

President's Message



When the season at home started badly in May with the cancelling of Pymatuning's Spring Classic after twenty-six straight years, due to water levels the lake had not reached in my lifetime, the year was not off to a great start. But, for a year that I had long dreaded, 2011 wasn't so bad after all.

You see, for years, when asked if I was skippering in a Masters' event, I had proudly been able to say, "How old do you think I am?!" That all finally changed in 2011. In retrospect, I am sure the question was the result of having spent a lifetime in the Class much more so than actually looking eligible!

And what a wonderful lifetime it has been. My father, ILCA Past President, Jon Ruhlman, was racing Lightnings before I was born, and, consequently, you might say being part of this amazing Class came to me naturally, as it has for my kids, Ryan and Maegan. My wife Abby took to the game quite naturally as well, after being "baptized" by the wind and waves of St. Pete during the 1978 Southern Circuit. We've had a great time through the years racing as a family, both together and as competitors. As you might imagine, those events, where we have all three teams on the line, can lead to some pretty interesting dinner conversations. Yet, we still team up for various events as well, as we did in 2011.

My first Masters' event at the helm was this year's Masters' Worlds in the big breezes of Búzios, Brazil. Abby, Ryan and I teamed up for this event, and were we ever glad to have the "big man" in the middle. Still, we were no match for team Biekarck, which sailed a brilliant series, winning the Masters' and finishing as Runner-Up in the South American Championships! Ryan then jumped ship for the Worlds, beating us handily with an 8th to our 16th, as he sailed with Nick Turney and Martha Fisher, both "adopted" family members, while Abby and I sailed with long-time teammate and member of our extended Pymatuning family, Dave Werley.

In August we took another run at a Masters' Championship with surrogate son Nick Turney. While we were in a hard fought battle with Peter Hall and his team of Ched Proctor and Stephanie Boucher, Maegan, Abby Rowlands and ILCA Executive Secretary, Laura Jeffers, were battling it

out with another family-based team of Allie and Monica Jones sailing with Debbie Probst. Where Maegan and team prevailed by a point, we lost our battle with Peter by a point.

We even sailed under the pink flash for that event, thanks to Maegan being on board. Ryan and team beat us again with his 12th to our 13th! The number of times over the years that we have finished events side by side on the scoreboard is almost comical.

Our NA's finish combined with our Masters' finish led to the bittersweet moment of winning the Jack Elfman trophy. Jack was a great friend of our family and he and Maegan had a really special relationship. For my part, Jack was a tremendous friend and mentor when I first ventured beyond the safe confines of Pymatuning and the Ohio District and into the broader and more competitive national scene. It's an honor to have my name on his trophy.

I could go on forever with our various sailing stories involving immediate as well as extended family, but those can wait for another day, perhaps a lazy afternoon waiting for the AP to drop or a late night around the bar. Besides, there are lots of other great family stories in this yearbook.

I don't use the term "family" loosely, because family is hugely important to me. While I am lucky to have my immediate family so involved in this great Class, we also consider ourselves to be extremely fortunate to be part of the extended ILCA family. The competition and camaraderie on and off the water over the years have led to something far more than simple friendship with many, many members of the Class. 



The Limbaugh Fund Charter of the Fund

The Mary Huntsman History Fund Charter of the Fund

The Mary Huntsman History Fund's primary objective is to help recover and properly preserve the Lightning Class heritage. The Fund is named after Mrs. Mary Huntsman, Past President and Officer of the Class, and who was the first to hold the Historian VP position when it was established. Under her Presidency, Mary secured the purchase of Lightning number one and subsequently coordinated its donation to the Mystic Seaport Museum, where the boat has been restored and is displayed.

Use of the Fund

The Mary Huntsman Lightning History Fund was formed in 2004. Its primary objective is to help recover Lightning memorabilia and properly preserve Class heritage.

How may Gifts be Made During Your Lifetime?

Gifts of Cash: A gift of cash during a person's lifetime is the simplest type of gift. These can be made in person or anonymously, directly or on behalf of another person. Gifts within a year are deductible from that year's income taxes. You may send a check to the ILCA at any time or include an extra amount of money in the renewal form when you pay your membership every year.

Gifts of Marketable Securities and Investment Real Estate: Gifts of appreciated securities and real estate held for investment purposes are often more beneficial to the donor than gifts of cash. When such items are donated, the donor receives a contribution deduction equal to the current market value of the security and generally, the excess of the market value over the donor's cost basis is not taxed. Often it can be advantageous to donate substantially appreciated

items than to sell them and pay the capital gains tax.

Gifts through Wills: Remembering The ILCA in your will is another method of giving. Such a gift is deductible in calculating estate taxes. Provisions for the gift may be included in the body of the will or by adding a simple codicil. If you desire to establish a separate memorial gift within either the ILCA Fund or the Limbaugh Fund, or to specify the purpose of the gift, this may be done by so stating in the provisions of the will.

Gifts of Boats and Equipment: You may consider donating your boat and equipment to the ILCA, thereby helping make them available to newcomers. You can deduct the fair market value of your donation from your income or estate taxes. It may be more advantageous for you to give the boat to the Class than to sell it. The Class has the procedures in place to facilitate making this important gift.

There is no time better than the present to make gifts to our Class. Your contribution will assure that the next generation of sailors will have the same support that we all now enjoy. We hope you will consider planning an ILCA donation, always informed, by appropriate legal and financial counsel.

Associação Brasileira da Classe Lightning



It was, of course, the year that Brazil hosted the World Championship of Búzios, and all other events led up to that event. I have published my thanks to all that assisted us to organize the event so, I will take another approach now and talk about the event through the eyes of the organization and through a Lightning sailing enthusiast.

A. Organizing a Lightning Worlds

The key to holding a successful championship of the size and importance that our Lightning Class deserves requires three most important areas of concern:

- 1. Technical and support Team.
- 2. A venue that attracts sailors from all over the world.
- 3. Money.

b. Venue

When deciding to hold the event in Brazil, we wanted to find a spot that we could lock in tightly all the people coming, in order to guarantee safety, great sailing conditions and an excellent tourism spot. Búzios and the ICAB Yacht Club offered all of these, and all those who participated will for sure confirm this statement. However, if I were to organize another event like this one, I would keep it closer to home and use SPYC, our home yacht club, for even with all the above mentioned qualities, we still couldn't attract more than twenty-two International teams.

These are the participating countries:

Argentina – 2 boats Australia – 1 boat Chile - 6 boats.

Colombia – 1 boat Finland – 1 boat Nigeria -2 boat USA – 9 boats

We held Brazil to eight boats, but should have allowed every skipper we had to participate! It was very sad and disappointing to not see boats from the Equador, Italy, Canada, México and Switzerland. Only nine boats from North America is a very important issue. We must always remember that people will prefer to sail the North Americans. I have seen comments from Carlos del Mare in México, and, although I don't agree with all of them, I can see that others are also concerned with this issue.

c. Money.

You can hold the Worlds only with volunteers if you so wish to, and if you have competent people willing to assist their time, but in my perception a World Championship deserves professional guidance. The Brazilian Worlds had an out of pocket cost of US \$50,000. With two events for thirty boats, we received less than US \$15,000 in entry fees.

B. Sailing a Lightning Worlds

Búzios required physical strength and stamina that I had not used in a long time. For over a month I had no will to go back to exercises or sailing. Having run a few marathons in my youth, I felt that getting back on the water the last few days was like running a marathon every day. I had a former Olympic Games sailing skipper that kept pushing all the time, and in the end our goal of Top 10 was only just achieved, so to all who finished the event you must really be happy with what you accomplished.

High point: making it in second around the first buoy.

Low point: capsizing just after rounding that buoy!

For Brazil, taking second with a Master's skipper and third with a three-time Junior World Champion showed that our Class is extremely tough and that we have the quality it takes to grow the class.

C. The Future of Lightning Worlds

I have thought a lot about this, and it is my firm belief that ILCA Worlds Organization must offer for charter, USA-made boats delivered to the venue and to all participants willing to sail the event. Look at how teams from Australia and Nigeria were able to participate at Búzios. Their boats arrived from the USA, together with the USA Team boats, and then returned the same way. ILCA must invest together with the manufacturers. We are a One-Design Class, and with this we will raise the interest of the Worlds and allow all countries to sail wherever the venue is. Realistically, only the USA can hold a World Championship and offer good boats to all who want to participate.

For Italy, I have talked to other Brazilians, and we are planning to go that way. We would charter four boats and have them shipped to Italy together with the USA team. These boats could be ILCA's and used for Boat Grant Programs or belong to others willing to get some money from the charter.

A World Championship must have at least sixty boats.

Hope to see you all in Italy 2013.

Lightning 10275 is a 1967 Allen "Classic Glass" with wood all over her, including the carved figurehead at the front point of the splash rail.

We still sail regularly at Folsom Lake and take the Lightning to Richmond Yacht Club on San Francisco Bay for their regattas in the spring and fall. I can never remember which one is the Big Dinghy regatta and which is the Totally Dinghy regatta, but I put both of them on the calendar. I also do the Delta Dinghy Ditch regatta, where we put the boats in at Rio Vista, California. One crew member takes the empty trailer to Lake Washington in Sacramento and gets the shuttle back to Rio Vista; then we race thirty miles up the ship channel back to Lake Washington—mostly under spinnaker!

In 2012 I'll be doing something different for the competitive spring race series and fall race series. I bought a Banshee, which is a single-handed boat designed

in the 1970s that was intended to fill the niche that the Laser ended up filling. Not a fabulous boat, but there's a large fleet of them here, so I can fleet race with them. I'd been Portsmouthing against them and having to give them a HUGE amount of time. Last summer, I finished one race in the Lightning about eleven minutes before the next boat, losing to him by less than thirty seconds on the corrected time. Frustrating! All the tactical elements of the race go away when you beat everyone off the line and then extend the lead the whole race. No "when boats meet" element comes in to play at all. Doing a "horizon job" from time to time is fun, but it gets old if it happens every race. Lightnings are FAST!

However, the Banshee is a single-hander. Once summer comes and the Wednesday evening series starts up again, I'll be on the Lightning a lot—which can carry friends and a cooler. That series isn't scored, though, so it's just fun racing. Last summer we had a fair number of friends come on the boat. For some, it was their first time on a sailboat.

One evening was particularly fun when we got out of the harbour late. We weren't anywhere near the start when they wanted to get the sequence started. We waved them on and just for fun shouted, "Go ahead, we'll catch up." And then we did. From a start about three minutes late, we caught all the Catalina 22s, Santana 20s, Lido 14s and Banshees that were out that night and finished about two minutes ahead of the next boat. We got to do some tactical sailing. Maybe I'll see about starting all those races late. Nah!

This Lightning Class Association is nicely populated with great people, although sometimes, also very amusing, with the special treatments of sportingly mutual admiration society antics, especially within this District. (The present writer's email page ILCA Folder is deliberately mislabeled MAD for Middle Atlantic District, apropos of my own situation, to wit:

Fleet 3 is the oldest fleet for the Lightning Class on the East Coast, founded in 1939.

As Fleet Captain, I am honored to be surrounded by many seniors, some of whom are lifetime members of the LCA/ILCA. I am the newest sailor among them, having begun just nine years ago, in 2002.

You may recognize the names Jim "Fuzzy Specialties" Carson, Bob Adams, George and Russ Lucas, George Francis (elder), Mimi Dimon, John Wardell, Betty Jo ("B.J.") and Bob France, Professor William Fortenbaugh (Rutgers), Allen Terhune, Sr., to name a very few, and realize their great contributions.

In their day, the Barnegat Bay was populous with hundreds of Lightnings. The legacy is anchored in many generations of sailing talent.

There are thirteen yacht clubs on the Bay. All are involved in the Barnegat Bay Sailing Hall of Fame, which recently inducted: Jody Lutz of Metedeconk River Yacht Club, home of Fleet 43 and the master-skipper, our own Jim Carson.

As recently as that same year, the Intercollegiate Sailing Initiative was formed at a Ocean County College junior college, which eventually fostered the OCC Sailing Club and is competing in MAICA with great success under coach Roy Wilkins. We all like to think that he's breeding Lightning sailors in his program with the 420s!

One writing was appointed by lifetime Lightning sailor, Robert B. O'Brien, former Commodore of Bay Head Yacht Club and current President of the Board of trustees of the New Jersey Museum of Boating. I was hired there to restore a twelve-foot Duck boat, a cat-rigged version of the sailing Barnegat Bay fifteen-foot Sneak Box, an official sailing class currently racing on same courses with Lightnings, although formalized with separate history and regatta trophies.

In 2002, my first wooden-boat restoration involved sixweeks of preparation for the annual Duckboat Worlds regatta, where I became recognized with the winning of "Princess of Show," won by George Francis, younger, MRYC, in 2010.

Judges included sailing master and engineer, Runyon Colie, and Tom Beaton, whose father and grandfather have been boat builders for many generations.

David Beaton & Sons made many Lightnings in the 1950s and 60s, along with Duck boats and many other types; they are still active wooden boat builders and restorers.

Fleet 3 is currently an inactive fleet, nominally known as "The Wooden Lightning Fleet of the District." At least one writing would like to be honored with that billing, for the present.

I feel privileged to be connected with your Lightning woodie members, through Bob Astrove, and to continue to be invited to special nationwide and international regattas for their recognition and sailing enjoyment in the District and abroad.



Albeit the circumstances pertaining to the many other classes of sailing/racing which compete for their own purposes, the unfortunate predicament involves decreased sailing populations, but I believe Lightnings have the capacity to inspire change for a renewed increase.


Many sailors who become introduced to the Lightning demonstrate a particular aptitude for the Class and for versatility in crewing membership in other classes. I hope they'll have the time, as well as the interest!

Toward that result, I seek to make it advocated and popular among the Bay Head members and establish dates for Lightning Class labs, expanding the Lightning Lab Program with Bay Head and Fleet 3 and its momentous potential for sailing talent and contribution.

There is one Lightning, #579, called "Gussie Feathers," housed in at the Toms River Seaport Society. She has not been in the water since sometime before 1974.

As long as the history of the Barnegat Bay includes Lightnings, there is always a special bond between the ILCA and the special sailing afforded here, when, during the summer season, westerly and southwesterly winds cycle around toward eventide and provide sailors thorough freedom in the shoal-draft waters.

There are many preservation efforts, including New Jersey Land Trust. Several others seek to instill vitality and a sense of significance in the natural wonder in which sailing continues to be the most aesthetic and simple form of transportation and lifestyle.







I want to launch my own Beaton-built #7678 this year, with gratitude, again, to the Beatons. I restored her myself in 2007, converting her former, white-hulled, red-lettered image as "Yahoo" into the appropriately green-hulled "Cosette."

My introduction to Lightnings began with the blessing of restoring a 1942 Hubert Johnson-built, double-planked, plywood-hulled, oak-framed rendition, in 2006.

The true blessedness of the Lightning can be realized especially for discerning that the 1938 design by the late, great Olin Stevens, III is so perfectly engineered that it does not waste one structural member.

While the Lightning has now been upgraded to include a sophisticated "super-rig," we all continue to keep faith that the boats currently being built can dignify the strength and integrity of the original design to afford sailors the best possible sailing experience with all material and technology available and unto its optimum formula.

In the meantime, thank you all, on behalf of all good, distinguished companionship, here, for sailing Lightnings, and for your kind attention.

Generations of Lutz

As has been the stories of past years, the Lutz family had great success on the national/international Lightning scene. In 2010, Jody won the US trials to become the United States representative for the Lightning competition in the 2011 Pan American Games, held in Mexico in October. Jody, with team of brother Jay and Derek Gauger, tuned up for the event by sailing the 2011 Southern Circuit. The 2010-11 winter did little to dim Jody and team's speed. They dominated the Circuit, winning Savannah's Deep South regatta and Miami's Midwinter Championship, before suffering an OCS in the three-race St. Petersburg championship to keep them from contending for that title. The culmination of Team Lutz efforts won them the 2011 Southern Circuit Championship. In the summer, Jody's son, Jason won the Junior North Americans, held at North Cape Yacht Club in Michigan. Jason, with brother

Jonathan and Metedeconk Club member Tommy Zanowic, won over a tough fleet, which included defending champion Timmy Crann, also of Metedeconk, who finished third. With his victory, Jason became the sixth Metedeconk sailor to win the Junior NAs. Previous winners were Jay Lutz, Jody Lutz, Andrew Brennan, Wade Schon and Timmy Crann.

October brought the Pan American competition, where the sailing events were held in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico, on the Pacific Ocean. The small seven-boat fleet, filled with distinguished sailors, made for tense, tight races. The gold medal was up for grabs in the final race, with Jody able to grab it with a victory. The final tight race, where an opportunity was missed for a key jibe, eventually cost Jody the final race, and Lightning World Champion Tito Gonzalez of Chile became the 2011 Pan American Champion. Jody took home the Silver medal, along with a host of memories he will cherish.

Central Atlantic Districts come to Metedeconk

Metedeconk had the opportunity to host the 2011 CADs on July 16-17. Co-Chairmen Mitch Hnatt and Dick Thomas led a band of volunteers to doing what Metedeconk does best—host top flight regattas with excellent racing, fun on shore and lots of smiles and laughs. The sailing was held on Barnegat Bay, site of the 2010 WJMs, and exhibited typical Jersey shore breeze afternoons. The mornings brought light winds, which gave way to building sea breeze which culminated in heavy winds by mid afternoon. Ched Proctor from Connecticut, who would go on to win the 2011 North Americans, persevered narrowly over Rich Warren from Surf City. Jody Lutz finished third. despite winning three of the five races. A capsize for Jody in Race 3 doomed his regatta chances—a reminder of the possible impact of the strong Barnegat Bay breezes. Other Fleet members who competed included Brian and Keith Taboada, Timmy Crann, Mitch Hnatt, George Francis and Matt Reiser.

Bill Bogardus did a fabulous job as Race Committee Chair, and Brian Schmidt pulled off an unforgettable cocktail party/pulled pork dinner at the pool, complete with live music. Co-Chairs Mitch and Dick did their utmost to remove the contents of the beer keg, as they let go after months of regatta planning. The regatta was great fun, both on and off the water.

Fleet Sailing

Metedeconk hosts a Spring and Fall Series which are open to all sailors. The impact of growing families has diminished the number of boats sailing in the river races, but not the inherent competition. The class, a continuation of Jim Carson and Dave Ruiter's original advanced junior class, initiated over thirty-five years ago, seeks to bring a new breed of Lightning sailors through expert teaching and learning mixed with fun. Mitch led a group of instructors, which includes many of the names you have read in this article, in providing a great opportunity to grow excellent young sailors. It is hoped that graduates of this



class will follow Jason and Timmy in future Lightning success. Each year the class holds a Championship. Robert Alldian became the 2011 Metedeconk Junior Champion, followed by Jonathan Lutz, Gillian Francis and Alex Lehnes.

Brant Beach has the pleasure of hosting the CADs in 2012 on June 23 and 24. Come and join us for some great sailing in Barnegat Bay.



Notably, Josh ended the Circuit in third overall—quite a way to kick off his 2011 campaign to defend his club championship.

Local sailing on Long Island Sound started in May with our annual Early Bird regatta. We hosted eleven

teams, including regatta winner Peter Hall, who used the challenging conditions as practice for the Pan American games where he and his team represented Canada. Cedar Point's own Charlie Proctor finished second, while another Fleet 126 member, David Fried, sailed well to claim third.

The Fleet 126 summer series extends from May through to September, generally with races held on Saturdays on Long Island Sound. The series kicked off with the Cedar Point Yacht Club Vice Commodore's Cup over Memorial Day weekend. Rod is always willing to lend a hand in the parking lot and introduces several new sailors into the Fleet every year. Our Fleet was also proud to have Dick Thackaberry recognized by the Cedar Point Yacht Club for his excellent race management skills with the Joan Eadie Perpetual Trophy. Dick acts as the PRO for what seems like every major, and minor, regatta that comes to Cedar Point and has yet to disappoint a competitor!

The local scene wrapped up with the Annual Fall Classic regatta. Only eight boats made it out for this two-day event, but the competition was incredibly tight, with only four points separating the top three. Ted Duffy edged out Justin Coplan for the win, while our own Bill Bogardus claimed third.

In addition to the already mentioned Southern Circuit, Fleet 126 was well represented around the Lightning Circuit at both district and national events. Highlights included having nine fleet boats sail the Connecticut/ Rhode Island Districts at Housatonic Boat Club, with Ched Proctor in second, Josh Goldman in third, Ched Proctor besting twenty-one boats to win overall at the Central Atlantic Districts regatta, David Peck and Ched Proctor taking first and second at the forty-boat Atlantic Coast Championships, and a North American victory to finish out the year. Ched Proctor led his team to the North American Championship, and he also crewed with Peter Hall to win the Masters' Championship. Quite a year for Ched!

As mentioned earlier, Fleet 126 is thrilled to be hosting the 2013 North American Championships. Chairman David Lutian has already begun organizing what promises to be an excellent event. We look forward to everyone joining us for some excellent competition and not-to-be-matched fun. We welcome everyone to join in and sail or socialize with our Fleet at any point in the upcoming 2012 season to practice up for the big event! Our competitive Fleet boat is ready and waiting for you!

Mike McCusker finished repairs on #14629, my old boat that was damaged in a tornado. Mike sailed with our Fleet several years ago. We welcome him back.






Due to bulkhead repairs at Susquehanna, the traditional team race between the Susquehanna Yacht Club and our Fleet did not take place.


Local Regattas

Finland District was proud to host the Lightning European Championships and Ranking Series, consisting of six regattas. In the Europeans, the fleet was nineteen boats, with three boats from abroad and two from Africa. The Ranking Series was sailed by twenty-three skippers.

Urs Wyler from Switzerland won the Europeans, Lauri Hemming won the Finnish Championship, and Kimmo Aromaa won the Ranking Series. It has been very nice to have the Lagos Fleet sailors attending and winning, the European events, and I hope this will continue, despite the ILCA geographical area division.

The Finland District has kept on publishing the biannual magazine for the local Lightning sailors. The Fleets in Helsinki, Jyväskylä and Tuusula have sailed actively, and we see new fleets to be born.

We are very happy and enjoy a high number of young sailors attending the Lightning events. In the Finnish Championships we had twenty-six percent juniors and thirty percent of the sailors under twenty-five years of age. 

50 Years of Lightning Racing and Cruising in Jyväskylä, Finland

Jyväskylä Lightning Fleet 328 had its fiftieth year anniversary in Hotel Laajavuori in Jyväskylä on October 28, 2011. We had great time together. We saw a lot of pictures and heard several stories from the earlier sixties when the young sailors started to sail with Lightnings on the great Lake Päijänne.

Fleet members had collected a lot of all possible Lightning material, pictures, articles, trophies, etc. from their homes. There was a great exhibition where the younger Fleet members could see and imagine the feeling when the Lightning pioneers sailed fifty years ago.

In the Beginning

In 1959 the first Lightning sailors in the Jyväskylä region where also the 'Last Lake Boy Scouts' in northern lake Päijänne. The Lake Boy Scout organization, Päijänteen järvipartio, was founded with support from Valmet Rautpohja Works, which is a leading manufacturer of paper machines.

The Boy Scouts' first long cruise in a two-mast yacht, "Tuulikki," took place from Jyväskylä to Lahti—one hundred and fifty kilometers southward in the summer of 1954. Martti Nurminen and Veikko Miettinen were thirteen years old, and Martti's brother Matti was eleven years old. "Tuulikki" was an eight-meter-long keel boat with five to six beds. The return cruise was an honourable standard for the Boy Scout organization. As soon as elementary schools closed doors at end of May, four to six Lightning sailors jumped into "Tuulikki" for a two-week cruise.

First Lightning

Boy Scout sailors met their first Lightning in 1958 while cruising in Ristiselkä, twenty kilometers south of Jyväskylä harbor. That Lightning was owned by Osmo Konkola from Juokslahti. Enthusiasm rose rapidly, and a local boat builder, Matti Hjelt, built the first three Lightnings during 1958–1959. The shipyard was situated in the southwest sector of the Keljonlahti Bay in lake Päijänne.

The skippers/owners of the first three boats where Martti Nurminen, Veikko Miettinen and Risto Hämäläinen. Martti's boat was #7180, "Mary," Veikko's was #7179, "Sami," and Risto's boat was "Mona-Lisa." Martti was then eighteen years old. He had already worked three years in Valmet Rautpohja works. A nearby road was built from foundry sand transported from the Valmet Foundry. Mixed in the sand were valuable metals, including steel and bronze. Those Martti picked up from sand and sold to a metal collecting shop, Romuliike Oksanen. The money was used to pay for his new Lightning, "Mary."

Next Generation: Suomen Kalastus Oy Boatworks in Loviisa

A new mahogany Lightning was ordered from Loviisa, where Raimo Ragnar Nordström, a many-time Lightning champion, owned not only shipping and fishing vessels but also that small boat works. Boats were made for Martti Nurminen, Ilkka Lilja and Kalervo Airaksinen.

Kalervo had a famous history as a sea doctor in a most famous Finnish school fregate, "Suomen Joutsen." In 1962, we had the first inner lake national sailing championships ever held outside of a Finnish ocean. Racing was arranged by Fleet 328 ladies and volunteers at Ristiselkä, the deepest open lake in Finland, about one hundred m maximum. Dr. Airaksinen

gave his summer house and a private harbour for the nationals, with shores and forest for camping. The first boats made by Matti Hjelt were of pine wood. Later boats, made by Martti Nurminen and Kari Elivuo, "Vanha Herra" and "Vanha Herra II," and also Lightning "Kristiina," made by ILkka J. Salminen were of two by four mm fir plywood. In 1962 the Loviisa boats were of mahogany, and these boats were not allowed to be left in water after a regatta to avoid harmful expansion of the glued bottom boards.

Races

In just five years, in 1966, Fleet 328 became second largest in Finland with eighteen boats.

Long way to Helsinki Regattas

Today our Fleet members need only three hours to drive one hundred ninety miles to Lightning regattas held in Helsinki. Fifty years ago it was not so easy. Martti Nurminen remembers, "We put all we needed into the Lightning and raised the sails in front of our Fleet club house in Keljonlahti. First we sailed along Lake Päijänne, eighty nautical miles to the city Lahti. In the harbour of Lahti we put the boat on a lorry and drove to Helsinki. Then we sailed the regatta weekend on the sea. Some friendly Lightning sailors from the Helsinki Fleet took us with their trailer back to Lahti. After two or three days sailing, depending on the wind, we returned home!

Europeans and World's in Naples, Italy, 1965


The Naples trip through Europe and through the grand new Mont Blank tunnel and along Auto Strada del Sole to Naples was made by Ford Anglia m 1962, borrowed from Erkki Lilja. The Hki-Travemunde leg was a car ferry. Nina was the best Finnish boat: tenth in EM, twenty-sixth in the Words.

World's in Canada, Toronto, 1967

Martti and Matti Nurminen were our Fleet's first sailors to attend the Worlds in America. They sailed with their own sail set, but the boat was borrowed from a local Canadian sailor, who also was the second crew. In photo below are skipper Martti Nurminen and the boat's owner.







During the same trip, they participated in the North Americans in 1967 as crews in a local boat. Martti and Matti were housed together in a same home with Markku Aromaa from Helsinki, Fleet 166. The hospitality and friendliness they received from the local Lightning sailors was so exceptional that they still remember it warmly after forty-four years!



The Indianapolis Sailing Club was founded in 1955 on the shores of Geist Reservoir. It's located in the far northeast corner of the city of Indianapolis, about twenty miles from the city center. Lightnings were among the first fleets in the Club. The reservoir was formed by the damming of Fall Creek, a stream which flows southwest into the White River and further down, the Wabash, Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. The resulting lake is about three miles long and half mile wide at the widest point.

Most visitors don't imagine sailing and competitive racing on such a small body of water in the middle of Indiana. But if you visit, you will find nine different fleets, plus Sunfish, Laser, Optimists and Sailboards enjoying the lake all season long. There are also ice boats ready to race when and if the winter weather provides thick enough ice.

Even though our lake is small, our Club and Lightning Fleet has found a niche to entice visiting sailors in early spring and late fall when the big waters are too rough and/or too cold. Our racing season starts mid-April and ends on November 1. This is one of the longest seasons in the northern U.S. Our Lightning Fleet regularly conducts seventy to eighty-five races every season. In 2011, the number was seventy-three.

2012 will be a special season for our Fleet as we celebrate the fiftieth running of the Burl Harmon Indiana Open regatta. The dates are May 5 and 6 in 2012. 

Unfortunately, July 24 and 31 resulted in cancellations due to lack of wind. was set by race officials Perry and Margaret Anderson. We had light to moderate wind out of the northeast, and we sailed two races, the second race requiring a shortened course. Finishing positions for both races were the same, with Rich Miner in first position, followed by Hank Jelinek second and Don Okner third.



Fleet 54 sailed through another year full of activities in 2011. We had an active Club racing schedule, some social activities, training clinics and sent several members to regattas near and far.

Before the racing started, we held a "Spring Recall" to roust everyone out of their winter funk and get them energized about the upcoming season. Like last year, this event featured a Past Commodore's chili cook off, as well as some chalk talk. Mark Allen walked the audience through a question-and-answer filled presentation on his approach to a race, from preparation to finish.

We also used this opportunity to advance the cause of race management, as we all are responsible for running races over the course of the year. We addressed the eternal dilemma of how to get people to sign up for a fair number of Race Committee duties by introducing a points system. This allows skippers to choose duties and assignments that fit their schedule and getting the most difficult, highest points assignments filled. By signing up for a specified number of points, skippers are assured immunity from any further last-minute calls to duty. Those who chose not to sign up for the minimum number of points leave themselves exposed to short-notice calls to action. The more races they



complete, the greater the likelihood of being called on to fill a gap in the schedule when it arises.

Early in the year, after just enough racing to shake the cob webs, we were fortunate enough to host an ILCA-sponsored Lightning Lab. We had sixteen skippers participate in the seminar-style learning conducted by Skip Dieball. Instruction included onshore discussions about tuning and boat set up, as well as an afternoon full of on-the-water drills. Afterwards, we had a video debrief with beverages and burgers back at the Club.

Sunday, we ran a couple of race-structured events, with Skip giving pointers to the competitor's real time. This proved to be a great tool to get people up to speed and bring along some of the less sure skippers. Our goal was to get more travel-ready skippers, and I believe we moved a number of skippers along that road. Many thanks to both the Class' Todd Wake and instructor Skip Dieball for making this event great.

In terms of racing, it is a fact that we had ninety-eight races scheduled over forty-eight dates in 2011. Unfortunately, we lost an unprecedented number of races to weather conditions this year. The optimist's perspective would be that in spite of thirty-two cancelled races, we still were able to sail sixty-six races! That's a pretty good season's worth.

Statistically, participation was up a bit this year. We averaged fifteen boats per race, compared to thirteen last year. A total of forty-six different skippers finished

at least one race this year. By awarding trophies five deep, we had seventeen skippers take home some hardware from our annual awards banquet.

Our regular season is divided into three—Spring, Summer and Fall. We score Wednesday night and Sunday races separately, giving us a total of six major series. Two races are planned for every date. Races in these series are scored on an average low-score basis, with a skipper needing to sail in at least one-half of the sailed races in a series to qualify for awards. Sunday Series winners were Mark Whatley (Spring, Fall) and Tom Klaban (Summer, Overall). Wednesday Series winners were Mark Whatley (Spring) and Tom Klaban (Summer, Fall, Overall).

In addition to the main series, we conduct three miniregattas over the course of the season on the holiday weekends—Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day. Each regatta consists of five races over Sunday and Monday, and then we partake in the Club's holiday potluck picnic. This year, we had a different winner of each mini regatta. Rear Commodore John Morley won the Memorial Day Series, and Joe LaPalme Jr. won the Memorial

To assist newer Fleet members who are just learning the boat, we run a "rock star" Wednesday night early in the season. For this event, we have a number top-of-the-fleet sailors volunteer to serve as crew for a skipper that may be looking for a little help. Alas, this year's event, and two re-schedules of it, was victimized by the weather. Nevertheless, each of the rock stars committed to being available to sail with a newbie at a mutually agreeable date.

We have two other special Wednesdays throughout the course of the season. The first is a junior championship. We encourage skippers to recruit a junior to skipper their boat for this event. Kevin Ziegler repeated as this year's PYC Junior Champion.

The other special Wednesday event is the Commodore's Challenge. This is an opportunity for crew members to get a chance to take the helm. We had seventeen boats participate in the 2011 edition of the Commodore's Challenge. The results from this series

are always very tight at the top, but it seems every year, as this, Eric Klaban manages to pull the win out.

On the road, members of our Fleet enjoyed the District season by getting out early and often. It started with Lake Lansing. Fifteen of the thirty-nine boats registered at the Michigan/Indiana District regatta were from Fleet 54. Mark Allen won the regatta, followed closely by Jim Allen. Fleet 54 sent a total of fifteen boats to the NA events, Masters and Open, so ably hosted by Michigan's own North Cape Yacht Club. Jim Allen and Mark Allen both sailed in the championship fleet.

We are the biggest Lightning Fleet in the world, but our goal is to be the BEST. Please help us have a great 2012 by attending one of our events. We will be hosting the Michigan District regatta on June 30–July 1. The annual White Cap regatta will be held September 8–9. The final event of the season is the Club championship Sail-off Series in which the qualifying skippers sail as many races as boats qualified with skippers and crews, switching boats for every race. A week after that, our abbreviated Spring Series, in which only ten of eighteen scheduled races were held, due to poor weather, wound down with Steve Davis taking first, Bill Cabrall second, and Al Gawthrup III in third place.

Fleet 488 was well represented globally this year, with Steve Davis going to the Worlds in Búzio, Brazil, to crew for Tommy Allen. He then went immediately to the North Americans in Toledo. Bill Cabrall, Raeyane Farrell and Rebecca Espinosa sailed in the Masters', and then Jim England switched with Raeyane for the North Americans.



Of course, with this much travel, anything can happen, and it turned out that the fates had more in store than kamikaze deer for Team Cabrall. On the way out to Toledo, double decking a boat for the Ecuadorians, the dust cap, castle nut, thrust washer, and outer bearings of one wheel departed for an alternate universe just west of Lincoln, Nebraska. Hearing a strange noise, Bill and Raeyane found a truck stop, pulled over, jacked up the trailer, and discovered that the left tire came off in their bare hands.

The next eighteen hours are best left to your imagination, but for three observations:

- If your trailer starts making a strange noise, or any noise for that matter, stop immediately.
- Tommy Allen, Jr. says that the first hint you will get that a wheel has actually come off will be when it passes you along the interstate. He adds that you should keep an eye on it because it can roll up to a half mile, and you'll need it later. I can't verify this, but I believe him.
- Raeyane Farrell held up the side for all of Lightning womanhood by working with dirty grease in one hundred degree sun for six hours in pristine white shorts without acquiring a spot of dirt or drop of sweat, and then produced a tall glass of iced lemonade and a butter brickle ice cream cone before I could get my hands properly washed.

Team Cabrall then had the great good fortune to carry their blue streamer on the backstay throughout the Masters', through every race of qualifying for the NAs, and then into the North Americans themselves, making the Blue Fleet for the first time ever.

Back in Colorado, our summer series continued, with the fastest five-person Lightning team in history, tuning up for a run at the returning road warriors.

Five people, you say? That's right—five. Jacob and Tara Vargish are blazingly fast with their three children, Andrew, who is eight, Joshua, who is six, and Caroline, who is three, running the middle of the boat. Their teamwork is mesmerizing to watch, their laughter is infectious, and when a high, clear, sweet three-year-old girl's voice hails for room at a mark, every parent in the



fleet automatically freezes and looks for the source, while they breeze through the newly opened gaps in the fleet.

I think that's legal, isn't it?

In addition to being killer cute and pioneering the latest trends in foul weather protection—pixie wings and a fairy wand—Caroline made nautical history on her fourth birthday at the Colorado Governor's Cup regatta by rousing the entire fleet of one hundred cold wet sailors off the dock after a thunderstorm laden postponement by running down the breakwater yelling, "We're going sailing! Yea! Yea! We're going sailing, Yea!"

I think I have already mentioned that Lightning women are the best on earth.

Fleet 488 is proud to include many in its ranks. In addition to Raeyane, Rebecca, Tara, and Caroline, Fleet 488 has Jan Davis, Francine Hoffman, Kylie and Barb Thompson, just to mention a few. We are truly blessed.



High temperatures were a nightmare, but the support boat was full of all the water that we needed. The facilities and the organization for the races were impecable. The wind was better than predicted, via the Internet, in the weeks leading up to the race. Those who were fortunate to stay in the Paradise Village, were lucky—it was a perfect choice.

The delivery of medals was on the Boardwalk of old Vallarta, out in the open air, lots of people, traditional music of Mexico (mariachis). After the ceremony we went to dinner with the President of the Chilean Olympic Committee and the entire Chilean Sailing Team—one night that inadvoidabily ended with festivities and dancing.

Finally, I would like to say that all Lightning competitors were very fast and showed the highest level of competition.

I hope to see them in Toronto 2015 if God wills it.

It's a regatta where you go as a team, not just the Lightning team, but Team USA. You pull and root for your teammates, and everybody works together for the common good of the TEAM!

The sailing is intense. It's a small fleet, but everybody is good, and nobody gives anybody a break. Save your

safe covers and gentleman's agreements for another regatta. It does not happen at the PAG.



North Cape Yacht Club LaSalle, Michigan

I was very fortunate in pulling together a good team for the Lightning North Americans. With the economy the way it is, people have been reluctant to take a full week off from work. Jamie Ewing sailed with me and Jay Mueller last year, and we had a great time. Like so many capable people these days, back in February he found himself looking at unemployment, as his firm was in the process of closing down. In June, he told me that if he still didn't have a permanent position come August, he'd definitely like to sail at North Cape. Some-

time in mid-July he said prospects weren't encouraging for the next few weeks, so let's go to North Cape! At that point I'd pretty much resigned myself to doing something else, but when Jamie suggested it, I just couldn't resist temptation and changed my plans again.

My other long-time teammate Jay was unavailable, as his wife was due to give birth during the championship, so we still needed a third. Meredith Killion, who races with us in the V15 fleet at Cedar Point, was an excel-



lent candidate, but she found it difficult to arrange the whole week away from work. After a close reading of the NOR, it looked highly unlikely that we would be racing on the Friday. So we told her she only needed four days away from the office, flying home late Thursday evening to be back at work Friday. That worked for her, so we were on!

We then organized a couple of evening practice sessions, one of which was in a lovely easterly breeze. We had a good time and so were pretty enthusiastic to get to the regatta.

I also decided to go to Burlington for the ACC championship, and Peter Hall suggested that I sail the Masters' North Americans at North Cape Yacht Club crewing for him. Since coming home from Burlington would allow me only a day before I had to be at North Cape to set up and get organized for the Masters' Championship, the obvious choice was to drive to North Cape straight from Burlington. All of this worked well logistically—it just meant being away from home for two weeks straight. Fortunately, Mallets Bay Boat Club and North Cape Yacht Club are both two great places to sail and spend time.

All the regattas had some great sailing with good competition. They told us at North Cape that they had beautiful wind for the Snipe Nationals the week before, and, true to form, the Masters' ended with a beautiful south easterly on Friday. I suggested to Peter, as we sailed out, that we shouldn't sail too much that day—

after all we didn't want to use up all of the good breeze just before the North Americans!

After a great Masters' event, we were on to the big show. Jamie and Meredith arrived Saturday morning, and we spent the afternoon practicing. The next day opened the qualifying series, which was a bit rough for us, as we found ourselves working out our communication and tactics. We were hoping to get some of this out of our system for the Championship.

The first two qualifiers were held on Sunday, and Monday never supplied a breeze that the Pro David Schaffer felt appropriate to run a race. So the schedule was revised to hold one qualifying race at 10:00 AM on Tuesday, then come in to do the split and head back out for the first two Championship races. We had hoped that this one final race would be enough to get the tactical roughness out of our system before the Championship.

In that qualifying race we won the pin and tacked to cross the fleet. After the fleet crossed behind us and tacked up on our left, they all passed us. We were very deep and had to claw our way back to get a half reasonable finish.

Race 1

The first race was run Tuesday, August 9, in the afternoon after the qualifying Race 3. The wind was again out of the northwest, building in front of a frontal approach that evening.



On the first beat of the morning qualifying race we had been severely burned by boats to the left of us, so we determined not to let that be the case again. We probably got too far left too early and, therefore, had some distance to make up on the leaders because we rounded the weather mark somewhere out of the top ten. We jibed fairly early to port to get away from the bunch of boats fighting high. Things started to go better after that.

We rounded the second weather mark in third place a few lengths behind Skip Dieball and team, while Allan Terhune's team had a fairly comfortable lead. Tom Allen was a ways behind us in fourth, which was, as it turned out, just the right distance behind. After setting the spinnaker and jibing, I asked, "Is this a four or a five course?" The difference would be that if it were a five course posted, we would need to turn upwind at the leeward gate on a beat to the finish, versus continuing past the leeward gate to the finish line for course four. As it turned out, none of us had seen the course board. The start had came quickly after a postponement, and we had spent the entire sequence towards the pin end, in keeping with our plan to go left.

I noted that the good news was that we were not winning, so we could just follow the leaders. We figured it was probably a four course for two reasons: 1) The PRO had stated that he wanted to run two championship races that afternoon, and 2) the committee boat as still anchored downwind with a pin set, looking like a finish line.

What happened next couldn't have gone better for us, even if we had known. Apparently, Allan in the lead was confused because they put up their jib, dropped their chute and were sailing towards the left hand mark. Meredith noted this, so we started to wonder. Tom Starck, sailing with Skip in the second-place boat, turned around and asked us, "Are we finishing?" Meredith shrugged, as we were a little confused by Allan Terhune's actions. We decided to err on the side of safety, and we hoisted our jib and prepared for the rounding. Skip did the same, and after seeing the two of us with our jibs up, he rounded and hardened up around the mark. As we started to do the same, Jamie turned around and said that Tom was "not taking down his spinnaker." So we bore off and headed down to the committee boat with our jib up and chute down. We had just enough distance on Tom to beat him to the line and got the gun (horn). It seemed like things were beginning to fall our way.

Race 2

The first attempt at Race 2 started shortly after the finish of Race 1 late on Tuesday. The front was moving in, and the breeze and shifts were getting bigger. Again, we were a bit behind at the weather mark, but a quick jibe to port helped us get into the new breeze and move toward the front of the fleet. Todd Wake's team, Neal Fowler and Kristine Wake, rounded in front of us, and were one of the few other boats to jibe early. We both rounded the left gate mark, looking down-





wind. The leaders turned the other mark but were not much ahead of us. We followed Todd out to the right side on port tack.

The new weather had been pulling the wind to the right, and the cloud cover was greater in that direction. Before long, it looked like we would be in good position to lead or be second at the weather mark. When we were two thirds of the way up the leg, the race was abandoned, as the RC had heard reports of severe weather. Oh well, it was good fun while it lasted.

Wednesday was going to be a big day, as the start was again moved up to 10:00 AM, and the RC told us they would run three races if conditions allowed. The breeze was quite strong when we arrived at the race course early Wednesday morning.

The Real Race 2

The real Race 2 got underway on schedule. The details have become a little fuzzy in my head with time, as the three races on one big breeze day, and the first two in particular, have begun to blend together. As I reread the event blog, thanks to the team that put that together, I see we had a small lead over Dave Starck at the weather mark. That brings back the memory of the first leg a bit.

We started fairly well and tried to favor the middle left of the course. Dave Starck was a little to the left of us for the second half of the beat. We were well left of the rhumb line early on. Dave sailed behind us on starboard, heading toward the left, and set up on our weather hip on port tack. With a long port to sail, it seemed the wind would come back right some time, and we'd be able to extend on David. As it turned out, he held the breeze on the left, and we fell out of it.

That is how Dave narrowed our early lead to round close behind us. Dave jibed to port first and gained in a puff. At the bottom we elected the right gate, looking downwind, and David rounded the left at pretty much the same time. Ryan Ruhlman rounded the left gate also, while we tacked to defend to the left of David. Ryan continued on port to the right side. The wind went right, and Ryan came through to win. Juan Santos also held out to the right early in the leg and, thus, got in front of us. Juan tacked on us, and left David clean on our right while the wind was in left phase. We tacked away from Juan Santos' wind shadow and lost considerable distance at the top left.

Race 3

We won the pin hoping the left side would do its thing. We had a challenge since there was a bit of a right shift near the time of the start that we failed to notice. We missed a few waves right off the line and the boat on our weather hip was able to work off us, while Tito had started well a few boat lengths up and was holding us out to the left. A lot of the fleet from the weather end seemed to be wound up, so our plan to tack and cross looked more like a tack and duck—of about thirty sterns. Not a great feeling! We continued on out until we



were able to tack without ducking because all the boats, including Tito, had already tacked. This had us very near the port tack layline in the corner. This was definitely a place I like to avoid, as all the cards are already played, and we just have to hope for some breaks.

Our biggest break was when Tito was tacked on by one of the boats coming in ahead from the right. He tacked to clear his wind. He crossed us and tacked to weather to our left instead of tacking on us. So we had a pretty clear lane until we got fairly close to the mark. Despite missing the main shift, our clear lane allowed us to round not too far behind the leaders.

Todd Wake started near the weather end of the line, apparently fairly late. He cleared out to the right and rounded the first weather mark with an eight-boat length lead. They continued to extend for the rest of the race and won easily. How we got to our 5th place finish, I can't remember too clearly. However, I do think this is the race where we had a very dramatic leeward mark rounding. We were nearly overlapped with a large group of boats as we approached the left gate. There was quite a sudden left shift, putting us severely by the lee. My thinking suddenly went from tactical position to surviving, which seemed to work OK, as we doused early and rounded behind the group, but cleanly and with our own lane.

When we rounded the second weather mark, we were again right behind Skip. Another early jibe once again put us in a strong puff, and we gained several hundred meters on all the boats around us, including Skip.

Race 4

The wind had shifted further right. The course for this race was a five. We used every bit of it to climb back after a pretty mediocre start and completely missing the first shift. Having been burned at the leeward end of the line in the prior race, we chose to start near the middle. But this time a large group of boats were able to tack to port and cross off the leeward end. We ended up in the middle and getting bounced around by the winds on each side. Part way up the leg we were not doing well and elected to try cutting our losses by getting to the right. We rounded fairly deep and started chipping away one boat at a time.

Allan Terhune and Bill Faude started near the weather end and tacked immediately to port. They hooked into an early right shift that lifted them to the mark, and Allan, in particular, had an unassailable lead at the weather mark. We again jibed early, using the port jibe on the run to gain considerable distance. On the second beat we took a long port tack and sailed through what we had previously regarded as port tack headers to get to the vein of breeze that seemed to be hanging out on the right. This worked pretty well. We were a little behind Dave Starck and continually working similar shifts. Near the starboard tack layline we ducked to the right of him and missed an opportunity to pass him. We rounded the weather mark much closer to the leaders and again jibed fairly early. We gained on the next boat ahead, which was Kevin Robinson sailing





with his daughter Paige and Kathryn Moloney. Lacking a bit of the he-man beef, they were probably sailing a little conservatively in the breezy conditions. We gained an overlap inside to the right of them. When they jibed to starboard, we probably should have given up a little distance and ducked them to hold our port tack. As it was we sailed a little out of phase to keep clear and went to the right mark rounding inside them. This allowed David to get a bit ahead, but, surprisingly, we had by then broken through the main pack and had very few boats left in our vicinity.

Upwind we again tried to work back to the right every chance we got. Jamie and I had the same reaction at one point—Allan Terhune and Bill Faude were well extended and probably out of reach. Then there was Tim Scanlon, who had been sailing well, then David and us. We had no idea what had happened to the rest of the fleet, but suddenly a 3rd or 4th was in sight if we sailed smart and fast.

Somehow we got to David and were able to tack on him, sending him a little too far right near the end. We took one more wiggle on port later on, and Bill Faude and Tim Scanlon allowed us to the right of them. Tim took a dig back to the right but was behind us and tacked on the layline. Faude barely crossed us at the pin end of the line, but we were able to tack across Tim to gain third place. As we sailed in, we realized that the day had gone pretty well for us. In the first race we gave up a lead. But in the other two races

we had struggled back from fairly deep positions to finish strong, and it looked like with no throw out we'd be leading.

Thursday

On the score sheet, David Starck was the closest to us, at 18 points to our 13. But Allan had a 5-4-1, and if there were two races the last day, he'd likely drop a DNF, so he'd be counting 10 plus whatever he got on Thursday. And if we missed a few opportunities and got behind, we'd certainly be tacked on, making it difficult to stay in the lead. It felt like there was a long way to go.

With the front already a day gone, this day brought a weakening northerly wind, and PRO Dave Schaffer elected to have us out for a 10:00 AM start time to try and get a race in before the wind died. But as the fleet sailed downwind toward the starting area, the wind died, and the Committee postponed. At 12:30 Dave Schaffer felt the wind was sufficient to start a race and lowered the postponement. With the length of time left before our 2:00 PM cut off, it was beginning to look like a one race day, so Allan would have to count his DNF.

Our closest competitor then was David. What was left of the wind was still out of the northwest and seemed full of holes, so we hung out around the mid line area trying to figure out where the first puff would come from.

At a minute and a half to go, we were near the pin heading toward the boat on port tack. Much of the fleet



seemed to be lining up at the boat in what seemed like a right puff. We wondered how close we could get to the fleet, with David Starck a little ahead of us and Allan Terhune behind us to our left.

When David tacked around I decided this would probably be as good a place as any, so we took our spot. No one was all that close to weather of us, and we were a little closer to the line than David. Just before the gun, the breeze shifted left, and we found ourselves able to easily cross everyone to weather of us. We tacked in the final seconds of the countdown.

At the start, we were on port with speed, crossing the fleet below us and bow-out on those above us. Todd Wake was the closest on our hip, with Allan above and behind him. Everyone to leeward of us found themselves parked in a hole, while those of us on the left side were sailing a one-tack beat to the mark. With more breeze to the left, Todd eventually rolled us, but the RC made the right call and abandoned the race.

Though N over H was signaled, it still took a second before it sunk in—that the prior results stood, and we were the 2011 North American Champions!

Overall Thoughts/Lessons Learned

1. Boat Speed and Clear Lanes

We found that good boat speed and clear lanes could make up for tactical mistakes. More specifically, while in clear lanes sailing upwind, we concentrated on making the boat go fast. Meredith was calling immediate puffs and lulls while I was focused on driving the boat through the waves. At the same time, Jamie was paying attention to the larger wind patterns and fleet management.

All three of us were hiking very hard as we were overpowered in many of the upwind legs! This allowed us to make headway up the course, even if we were pinned at times from tacking exactly where we wanted to. Luckily we were always able to round in the top half of the fleet and put ourselves in a position to make gains downwind.

With Jamie concentrating on flying the spinnaker, tactical decisions were left to Meredith and me. We were perhaps too conservative in a couple of the earlier windward mark roundings and sailed too long on starboard before jibing. As the wind shifted right during Races 3 and 4, we were more proactive about jibing earlier, not only to catch the breeze but also to separate ourselves from the other boats.



It was great fun to sail in surfing conditions downwind, and we continued to focus on speed. Clean air downwind was a premium, and we would frequently up or jibe to clear our air from other boats.

We often seemed to be more centered on the runs compared to the boats around us, but were careful to watch for wind pressure bleeding down the side of the course. Sometimes heading up only a boat length or two made the difference between getting into more pressure and just missing a puff.

2. Know the Course

This is one of the basics and should go without saying, but we were guilty of not knowing the course during the first championship race.

3. Observe/Practice

On all of our sails out to the race courses, we tried to glean as much information as possible—shifts, pressure differences, movement of puffs, etc. Watching the other fleet sail around the course was helpful, as well to see how wind changes actually affected the boats.

Additionally, because it was the first time the three of us had sailed together, we took advantage of extra practice time. After racing was cancelled for the day on Monday, we stayed out on the water to tune with a few other boats. It felt good to get some light air speed tuning in and also to work on team coordination through the jibes to keep the spinnaker full and the boat moving.

4. Have Fun!

While our ultimate goal was to do well at the event, part of the equation was certainly to have fun, and sailing at North Cape Yacht Club made this easy to do.

PRO Dave Schaffer and his team of RC volunteers did an excellent job of running quality races. Hank and the other hoist operators made sure that the launching/hauling process moved as quickly as possible. A big thank you goes to Laurie and Skip Dieball for all of their off-the-water organizing. Everything from registration, after-racing entertainment, and the dinners were top notch! Thanks to all of the other members and staff at North Cape for making us feel really welcomed and we look forward to coming back for future events. I still don't exactly know what is in a Painkiller, but it's probably better that way!


























First, I'd like to thank the Lightning Class, Laurie Dieball, Fleet 42, and all the North Cape Yacht Club volunteers for hosting an incredible regatta. Although it has been thirty years since I've sailed out of NCYC, it's clear they haven't lost their flair for running a top-notch event with an abundance of hospitality and great sailing to boot.

As a few of you know, I'm a newbie to the Lightning Class and haven't participated in a NA/ World event since 1978. Sad to say, I got lost for twenty or so years in other activities, including a career, but I've righted the ship and pulled into the Lightning Class harbor.

I also must thank my home club, Fleet 216, from Bay City Yacht Club, especially Joe Dissette, John McCree, Matt Princing, Jennifer Princing, Chris Princing and Gary Sowden, who have been a great help in answering my many questions and getting me up to speed—at least





once in a while. It's a testament to our members that a new guy can feel at home so soon. That camaraderie, along with the tough competition and great sailing, drew me to the Lightning Class.

One of the "joys" of coming back to sailing after such a long hiatus is finding crew. I was fortunate to have my brother Frank Lyons as middle and Diana Synowiec, Laurie Dieball's sister-in-law, working bow. Frank and I sailed against and with each other when we were young, but this was the first time for Diana on a Lightning, and she deserves major kudos for her willingness to jump into the fray. The rate at which she learned, even in challenging conditions, puts her on my short list for a call next time.

Our race week began with a disappointing first race in the qualifier. A bad start by me put us into a hole, and we found ourselves out on the left layline with a right shift. We improved the second race; the third was so-so. Then the wind didn't show, leaving us five points from the Blue Fleet cutoff. Feeling good about our boat speed and quite displeased with my starts and tactics, we were confident we'd be competitive in the President's Cup if I could only get the six inches between my ears to work.

The first race of the President's Cup greeted us with a moderate 12–15 knot breeze out of

the west, choppy seas and a spacious starting line. We had clear air and good speed off the line, looking for the first shift. Unfortunately, an "aquatic excellence" award-worthy move (a missed hiking strap, which resulted in a head-over-heels, wet crew member and an over-trimmed jib), along with a few other mishaps, put us in the back of the fleet by the end of the first leg. But good crew work, boat speed and calling a few shifts allowed us to fight back to seventh place at the downwind finish.

Team Lenny Krawcheck, who won the race and the series, showed us all how it's done by winning by a wide margin. After starting the second race, it was quickly abandoned due to darkening skies and a severe thunderstorm warning.

Day two began with the similar, but freshening, breeze out of the WNW. In the first race of the day, Race 2, we had another "aquatic event" and found ourselves in sixth at the weather mark. With good downwind speed, staying in the puffs, and working hard up the next beat, we made our way into fourth place in the end, finishing behind Ed Wagnon, Lenny Krawcheck and Tom Vickers.

As the wind began to build for Race 3, we had a good start and were in the hunt with many lead changes—all very tight until the end. Adam



MacDonald, showing great form downwind, took the finish, followed by Lenny Krawcheck in second and us in third.

Expecting a left shift, we called the start of Race 4 as pin end. When the shift occurred, we tacked to consolidate and were in the top three with Lenny Krawcheck, Adam MacDonald and Edward Wagnon all in the hunt. We had good speed in the heavier air and choppy conditions and were able to call the next two shifts. Bang—we had that "happy" distance where you have some tenuous control. With loose cover, we managed a six-boat-length lead at the first weather mark.

The wind continued to build to 18 knots near the weather mark, with quick gusts in the 20s, which included some nasty direction changes that made conditions quite difficult. The biggest challenge was downwind where a number of competitors capsized by failing to keep the hull under the spinnaker. As we approached the weather finish near NCYC, the amount of both direction and velocity intensified, and it was quite a handful to manage. A few 15+ degree shifts, with winds in the high teens, resulted in a number of almost "auto tacks" with me being submerged once with the tiller hard over as we approached the weather mark. Using a loose cover, playing the shifts and being bit conservative downwind, we held on to take first on

the upwind finish, followed by the ever-present Lenny Krawcheck in second, Edward Wagnon in third and a very fast Adam MacDonald fourth.

On Day 3 the wind was light and shifty. The AP came down in an attempt at a race, but it was quickly abandoned after a 40+ degree wind shift. Done for the day—game, set and match.

While we all hoped to have a few more races, those we did have resulted in great competition. Thanks again to North Cape and all involved for putting together a first-rate event, great racing, delicious food and drink—a most gracious atmosphere indeed. Coming back to NCYC was like visiting with an old friend, and meeting many new friends from around the country on my first Lightning NA made this year's North Americans a memorable event.

Back in August of 2008, I was lucky enough to have won the Junior North Americans while manning the middle for my cousin, Taylor. I was ecstatic to have won, but, at the same time, was not completely satisfied and made it my goal to win the regatta again, except next time as a skipper. Of course, to try to accomplish my goal, I would need to recruit a first-class team. My brother, Jonathan, returned for a second year to be my bowman, while I enlisted one of my best

friends and longtime sailing partner, Tommy Zanowic, to fly the spinnaker. After winning our only "tune-up" regatta, the New Jersey State Junior Championship, we felt confident about our chances as we headed out on our ten-hour drive to North Cape.

We woke up on day one to a strong westerly breeze and building chop out on the Lake. We struggled to find our "groove" during the first race of the day and finished a disappointing

sixth. We immediately called that race our drop and regained our focus for Race 2. The Race Committee decided not to sail a third race, due to the breeze, and we found ourselves two points out of first after day one.

Day two brought lighter breeze with some remaining lake chop from the day before. The first race of the day started poorly, as we rounded the first windward mark in sixth, but the combination of Tommy's excellent spinnaker work downwind and our pure speed upwind helped us finish second. After winning the second race of the day, we found ourselves at the top of the fleet again in Race 3. As the breeze was quickly dying, we finished a close second and ended the day at the top of the fleet by five points. I pleaded to the Race Committee to finish the regatta that night, as I was hoping to continue our hot sailing, but no such luck.

Although I hoped for breeze, we began day three in similar conditions to day two—lighter air and more Lake Erie chop. Race 1 was a struggle for my team, as we found ourselves struggling to hang with the leaders. Although we did not have the start to the day we had hoped, we still led by three points heading into what would be the final race of the regatta.

In the final race, we rounded the first windward mark in third, but soon caught both boats to round the leeward gate first. We again used our upwind speed to cover the fleet and stay ahead of the boats we needed to beat. Although we lost the race to a very fast Christine Moloney, we were ultimately satisfied because we soon learned, after a few minutes of nervously waiting, that we were finished for the day and had clinched the regatta. A pair of former champions, Connor Godfrey and Timmy Crann, rounded out the top three.

Winning this regatta would not have been possible without the help of my teammates. Jona-

than did an outstanding job calling the breeze and helping me with tactics, while Tommy flew the spinnaker like a pro, used his long legs to help hike the boat flat and, most importantly, kept my nerves under control! I would like to thank Mr. Shaffer and his race management team, who did a great job getting seven races off in the always changing conditions. I would also like to recognize Laurie Dieball, Heidi Schultz, and the rest of the North Cape Yacht Club volunteers, who did a fantastic job organizing a successful regatta. And last but not least, we could not have won this regatta without the support and guidance from my father, Jody Lutz. Ever since I was seven years old in the Optimist Class, he has been right there to coach me—and give me a little push when needed! He has been my number-one supporter, and I am especially proud to have my name engraved, thirty-one years later, alongside his on the Junior North American trophy.

Tom, Maddie and I were really happy to have won. We sailed a strong regatta, and with the exception of our first race, we had really smooth work inside the boat. Funny thing in that race, we had Maddie on the bow. She's rarely sailed in the bow but was willing to give it a try. Our lesson for that day is that, as a team, we should have discussed positions in more detail. When Maddie got into the middle, everyone was far more comfortable and confident. She and Tom are terrific in any crew position on the Lightning, but it comes down to comfort. Once we got this sorted, we had a great regatta!

Thanks to the entire BCC fleet, staff and officers. The 2011 Canadian Open was a great event, and we were delighted to have won.
