FROM ROBERT F. MORRIS, L.E.H.Y.C. INTERNATIONAL REGATTA, 1958."

My curiosity was sparked and so I requested our Historian and Past President Mary Huntsman to research some more. She found out that Bob Morris had a passion for Lightnings as well as the America's Cup which she believes is why he got the wood to make the gavels in the first place.

Robert Morris was a sailor from Philadelphia who sailed Lightnings



out of Little Egg Harbor Yacht Club and when the Yacht America was destroyed in Annapolis, he took some of the wood. He made four gavels: the one he gave to ILCA, one for the New York Yacht Club (We are not sure its whereabouts), and two for his sons, Robert and William. Apparently there is more of the wood which Bob thought his dad gave to Mystic Seaport, where our Lightning #1 will be showcased.

#### The Helen and Jay Limbaugh Fund

Created to further an appreciation of the joys of Lightning sailing among Junior and Active Members of the International Lightning Class Association. It is meant to be funded by donations from class members in honor of Helen and Jay.

The Helen and Jay Limbaugh fund was established in memory of two of our most avid supporters. Helen was our Executive Secretary from 1965 to 1982. Jay was our class president in 1964. Both remained strong supporters of the class long after their tenures were completed.

The aim is to help junior sailors improve their boathandling skills, teamwork and tactical abilities. Print, video and/or electronic media may supplement these efforts. Future uses of these funds could be, but are not limited to: support for the US Sailing Sears Cup, fund junior racing clinics, trophies, etc. These efforts will doubtless evolve over time as input is received and as needs change.

Only the income generated on an annual basis may be used to supplement such programs. The principal may not be spent.



The ILCA fund was formed in 1982 to give some direction and impetus to the solicitation of charitable gifts. The Fund is directed by three former ILCA Presidents. The long term goal of the Fund is to build an endowment equal to two hundred percent of the annual operating budget. This should help guarantee that the



class remains solvent and ensure future sailors the opportunity to enjoy the excitement and fellowship of sailing a Lightning.

#### How to donate

When you pay your annual membership dues, include something extra as a gift to either fund. If you donate in excess of \$50 you will receive a gold sticker to place proudly on your boat that will allow others to see you love the Lightning.

## TRAINING AND FLEET DEVELOPMENT IN 2002



The year 2002 was an exciting one for the training and fleet development programs. Lightning Labs went to new areas and the Advanced Training Video was released in time for the holidays. One more tool is to be released prior to the Southern Circuit and that is a set of Crib Notes, tailored to the Lightning, to the North U books.

Just a bit of history on these projects to give credit to the



people who volunteered their time and effort to produce these programs in 2002. Lightning Labs: Skip Diebold to Indianapolis to train folks in the Indiana District; Bill Faude to Fleet 488 at Cherry Creek Reservoir in Denver Colorado; Bill Fastiggi to Fleet 332 on Squam Lake Holderness NH; Greg Fisher to Fleet 196 in Surf City NJ; Brian Hayes to Fleet 253 in Susquehanna PA, Fleet 75 in Nyack NY and Fleet 262 in Nashville TN. We are indebted to these people for their assistance. Advanced Training Video: Rick Bernstein provided the video technical expertise by putting together video from the 2000 North Americans at SSA and performing on the water video on the Monday before the Miami Mid-Winter Regatta in 2001. This was more than a simple task as the boats participating in the video had raced in Savannah the previous day and had driven through the night to Miami so that there would be a full day of filming on Monday. The actors in this production were

Bill Fastiggi, Andy Horton and Suzy Coburn, Greg Fisher, Jeff Eiber and Carol Cronin. The photo boat driver was Jack Jones Crib Notes: Last year at St Pete, during a lull in the racing, Ed Michaels of Fleet 481 in Raleigh NC persuaded Greg Fisher to put together a set of notes, based on the North U Performance Sail Trim book, that is Lightning specific. Everything is in place and Ed promises to have this information available before the 2003 Southern Circuit.

All of these new tools are available now, along with the original Crew Training Video from Bob Glassman. It is our hope that by using these tools, local fleets will be able to help everyone become more proficient in sailing their boats and minimize the frustrations of not understanding how to. One of the issues that we have noticed in the Lightning Labs is the large spread of knowledge in the participants, making it difficult to tailor a program that fits all needs and yet condense it into a two-day program. In order to make the Lightning Labs more productive, we are encouraging fleets to use the Advanced Training Video and the Crib Notes prior to coming to a Lightning Labs, which we see as a District event.

One other program that we see as a potential need is boat repair and rigging upgrades. The Lightning is a boat that has structural specifications that permit older boats to remain competitive over a long period. If there is one lack, it is that that the older boats have not kept current with the new controls, hardware and lines that make it easier to adjust sail shape, trim sails, etc. Lines that are so old that they are no longer flexible and cleats that don't hold are a great source of frustration. A winter session could be held by each Fleet to assist in the upgrade of these items.



## "FIRST LADY" OF THE LIGHTNING CLASS

October of 1938 brought Rod Stephens to Skaneateles Lake in central New York to try out a new sloop called a Lightning. With a 25 to 30 mile an hour wind, he gave Lightning #1, built by Skaneateles Boat Inc., a run for her money. She was sailed every way possible, according to a report in the MANUAL FOR LIGHTNING SKIPPERS===with and without a spinnaker, with and without a jib, with the main reefed, the centerboard in all stages of adjustment etc., and finally without a tiller. Mr. Stephens's pronouncement, "It is beyond all my expectations. To my mind she is the finest small centerboard boat ever built," paved the way for the development of the Lightning Class. Shortly thereafter, the Lightning Class Association was formed with E. Gordon Cronk, the original owner of Lightning #1, as Secretary-Treasurer.

Mr. Cronk held title to the boat until August 21, 1944, at which time Lewis S. Ayers, my father in law, purchased her. He retained ownership from that time until his death in June of 1963. Lew, an avid sportsman, who loved to share his enthusiasm in any new venture, used #1 to introduce many people to the joys of sailing. Lightning #1 was christened WEERLIGHT, (not pronounced we're licked!) remains in the family, but has left her home waters. We are sailing her on Casanovia Lake, just 30 miles from Skaneateles, out of Willow Bank Yacht Club, Fleet 164, having about 24 boats.

She is an "antique" — but hardly treated as one. She is in excellent condition and remains the original colors of dark blue hull, a white water line and a red bottom, which has been fiber glassed.

The boat has been sailed in races, although not with great regularity. The 1954 season was probably the most successful one for her. But she competes admirably and will continue to do so, we hope. This past summer, she beat the newest boat present (8555) in 2 out of 3 races in the Central New York Districts, sailed on Casanovia Lake, placing a fairly respectable 21st overall.

Visitors to New York will probably see the matriarch of the Lightnings, stately as ever with spanking new sails, out on Casanovia Lake, and all are invited to stop in for an inspection tour.

Historian's note: Jack Ryan bought #1 from these owners. Sandy and I purchased the boat from Jack and guaranteed the purchase and agreed to keep it stored at Mystic until we would donate it as a Class to the Seaport, where it will be showcased in 2003 during the WJM in August.







## SO WHAT IS NEW IN THE WAY OF LIGHTNING RULES?

Before enumerating recent changes in the regulations that guide our class it is important to have some understanding of the structure of the Class and the rules for making changes. There are a group of documents that delineate the policies and rules under which we operate starting with the By-Laws and Constitution that may be amended when necessary by the membership. Then there are Rules Governing our Sanctioned Regattas (Districts, Areas, and Worlds) and Specifications that may be amended by the Governing Board. Specification changes also require prior approval of the Measurement Committee. The Governing Board can interpret the By-Laws and Constitution. The Executive Committee is empowered to act in the name of the Governing Board when prompt action is required. The Executive and Measurement Committees are also given the authority to make Rulings and Interpretations so long as they adhere to intended meaning and established policy. The Governing Board ratifies Executive and Measurement Committee Rulings.

As we move into the twenty-first century, we find that our documents, most originating in the nineteen forties and fifties need revision to bring them in line with twenty-first century practice and technology. Hence, a great deal of effort continues to go into review and up-date. Here are some of the many recent items addressed and decisions made during the past year:

#### Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws:

Return membership to an annual calendar year basis. Membership now runs January to January except for new members joining after June 1st whose first renewal will be January of the second calendar year after joining.

Adds International Masters and the North American Masters, Juniors, Women's

Championships to the list of regattas automatically sanctioned.

#### Amendments to the Specifications:

Leaves District Measurement (except safety equipment) to the discretion of the District governing body.

Allows greater use of modern fittings.

Requires record of all currently valid Measurement

Committee rulings be kept in the Class Office and on the Website.

#### **Rulings and Interpretations:**

Up-date of rules for electronic equipment on board. Allows having communication equipment on board, basically for emergency use. To be proposed as an amendment to the Specifications.

Sailcloth Specification up-dated to recognize materials currently available with provision for consideration of new materials and method of control. To be proposed as an amendment to the Specifications.

Ruling sets minimum age requirement for North American & International Masters at 55 for the skipper and total age of skipper and crew at 130. Subsequent clarification specifies age is that attained during the calendar of the Championship. To be proposed as an amendment to the Rules Governing.

Ruling that for purposes of qualifying for World Championships, the country of residence prevails rather than country of citizenship.

Ruling which makes most existing spinnaker poles legal. To be proposed as an amendment to the Specifications.

#### Other Significant Activity:

Recalculated metric conversions in the Plans & Specifications and corrected where necessary. (English units take precedence.)

Measurement procedure to provide a consistent method of checking shroud tension developed by the Measurement Committee.

Review of old Measurement Committee Rulings and Interpretations. Those currently valid will be retained in the Office and on the Website.

New ISAF rules that will require revision of Class Rules regarding advertising are currently being evaluated.

So that's a quick overview of where we are as we enter 2003. It is obvious that as our sailing world becomes more technical, our old rules will require constant reassessment. We'll try to keep you posted.

## COPA DEL PACIFICO 2002 UNO MAS POR FAVOR

Although lightly attended this International youth regatta required no qualifications to sail other being under 20 years of age and getting your team to Guayaquil, Ecuador on December 5th. Salinas and back, as well as the boats, lodging and meals for all the competitors. Other than the six teams from Ecuador only one team from the USA attended. Salinas is very much interested in hosting this regatta again next year and with the 2004 Youth Worlds almost 2 years away this could serve as a warm-up for that event. The making of life long international friends is a very important part of this regatta as well as increasing the interest in the younger sailors to sail our beloved boat. On another note, the USA qualifiers for the 2004 Lightning Youth World Championships will be this summer at the Junior NAs in Niantic, August 12th thru 15th. Only two USA teams will qualify for the 2004 Youth Worlds. Now is the time to start getting your teams together for this regatta. I would like to challenge each District in the US sent at least one team. And I would definitely like to see a few teams from South America and Europe as well. One problem with getting International teams to come to the Junior NAs is boats, so if your willing to loan your boat to a team let me know. This is definitely one way to build interest in our sport. Also starting looking around your district for younger sailors and help put a team together. This doesn't happen over night and to be competitive they need coaching and practice, along with sailing a few district regattas. If you need an example, just look at



Metedeconk River and what Jim Carson has done over the years or Central New York District or Mallet's Bay. This didn't happen with the help from those club and district members. And remember if they don't qualify for the Youth Worlds, there is the 2003 Pacific Cup to look forward to. I know I am and I was only a spectator (except for the practice race, thanks Juan).

















## SO WHAT IS NEW IN THE WORLD OF LIGHTNING DESIGN?

Not much really, this is a one design class. Maybe a better question would be: What are we rediscovering? Doing well does not come from the latest gadgets. I know, don't say it – the guys at the top of the class all have the latest and greatest stuff. Heard it before, sailed with them and I own the latest stuff. It might matter a little bit if all the teams out there were equal in caliber, but we are strong class with a wide range of boat ages. For 99.9% of us out there, it is not the latest and greatest that makes you faster on the course. I won't debate that boats, masts and sails get older –

even sailors do (I would like to think I am getting smarter though). And I agree that older things do not necessarily perform like new ones. But look at it this way, there are a number of 70+ olds that can out


perform me in a 10k, because they take better care of themselves than I do. So what is new?

There is a renewed focus to get the fundamentals right.

What sailors are relearning is to work at the following things first:

• Bottom: No other surface has a greater impact on speed (well, maybe the sails). This year we debated the issue of fairing the bottoms of boats. We all agreed that this is a great way of taking an old boat and making is look and perform new again. You do not have to spend lots of money to make a difference. Some elbow grease and time to clean up the bottom can make a noticeable difference.

- Sails: No, this is not an ad for the sail makers. Old sails are slower. Over time, they lose their shape.
- Rig tuning: Each sail maker has a recommended tuning plan for the rig. This year a good friend of mine finally let me tune his rig (it was way off). With no other changes, I saw him place consistently a lot higher.
- Ease of crew work: I don't think any other thing you
  can do could have a bigger impact on the enjoyment of
  sailing and speed. This is a class that requires team
  work. Imagine if I had to play a soccer match against
  those 70 olds who win the 10Ks and my team had to




 Make sure the lines run smooth – decrease the line size, make sure that the lines are

long enough so you don't run out, and back-bungee everything that gets adjusted a lot (e.g. wire, cloth, vang).

- Place the controls so that they are easy to get to and don't require the weight to go to the wrong places. The key controls to rethink are:
- Spinnaker halyard: It should cleat on its own when pulled up and allow multiple people to raise and lower it.
- Jib halyard: It should be aligned so that when you pull
  it up it easily pops into the slide or when pulled it pops
  out from the slide to lower quickly.
- Jib cloth and wire controls: get them out on the rail and double side them.





- Ability to un-sheet the jib: Ever try to un-sheet that old style block and cleat thing that fits on the slide in a heavy breeze? You can't. Change those out for a fixed cleating position that is aligned for easy sheeting/unsheeting by the forward crew.
- Traveler and height: These controls make a big difference in main shape that translates into speed.
- Get a compass that you can read: Maybe you are really good and just know what wind is doing. Many of us do not. We need a compass to understand where we should be going on the course. Many boats have compasses that don't help you see the wind shifts. You don't need one of those new fangled digital compassesjust one you can read.

Trailer: We forget about this one. But you do have to get to the regatta, don't you? So check the bearings

and axels. Make sure the bunks are not contributing to problems with the smoothness of your bottom (the boat's!).

There are lots of ways to accomplish the things above. This is a class of people who help each other so ask someone for ideas - all of us have a personal preference on how to...

And don't forget – tactics and boat handling matter, too. But most of all, if you are having fun, you are winning.



## A BRIEF HISTORY FROM THE 1940 YEARBOOK

The idea that a small yacht could be designed to serve both as a safe, and as responsive, lively racer with big boat performance was inspired by the suggestion of experienced small boat sailors over a wide area. It was thought that such a boat would have more universal appeal and result in a strong, one-design class organization. Early in 1938 the idea took form on the designing boards of Sparkman & Stephens, and the unusual features of this 19-foot sloop became more readily apparent. The boat was given the name "Lightning".

Between October 1938, when the first Lightning was launched at Skaneateles, and January 1939, when she was unveiled officially to the public at the New York Boat Show, there were many tests and searching trials by the designers and other qualified experts. Preliminary announcements in yachting publications had aroused a natural curiosity, but the enthusiastic reception accorded the first public showing was little short of sensational. The design so long visualized by many small boat sailors had become a reality.

Before the New York show closed a meeting of those who had ordered Lightnings was held in the Grand Central Palace. A temporary chairman was elected and a committee was named to draw the constitution, by-laws and racing rules for the new class organization. On April 15th the second general meeting was held, and out of the 117 paid registration in the class at the time, Lightning owners came from such widely separated points as Barnegat Bay, Long Island Sound, Lake Hopatcong, and Buffalo. Proxies were voted by the other owners in Maine,

Texas and Oklahoma. Many were interested in the formation of fleets. Officers were elected, the constitution was ratified, and the Lightning Class Association was officially organized.

One of the first official acts of the Associations was to acquire the rights and title to the Lightning plans, to establish the means and machinery for regulating the use of these plans and to publish such information as would be of value to the many who were buying or building Lightnings. The Constitution, By-laws and Rules for National Championships were published in booklet form, membership cards were made and distributed, and a new charter was designed. Complete specifications and blue prints were made up, measurement certificates were made up and printed, and plans were made for the first National Championships.

Due to the newness of the Class and the brief time for fleet organization before the summer season was under way local

activity was limited to individual participation in a few regattas. A number of Lightning owners in Central New York participated in the Central New York Y. R. A. regions at Canandaigua; others were entered at Larchmont Race Week. But the high point of activity for the class was the first National Championship at Barnegat Bay over the course of the Bay Head Yacht Club.

As the sailing season closed in Northern areas the focus of attention on Lightning activity shifted to southern waters whose group of Lightning owners were found in Florida, Georgia,

Louisiana and Texas. Interest in the Class appeared to continue unabated, and by January 1940 – the first anniversary of Lightning's public debut – close to 400 numbers had been assigned by the secretary of the class.

The second annual meeting, held on January 11th in New York was marked by a representative attendance and lively discussion on the question of policy. In terms of the future of the class, the enthusiasm for an active second year was equaled in importance by the determined opposition of membership to resist changes in design and uphold that significant feature of the Lightning Class constitution - "To rigidly maintain a strictly one-design class, in order to positively insure that all Lightning Class races held under the auspices of the Association be to determine the skill of the skipper, and to eliminate all variations in construction of the yachts".

- 1. What did you do from a sailing/training perspective prior to the regatta that you think made the biggest difference in your winning the regatta?
- 2. Putting the right team together is critical to winning a major championship. Why did you select the team that you did?
- 3. What changes did you make to the boat (rigging, sails, set up etc.) did you make to the boat prior to the regatta that made a big difference to your finish?
- 4. When did you know you had won the regatta? How did that feel?
- 5. This is pretty obscure, but think back...what was in your starboard cubby as you crossed the finish line of the last race?



## Jeff Linton, Mark Taylor, Amy Smith Linton WORLD CHAMPIONS

- 1. That's a hard question. We knew we had the best equipment we could find. We had been working out regularly for the year and a half before the regatta. We did a lot of boat-handling practice and we tried to anticipate the conditions. We came into the event after a week's vacation for Jeff and Amy, and Mark had spent a whirlwind two days in Rome, so we had plenty to think about aside from the racing. It's as much good fortune as anything, but we gave ourselves the best chance of being ready to do well.
- 2. Our team started with the nucleus of Mark and Jeff. They had sailed against one another in Sunfish, and also sailed successfully together for many years on J-24's and other big boats. Mark had sailed Lightnings on the Hudson river as a kid. They got into a Lightning together in around 1994, and their tactics gelled.

When Amy married into the family in 1995, she was just convenient back-up crew in need of boat-handling skills. It wasn't until after we placed second at the Ecuador Worlds that she dropped the "provisional" status.

As a team, we have a great time together: we laugh a lot on the race course, and, as Mark points out, "We aren't in this for the money. It's all about having a great time."

Family life takes precedence, but we anticipate sailing together as long as we are able.

3. Thanks to an unfortunate boat collision the autumn before the regatta, we had a brand-spanking-new Allen. A more-or-less bare hull was delivered during Southern Circuit, and we shipped the boat in early June. During those short weeks, we crammed in a lot of boat work. We tend to spend a lot of time on preparation, regardless the boat. Not so much because the boat needs it – other teams win without touching their boats – but because it gives us a sense of being ready to do battle.

Our boat had a new set of Ullman Sails, including a spinnaker that we feel is really fast, a Gable-ized bottom job (Gable Enterprises of St. Petersburg), and a unique boat setup. It was the work of a couple of weekends putting on hardware and rigging lateral hiking straps (like a Sunfish or Laser, rather than transverse ones, which our ankles cannot take). We don't have many duplicate controls. All the ends of lines were taped, the halyards were fresh, pole ends were lubricated. The

usual routine - just double-checked a few more times!

- 4. We didn't know for sure really for sure and reeeeeeealy believe it until they posted results. It felt like we had really won when we were standing on the podium with the national anthem playing, and all the hardware massed before us. Then again, it's occurred to all three of us over and over in the ensuing months ("Wow! We really won it. The Worlds!"), like when our host club threw a party for us, when the trophies arrived safe with the boat, when someone calls for an interview. It's been pretty darned amazing.
- 5. Not such a hard question, our starboard cubby has often been the source of some envy: we had a spare glove for Amy, a pair of gloves for Mark, sunblock, the remains of a mozzarella-and-tomato sandwich, and here's what some crew envied us a tall bottle of Moretta, the local beer.





## Bill Healy, Tim Healy, Jo Ann Jones NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONS

- One thing I really worked on was my intensity at regattas prior to the North Americans. Typically I have not been very aggressive or try to force issues at local or District regattas, but I knew that I needed to do that to be ready for the intensity of the NA's.
- 2. Our team was awesome. I have been sailing with Jo Ann for a few years now and she knows what to expect from me and I know what to expect from her. She is very focused and can handle the front of a Lightning with a blindfold on. My reasons for picking my brother Tim are obvious. He's a

pretty damn good sailor! But I also wanted to sail with him because we know what each other is thinking without saying anything. Sounds weird but it's true. Right after the start if he calls for a tack, there is no hesitation on my part. Over goes the helm. We trust each other's calls out on the water. That

3. I bought a seven year old boat before the NA's due to budget constraints so I did a few things to update the boat. The first two things I did was have an eight inch jib halyard installed, and then I removed the booby trap jib sheeting system the previous owner had on the boat and replaced it with Allen inboard glass mounts with Harken micro tracks. Then during the summer I replaced old lines and shock cord as needed and made sure every system worked perfectly.

I did not do the Atlantic Coast Championships because I would have been without a family so I negotiated and was able to flip the boat then wet sand and polish the bottom. Luckily I had a new daughter and I was able to compare her smooth baby bottom to the work I was doing on the boat. I didn't stop until I couldn't tell the difference. I also paid close attention to the bailer area and the chine's. An older boat tends to have worn chines so I did the best I could and tried to sharpen them up. I

also sanded and polished the centerboard and rudder.

4. The regatta came down to the last race. We were deep

after restarting and we were counting back from the top to see where Matt Fisher's team was. We needed him to finish 12th or worse and we would After an awesome comeback I think we counted Matt as finishing 13th. But that did not mean we could celebrate. There were a few boats that were OCS and if some of them finished in front of Matt, he would win. So after pulling up the rear in the last race we finally hit the dock and found out Matt had been OCS. I've always dreamed of finishing the last race ahead of your closest



competitor and being able to celebrate right there and have a great sail in with spectators throwing us beers. But we had to sail the last beat by ourselves and all the way in until we were sure we had won. It was quite a Mylanta moment.

5. Well, I wish we had Mylanta or Tums or something but I think we had in no particular order: hiking pants, lunch, mast blocks, anchor, our bucket with tools and bow line and our lone shroud adjuster. I think that was it.





## Erik Johnson, Kail Johnson, Kate Brush NORTH AMERICAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONS

- 1. For the past two years we sailed as a team in all of the fleet and districts regattas we could as well as last years Junior and open NA's, then Erik and Karl sailed in and won the Seas Cup with another member of our fleet. We have also spent the past two years working tirelessly on tuning and tactic techniques with Bill Fastiggi and Don Brush as well as breaking up and sailing with the two of them this year in the ACCs. All of this have taught us an unbelievable amount and considerably enhanced our boat handling skills.
- 2. I don't really know how it all started but the three of us had sailed together for several years before we got to this point. We have the advantage that a lot of teams don't have because we are consistent. We have done almost nothing but sail together for about two years now, so we have gotten really comfortable as team in the boat. We anticipate each other's moves and are able to work together better because of that knowledge of each other. Now, Erik and Karl were born with this connection, so when we first started I was defiantly the outsider and it took me a lot longer to get the hang of the team then it did for them. But now we know each other pretty well and while I think it is still a little more difficult for me, it is defiantly this connection that brought us so much good fortune this year.
- 3. I think the thing that made the biggest difference between our competition and us was the amount of training that we did. But we did also have good fortune of sailing with new sails that were loaned to us from Shore Sails Burlington. The other thing that we did right before we left for Michigan was to thoroughly wash and wax the boat, which made a big difference because whenever we tried to move the boat it would slide around on the trailer if we weren't careful.

4. It was close, very close and there were definitely no guarantees going into the last race, in fact I think that the leader of the regatta changed several times throughout the last race. We knew we had won when crossed the finish line and there was this sense of calm as well as unbearable excitement, but at that point what we really wanted to know was how the rest of the standings would end up. The top four teams had all become

#### **FLEET 50 REPORT**

We had a terrific 2002 sailing season and we set several new records. Thirty-six boats competed in the Doc Gilbert Potomac Cup (second highest ever). Twenty-six boats competed in the Leukemia/President's Cup (the largest fleet). We had a record turnout in our Fall series (an average of 11 boats). Growth resumed this year with a net increase of 4 new skippers. At the end of the sailing season 23 skippers/boat owners (including one who lives in Hampton, VA had sailed at least one day on the river. We also had the first marriage of a skipper and crew.

Six new skippers joined the fleet and two left. New boat owner/skipper Laurie Duncan campaigned Wasabi (13306) almost every Sunday this fall with dedicated crew Cathy Bleakly. Improvement was steady and on the last day she finished 6th out of 10 boats. She will be honored with the best rookie skipper award for 2002. We were also delighted to see Eric Swanson back on the course after an absence of several years. Bobby Astrove who sold 14019 several years ago was back with a restored woody, 7603 Pandora II. His 6th place finish in the 26 boat President's Cup regatta shows that with a good sailor at the helm of an old woody can be competitive. Newcomer Rob Tompkins brought 10527 into the fleet and competed her for the first time on the last day of the season. Jim Greenwell crewed for Nabeel and is anxious to join the racing next spring. Peter McDonnell brought 14375 into our area, but with Ainsley being born into the family, he and Allison took the year off from racing. Unfortunately, we lost good friend and former fleet captain Stuart White who sold 14479 because he and his family decided to try cruising on a C&C 35 for a while. We also lost a great advocate for sailing Ben Forman who sold 12018, Swill Dog, to a Susquehanna skipper because he moved back to Boston to go to graduate school. However, we were delighted to see his regular crew, Thacher Tiffany, campaign Lord Jim, Doc Gilbert's boat that is still with the Gilbert family.

#### DOC GILBERT POTOMAC CUP

Our major event of the year is the Potomac Cup, sailed from expansive Leesylvania State park about 20 miles south of our marina. With pleasant weather 36 boats competed, the second highest number ever. Beyond our own skippers, we drew 21 boats from fleets in 7 states. Three boats came from the Solomon's fleet (out of a total fleet size of 5), 3 came from Nyack and 3 from Riverton near Philadelphia. Dick Hallagan, who regularly does the 8 plus hour drive from Rochester, NY to participate, again won the regatta – his name on the perpetual trophy dominates all others. Pierce Barden, who finished 2nd, wrote a nice article for the August Flashes. Of particular interest this year was the participation and finish of the "girl boat." Skipper Wendy Bisset, and crew Cathy Bleakly and

#### FLEET CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

The championship series was comprised of 58 races on the river with the best 46 being scored. This scoring system rewarded skippers who sailed often, which, of course, is what we want. The Potomac River Sailing Association (PRSA) Spring and Fall Sunday series consisted of 22 races each. The remaining 14 races were from the Doc Gilbert Potomac Cup, the PRSA Spring Regatta, and the Leukemia & President's Cup regatta. In 2002, 23 Fleet 50 boats sailed at least one day on the river. Racing was close well down into the standings.

The Fall series was particularly noteworthy. Eighteen boats participated. We averaged 11 boats on the starting line up from 9 in 2001. The moderate breezes made for very close racing. On several days, 3-4 boats were trying to round the windward mark at the same time leading to colorful conversation. Drew Hudson, who displays an uncanny ability to always being sailing in the right direction, won the Fall with crew Sousan Arafeh and Eric Ostenfeld. Pat McGee sailing with Jill Williamson and lan MacLeod, took second for both the Fall and the overall Championship Series. Pat owes more than a debt of gratitude to Paul Maher who loaned Pat his mast after Pat's mast was broken during a capsize at the Frigit Digit. Jeff

Our annual Leukemia /President's Cup, (the 9th Leukemia and 68th President's Cup) has raised more money than any other Leukemia/Lymphoma society sponsored racing event around the country! He had to contend with an easterly (cross river) wind, 6 starts for each race (not counting general recalls), and inconsistent winds that wreaked havoc with the starting line. PRSA awarded him and the Lightning Fleet with the coveted Fleet Captain's award for outstanding race committee performance. The largest fleet was the Lightning class with 26 boats, of which 10 boats were visitors. River sailing might be less than ideal, but the other attractions and our hospitality are drawing lots of boats. Our own Frank Gallagher won the Lightning class with the help of former fleet captain, Christy Dillard, who is back from Hawaii where husband had been stationed. Nabeel Alsalam's third place finish was his best in a relatively large regatta.

Thacher Tiffany made the Lightning fleet proud by winning the PRSA Helms regatta, an event that pits the best skippers from each of the one-design fleets against each other in three types of boats – Lasers, Albacores, and Lightnings this year.



Again, the RC proved that they know more than we do, as the races started in 10+ feet of water on a GREAT square course. Garrett's local knowledge from years of fishing on these waters showed that he has the knowledge and experience to make a nice long course. Racing commenced in a good breeze from this area, about 8-10 kts, with flat water and little powerboat chop. Add

in a moored barge on the course, the proximity of a shoreline, the local river current, and tidal changes, and you had an excellent racing venue. Dick Moyer and Carl Muska waged a great battle to end up neck and neck in the end. Dick took the overall title with the benefit of a throwout score ending a great first time regatta. The traditional HdG duck decoys presented as trophies were a great hit, and to make sure that everyone was happy, the fleet took that extra step to make sure that the "side show" portions of the regatta were top notch. Myrl, Scott, and many others put together a top notch dinner and there was an ample amount of Caribbean rum available at breakfast to keep everyone happy. (If one can't beat the competition, ply them with alcohol)

Last year, we wrote that 2001 was one of our best years ever. Few could argue that 2002 wasn't just as much fun. Participation in our Sunday Series remained strong, and we had many 'Road Warriors' carrying the LSC Burgee to away regattas around the state. For a small fleet, we had a lot of sailing going on! All but three of our boats raced.

Sunday Series Racing The traditional LSC Sunday Series kicked off this year on April 21. The usual suspects claimed the podium positions. George Siegle, with Ann Siegle and Gil Chesbro on 'Fins' had two bullets and a 2nd. Pat Dolan with Stacy Kotecki and Gary Marx aboard 'Wind Dancer' got the other 1st, plus a 2nd and a 3rd. Mike Moody with Ken Knight on 'Moody's Booty' sailed consistently to score a 2nd and two 3rd-place finishes. Dying winds shortened sailing on the following Sunday, but not before 'Fins' and 'Wind Dancer' each claimed one more bullet. You know it must be light when an LSC race is called off – we love our Sunday sailing. With two weeks of sailing practice, we were ready for the regatta.

LSC Regatta "Big Water' Lightning skippers came from near and far to attend Lansing Sailing Club's 37th Annual - Lake Lansing "Tune Up" Regatta. Justin 'Gus' Dey, with daughter Rachel and George Peet, came

from the Saginaw Bay fleet. The Lake Michigan sailors, Bill Gibson, Steve Jenkins and Dave Gibson, arrived after the 4+ hour drive from Chicago. Jeff Hagman, Jennifer Wood and Al Newell represented the Western Lake Erie Fleet 42. The other long distant traveler was Jeff Bodkin of the Pymatuning YC, a resident of Shaker Heights, OH (near Cleveland) came with Eli Milonas and Julie Pierce of LSC was their 3rd.

We again used the one day regatta format: 1st start at 10:30 am with 2 short races back to back, come in for a delicious chili - cornbread lunch break, then plan on 4 mare races, but no race to start after 4 pm.

David Nickels of the Lake Fenton Sailing Club, with Jennifer and Nancy Armbruster, took 1st place honors, after the tie-breaker with Jeff Hagman of the North Cape Yacht Club, both were at 13 points after the 5 race one-day regatta. David had 1st places finishes in race 1 and race 4. Jeff had a 1st place finish in race 2 and a 2nd place finish in race 5. The Chicago crew, Bill Gibson, Steve Jenkins and Dave Gibson, with 20 points, placed 3rd. Their best results were 2nd place finishes in races 2 and 4. LSC skipper Pat Dolan with Doug Carlson and Gary Marx, earned 22 points to place 4th. Their best race was a 1st place finish in race 5. LSC's Fleet Captain, George Siegle with Ann Siegle and Gil Chesbro had a 2nd in race 1 and a 3rd in race 5 earning 29 points to place 5th in the regatta. LSC's Pat Dolan was awarded the "Ye Olde Silver Platter" for the third year in a row. This honor goes to the highest placing Fleet #387 skipper as visitor boats usually drive away with the top regatta honors.

Back to Sunday Sailing... Our Sunday format is two races, back to back, with the first starting signal at 1 p.m. A lunch break is followed by the third race. The three-races-per-day format was new for 2001 and has proven popular. We managed to get in 66 races this year, the most ever. Only a few days were completely shut out due to either no wind or too much wind. Even though we sent a lot more boats to away regattas, our average number of boats on the starting line remained above 6, with a couple of 9 and 10 boat days. The three usual suspects 'Moody's Booty,' 'Wind Dancer' and 'Fins' battled throughout the season, with Moody leading most of the season followed by Dolan and Siegle. The Marshalls, sailing 'Ohm,' proved tough on light air days, picking up a number of first-place finishes. After missing most of August and September, Siegle edged back in front of Dolan in early October, but just barely. The three arrived at the final Sunday, October 20, with only 90 points (out of about 3000+) separating them. Behind the scenes, skippers and crews were calculating the possibilities. Though incorrectly reported at the time (it's that 'new math'), it later was determined that with five boats on the line, three wins would allow Dolan to pass Siegle for 2nd, three wins would allow Siegle to pass Moody for 1st, and one win would secure the championship for Moody. The 'Fins' crew continued their hot streok and won the first two races, but not by much; it was close all the way around. So it was down to one race - seven leas windward-leeward on a chilly, windy and typically shifty day. Moody and Siegle both started cleanly on the left side of the line and headed up the course nearly even and on starboard. Getting near the west side of the lake, 'Fins' tacked first to get back in touch with a boat going up the middle. This proved to be a huge mistake. 'Moody's Booty' tacked almost immediately as well, But the Lake Lansing winds gave it a ten degree lift that 'Fins' did not get, and by the



first mark, 'Moody's Booty' had a sizeable lead of 20+ boat lengths over second-place 'Fins.' The lead expanded and contracted, and by the bottom of downwind leg four, the gap was almost a quarter leg. After two big shifts on the beat, the gap was closed down to six boat lengths heading into the last of the downwind legs. 'Moody's Booty' did a bearaway set, but gybed shortly onto port. 'Fins' gybe-set the chute and tried to cover from behind on port. The margin was down to about three to four lengths when boat boats gybed simultaneously for the mark. 'Fins' dropped the board, put the pole on the forestay and hiked for a fast reach to the mark. 'Moody's Booty' headed up to protect their wind, but started to get overpowered. The slippery cockpit kept them from getting their weight out, and the combination of the puff, a stalled rudder and the Lightning's big square chines induced a slow knockdown. The two boats exchanged offers of assistance and congratulations to close out the season. The 'Fins' crew sailed alone up to the finish, but mused on what could have been a great mark rounding and an epic tacking duel up the final beat

In the end, it was 'Firis' by only 11 points (21 wins, 3167 points) over 'Moody's Booty' (17 wins, 3156 points) - a margin of just 0.3 %. But for the quirks in our scoring system, this is about as close to a draw as you can get. A wind shift here, another boat on the line there and it could have been a different result. 'Wind Dancer' was close behind with 14 wins and 3066 points. Ron Marshall, usually sailing with Jane Marshall and many-times fleet champion Bob Hill, sailed to fourth in 'Ohm' with 7 wins and 2640 points, and Blaine Severin skippered 'UPF' to fifth with one win and 2166 points. Skippers needed 26 races out of 66 possible to qualify, and the best 26 were counted. Nine skippers qualified for season honors and there were 21 different skippers on the starting line in 2002.

Away Regattas Lansing skippers hit the road in record numbers in 2002. Despite our small size and conflicting Sunday races, the fleet skippers made a concerted effort to attend district regattas this season - and it shows. Competition for people's time was tight, with EIGHT home MSU football games (a big factor in this college town - many alums in the club), the Detroit NOOD, Sunfish and Laser regattas, and a season series that came down to the final downwind leg of 66 races. But we still managed to send boats all over Michigan. At North Cape, Larry Koster crewed for George Peet. Three boats made the trip to Michigan Districts at Tawas - George Siegle, Gil Chesbro and Ann Siegle in 'Fins'; Blaine Severin, Koster and Tom Rasmussen in 'UFP' and Mike Moody, Helio Vogel and friend in 'Moody's Booty.' Competition was intense on this beautiful bay of Lake Huron. Though memories are a bit fuzzy, it's widely believed that the 'Fins' team, with their 28th place finish, was the first Lansing boat to have qualified for NAs. Higgins Lake is a favorite among LSC sailors. Making the short trip up US-27 were Neil Harrison, Alanna Harvey and Jim Newton in 'Fubar', Severin, Koster and Dennis Dudley in 'UFP' and Siegle, John LeFevre and Ann Siegle in 'Fins.' This was Harrison's first away regatta. Congratulations Neill Bay City is also a popular destination for LSC sailors because it's Matt and Andrea Dahline's hometown. Severin, Rasmussen and Harrison sailed 'UFP', and Matt Dahline, LeFevre and Koster sailed 'Fastidiots.' George Siegle with Ann Siegle and Koster had a great week at North Cape - North Americans aboard 'Fins.' Although they had to miss the last day of racing, Team Fins enjoyed the competition and camaraderie of NAs -

and they came back better sailors for it. The nearby Pontiac White Cap Regatta was attended by Severin, Julie Pierce and LeFevre aboard 'UFP,' and Pat Dolan, Stacy Kotecki and Terry Kleiman on "Wind Dancer." Pat Dolan reports that he will be sailing in the upcoming Bluenose with Moody and Kleiman. Severin and Koster are our official 2002 Road Warriors!

Season Awards This year, LSC combined its traditional "Crew Appreciation Night" with the "Annual Banquet." In addition to trophies for the fleet champion (Siegle) and runner-up (Moody), several other awards were presented. Ken Knight, sailing with Mike Moody, was awarded 'Crew of the Year.' Tom Rasmussen was presented with the 'Wet Bottom Award' for going 'all out' for his team. Legend holds that Tom did a 'missed hiking strap with a full twist and half-gainer' from Severin's 'UFP' but didn't even get his head wet. Tom would have won gold, but the French judge was bought off by the Russian mafia and he scored only an 8.7.

We had no real rookie crews this year, so the "Rookie Crew of the Year" will have to wait for 2003. Neil Harrison was our most improved sailor this season, moving up a whole finishing place, on average. The final award, and one of the most important, is the "Corinthian Award." The award is presented annually to the skipper who most actively advances the interests of the Lansing Lightning Fleet. Mike Moody was a regular instructor in LSC's Discover Sailboat Racing Class. In addition, he was active in fleet racing and away regattas. And, he showed great competitive spirit and sportsmanship throughout the year and especially on the final day of the Sunday Series. Way to go Mike!

Also, we are sailing as much as possible during the year.


With ours friends in Salinas Yacht Club we sail as much as we can.

#### FLEET 456, TUUSULVANJARVI LAKE TUUSULVANJARVI, TUUSULA, FINLAND



2002 was a mixed year. Fleet membership (17 to 18) and ILCA membership (8 to 13) were up, but the amount of total sailing done was down 17%, just erasing the growth of 2001. Looking at it member by member, there is no common reason why the activity was down. The average member raced or sailed 13 days last year. About 60% (or 8 days) of the sailing by members is racing their Lightning; the rest is day-sailing or racing on a boat other than their Lightning. The racing-their-Lightning days only went down by 7% and is still 17% ahead of 2000, but we need that number to double, not go down. It does, however, look like the amount of racing and total sailing will recover, plus some, in 2003.

Background: Fleet 481 is one of the 5 one-design fleets that constitute the Carolina Sailing Club (CarolinaSailingClub.org). The club is a racing-only club, owns race committee boats and

equipment, and no real estate. It was the first US Sailing (USYRU) One-Design Club of the Year. The club and fleet race on Kerr Lake and Lake Jordan, which are near Raleigh, Durham and Chapel Hill in central North Carolina, and the club fleets frequently hold regattas on the Pamlico and Albemarle Sounds in eastern NC. The club is healthy in terms of membership, finances, and the amount of racing (all small boat).

Membership: Three boats joined the fleet: John Driscoll, Frank Mason and David Raley. Two boats were dropped: Tim Borland moved away, and one other is no longer reported as a fleet member (not ILCA member, boat not sailed in 3 yrs.). Net: up one member. Therefore, the fleet now numbers 18 skipper/owners, up from 14 in 2000 and 17 last year. Two of the existing members bought almost new boats (John Pelosi and Avis & Henry Bridgers), and David Raley joined and bought a brand new one – so we went from 2 to 5 boats numbered higher than 14900.

Regular and frequent crew in 2003: we are informal about fleet membership in general, and downright slack about crew membership. There are many folk that crewed frequently in our boats last year. Some of them are Harold Broadwell, Gene Prather, Clay Rumble, Kelsey Libner, Tom Walker, Scott Lowery, Dan Richards, Sara Paisner, John McLaughlin, Jessica Mills and Dale Oller. John Chaplinsky frequently has his wife Brenda and daughters Tanya and Sonya; Chuck Moore sails with his daughters Meryl and Mallory.

Amount of sailing: See the table at the end of the report. Essentially we look at both the number of days the Lightning was sailed, plus any days that the member sailed on other boats. Looking at individual members/boats, the amount of actual sailing was down 17% from 2001, measured by the number of days we sailed (234). The average was 13 days of sailing per fleet member/boat. Of the 18 boats/members, seven raced their Lightning on at least three weekends, and an additional two raced at least once; the other nine – or half the fleet - did not race their boat this year. Of that non-racing half, only two did not get in any sailing in any form.

Slightly down from 2001 because of racing canceled for weather or low water, available local race days are still high and not at all a limiting factor on people getting racing. The fleet and the club conducted 27 days of local racing open to Lightnings, spread over all 12 months. This year 2 or more



Lightnings raced in 24 of the days available. Since our winter climate is moderate by northern standards, we do "frostbite" Lightnings. No wet suits, do use spinnakers, but sail more conservatively to avoid swimming incidents, and the club does cancel if the wind-temperature combination is bad. There were five days canceled (of the nine scheduled days) in 2002, more than double the old record of two cancellations.

Local glory: in club racing, one of the three series provides trophies. Bob Graves won for the first half, and Michael Rees (1st) and John Pelosi (2nd) won the silver for the second half and for the full series.

Six boats participated in the Southeastern District Circuit. For two, the only participation were the two "local" regattas that we hold that are on the circuit; the other 4 boats did away district regattas also. Fleet participation in the district circuit was down for the third year in a row; only John Pelosi sailed enough to "qualify" for circuit trophies. He finished 4th of the 8 total qualifiers.

We sent a boat to the full Southern Circuit and to the NAs. Ed Michels and crew (SC: Dan Richards and Sara Paisner; NAs: John Mclaughlin and Jessica Mills) recommend the experience to everyone. A second boat (Tom Wiltberger, Ray Connolly, Amanda Huber in Banana Boat, 13620) went to just Savannah on the SC; it was the featured story in the Savannah paper that Sunday morning!

The fleet sponsors and runs a large regatta on the Lightning Intersectional Circuit, the Borderline Regatta. Always the 4th weekend in October, it normally draws 30-40 boats from Maine to Florida. Because of drought, this year the regatta was moved to a new venue on a different lake (Lake Gaston, which does not go down in drought conditions). Attendance was low (22), but the venue worked out perfectly; it was so nice that we are considering permanently moving the regatta to the new site. Winners, in order, Richard Hallagan, Pete Marriott, Lenny Krawcheck, and Bob Harkrider. For the Hull Number Handicapping trophies, winners in order were Peter Marriott, Bob Harkrider, Don Behrens, and Richard Hallagan. For the Frigid Diget – Borderline Double-Header, winners were: Tom Allen, Jim Carsen, and Pete Marriott.

The fleet continued to contribute heavily to the running of the Carolina Sailing Club: we provided the commodore (Michael Rees) and four board members/committee chairpersons: Nicole Knowles (Web), Ed Michels (Nominating, and Participation), John Pelosi (Race Management/Regatta Operations), and Tom Walker (New Members). This level of club support is a significant drain on the manpower available to run the fleet; relief will start with the 2003 season. (The fleet has provided the club Commodore for four of the last five years.)

We feel that the key to fleet health (or class health, for that matter,) is the amount of time the boats are sailed or raced. Since it is easier to improve something if you can and do measure it, we started tracking in 2000, and offer this as our status:

This data is easy to compile: once you have the categories and the spreadsheet (more detailed, not shown), we take the club and district circuit data from the score sheets, and then call each fleet member and discuss the prior years "other" sailing, and what the prospects are for 2003. Total phone time was less than 2 hours.

Repeatedly one of those common phases on board was "Who are these guys?" Conditions didn't matter, starts didn't matter, it was not the witch of the east or the witch of the west it was the Witch of the Wave. That is who they were. It was the fine tune machine like no other in the world. Each tack was crisp like that new box of corn flakes that you just bought from the store. roundings seemed effortlessly and the spinnaker sets were as fluid as soft ice cream pouring into a super size cone. Once they took the lead it was over, simply over, when Witch of the Wave cleared ahead the oxygen masks would eject from competitors booms, crews would shake in their boots like 2 day old Jell-O in your fridge. It was suffocating for the fleet, throughout the 2002 season we managed to get in 26 races and the O'Briens would win 23 of them. LET'S DO THE MATH. That is a winning percentage of .900. If we roll the audio tape that's a thrashing only found at a one-night stand in the Bates Hotel.

With one team winning all but three of the races you must wonder what was going on with the other fleet members. At the beginning of the year the fleet was being issues constant technical and applied material updates on code name "Little Project". However, there was nothing little about what was being done. - 8) Do you see them on starboard ?....Yes Sweetie !
- 7) I'm the rabbit...OOOH I'm the VABBITT!
- 6) Your boards down!
- 5) Hey you blind goat do you see them on STARBORD!
- 4) IM STUCK and the hiking stick is up my shorts.
- 3) I think this old boat will go !
- 2) You realize we just started and the chute is not riaged.

And the number one thing said by most of members of Fleet 484 was:

Are they yelling at each other yet?

As you can see from our roster, we have become a midsized fleet as Lightning Fleets go. There are some 17
Lightning's in our greater sailing region – Colorado,
Nebraska, and Wyoming (this may be the largest local
region in the world). Of these, 9-10 berth at Cherry
Creek Lake and the others are scattered throughout the
intermountain west. On any given Thursday night, 4-7 of
these boats is on the starting line. Over half our fleet (Bill
Cabrall, Steve Davis, Marty Mulhern, Dave Spira, and
Bob Stoller) went "outside" to venues as far away as the
Orange Bowl, California Circuit, North Americans, and
Bluenose this year.

In our local racing, Bill Cabrall won our Spring Series; Steve Davis won our Summer Series and clinched our Season Championship on the last evening of racing. Steve also became the undisputed burger-flipping champion of our club's Thursday night "buck-a-burger" post race parties. It's worth mentioning that Jan Davis did such an amazing job organizing social events that we have had to elect a 3 person committee this year in order to the momentum going.

Beth & Brad Hamilton joined the fleet this year with 12428, Nancy Nowak sold her boat to a man in Arizona. Dave Spira and Steve Davis are both running 2 boat campaigns, with one boat sailed locally and the other campaigned "outside". This can be a mixed blessing, as Steve & Jan Davis spent Christmas Day locating the boats in Nashville and heading South to the Orange Bowl. Earl Harris sold #584 back East this fall, after keeping it inside for over 40 years. We hated to see this boat go, but love the idea of having it sail again.

This year Steve Davis became the Treasurer of the ILCA, and next year Bill Cabrall may end up as a measurer or member of the technical committee.



We sponsored a Lightning Lab this year over the Memorial Day weekend, and had a fantastic time. A Lightning Lab is one of the best, if not the best things, a fleet can do for itself and it's members. In our case, Bill Faude agreed to come out and instruct, and was also able to spend time with relatives here in Golden, Colorado. The shore sessions were extremely informative, filled with all the little tips and tricks that it can take years to discover, particularly in a geographically challenged fleet such as ours. Now if we'd only had wind ...

Next year we intend to increase our numbers on the water locally, our presence at national events, and start to build a junior sailing tradition. We hope to hold another Lightning Lab, and we'll have some of our young people at the North Americans. It's going to be a great year.

The season started with Bob Shapiro heading down to the Southern Circuit with Margo Krukonis and Brad Winslow.

Southern Circuit Highlights: Eating ice cream on the sidewalk in St. Pete, "creative" word games in the car driving between regattas, finishing 25th out of 71 in a race at St. Pete, dinner at Brad's parents in Seminole, no capsizes, lunch with Bob's Mom in Maryland on the way down, lots of sun and fun and laughter and camaraderie and good food and great sailing.

Southern Circuit Lowlights: Snowstorm in Massachusetts the day before we left, Margo (first time racing) asking "Why are all the other boats in front of us?" boat leaking like a sieve – an inch of water in the "air" tank during each windward leg, snowstorm in Connecticut on the way home.

Southern Circuit Summary: 3600 miles of driving and 80 miles of sailing – the most fun you can have and still be G-rated (except for those word games...).

Fleet 493 races on Bow Lake in Strafford, NH. On Golden Pond may have been filmed on Squam Lake, but the sounds of the loons for the movie were recorded at Bow Lake. Our summer series, the Bob Evans regatta, is named after Chief Bob Evans who for many years organized and ran the races on Bow Lake. This summer we raced 14 races. When it was all over, Bob Shapiro came out on top, thanks to great crew work, lots of luck and a boat that no longer leaked. Margo and Brad both sailed lots of races with Bob. Also crewing were Greg Shapiro, Marc Couch (who was plucked out of a daysailor on the starting line to round out the crew), David deSwaan Aarons (no chance that is spelled correctly!), and Norbert Church.

Ned Hinds finished in second place, using an almost all family crew of wife Karen and son Derrick. Ned did use a neighbor as crew for a couple of races. Ned has won the Bob Evans Regatta 22 of the 26 years it has been held!

Mike Aversa in third place was tough as always, but had problems finding crew and couldn't make all the races. Seems as though outfitting nuclear subs comes ahead of sailing sometimes – what a crazy world we live int Daughter Jillian sailed all the races with Mike, and Peggy Martheze also sailed one day. After that day, Mike remarked that Peggy (never having sailed before) did "a great job of staying out of the way!"

In January 2002 the Boynton bunch declared the end of an almost 3 year project to restore the family's Lightning. The project started with the boat's foam core filled with water at a weight of almost 1400 pounds. Two summers were spent digging out the foam and refitting. Alas in November 2001 at an estimated 1000 pounds, the crew declared mutiny and made a surprise 2001 Christmas purchase of Pat Zachary's 13888. In early June 2002 the 13888 made a new home on Bow Lake. After three months of sailing in the Bow Lake Summer Series the Boynton's were back to true racing form. In 2002 the 13888 came away with wins in both the endurance category (only boat to sail in every race all summer long) and most crew (at least one different crewmember each weekend). They were also first to the windward mark in one race! The crew of the 13888 What Now? is looking forward to 2003 as the year when they master that thing wrapped around the front stay – AKA the Spinnaker. Watch out!

Son Jamie Boynton made every race, Papa Bob made all but two (Greg Shapiro guest-skippered those two races and beat his old man to the windward mark in one of them!), Uncle Steve, Mom Sandy, Daughter Laura, Son John and Roommate Jacques rounded out the Boynton's crew.

9662 was looking great the first couple of weeks of the season, but then disaster struck. It was destroyed – oops – not destroyed, merely broke off its mooring, wound up on the rocks and has numerous huge holes in it. Bob Murphy reports: "Don't refer to it in the past-tense just yet. That boat has more lives (or at least as many lives) as Wal-Mart has fiberglass kits." Rumor has it that the Bob Murphy/Norbert Church/Dave Sandmann trio of sailors has acquired a newer boat, and that they'll be out for bear on the racecourse next year. NA's Highlights: Tiger's game, oysters in Detroit, fried turtle and turtle soup, hanging out with friends from New England, Go Karts, great racing! Our results in the Yellow Fleet got better every day. After opening with an 18th and a 23rd, we got a 4th and a 2nd, and then on the last day, got a 2nd and a 1stl Alas, the first 2nd was actually an OCS (now you know why we wish the boat were 2 feet shorter!).

Bob Shapiro traveled off the lake to four regattas during the



summer. True to form he capsized at two of them. Please not that for Bob's last 4 capsizes (including 2 in Lake Champlain in the middle of October) – Jim Lerner has been on board. Is there a pattern here?

The Spofford Regatta was renamed the Dave Fitch Memorial Regatta in honor of Dave Fitch. Bob and Greg were proud to have Dottie Fitch on board 14111 for the regatta. Dottie hopped around the boat like a 25-year-old – not like the 39-year-old that she really is! (Wink! Wink!) Dottie read a wonderful poem about Dave at the awards ceremony – leaving nobody with a dry eye. In the 37 (is that a typo?) years I have been sailing Lightning's, Dave and Dottie are two of the nicest people I have met.

At the Squam Lake Regatta, Bob Shapiro, Greg Shapiro and Jim Lerner co-skippered. (Bob was at the helm for the capsize on the way out to the race course!) This is one of the prettiest places in the world to sail – and sometimes the wind shifts no more than 83 degrees during a race! At the end of the regatta, Bob's team was in 7th place, and Mike Aversa with daughter Jillian, and Jamie Boynton, was in 8th.

At the Massabesic Regatta, Ned Hinds joined Bob and Greg on the boat. The team got steadily better, with finishes of 4, 3, 2 and 1 – good for 2nd place overall. If Massabesic agrees to start providing crew trophies, we'll be back again next year!

#### History

Founded in 1932 as a British Officer's sailing club with 17 members and nine boats Lagos Yacht Club membership now stands at 250 active members and 123 boats.

Lagos commands the entrance to a large inland lagoon and is the major deep water port for Nigeria. Tides range plus or minus 3ft (depending on the rains). With temperatures varying from 25 C to 35 C, racing and cruising takes place every weekend throughout the year with a mixture of harbour, creek and off-shore sailing. These include both one and two day events, in Lagos Harbour dodging commercial shipping, in the creeks avoiding canoes and fishing stakes. At times offshore swells reach up to 20 ft thus producing some very challenging conditions. The best sailing can be expected during the rainy season between March and October with wind-speeds ranging from 12 mph to 24 mph and occasional line squalls (gales). The rest of the year is marked by light wind mixed with Harmattan haze (fine dust from the Sahara desert), particularly in December and January.

Presently the club operates a mixed fleet of over a hundred dinghies comprising 39 Lightnings ("Woodies" and "Fibres") still in sailable condition, approx 29 Hobie 16s, 26 GP 14s, 14 Ospreys and a few Lasers.

#### **Lightning Fleet 510**

The first "Woodies" were built locally in 1946 to the plans and specifications of the Lightning Class but were too heavy to be registered as such. The cost of these boats is very revealing. In 1951 it was reported that a prefabricated boat, excluding sails, could be bought for £120-6-od per boat (about \$190). One of these original boats still sails albeit occasionally as befitting her age. The "Fibres" were imported from USA and Switzerland starting 20 years ago with the latest additions within the last 3 years. Maintaining the boats is not a major problem since the Club has excellent carpenters and fibreglass craftsmen. The mast and boom sections are extruded locally. In the absence of any ship chandlers fittings, sheets and wire ropes are imported by members when returning from overseas travels.

#### **Hermitage Cup Race**

For many years the Hermitage Cup Race was listed in the Guiness Book of Records as the longest dinghy race regularly sailed. The race was established in 1940 and covers a distance of approx. 127 kilometres from Lagos along the inland waterways (creeks) meandering parallel to the Atlantic coast line to Badagry Town and back. Initially it was a 3-day-event with overnight stays in Government rest houses. Nowadays it has reduced to a combined two day race with no outside assistance allowed meaning that every item of equipment required for sailing, eating, drinking and sleeping has to be carried along. It is an endurance race with helms and crews fighting exposure to the elements (hot sun, rain, dew etc.) and mosquitos. Each boat keeps a log and is allowed to deduct stops (anchoring or mooring) in excess of 1 hour from its sailing time. The logs are cross-checked with those of other competitors. Due to prevailing south westerly winds the outward leg tends to be a series of beats all the way to Badagry and can be achieved in daylight if the winds are good. The return journey is usually done under Spinnaker ranging from

only 3 boats (1 Lightning, 1 GP 14 and 1 Hobie) completed the course, albeit the GP 14 and Hobie 16 finished after the time limit (18:30 hours) and had to retire. The winner was Lightning 14448 "Kiwi Magic" helmed by Helmut Braun and crewed by Dolly Braun and Martin Hannah with a total sailing time of 20:37 hours (last year 13:28 hours) out of which the last 13:12 hours (04:00 to 17:12 hours) were sailed non-stop.

#### General

runs to fine reaches while negotiating the S-bends of the creeks. Night sailing is permitted outside the Lagos Harbour limits and nothing can match the exhilarating feeling of flying at midnight under spinnaker through a creek filled with fish traps, sprinkled with floating islands of weeds (water hyacinth) and bordered by mangrove swamps on one side and palm trees on the other under the ethereal glow of a full moon while listening to the rollers breaking on the beaches of the nearby Atlantic Ocean occasionally interrupted by frantic shouts of helms and crews trying to avoid an unexpected obstacle.

This year 9 Lightnings (including 1 "Woodie"), 2 GP 14s and 2 Hobie 16s participated in the race out of which

Cape Fear Fleet 511 gained two boats in the 2002 season when Jim Harris and Pierce Barden relocated to Wilmington, NC, raising Fleet 511's total number of Lightning's to eight. five Tuesday nights and was won by Steve Johnston. This series was sailed mostly in heavy air, and even had one race in which the race committee clocked wind gusts of 48 knots! Harris convincingly won the July 4th Cup regatta. The fall series was won by Barden and consisted of nine races held on three Sunday afternoons.

In late August, the fleet hosted a two-day regatta that counted as part of the Southeastern District traveling circuit. Jim & Connie Harris hosted a spectacular Friday night party while other fleet members handled regatta logistics and responsibilities. Fifteen boats competed in varying conditions. Saturday saw lots of wind, waves, surfing, one broken mast, and other minor breakdowns. That night the club hosted a social and talk given by Dr. Stuart Walker, followed by dinner. Sunday brought light air that required lots of patience and a race that barely finished within the official time limit. Four Fleet 511 members placed in the top half with Barden winning the regatta, Harris in second, Johnston in fourth, and Sawyer in sixth.

Fleet members that sailed a minimum of five regattas faired well in the overall 2002 Southeastern District standings, with Sawyer and Waldkirch finishing third and seventh, respectively.

### North American Champions

In 1945, the Championship was renamed International, there being thirty some boats in "foreign" countries.

In 1961, the first Lightning World Championship was held and that year the Internationals were renamed once again, this time to the North American Championships.






