from Carl Schaefer to the One Design Class Council.

PRSA RACING EVENTS

As the fleet has grown over the last two years, we have experienced some very close racing, increasing interest all through the standings. In the Spring Series, which was 6 Sundays and 19 races, 15 boats competed and 12 qualified by sailing more than half. At the end, only 2.4 points separated newcomer Drew Hudson sailing with Sousan Arafeh and Dave Barret, in fifth place, from Wasabi skippered by Jeff Storck, Jeremy Terr, and Dan Fritz and crewed by Craig Huzway and Emilie Pavilon in sixth. The team of Jim Dillard, Nelson Pemberton, and Carl Wilson in third was only 9 points ahead of Drew.

The Fall Series was great practice for sailing in big air. We had 15 to 25 knot breezes on 3 of the 6 Sundays. Still, we had an average of 9 boats on the starting line compared to 8 the year before. In the end, only 12 points separated 4th from 8th place! Although Nabeel Alsalam, Russ Roberts, and Scott Bradford won the series, the team of Ben Forman, Thacher Tiffany, and Ann Cody were in first place on the last day. Unfortunately, they couldn't sail that day and slipped to third. Pat McGee sailing with Jill Williamson and Cathy Feig were second. Paul Maher and Ben Kuykendall and various thirds combined to take fourth.

Our first Fall Sunday was cancelled due to the closure of the river after the September 11 attacks. When we resumed racing next to Reagan National Airport on the 23rd it was in eerie silence. However, one day we did have spectators in black Suburbans on the shoreline, in a helicopter overhead, and on a police boat on the water. Even small sailboats made people jumpy then. The airport remained shut down almost three weeks.

Eight boats sailed in the PRSA Spring Regatta on May 26-27 even though our fleet staffed the race committee. Thanks to Jim and Robin Krest, David and Barbara Thompson, Murray Jones and Susan Kaufman. The race chair was very impressed with their organization and commitment to doing a professional job. The view from the race committee boat provided those neophyte racers with a great view of strategy and tactics. Although Saturday was dreary, Sunday was beautiful. Frank Gallagher sailing with Skip Hirsh and Lolita Hart won the regatta; Drew tied Nabeel in points in the last race and won the tiebreaker by virtue of having a second. Pat McGee was only 2 points behind those two.

The Leukemia/President's Cup on Sept. 8-9 was the best attended in memory-21 boats, 14 from our fleet. This is an increase of 5 with 2 more from our fleet over 2000. Temperatures were in the low 80's both days, and we enjoyed a southerly wind of 8-10 knots on Sat and 5-7 knots on Sunday. The Annapolis fleet sent four; the Solomons fleet sent two; and Justin Morris, a fleet 50 member, made a return trip from Virginia Beach. The Annapolis folks have come to love the challenges of the river with its current, wind shifts and favored side near the airport. But if you get too greedy going after the thermals off the runway you may get caught in the hydrilla that lurks in the shallows off shore. That is all part of the challenge of racing on the river. Nonetheless, Jon Guth from fleet 329 won the regatta after several years of trying. Fleet-mate Jamie Brickell was second and Frank Gallagher was third. Thanks Jon for your nice report.

POTOMAC CUP

Perhaps the word has gotten around about our famous filet mignon dinner. Whatever the reasons, we enjoyed the second highest turnout in the 17-year history of Potomac Cup with 32 boats on May 5-6. Half the boats were from our fleet-every active skipper raced. Chandler Owen came from Tennessee to sail Doc Gilbert's boat with Gloria Gilbert Black and husband Mike as crew. Others came from Ohio, upstate New York, and Connecticut. Only one race was completed on Saturday in the light winds. OTHER RACING EVENTS

PRSA's Helms event on June 10th was fun for all. The idea is to see which skipper is best across types of boats. Twelve of the best PRSA skippers selected from each of the fleets sailed in six races using Lightnings, Albacores, and Lasers. After each race the skippers would switch to another boat. Our guy, Drew Hudson, got 5 first place finishes, and was nipped by less than 2 feet in the sixth.

Fleet 50 skippers traveled to other regattas. Fleet 329 hosted the Dixie Districts on June 16-17. The weather was wild with torrential rain on Saturday and 15-25 knot winds on Sunday. Despite this, 19 boats participated with five from our fleet—Stuart White, Ben Forman, Rick Welch, John Butler and Jeff Storck. The elusive Dan Dressel, with his lightweight crew, won with four first place finishes in five races—amazing! Three boats (Nabeel, Drew and Ben Forman) attended SSA's July 1 Summer Series, and four (Nabeel, Ben, Joe Warren and Pat) went to part 2 of this series on July 21-22. While there was no wind on the 21st a delightful 8-10 knot southerly sprang up on Sunday. Racing in the chop in light winds is a real learning experience for us flat-water river sailors.

Joe, learning fast, nearly beat the always Jamie Brickell in one race. In the overall scoring, Nabeel got 3rd.

Some of our skippers went to the June 4-5 Sweet Corn regatta held by Susquehanna fleet 253. This fleet has shown much growth over the last two years, and this event is now well attended. Teams Alsalam, McGee, Forman, and Storck attended the regatta. Nabeel finished 5th.

In September, Fleet 508 hosted an invitational event on Sept. 22-23. Team White, with skipper Stuart, wife Sondra and daughter Kelsey, nipped team Brickell (skipper Jamie, wife Susan and daughter Kimberly) by one point. The Frigit Digit/Lightning Fall Championship (Oct. 20-21) and the Borderline (Oct 27-28) are the highlights of off-river racing in the fall. The Borderline is one of 7 intersectional series, and both events attract some of the most skilled sailors in the class. Thirty-eight boats attended the Digit with 5 from our fleet—Frank Gallagher, Nabeel, Ben, Rick Welch and Red Fehrle. The very high level of competition was evident; our guys got trounced; Frank was the highest fleet finisher at 21st. We also sent 5 boats to the Borderline. They did the fleet proud. Of the 32 total registered—Pat finished 12th, John Butler 13th, Drew 15th and Jeff Storck was 17th. Unfortunately, Stuart didn't sail Sunday since he ran over a spike bar while trying to do a good deed and spent the day looking for new tires.

TRAINING AND PROMOTION

Fleet officers make a serious effort to bring in new boat owners and crew. We displayed Stuart's Lightning at the Alexandria Waterfront Festival in June. Many skippers took turns staffing this event over two days. Thanks to Jeff Storck for organizing this. Later in June, we designated one of our Wednesday series as an Open House for new crew to meet skippers and to get them in a boat. We followed this up with several other training sessions in July and August. Frank Gallagher ran a capsizing practice training session in August. In late August, Paul Maher held a one-day seminar and on-water drills about starting techniques such as slow sailing, judging starting time and accelerating after the start; six boats participated. We also created a website to be envied (thanks, Cathy and Nabeel) and ran active email list for skippers and crew.

SOCIAL EVENTS

Our main social activity was a 4.5 mile cruise to Fort Foote, and picnic/volleyball game there. On Sunday, June 24, eight fleet 50 boats and 30 skippers, crew and friends participated in this event—three more boats than the cruise to Ft Washington in 2000. Nabeel came with Russ and Hilary Frier; Frank brought Colleen and Maryann; Joe brought four including C.J. Fisher. This was her first time on a Lightning. The "Barebut" Charter handily beat the "Pregnant Sow" in the between-anchoring spot races. This was such a blast that we plan to do it again next November and bring even more Fleet 50 racers along.

Our annual meeting and dinner held, as usual, at Stuart and Sondra White's home capped off our 2001 year. In addition, to the awards already mentioned these were also conferred. Cathy Bleakly received the Doc Gilbert Fleet Helper award for organizing the Potomac Cup dinner, designing the website, and always being a force for having fun. Paul Maher repeats as the winner of the Ironman award. He was on the water for all 54 of our races. Not even a broken mast took him off the water. Jim Krest takes the Best Rookie Skipper award. Jim & Robin have only cruised in Redline in the past. This year they were introduced to racing by crewing for Bob Wilbur, who let Jim drive the boat when he couldn't be there. Jim did great. Thacher Tiffany takes the "hired gun" or best skipper among the crew award. Thacher joined Ben Forman's team and skippered the boat when Ben had to be out of town and always kept the Swill Dog in the hunt. Ben Kuykendall takes the most improved crew award. sequence really helps with the general recalls.

Club racing rules at PYC require boats to display a current ILCA membership sticker to be scored in the series. A total of 55 different skippers competed in at least one race during the course of the season. A. Dubel, T. Crosby, and V. Neudoerffer collectively raced their boat in 34 races. Bob and John Mathers competed in 33 races. Normal club racing is held on Wednesday evenings and on Sunday mornings. Three series are scored: spring, summer, and fall, as well as an overall series winner. This year Jon Bennett won the overall Wednesday series, John Garrison the overall Sunday series. Sean Fidler won the PYC annual invitational Whitecap regatta. Charlie Hess took the title of 2001 Fleet Champion.

One special event we hold every year is the Commodore's Challenge. This is the opportunity for the crews to skipper and bark orders at their skippers now crewing for them. This year's top three were: Eric Klaban - First Place, Rachel Ziegler - Second Place, and Jennifer Armbruster - Third Place.

We have expanded our racing this year to include two day mini-regattas on the holiday weekends: Memorial Day (Winner Mark Whatley), Fourth of July (Winner Tom Klaban), and Labor Day Weekend (Winner Mark Whatley). For 2002 the race committee chairman is planning to extend it to three day regattas, needing only two days of racing to be scored. The chairman has also extended an invitation to any registered Lightning sailors that would care to join us for a weekend of racing during those dates. Check our website at www.pyc54.org for updates on the status. This is free racing, no registration fee, just drop us a line to let us know you're coming.

Racing at PYC is not limited to club racing. Many of us enjoy traveling to all the Michigan District Travel Regattas. Seventeen of our skippers made it to the Michigan Districts at Crescent YC. Some of us even manage to get to the big travel regattas. Last year we had 5 boats at the Southern Circuit, and 10 skippers at the Malletts Bay North Americans participating in the Masters, Women's and North Americans. And if you were at any of these regattas, you would have run into PYC sailors at the Orange Bowl, the Pymatuning Spring Classic, the Red Flannels, and the Bluenose.

The comments by Kimmo have been censored from this report, and his conclusions can be shortened to: "We need more sailing in different conditions".

2001 was the biggest year in the history of Fleet 301. We held both the 2001 Women's, Junior's & Master's Lightning North Americans as well as the 2001 Lightning North Americans. After the event, all of the members of Fleet 301 are still sailing (and talking to each other) but we are limiting our decisions to dinner choices at the annual 2002 spring regatta.

Running the regatta was a great deal of work but it was more fun than I could have ever imagined. It was like having everybody you sail with over to your house for a two week party. During the awards ceremony, a long and drawn-out thank you session often takes place recognizing all the organizers. Ann Brush mentioned to me during this ceremony that this seems really pointless until you've organized one of these events and know how much work is involved. With this in mind, I will still instigate food fights during this part of the dinner but, it gave me an even greater appreciation for all of the people who step forward and volunteer for an event as big as the North Americans.

We had many things to be thankful for while planning and hosting the event. We were lucky enough to have one of most versatile people that I have ever met, Patrick Zachary, as one of the co-chairpersons. Patrick took the meeting minutes during all of the more than 25 organizing meetings we had during the 18 months of planning. As the fleet members volunteered to become the head of each of the individual committee's, Patrick created and maintained an organizational chart that allowed us to understand the duties of each of the committee's. When new requirements for the event were identified, one of the individual committee heads would accept responsibility to make sure it got done. Patrick would record what the job was and who was to get it done.

Since space was so tight at the site, Patrick created a site map of the Mallett's Bay Boat Club that would make any construction site foreman envious. Patrick kept telling us that 125 boats would fit into the space on the water, I had my doubts; but during the regatta, all the boats had sufficient space to be stored safely. During the site preparation, Patrick was seen standing in knee deep water welding eye rings to the steel retaining wall to allow line to be fastened to it. You have Patrick to thank for the highly visible (8 foot) race course marks. Patrick insisted from day one that we needed new marks and they should be as large as possible.

Charlie Dickerson, not a Lightning sailor but an ardent supporter of Fleet 301, helped obtain state permits during the planning of the North Americans. Charlie works for the state of Vermont and would often come to the planning meetings asking us if we had secured the numerous permits required to hold such an event. We would ask, more than once, "what permit?" and Charlie would respond that he had already filed for the permit and that we shouldn't worry. During the planning of the regatta, it was agreed that a couple of spectator boats would help friends and family see the race. Charlie, without thinking, agreed to organize the spectator fleet. The participation in the spectator fleet was, to say the least, bigger than anybody would have ever believed. Charlie coordinated many boats and a large number of spectators. The spectator boats were also given an additional duty, if towing was to be required, the spectator fleet would help out. Charlie has been elected as the Yeoman of the Malletts Bay Boat Club for the 2002 year. It's great to know that one of Lightning Fleet 301's best friends is running the club.

Everybody knows Bill Fastiggi, but many people might not realize how much Bill does for the Lightning Class and Fleet 301. Bill acted as event co-chair person and event bookkeeper. Bill sold us on the idea that we could host such an event. During the early planning of the event Bill kept using a word we had very little familiarity with, "Budget". Bill required that all of the committee heads prepare an itemized budget and we were expected to stick to that budget. An enormous spreadsheet was developed projecting the amount of money that would be required to run the regatta and at what times cash flow would be an issue. Each of the committee chair people were then asked to look over all of the other budgets to make sure that expenses weren't being allocated twice. This also had the added benefit of catching any expenses that may have been overlooked. Bill kept us abreast of all of the responsibilities that we had unwittingly taken upon by planning such an event. There are literally hundreds of little tasks that have to be done for the North Americans. Constructing pennants, securing bow numbers and all of the little things that make you say "oh yeah, you need those at a North Americans; Bill helped to keep a realistic view of what the participants were expecting for the race.

Mark Gardner developed and maintained the event web site. Mark is a professional web site designer and developer. The web site, in my opinion, set the tone for the professionalism that ran the regatta. Before the actual two weeks of racing, the web site was the regatta. Everything that was to happen was already outlined at the site. It is where people went to get information and read about the latest news. Each time I would e-mail Mark with an update for the website, it would be available within minutes. Mark worked with Bill to ensure that all of the regatta organizers had their area of responsibility represented on the web site. This required that all of us had to have our ducks in a line and that we had a clear idea of what was expected of us. Mark also ran the Women's, Junior's and Master's regatta. One of the most amazing things about the regatta was the fact that the actual races were almost never mentioned during any of the planning meetings. There were so many people that were involved who I cannot mention by name but I thank them every time I see them. The measurement portion of the regatta was a success because of the people that took vacation time to help out. It was great fun for all of the volunteers to meet all of the racers and vice versa. *Editors note- Tim is being too modest here. As a participant at this event I must say that he set the standard for measurement and how it can be done for a large event. There were a lot of boats to process in a very limited space. I never heard anyone complain- only compliment- the work he and his committee did.*

I know I have failed to mention many people that gave some of the best years' of their lives for this event, but if I don't send this thing in soon Karen will kill me.

The LSC Lightning racing program continued on Sunday, April 29th, with nine boats sailing three races. Our Sunday format is two races, back to back, with the first starting signal at 1 p.m. A lunch break is followed by the third race. The three-races-per-day format was new for 2001. The wind gods gave us a total of 61 races. The competition was close between the Moody and the Siegle crews with the Pat Dolan crew chasing their transoms. The best 24 races were counted. Mike Moody sailed 46 races, getting 20 firsts and 4 second-place finishes in his qualifying total. George Siegle sailed 38 races, his best 24 races were 19 firsts and 5 seconds. Pat Dolan and Blaine Severin each sailed in 44 races. Pat had 10 firsts and 11 second-place finishes. Blaine had a 1st, eleven 2nds, seven 3rds and three 4th-place finishes as his best scores.

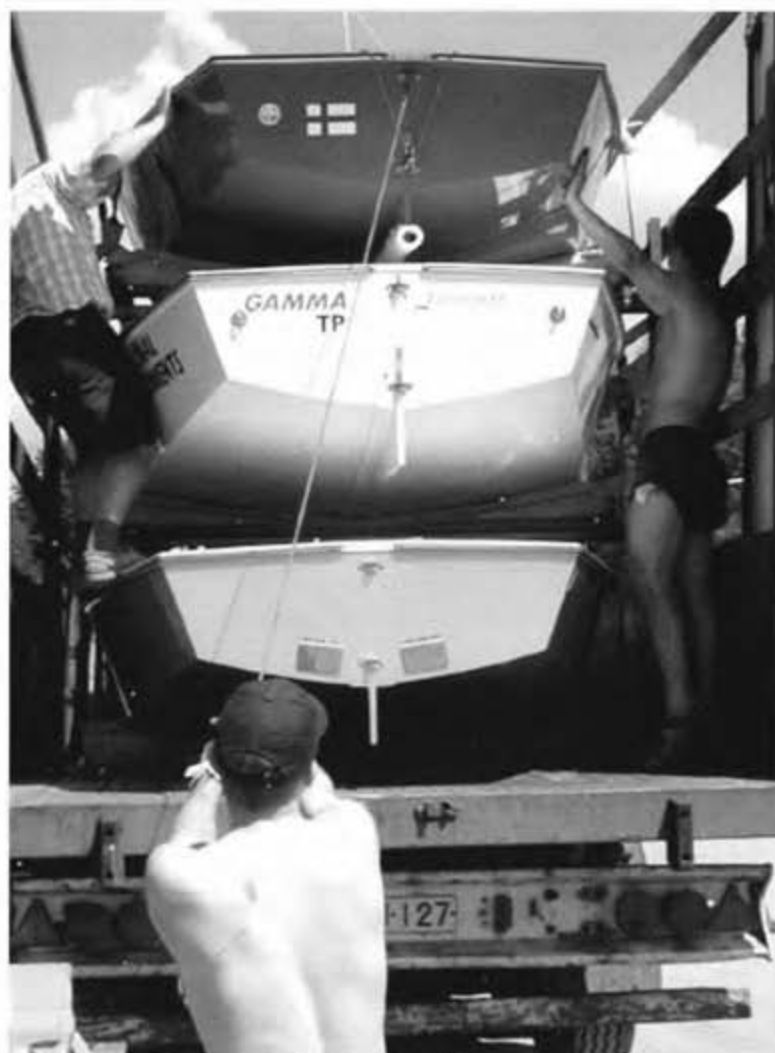

2001 was a good year. Fleet membership and the amount of sailing done were both up 20%.

Background: Fleet 481 is one of the 6 one-design fleets that constitute the Carolina Sailing Club (CarolinaSailingClub.org). The club is a racing-only club, owns race committee boats and equipment, and no real estate. It was the first US Sailing (USYRU) One-Design Club of the Year. The club and fleet race on Kerr Lake and Lake Jordan, which are near Raleigh, Durham and Chapel Hill in central North Carolina, and the club fleets frequently hold regattas on the Pamlico and Albemarle Sounds in eastern NC.

Membership: Two boats joined the fleet (Bob Graves and Ken Hollis), and no one quit or moved away. One skipper/boat that we thought was so inactive that we did not count him last year is now racing (Art Thinguldstad). Therefore, the fleet now numbers 17 skipper/owners (with one owning two boats), up from 14 in 2000.

Amount of sailing: Looking at individual boats, the amount of actual sailing was up 20% from 2000, measured by the number of boat days we sailed (281). The average was 16.5 days of sailing per fleet boat. Of the 17 boats, only 4 boats sailed less than 5 days, and only an additional 3 sailed 5-9 days; the remaining 10 boats sailed 10 or more days. Several Fleet members were able to significantly increase their "boat time" this year: John Chaplinsky (with wife Brenda and daughters), Bob Graves, Chuck Moore (frequently with kids), Richard Phillips (with brother Andrew), and Art Thinguldstad. For those who didn't get to sail much, the greatest impediments were job overload and uncertainty, and young children. (And one guy, Ned Nutt, was and is spending all his free time building an airplane; takes all kinds. . .).

No change from 2000, available local race days are high and not at all a limiting factor on people getting racing. The fleet and the club conduct 33 days of local racing open to Lightnings, spread over all 12 months. This year Lightnings raced in all 33 days available. Since our winter climate is moderate by northern standards, we do "frostbite" Lightnings. No wet suits, do use spinnakers, but sail more conservatively to avoid swimming incidents, and we do cancel if the wind-temperature combination is bad. No cancellations in 2001.

9 boats participated in the Southeastern District Circuit. For four, the only participation were the two "local" regattas that we hold that are on the circuit; the other 5 boats did away district regattas also. Fleet participation in the district circuit was down for the second year in a row; only John Pelosi sailed enough to qualify. He finished 5th of the 9 total qualifiers.

We sent a boat to the full Southern Circuit, which we have not done for many years. Ed Michels, crew John Pelosi and Joan Woods recommend the experience to everyone. Also, Doug King crewed in the NAs, and Tim Borland crewed in the Worlds.

The fleet sponsors and runs a large regatta on the Lightning Intersectional Circuit, the Borderline Regatta. Always the 4th weekend in October, it draws 30-40 boats from Maine to Florida. This year attendance was a little low (32), winds were strong, great racing and a good time were had by all. Steve Hayden won, followed by Tom Allen and Bob Harkrider. For the Hull Number Handicapping trophies, Peter Marriott won, followed by Neil Hayes and Drew Hudson.

However, although we successfully ran club racing there the weekend before, on the Borderline weekend the lake level, wind direction and strength conspired to put all the local ramps out of service. The lake was at an historic low for a racing month, last seen that low in 1969 (pre-Borderline). After some scrambling, 2/3 of the boats were launched over the beach (plywood and 4-wheel drive), and 1/3, caught before they had rigged, were redirected to a nearby alternative ramp.

The fleet continued to contribute heavily to the running of the Carolina Sailing Club; we provided the commodore (Ed Michels), the vice Commodore (Michael Rees), four board members/committee chairpersons (Steve Cardoze, Nicole Knowles, John Pelosi, and Joan Woods). This level of club support is a significant drain on the manpower available to run the fleet; relief is not due until the 2003 season.

We feel that the key to fleet health (or class health, for that matter,) is the amount of time the boats are sailed or raced. Since it is easier to improve something if you can and do measure it, we started tracking in 2000, and offer this as our status:

As the spectator fleet gathered on the viewing venue and the sequence was approaching the final seconds the Lightnings jockeyed for position and leverage. Miller won the start and scooted on the fleet. After a series of tacks and sets Rudds gained a sliver lead and Littles were in the fray.

The Finish.

The whole cans of beans was determined on a final spinnaker run from Sycamore to the Club and remember the team that shocked the world. Seyerlein was looking for a two-peat, but a series of personnel changes as like O'Briens was having the opposite affect. The Champ makes no bones about it; the O'Briens worked hard in the off season.

O'Briens work ethic was displayed in the acquisition of two very special coaches conveniently coined Spinnaker and Cunningham. To the casual observer they were dogs, but the behind scenes of the O'Brien compound they ruled, motivated and inspired.

Team O'Brien started off the sailing season and never looked back. For Seyerlein it was like coming to a fork in the road and taking it, hence, whatever was tried came to the same conclusion, second place.

However, there was one last stand. One brilliant Sunday afternoon with a strong 12-15 mph southerly piping through the valley the competitors braced for a colossal battle. Seyerlein knew he had better chance in heavier air conditions. That Sunday afternoon Seyerlein's crew was his best. At point he had extraterrestrial Jerry and Ultra Featherweight De-man at middle. The conditions prompted for two long races each measuring approximately 3 miles and this was just a Sunday fleet race! Each start was picture perfect for each boat, it lent itself to who could tack first and cross was going to take a first big step. Seyerlein within the first 3 minutes of each start manages to cross O'Briens, but it was to close to call.

Hindsight, the most a single competitor would enjoy the whole day. O'Briens in the first race played a classic rope de dope strategy in trying to lure Seyerlein to play the east shore of the lake. Seyerlein had a slight lead, but the shore had less velocity and that favored O'Briens. However, Seyerlein sniffed the scheme out and was swinging on three balls and no strikes. Seyerlein moves to the port layline and O'Brien decide they best cover, two-thirds into the final leg with only a slight lead the indecision by O'Briens leaves a slimmer of hope for Team Seyerlein. In the final 10 yards of the race, Seyerlein manages to make a comeback to win. The battle was won by Seyerlein, but Team O'Brien was looking at the big picture and what they saw was eventual Sunday Series Championship and steward of the coveted Hallagan award.

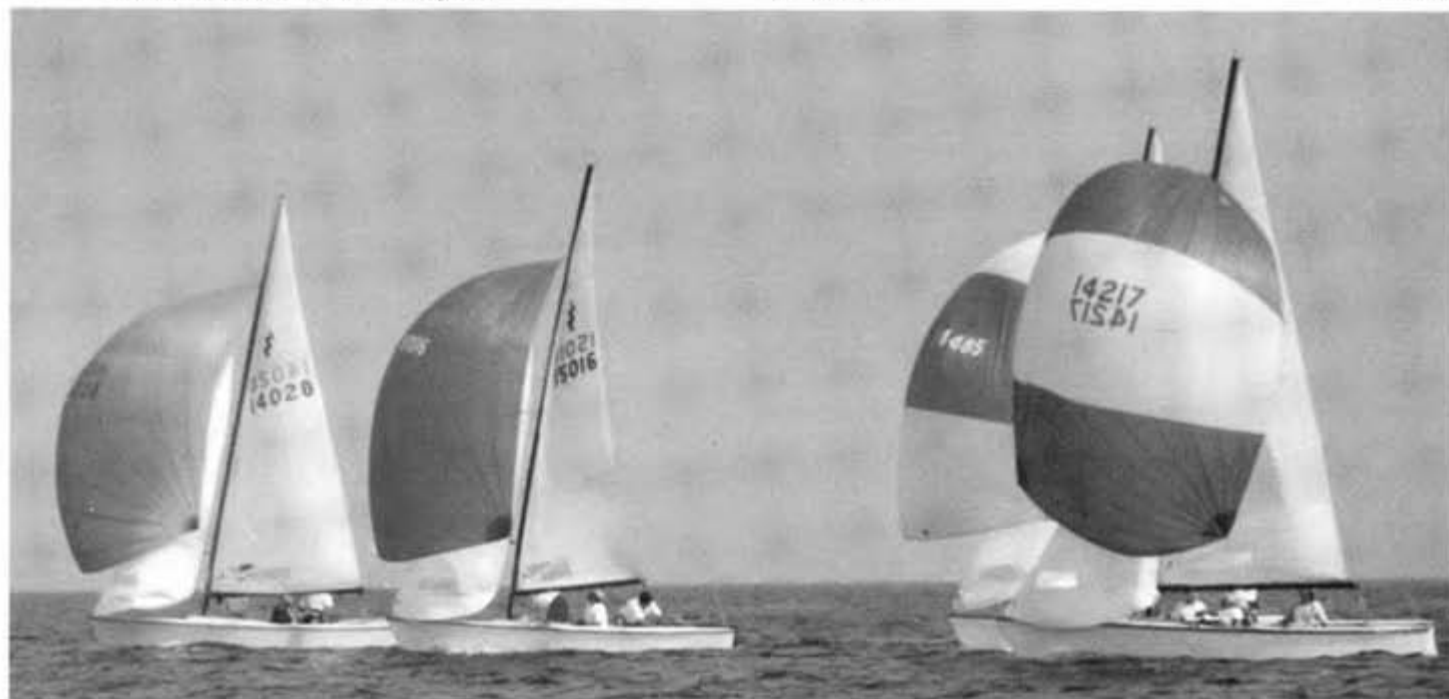

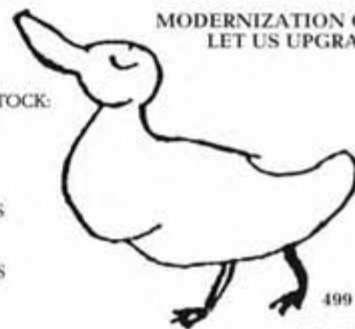
