*John Faus – President*

John started sailing Lightnings at age seven on his father's 10823 Helms. Growing up in the Barnegat Light Yacht Club's youth program, he later started racing Lightnings at age thirteen. His mentors, outside of his dad, have included Bill Clarke, Jack Elfman, Greg Fisher and Jim Carson. "As a junior sailor, I had no idea the gift that I was being given with learning how to sail." Unlike many other sports, sailing is a life-long sport where you can always continue to learn new things and improve.

While Lightning racing is a big part of being a member of the ILCA, meeting new people, enjoying various social events, and spending time with lifelong friends and family is equally important. Growth of the Lightning Class is important to John. Fleet Development, the Boat Grant Program, and just getting people to race or cruise is challenging, yet very rewarding. John is heavily active in recruiting and developing youth sailors and showing them how much fun sailing these boats can be. When not sailing, John likes to occasionally go fishing, work on his house and cheer for the New York Yankees and Washington Redskins.

John resides in Rocky Hill, New Jersey, and spends extended summers in Harvey Cedars on Long Beach Island, New Jersey. He has worked in the sporting goods apparel business since graduating from Kenyon College. Although his yacht club is only 100 members strong, John is proud when his club is called upon to host a regatta because the membership comes together to throw a first-class regatta as well as a 'not to miss' regatta party.

Debbie Probst – Secretary

Sailing for me started very young, on our family Highlander and progressing through Optis, Sunfish and Lasers at Cowan Lake in Southwestern Ohio. The fierce competition and camaraderie amongst the juniors on Sunday afternoons was always the highlight of my week. My love for this sport and the people it attracts is deeply rooted in Cowan Lake Sailing Association and the incredible volunteers there.

Junior Sailing led to four years on the University of Michigan Sailing Team and meeting fellow Wolverine Jody Swanson. What followed has been twenty-five years (and counting!) of sitting next to Jody on J-24s, J-22s, and 470s. As teammates we can list quite a few Rolex Women's Keelboat Championships, an Olympic Campaign, multiple North American and World Championships, to say nothing of thousands and thousands of miles on the highway (yet somehow, never running out of dialogue!).

In 2000 my husband gave me Lightning #14678 for my birthday to sail with our young family on nearby Lake Wawasee. Considering we had a three-year-old, a two-year-old and a nine-month-old, the number of races we participated in was limited, and yet we were able to forge strong friendships with some great Hoosier sailors—Bill Allen, Jeff Schmahl, Brad Wagnon, etc. The majority of my Lightning sailing in those years came from regattas, where I learned to truly embrace this Class. Bill Faude, Larry MacDonald, Brian Hayes, Colin Park—these people encouraged me, answered my many questions, and most importantly made me feel part of the Lightning Family.

Our family has now spent ten summers at the Buffalo Canoe Club, and we just recently moved to Buffalo year-round. I have been a part of the Lightning Boat Grant Committee for five years, a program that I feel is a reflection of the Lightning Class' dedication to our sport, youth sailing and our Class itself. As an Executive Committee Member this past year I have greatly enjoyed the shared responsibility of keeping our Class strong.

Victor Lobos – Treasurer

Although Victor was born in Chile, his first encounter with Lightnings was at the age of fourteen in Arcabutla Lake in Mississippi, where he met an excellent group of people who showed him how much fun the Class is. Back in Chile there were no Lightnings in his hometown of Concepción so he continued racing on Snipes and IMS boats.

After being away from the Class for ten years, he was invited to go to the Southern Circuit with the Longarela brothers from Argentina, where he not only learned a lot about sailing but was captured by the spirit of the Class. It is this spirit that has provided him with the enthusiasm to get more people involved with Lightnings and to make the Class stronger in Chile and South America.

Even though his work as an architect keeps him quite busy, Victor is always imagining ways to escape and go sailing at a Lightning event, be it in Chile or anywhere in the world.

Bill Clausen – Measurer

Bill started racing Lightnings in 1947 on boat #134. He's owned #1495, #7195, #10895 and still has #14495.

He grew up racing in Ocean City on the New Jersey shore. Bill crewed and worked for some of the greats of the Lightning Class: Bob Seidelman, Marcy Lippincott, John Tieglund and Jim Carson. He learned a lot about Lightnings from them and continues to enjoy being involved in measurement and photographing at major events.

His son David sailed in four Junior NAs and crewed with Bill in the last Worlds Masters at Miami.

Bill has enjoyed being a part of the Executive Committee this year and hopes to continue to serve the Class as photographer and Chief Measurer in the years ahead.



Bill Faude – Executive Committee Member

I did not grow up in a Lightning family. I began sailing Lightnings in 1987 after finishing grad school and doing a somewhat formal review of affordable one-design classes that offered a lot of competition. It's probably an enormous rationalization, but I don't think I could have made a better choice. This beloved square boat and the people who listen to it slam through waves have become my tribe. To quote the immortal words of Stuart Nickerson, "I LOVE THIS CLASS." In the intervening years, I have owned Lightnings 13686, 14530, 14740, 15260 and am currently sailing 15480. I have been active on the Lightning Governing Board virtually non-stop since being elected Secretary in 1995. I was Class President in 1996 and 1997. It is a joy to serve in every capacity. And I particularly thank my long-time teammate Jared Drake for rigging or derigging our boat at every big regatta for the last twenty years while I was listening to myself talk in some meeting.

The last two years I have been elected the 5th "At Large" or "Fifth Wheel" member of the Executive Committee. I'm here to tell you that today that the Lightning Class is operated in a manner we would not have recognized in 1997. There is not a week when we don't have at least two Skype calls among the headquarters and members of the Executive Committee, and I'd say we average thirty emails between us a week. There is an incredible amount of activity that goes on, which is largely why our hard-chined beauty is still a vital class.

In 1995, I was living in a small apartment in Chicago with two cats and a pile of rolled up sails. I bought a new truck in order to drive thirteen hours to Thunder Bay for the Canadian Open. I didn't own a TV. Today, I live with my wife Julie and our two kids with a bunch of furniture and flat screens and Legos and American Girl Dolls. The sails are now out in the attic of the garage. That truck is still out there too. It has 255,000+ miles on it. I'm planning to drive it thirteen hours to Thunder Bay this summer for the Canadian Open. The more things change, the more some things are gonna stay the same.



Laura Jeffers – Executive Secretary

I am from the beautiful state of New Hampshire. I was introduced to the Lightning in the fall of 1987. I had just returned from my first sail ever on a Cal 21 and thought that was the coolest thing ever—until I walked up the dock. There were four or five Lightnings that were just getting in from an evening sail. My friend Amanda and I stopped to look, and we were "invited" to join them the next Sunday to race. I remember hearing, "Come on down, someone always needs crew!" Every Sunday that fall we sailed Lightnings on Lake Massabesic with Fleet 273—we were hooked. The Deyett Family took us under their wings. The following summer we sailed every afternoon during the week, training for the Junior Districts and then the Women's Districts. On most weekends I traveled all over New England sailing in various regattas. I have so many wonderful memories from sailing Lightnings. I remember how excited I was to go to my first North Americans and first Southern Circuit. My "Lightning Story" illustrates the fleet development that our Class continues to be built upon. My sailing mentors include Ken Deyett, Brian Hughes, Jack Elfman, George Fisher and Brian Hayes.

My husband Will is a life-long Lightning sailor from New Jersey and, like many other Lightning couples, we first met at a regatta—the Winter Championships at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club during a Southern Circuit. We have a Labrador Retriever named Salty who loves the water.

Our beloved square bottomed boat unites us all and keeps us coming back for more. I am very excited to be in a position to give back to an organization that has provided me with so many wonderful friends, memories and opportunities.

Growing Up Lightning

Buffalo Canoe Club sailors Lauren Jones and Joy MacDonald have been fortunate enough to grow up in the Lightning Class and have been competing from a young age. Thanks to their family, including their fathers, Ian Jones and Larry MacDonald, who won the Worlds together in 1997, they have had many wonderful experiences with the Lightning Class “family.”

What do you think your parents did that was most effective in making you want to stick around?

Lauren: My parents were so supportive of my junior team. They pretty much made going to any junior regatta possible. It was like having a personal travel coordinator to take care of hotels, restaurants, and transportation. At the same time, my dad worked hard at coaching us in preparation. He also taught us about the responsibilities of owning a boat and making sure it was ready for a major regatta. If I had not had so many positive experiences as a junior sailor in the Lightning Class, I probably would not have made so many close friends and great memories that have made me want to keep making more for years to come.

Joy: I was so fortunate that my dad involved me in Lightning sailing at such a young age. I was ten when I sailed my first North American Championship! We came in eighth in that regatta, and it showed the Lightning Class that even with a youngster on board, you could still be competitive. I have gone on to sail eight North American Championships and two World Championships and have loved every minute of it

because I was able to spend it with my family. My dad and mom were also very supportive of my junior team, with crew Kathryn Moloney and Mad-die Waldron. Not only did they help coach me and handle all the logistics, as Lauren discussed, they were always there for me on and off the water when I needed encouragement or a laugh. Sailing has become such a family activity for us, and I am so grateful to be a part of the Lightning Class.

Lauren: There are also little things my parents did, such as always having candy on the boat, which played a part in making my experiences out on the water so positive as a kid. Before regattas, we would go to the bulk section of the grocery store and buy pounds of gummies which would end up only lasting us two or three days. Gummies were very crucial to my success on the boat though! After every race, we would eat a few gummies that would supposedly allow the next race to be even better. I have learned this through instructing kids at the BCC as well making it fun out on the water in anyway you can is the most important thing to make them want to go back out again and again.

What are you really glad they NEVER did?

Lauren: The one thing I am very glad my parents never did was put pressure on me to be better than everyone else. I am not saying they did not care about my success, but I was never pressured into believing they would be made if I did not do well in a race. Again, as a kid, it is important for their experiences to be fun and safe, regardless of if they are in first or last place.

Joy: I agree completely! I never felt pressure to win. In the eyes of my parents, winning was second to being respectful to the other competitors and having fun. As long as I came off the water with a smile on my face, the day was a success. Of course, doing well in races was an added perk!

What do you think is particularly valuable to you now that you wouldn't have known if you hadn't started sailing Lightnings?

Lauren: I have gained so many important lessons and experiences from being part of the Lightning Class. Probably the most valuable thing I have gained is having the opportunity to learn from and sail with so many talented, world-class sailors. This has given me the inspiration and determination to strive to be as successful as they are.

Joy: Exactly! The Lightning Class has such a wide range of talented sailors from whom I am so fortunate to learn. I have also learned the value of family and the importance of cooperation. Being on a boat with my family or best friends can be trying at times; however, at the end of the day, I have made memories and strengthened bonds that I know will last a lifetime. Also, I am so happy to have grown up at the Buffalo Canoe Club, which is, without a doubt, my favorite place on earth! I cannot wait to help the BCC host the Youth Worlds in 2014 and the Open World' in 2015 (hope to see you there!!).

Favorite memories with the Lightning Class...

Lauren: One of my favorite memories, that pretty much began my journey as a Lightning sailor, was when I was given the opportunity to sail the 2004 Women's North Americans at the BCC, with Jody Starck and Maddie Waldron. I was eleven years old, and this was my first major Lightning regatta. I did not know what to expect at first, but it turned out to be a great time with some really intense moments mixed with of jokes and laughter. During one race, we rounded the windward mark, and as I hoisted the spinnaker, the knot came undone, and I succeed in pulling the halyard all the way up the mast. Jody was not going to let this stop us though. She handed Maddie the tiller and told

I'm pretty sure at one point it was hailing, and there even were icicles forming on the boat. However, even though my dad said we could go in and warm up, I was determined to finish the regatta, which we ended up winning.

Another memorable moment was winning my first race as a junior skipper. It was the last race in the 2008 Newport Junior North Americans, and Maddie, Kathryn and I decided to bang the left corner for every upwind leg. Somehow, this paid off, and we were ecstatic as we crossed the finish line to the sound of cheers from our parents, and even the other competitors. My other favorite memories involve sailing BCC Tuesday nights with every member of my family on the water (two family boats). I also enjoyed traveling to regattas with my family, and I loved going to Chile and Italy for the Worlds.

Overall, the Lightning Class means so much to Lauren and me, and we are thankful for everyone who has helped us out along the way. Also, we are thankful to our parents for getting us involved at such a young age and hope to inspire other youth sailors to get out on the water!

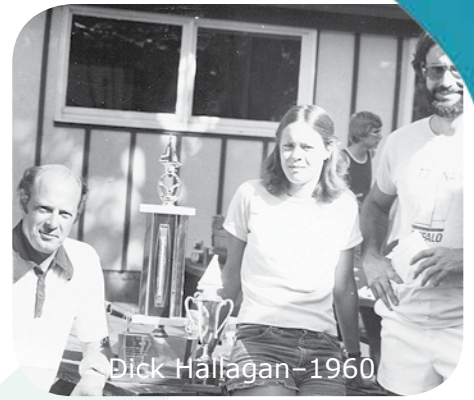

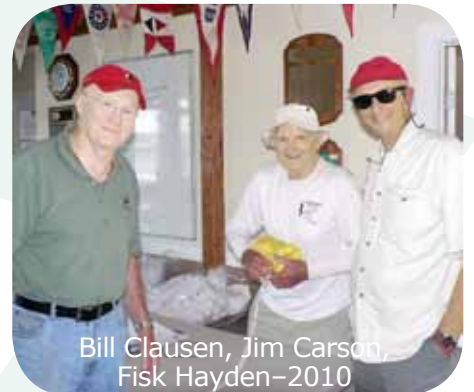

You can donate cash, boats, covers, sails, trailers, etc. to support this innovative program to attract young racers to the Lightning. Designed to help young sailors experience the high level of competition offered by the Class, this revolutionary program offers a unique opportunity among one-design classes. While many one-design classes struggle to attract and retain young sailors, the Lightning Class is taking active steps to give young adults a leg up. Since its inception in 2007, the Class has provided fully rigged, insured and competitive boats for worthy teams for the sailing season. The recipients participated in Fleet, District and national regattas.

The Limbaugh Fund **Charter of the Fund**

The Limbaugh Fund was established in honor of two of our most avid supporters. Helen was our Executive Director from 1965 to 1982. Jay was our Class President in 1964. Both remained strong supporters of the Class long after their tenures were completed. Because of Helen and Jay's strong interest in Junior sailing, and their belief that our Juniors are the future members and officers of our Class, the organizers of the fund have dedicated these funds toward Junior activities.

Use of the Fund

The available monies in the Limbaugh Fund are restricted to the support of education, training, and the promotion of Junior sailing. Only income generated from Limbaugh Fund investments may be used. The principal may not be spent. Uses of these funds have included support for the Youth World Championships, the Sears Cup, funding Junior racing clinics, trophies, promotion of youth regattas, etc.

How may Gifts be Made During Your Lifetime?

Gifts of Cash: A gift of cash during a person's lifetime is the simplest type of gift. These can be made in person or anonymously, directly or on behalf of another person. Gifts within a year are deductible from that year's income taxes. You may send a check to the ILCA at any time or include an extra amount of money in the renewal form when you pay your membership every year.

Gifts of Marketable Securities and Investment Real Estate: Gifts of appreciated securities and real estate held for investment purposes are often more beneficial to the donor than gifts of cash. When such items are donated, the donor receives a contribution deduction equal

to the current market value of the security and, generally, the excess of the market value over the donor's cost basis is not taxed. Often it can be advantageous to donate substantially appreciated items than to sell them and pay the capital gains tax.

Gifts through Wills: Remembering The ILCA in your will is another method of giving. Such a gift is deductible in calculating estate taxes. Provisions for the gift may be included in the body of the will or by adding a simple codicil. If you desire to establish a separate memorial gift within either the ILCA Fund or the Limbaugh Fund, or to specify the purpose of the gift, this may be done by so stating in the provisions of the will.

Gifts of Boats and Equipment: You may consider donating your boat and equipment to the ILCA, thereby helping make them available to newcomers. You can deduct the fair market value of your donation from your income or estate taxes. It may be more advantageous for you to give the boat to the Class than to sell it. The Class has the procedures in place to facilitate making this important gift.

There is no time better than the present to make gifts to our Class. Your contribution will assure that the next generation of sailors will have the same support that we all now enjoy. We hope you will consider planning an ILCA donation, always informed, by appropriate legal and financial counsel.

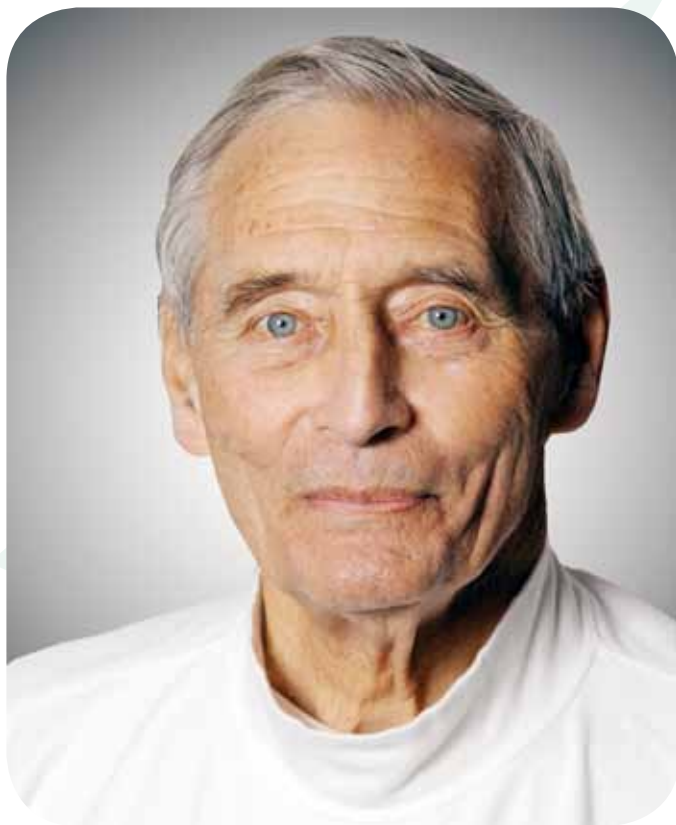

When the "Great TA," Tom Allen, sailed across the finish line for the last time, the Class lost an icon, and we all lost a friend. A man of few words but much accomplishment, never one to brag or boast, yet he taught legions of us many things by leading through quiet example. A master of boat speed and brilliant with tactics, lessons learned there came at the expense of following his transom. Perhaps the best sailing lesson all of us learned from him was the first time one tried to cross him on port. He'd instantly have another gear AND be able to point three degrees higher. At the next cross, one remembered to have ample room ahead.

He didn't excel in just Lightnings either. He sailed Finns, FDs and Tempests in Olympic trials, Solings a bit too. He finished second in two Olympic trials and won countless regattas in other classes, in addition to his multiple District, Southern Circuit, North American and Worlds Lightning championships.

Everyone who sailed Lightnings for probably the last fifty years knew Tom. It would be interesting to know all the different places he sailed. The list of regattas he never attended is probably much shorter than those he did. If there was a "frequent driver" award, he'd be on the A list.

We all know he owned a company that made boats. But he built something far more than important than boats; he helped to lead the Class, which for many people is as important as their family. Look at his wife and four children as an example of a great Lightning family. Then look

around at all the other families who have been part of the Class for generations. Boats come and go, families remain. In a way, you could say he helped to build families. We all sail Lightnings because they are fun and the competition is great, but we are a family of friends bound together by leaders like Tom.

The thing people will remember the most about the Great TA is a trait he shared with his late father-in-law, Karl Smither—the ability to win, and lose, with a dignity that is all too uncommon these days. Like Elvstrom taught us, he won the race, and he has our respect.

I remember you. You are forever a part of me, you are forever remembered, you are forever loved.

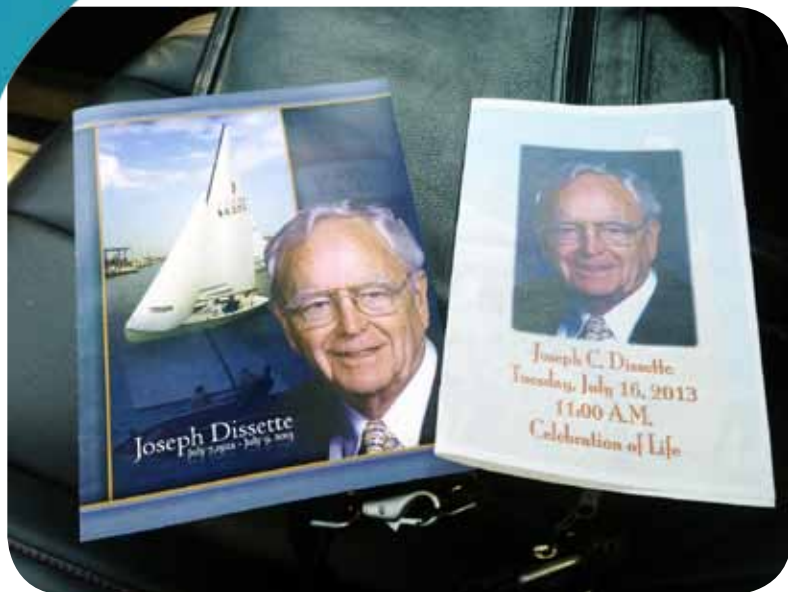
Of your myriad of accomplishments, I will always be the most proud and thankful for the following:

"Because we were ahead in the race, we finished in a mix of boats in the Blue Fleet. John McCree and Joe Schofield, my crew, asked the Racing Committee for a finish signal. We finished at the tail end of the Blue Fleet boats. The following two races were back to back with 5th place finishes—with a total of eleven points—the Green Fleet was ours. What could be better than winning your fleet at the 60th Lightning Anniversary Regatta? That had to be the highlight of my sixty-two years of Lightning racing."

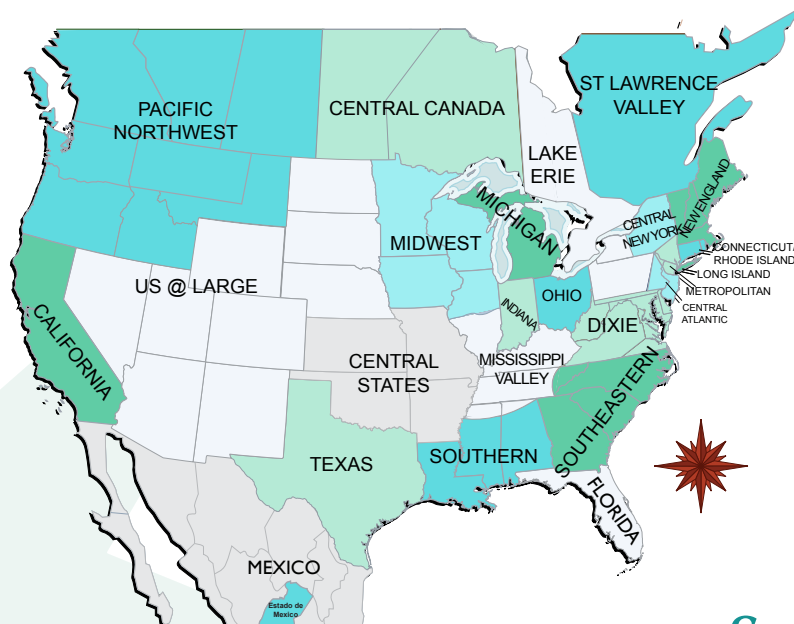

2012 in Metedeconk River Yacht Club's Fleet 34 was a busy and successful one for Lightning sailors.

In spring sailing, Jason Lutz with Timmy Crann and Lauren Jones finished 16th out of forty-six at Savannah's Deep South Regatta. At the annual Long John Regatta at Monmouth Boat Club, Mitch Hnatt, with Ryan Stagaard and Alex Lehnese, took fourth overall.

MRYC hosted the New Jersey State Championship in June, and Mitch Hnatt with Tara Schon and Ryan Staagard bested ten other boats to claim the 2012 title. A few weeks later, Keith Taboada with Russ and Chris Schon won the Central Atlantic District Championship by a single point over Jody Lutz with sons Jason and Jonathan, held at Brant Beach Yacht Club.

During July and August, junior representatives Jonathan Lutz and Timmy Crann finished exceptionally well in major youth Lightning events. In early July, Jonathan, with Jack Ruggiero and Tommy Fortunato, won the 2012 Junior State Championship, held at Surf City Yacht Club. The following week, USA representatives Timmy Crann, Lauren Jones (Buffalo Canoe Club) and Ali Blumenthal (Bellport, New York) finished a close second behind Adam MacDonald of Canada at the 2012 Youth World Championship in Finland. Finally, at the 2012 Junior North American Championship held at Houston Yacht Club, Jonathan, sailing with Reed Baldrige (Houston, Texas) captured the title. Coincidentally, Jonathan had won both the Junior States and Junior North Americans in 2011 with his older brother Jason.

Chris Schon with Haley Kardek and Kathryn Curtis finished fourth at the Junior NAs.

Perhaps the biggest story of 2012 Lightning sailing at MRYC was the Lutz Family winning the 2012 North American Championship. The team of Jody, Jay, and Jonathan sailed consistently throughout the ten-race event, only finishing out of the top ten once, en route to a seven-point win over Matt Fisher. Keith Taboada with Russ and Chris Schon finished tenth overall.

In the fall of 2012, Mitch Hnatt won the MRYC Fall Series over Phil and Greg Kinzel. In sailing elsewhere, Keith Taboada, with who other than Russ and Chris Schon, narrowly edged out his brother, Brian, for the Manahawkin Bay Cup at Surf City in September. Keith also finished seventh in the forty-boat fleet down in Annapolis at the annual Frigid Digit. At the 2nd annual Wild Oyster Regatta in Charleston, South Carolina, Jason Lutz, sailing with David and Jody Stark of Buffalo, New York, won the event in convincing fashion.

A fleet report for 2012 would not be complete without mentioning the devastation the New Jersey Shore received from super storm Sandy. Sandy brought winds and a storm surge that the Jersey Shore had never seen before. The Barnegat Bay, where the 2010 North Americans were sailed, was overrun with Atlantic Ocean water as the barrier island between the two was breached with several new, temporary inlets. The destruction was almost unimaginable. MRYC suffered extensive water damage, resulting in a total remodel of the first floor, which was more fortunate than our neighbor club, Bay Head Yacht Club. BHYC was forced to close their main clubhouse for the entirety of the 2013 sailing season due to foundation damage. Many MRYC club members suffered extensive damage to their homes, which put sailing on the back burner for much of winter 2013.

In 2013, Metedeconk had a few sailors on the circuit, including Jason Lutz, with Jonathan Lutz and Tommy Zanowic, at the Savannah stop and George Francis and Dick Thomas, who crewed for George Glenn of Ocean City, at the St. Petersburg stop.

At the end of July, the Atlantic Coast Championship was held in Wrightsville Beach, North Carolina and Keith Taboada, with Chris and Timmy, finished a strong third.

On August 2, MRYC hosted the 2013 New Jersey Junior State Championship. Seven teams attended, with four of them hailing from MRYC. Three races were completed in the westerly breeze as Chris Schon with Aaron Husak and Haley Kardek took the championship, winning the tiebreaker with Austin Newman of Riverton. Chris's win marks the fourth straight year that a Metedeconk sailor has won the Junior State Championship (Timmy Crann '10, Jason Lutz '11, Jonathan Lutz '12).

At the Junior North American Championship, MRYC's Jonathan Lutz, sailing with local juniors Charlie Nunn and Connor Swikart, finished fourth, losing the tiebreaker for third. Chris Schon, with Aaron Husak and Haley Kardek, finished eighth, and Teddy Schon with Ali Blisnuk and Harry Forbes finished 19th. The champions, Adam MacDonald, Abby Bennett, and Allie Jones, had MRYC connections, as Allie is the granddaughter of MRYC Past Commodore and lifetime member Jim Daley. Jonathan's top finish has qualified him to receive one of two automatic United States bids to the 2014 Youth World Championship.

In fall of 2013, Mitch Hnatt took the win in the Fall Series, with Greg Kinzel and Keith Taboada following. Mitch also was victorious at the New Jersey States at Monmouth Boat Club in September, with Keith finishing a close second.

US Sailing held its annual Championship of Champions regatta at Columbia Sailing Club in South Carolina. The Lightning Class representatives were Metedeconk's Jody Lutz with Jay Lutz and Derek Gauger via the 2012 North Americans. Metedeconk native, Betsy Alison, finished third, while Team Lutz finished sixth.

At the third annual Wild Oyster Regatta in Charleston, Metedeconk's Keith Taboada, with Russ Schon and Maggie MacDonald, finished 11th, while Jody Lutz with Jason and Jonathan finished 16th. Rumor has it Jason may have dropped the ball with calling tactics using his local Charleston knowledge.

It has certainly been a whirlwind two years on the Metedeconk River. From fantastic junior sailing, a North American Champion team, and a horrific tropical superstorm, members of Fleet 34 have seen enough to last them the next decade. But as always, the Lightning Class at MRYC will continue to have a strong presence on the Barnegat Bay and across the country in 2014 and beyond.

2013

Winners will be determined based on strength of nominators' citations, for making a significant difference in the racing performance of the boat or boats, commitment to racing, and support of the fleet. The winners may not also receive awards for Best New Crew; Most Improved Crew; or Fleet Helper.

Laura Lake – Laura skill and expertise help Team Lightning Bug significantly improve our position in the fleet during the spring series, for which we took a 3rd place.

Best New Crew: Steve Nabors

Recipients of the Best New Crew award must have completed their first season of racing for Fleet 50 skippers in Fleet 50 racing events. Winners will be determined based on strength of nominators' citations, for commitment to racing; sailing skill; and support of the Fleet. The winners may not also receive awards for High-impact Crew; Most Improved Crew; or Fleet Helper.

Recipients of the Most Improved Crew award must have completed their second or subsequent season of racing for Fleet 50 skippers in Fleet 50 racing events. Winners will be determined based on strength of nominators' citations, for improved sailing skill, commitment to racing; and support of the Fleet. The winners may not also receive awards for High-impact Crew; Best New Crew; or Fleet Helper.

Lisa-Marie Lane – although Lisa-Marie is also a boat owner and skipper, she spent most of the season crewing on various boats in or-

der to familiarize herself with the Lightning and with one-design racing. Her passion and intensity are unmatched, her energy level is incredible, and her thirst for knowledge and drive for self-improvement are simply amazing. Bungle Bucket: Not Awarded in 2013

The recipient of the Bungle Bucket award will be the Fleet 50 skipper who has demonstrated exceptional instances of lapses of sailing judgment that resulted in humorous or entertaining outcomes.

Instead of the Bungle Bucket Award, I'd like to present the "anti-Bungle Bucket" award to two skippers in recognition of good sportsmanship and outstanding seamanship. You might remember that Rose Maryann, and Anne took a spill on a nasty puff in the 2013 President's Cup. The Lightning Class Association in Finland has arranged for a five race ranking series for the local sailors, including official Finnish Championships for which we qualify when twenty or more boats have lined up the previous year. Although, Lake Wawasee is a spring fed lake, it also is supplied by a watershed which begins in southwestern Noble County and flows down through a chain of lakes by way of Turkey Creek. Well, the year has turned, and it's time to reflect about the 2013 sailing season. Our Fleet started out with a bang in early February when we had the honor of hosting the Commodore's Dinner Dance honoring Mike Naughton, the out-going Commodore, an active member of our Fleet. We livened up the normal transfer of command by a light "roasting" of this great guy. It seemed to go over well with some very positive comments from senior members who commented, "We used to do this every year."

Since our major event annually is the Burl Harmon Memorial Indy Open regatta, and it is scheduled for the first weekend every May, most of our active racers got their boats into the water for the start of the ISC racing on April 14. On May 4 and 5, we hosted the 51st running of the Indy Open, drawing sailors from seven fleets in Ohio, Michigan and Lake Wawasee

to compete against seven of our lo-crews. What made this year's competition so exciting was the extremely close finish of the two top boats. 2012 began with the loss of two of our club's long time members. Jack Roberston, who lived to the age of eighty-nine, was a unique person in many ways. He was an avid member of our Snipe fleet until he was well into his 70s when he retired from racing and opted for cruising in his little yellow Puffer. He enjoyed the camaraderie of our members and was ever present at our social events. Jack loved to converse, he

was not shy to express his opinions, and he enjoyed food—especially a good dessert. His wife Yancey predeceased him in 2000, and he is survived by a daughter, Medearis, and a son, John.

Less than a week after Jack died, we lost another fine member and friend, Anne "Nancy" Beveridge, wife of sixty-two years to retired Lightning skipper Bill Beveridge. Nancy, who was eighty-six at her death on March 2, 2012, and Bill made their home in Staten Island, where Nancy had been a kindergarten teacher for twenty-three years. Her parents were the original owners of their home at Lake Mohawk, where the Beveridge family spends summers. Nancy enjoyed the company of our club members, and she was always friendly and courteous. Son Bill, Jr. carries on the tradition of sailing a Lightning with his children. Nancy also leaves three daughters, Beth, Peggy and Anne, as well as seven grandchildren.

The Prep Signal Party on April 21, held in the Mohawk Room of the LMCC, officially kicked off our events for 2012 and was a great success, with a high turnout of sailors, crew, children and guests. There was an abundance of food for all to enjoy as we socialized and danced to the music provided by our in-house DJ, Mark Marussich. On May 5 we turned our efforts to preparing for sailing with mast raising. After that we were ready for another social event—our Cinco de Mayo Party.

Our first races took place on May 27. Despite light air, Perry and Don Okner were able to match race their Lightnings. Perry took two firsts over Don, as Rich and Gail Miner served as race officials. Margaret Anderson and Ali Brown, having completed her first year at Harvard graduate school, crewed for Perry and 2011 Crew of the Year, Ed Snook, was on board Don's boat.

The following weekend, June 3, brought strong winds and three Lightnings sailed with Hank Jelinek and new member Alex Fox running the races. Rich Miner took a first and a second, Perry a second and a first and Don Okner a DNF and a third. Gusts up to fifteen knots made for tough sailing during the first race, but by the time race two started, the wind settled down. New member Birgit Fox crewed with Ed Snook for Don.

Our Gabor Cup Regatta was scheduled for June 10, but there was little wind, so we postponed the event. However, the Makani Party took place as scheduled, and despite a squall at the beginning of the event, things went well, and there was a good turnout. The Gabor Cup, our first open Regatta for 2012, finally took place on June 18. The wind was very light, and only one race was held because, during the second race, the boats were unable to make the windward mark within the required time. Only Lightnings competed, and John Marx served as race official. The results were Richard Miner in first place, Perry Anderson second and Hank Jelinek third.

The following week, June 25, started out looking like another cancellation due to light air. However, we were able to hold one race, with Don Okner and Ed Snook on the committee boat. Rich Miner and Perry Anderson raced head-to-head, and Rich took another first. Fortunately, things picked up on July 1, and with Constance Gill and Angela Hopkins running the race, four Lightnings competed in race one, with Rich Miner in first place, followed by Perry Anderson second, Don Okner third and John Incantalupo fourth. Three Lightnings sailed in race two, with the Miner, Anderson and Okner boats finishing in that order.

On the morning of July 4, a team of adult and junior sailors, led by Chuck Chute, turned Chuck's Lightning into an impressive Native American, birch bark war canoe. As the sides and bow were assembled, the Sparta High School Band, including Haley Chute on drums, marched by, and the parade got underway. With the LMYC's golden arrowhead logo for the bow and a compass rose for the stern, the war canoe was ready to roll out into its proper place on time. It left the Yacht Club filled with the junior sailors in their "Wind Warriors" t-shirts, sporting head bands with pheasant feathers and carrying paddles specially decorated by Ian Oldridge. Mitch Romine, sitting in front wearing a fantastic eagle's head, capped off the scene. As the war canoe rolled down the East Shore Trail behind John Miller's van, the crowd showed the LMYC and its sailors enthusiastic praise. The judges agreed and awarded the LMYC's float first place.



Back at the Yacht Club, preparations were underway for the annual July 4th picnic party. Lots of helping hands, especially Perry and Margaret Anderson and Margaret's twin sister Mary, set up tables and got things ready for the enthusiastic crowd that showed up bearing food donations shortly after 6:00 PM. The chefs, Perry and Commodore Rich, cooked up burgers and dogs all evening, finishing just in time for the spectacular fireworks show visible so clearly from our docks.

This fund raiser for our Junior Sailing Program was very successful. Thanks to those who baked pies for our pie contest, which Margaret Anderson won for her delicious blueberry-peach concoction. Gail Miner, this year's party organizer, said it was a "piece of cake" to get volunteers to judge the pies.

Our Marine Base Regatta was held on July 8. We had a nice turnout that included four Lightnings, three Snipes and a Laser. John and Margie Incantalupo set an Olympic course in light to moderate and shifty winds that allowed for two races. Jeff Urbanski took first place in his Snipe, and John Marx, in another Snipe, was second. Darn those handicaps! Rich Miner in a Lightning came in third. Don Okner edged out Perry Anderson in a tie-breaker for fourth place. We socialized and enjoyed burgers, dogs, soda and beer, as well as other treats after the racing.

The following Sunday, July 22, brought nice wind out of the southwest, and our race officials, the Andersons, set a long course that allowed for some good spinnaker reaches. Rich Miner, with Gail Miner and Ken Potts on board as crew, managed two firsts in the Lightning Fleet, with Chuck Chute and crew Dave Newton in second place, followed by Don Okner with crew Ed Snook and Michael Mackey third in both races.

Rich Miner was our race official on July 29. The wind was variable out of the northeast for the one race that was held. Rich had to shorten the course to an Olympic for the Lightnings, and after good spinnaker run in the fifth leg, Don Okner and crew Ed Snook lead the way to the finish line, only to be overtaken in the last hundred yards by Perry Anderson and crew Margaret Anderson and Ali Brown. Hank Jelinek and crew Adam Anea followed in third place. The Lightning Fleet's Spring series ended up with Rich Miner and crew in first place, followed by Perry Anderson and crew in second place. Don Okner and crew came in third and Hank Jelinek was fourth.

August started off with no racing on the 5th due to poor wind conditions. However, on August 11 we were able to hold the Jack Robertson Cruising Day. This was the first year that Jack was not around to enjoy the event, which will henceforth be held in his memory. Chuck Chute followed through on a suggestion made by Constance Gill to give Jack a Viking send off. A model burial ship was floated with a symbolic flame as members read poignant poetic excerpts in honor of our late colleague.

August 12 brought a five to ten mph southwest wind. With Constance Gill and Angela Hopkins serving as race officials, Rich Miner, Perry Anderson and Chuck Chute raced their Lightnings, finishing in that order in both races. There was no wind on August 19, so racing was canceled again. Although the air was light on August 26, Don Okner and Chuck Chute were able to match race, with Don taking two firsts. The Commodore's Cup Regatta was postponed due to lack of wind on September 2, and on September 9 there was still no wind, resulting in yet another cancellation.

Although the Commodore's Cup Regatta was rescheduled, the party that usually follows was held on September 2 at the Miner's home, and it was a real success. There was a large turnout of

members of all ages who enjoyed the great food that everyone brought. Thanks to Gail Miner's creativity, the younger set did some craft projects while the adults socialized.

On September 23 the Commodore's Cup Regatta was finally held, with John Miller running the races and Ian Oldridge assisting. Four Lightnings competed in two races, and while the windward mark was set to the north, conditions were such that each leg seemed to have a beat, a reach and a run. That's sailing on Lake Mohawk! Rich Miner captured two firsts and won the regatta, with the runner-up Perry Anderson taking two seconds. Don Okner and Chuck Chute swapped for third place, with Chuck prevailing based on overall time.

On September 30, Rich Miner and Chuck Chute raced head-to-head with Perry Anderson serving as race official. Mark Marussich joined Rich and Gail aboard Hawkeye, with Haley Chute crewing for her dad on Tattoo. A hail storm forced a shortened course, with Rich taking yet another first. Just as the boats were pulled from the lake, there was a heavy down pour, followed by calm winds that prevented another race. October 7 brought some cold air and occasional showers but no wind, so racing was canceled.

Our last races were held on October 14, a day with a strong southwest wind in which three Lightnings competed while Don Okner and Ed Snook, assisted by Constance Gill, ran the races. Rich Miner was first in both races, Chuck Chute took two seconds and Hank Jelinek came in third. Thus, the fall series for the Lightnings ended with Rich Miner in first place, Perry Anderson second, Don Okner third and Chuck Chute in fourth place.

On October 27, we had our Finish Line Party and Annual Meeting at the LMCC. Everyone who attended brought great dishes to share, and after voting in our new officers, Fleet Captains and trustees for 2013, Alex Fernandez Fox treated us to some terrific entertainment. She organized a contest to see who could best match the names of yacht clubs in the United States with their locations (i.e., Lake Mohawk Yacht Club at Lake Mohawk, Sparta, New Jersey). Mark Marussich won with eighteen out of twenty points, followed by the team of Chuck Chute and Hank Jelinek with seventeen points. Laird Johnson and the Mackey family were close runners-up. Factoid: there are places named "Mohawk Lake" in Ohio, Utah and Massachusetts, but, according to Google Maps, we are the only "Lake Mohawk" in the USA.

2013 was not only the 75th anniversary of the Lightning class sailboat. It was also the 75th anniversary of the incorporation of the LMYC and the 75th anniversary of LMYC member Charles Gabor's Snipe Class world championship. So 1938 was an important year in our history in many ways.

We began our 2013 activities with our Prep Signal Party at the Chute home. It was a great event with good food and camaraderie. It was also an opportunity for us to bid farewell to Ed and Julie Snook as they head off for their new home in Maine, occasioned by a corporate move. We were sorry to lose this fine couple and Don Okner's Sushi lost a terrific crew member. But, we were happy that all worked out well for Ed and Julie, including jobs for both, a house bought and a house sold. We then made ready for sailing by raising our masts and celebrating with a Cinco de Mayo Party on May 4.

June 3 brought wind to our lake—perhaps a bit too much—so that our racers opted for using the opportunity to do some shake down cruising. On June 9 we were ready for the Gabor Cup Regatta and for our Hawaiian Makani Fest. Three Lightnings competed in the regatta, with Rich Miner and crew Gail Miner and Ken Potts taking first place, followed by Don Okner and crew Brad Newton second and Chuck Chute with crew Dave Newton taking third. Our Rich Miner retained his title as Fleet Champion, with Perry Anderson the runner-up and Chuck Chute as the second runner-up.

Fleet 75 – 2012

Lightning Fleet 75 based at the Nyack Boat Club on the west shore of the Hudson River at Nyack, New York, enjoyed a very active season in 2012 and is looking forward to hosting the 2013 Women's, Junior's and Master's North American Championships.

The club was pounded by hurricane Sandy in late October, sustaining damage to docks and the porch roof of the clubhouse. Fleet members had brought their boats home or moved them to upper parking area at the club before the storm hit, and fortunately no Lightnings were damaged by Sandy. Several members of the fleet helped with clean up and repairs, and the club looks forward to being fully operational for the 2013 season.

The fleet hosted the Magnus Pedersen Regatta on June 2 -3, with 11 boats completing. Justin Coplan, with crew members Danielle Prior and Jay Mueller, won the event with four firsts and four seconds. Bob Sengstacken, sailing with Daniel Zitin and Peter Broszkowski (on Saturday) and Penny Sengstacken (on Sunday) placed second.

Joan Hurban from the Severn Sailing Association with Peter Jadrosich and Elli Turk placed third. Gary Hurban was fourth in the regatta with Mike Carney and Rod Johnson (on Saturday) and Dave Foster (on Sunday). The Hurbans, life members of the Nyack Boat Club and stalwarts of Fleet 75, moved to Annapolis and joined the Severn Sailing Association several years ago. Gary is a past Nyack Boat Club Commodore (1987-1988), and they continue to compete often at Nyack.

A number of Nyack sailors traveled to Cedar Point Yacht Club in Westport, CT on June 16-17 to participate in the combined 2012 Connecticut/Rhode Island Metropolitan Districts. Justin Coplan with crew Danielle Prior and Bjurki Gunnerson was the regatta winner, and he has now won the Metropolitan District Championship for five years in a row!

Justin, with Beryl Bell as co-skipper, won the Fleet's spring series, Bob Sengstacken and co-skipper Daniel Zitin placed second, and Gary Hurban was third.

Several fleet members competed in the Atlantic Coast Championship on Sandy Hook Bay off Highlands, New Jersey, on July 29-30, hosted by the Monmouth Boat Club and the Atlantic Highlands Yacht Club. Justin and crew Mike Carney and Danielle Prior came away with the victory, taking first in the 44-boat fleet in both of the regatta's two races, sailed in breezy weather with some heavy rain showers and the New York City skyline as backdrop.

Other Fleet 75 sailors competing included Bob Sengstacken with crew Shea Thorvalsen and Ben Yanelli, and Dan Paretti with Jeff Sorenson and Emily Rathburn.

Gary Hurban won the Lightning North American Masters Championship hosted by the Houston Yacht Club on July 31-August 4, sailing with Joan Hurban and Justin.

At the North American Championship in Houston on August 5-10, Justin placed seventh, sailing Gary Hurban's boat with Gary and Joan crewing. This was his best finish so far at the North Americans and qualifies him for the 2013 World Championships.

Bob Sengstacken and co-skipper Daniel Zitin won the Fleet's summer series, with Eric Kent placing second and Larry Decker third.

At the Connecticut Governor's Cup regatta on September 8-9 at Niantic Bay Yacht Club, Justin with crew Danielle Prior and Seth Colley placed second.

Eric Kent organized two successful racing clinics taught by Justin on September 22-23, the first for fleet members on Saturday and the second for juniors on Sunday. Andrew Graham, George Penny, and Dan Parietti were among those helping out. The junior clinic was an important opportunity to introduce young sailors, both skippers and crew, to Lightnings and lay the groundwork for their participation in the 2013 North American Junior's Championship. After a morning chalk talk, the juniors participated in the fleet's regular Sunday afternoon races with Justin providing coaching.

Justin continued his successful season at a windy Last Blast Lightning regatta hosted by Fleet 75 on October 6, sailing with Danielle Prior and Mike Carney. Team Coplan won three of four races, with 16 boats competing. A cold front hammered the fleet during the last race with a gust recorded at over 30 knots. Three boats capsized with their spinnakers pulling like runaway horses.

Ed Adams from Rhode Island and the Niantic, Connecticut fleet placed second, sailing with Meredith Adams and Pat Connorney. Bob Sengstacken was third with Daniel Zitin and Maud Lindsay; and Dick Hallagan from Newport Yacht Club in Rochester, NY with Rick Ten Eyck and John Steiner took fourth place.

Bob Sengstacken with co-skipper Daniel Zitin won the fall series, with Eric Kent placing second and Peter Browne third.

Bob and Daniel also won the Fleet 75 championship for the year, marking Bob's eighth consecutive year as fleet champion! Eric Kent placed second and Larry Decker took third place.

Finally, the Fleet welcomed new member Ian Russell with a vintage Lightning in 2012, bringing the total number of boats in the Fleet up to sixteen.

From June 7–14 we practiced our Italian and wished we could eat pasta and sip espresso (OK, maybe wine) all day while we cheered on Team Coplan (Justin Coplan, Danielle Prior and Mike Carney) and "The Walrus" —first Runner-Up at the Lightning 2013 World Championships in Castiglione del Lago, Italy. Competing with forty-six boats from ten countries, Justin, an alumnus of NBC's Junior Sailing Program, was able to beat several multiple-times past World Champions. Justin's finishes included a bullet, a second and three other top ten finishes. Bravissimo to the trio! (See Championship Reports for full details.)

The Fleet, led by Eric Kent, hosted the combined Magnus Pedersen Regatta/Metropolitan Districts on June 22 and 23. With Judy Hanlon as PRO, seventeen boats competed for the Magnus and eleven for the Mets. With an exceptionally full moon and winds ranging from 5–12 knots, Judy flew the "I" flag for most of the day and got in seven great races in a variety of conditions. Bob Sengstacken, on Lucky Dog with Maud Lindsay and Daniel Zitin, got three bullets and a 2nd place finish on Saturday. Winds were variable on Sunday, but we had three more races. Bob held on to the lead to win the Districts. Jack Huntsman and Ted Duffy, both of Red Bank, took 2nd and 3rd.

Joan Hurban, sailing Hers with loyal crew of Gary Hurban and Peter Jadvosich, had consistent results both days, found the pressure and took the long sought-after Magnus Pedersen trophy. Joan calls the Magnus trophy a "coffee pot," but we all notice it conveniently holds her Coors Lite! Hugh Hutchinson from Riverton and Ted Duffy from Red Bank finished 2nd and 3rd. (See Regatta Reports for full details).

Joan's Report:

This year the annual Magnus Pedersen Regatta was combined with the Metropolitan District Championships. We had a great turnout, including two junior boats. Abbie Probst from Buffalo Canoe Club and Chris Schon from Metedeconk, New Jersey, both came to practice for the WJMs that will be hosted by Nyack in August. It was an awesome regatta all around! We had great wind on both days and excellent Race Committee work by PRO Judy Hanlon and her team, who will be running the WJMs in August. We will be in good hands for our event.

Gary and I started this regatta many years ago to build our fleet in Nyack. With the help of my crew, Peter Jadrosich, who has sailed with me for many years, and my husband Gary, I finally won the coveted "coffee pot"! They did an outstanding job, with Peter flying the spinnaker—and we were fast downwind— and Gary up front finding pressure, which was key. Thanks guys!

Judy Hanlon got in seven good races, with a variety of conditions. The wind was 5–12



knots, going from SE to SW, building each day, with some interesting shifts and variable current. They made several course changes to give us excellent courses as the wind shifted, and some "I" flags to get us started.

The forecast on Saturday was for 5–10 knot winds from the S to the SW and increasing to 10–15 knots. The wind was very light in the morning, so Judy postponed for one hour, and as the wind filled in, we headed out to the course. At the start of the first race the wind was SE at 5 knots. The current was slack, but that would change. We started at the pin and headed out to the left, where we saw more pressure. At the top of the leg, we gave up the left side to Jack Huntsman and Bob Sengstacken, who went on to beat us for a 1st and 2nd, with us in 3rd.

By the second race, the wind went right and increased to 8–10 knots, with the current increasing to a very strong ebb, due to an exceptionally full moon. This led to a general recall and an "I" flag for the rest of the day. We got a bad start and rounded the top mark at the back of the fleet. We went low and sailed the rhumb line to the leeward mark, as most of the fleet went high with Bob and Jack in the lead. We stayed in a shaft of air to pass most of the fleet. On the second beat, Hugh held port tack, as Bob and I tacked away—big mistake—and was well ahead of us at the weather mark. He went on to win that race.

The wind continued to increase during the next two races to 10–12 knots. In the third race Bob won the pin, went left, and never looked back. Hugh was close behind Bob, but we were able to just edge him out at the finish, to finish 2nd.

During the last race of the day, the fleet was pretty tight at the leeward mark. Bob rounded the right gate, went left, got a port tack lift, and went on to win the race, followed by Jack, then us. This put Bob in the lead. After the throw-out, he would be one point ahead of us, and we would have one point on Jack.

Saturday evening we had hors d'oeuvres, a keg, and a delicious catered dinner on the patio, overlooking the Hudson.

Sunday morning, we started in a 5–6 knot SE breeze. The current was challenging as we started in a flood current which changed to an ebb by the end of the last race. We started Race 5 in a light southeasterly. Jack took that race, and Ted Duffy a 2nd. Ted came back strong on Sunday, winning the sixth race, with Stephanie Mayo taking a 2nd, and Chris Schon a 3rd. During the Race 7, the wind shifted right, and increased to 8–10 knots. Hugh started at the boat, stayed right, and won that race going away, with Ted taking another 2nd and we were 3rd.

We didn't win any races, but our consistency paid off with all seconds and thirds, after

a throw-out, to win the Regatta, with Hugh Hutchinson 2nd and Ted Duffy 3rd.

We have moved to the Dixie District, although part of us will always be in Nyack, and when the regatta was scored, counting only the Metropolitan District boats, Bob Sengstacken won the Met Districts with Jack Huntsman 2nd and Ted Duffy 3rd.

Thanks to the Nyack Fleet and Eric Kent, our Regatta Chair, who did an excellent job organizing this event. Thanks again to Judy Hanlon and her team for running the races, and thanks to all competitors for coming.

After multiple capsizes at the 2012 Last Blast, Fleet Captain, Dick Leonard, organized the "Capsize and Crew Overboard Safety Clinic" for the club on July 13. The session was run by US SAILING instructors Stu Gilfillen, Steve Maddox and John Rousmaniere, seamanship and safety expert. The clinic was not just for sailors, but for safety patrol, Race Committee, the flag officers, small boats and big boats. The presentations were extremely informative, but even more so, the on-water demos and practice rescues allowed all to connect the dots and be better prepared for emergencies.

A direct result of the Safety clinic was that whistles were given to all 2013 WJM participants. On hearing this, John Rousmaniere told Amy Villalba that he's "Very pleased. Nothing sounds like a whistle on the water."

Next up, with Eric Kent and Bob Sengstacken at the helm, the Fleet was honored to host the Women's, Juniors' & Masters' Lightning North American Championships and Classic Rally on August 14–17.

We were thrilled to see only Lightning masts in our dry sail space as we welcomed fifty-seven teams from fourteen different states, and two Canadian provinces. Competitors included twenty-one Juniors under age 20, thirty-one Masters 55+, and five Classic teams, wood or glass boats built before 1974. Juniors had strong representation from the Buffalo Canoe Club, with twelve teams. The Masters included many familiar names, including Hallagan, Hurban and Proctor.

The Classic Rally, held in honor of the 75th Anniversary of the Class, included hull #2, possibly the oldest actively competing non-keel boat. This event has been held for thirty years, since 1983, and this was the largest turnout ever. There were only two other years when there were more than fifty boats.

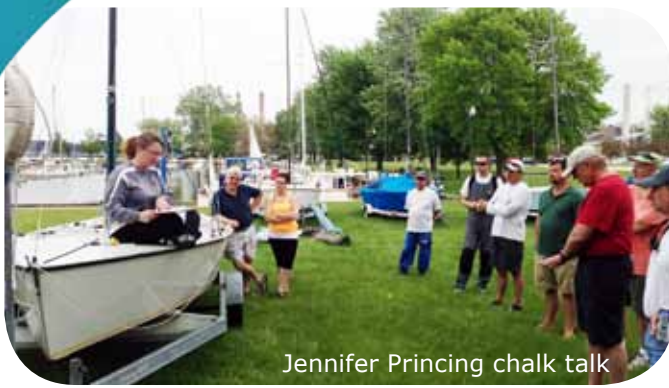

The Annisquam Yacht Club, AYC, sailing on Ipswich Bay, Gloucester, Massachusetts, in 1994 established the Smith Trophy in memory of the late U.S. Senator, Benjamin A. Smith, a legendary Lightning and later Etchells sailor. The Trophy is awarded to a club member:

"in recognition of outstanding achievement in or extraordinary contributions to the sport of sailing."

Smith, with his children, Russell, Ben, and Suzie, was Fleet 151 champion for many years, won several New England District Championships in the late 1950s and early 1960s and, subsequently, won an Etchells' nationals.



The award, not given each year, was given in 2012 to Dr. Georges Peter, who won AYC championships and Marblehead Race Week in different classes, including the Lightnings, the New England Districts in 1973, six Massachusetts Lightning

championships, and the 1972 Presidents Cup. He has raced his beloved Mouette, eight Lightnings in total, continuously since 1956, now completing fifty-eight years in the Class. He most recently finished 8th in the 2013 International Masters in Italy and 5th in the North American Masters. Other successful campaigns have included the following:

- Racing in more than 20 North Americans, qualifying for the Blue Fleet on seven occasions.
- Sailing in six World Championships, finishing 12th in Finland in 1995 and 16th in Dallas in 1979
- Finishing Runner-Up in the 2001 Presidents Cup
- Competing frequently in the Master's with a best finish of 4th in 1995

In receiving the award, the AYC noted his dedication to the Lightning Class, in addition to his devotion to his family (his wife Carolyn and his daughter Allison are accomplished Lightning sailors), and to his career, specializing in pediatric infectious diseases, all of which made him "a most deserving recipient of the Smith Trophy."

Georges also was Commodore of the New England District (1979-1980) and is a former ILCA Vice-President (1982-1991).

Peter continues to race regularly. He looks forward to the 2014 Southern Circuit, sailing with his long-standing and outstanding crew, C. H. Ritt from Marblehead, Massachusetts, who began sailing with Peter in 1976, and Eva Burpee from Rye, New York, who has crewed with Georges and CH since 2010.

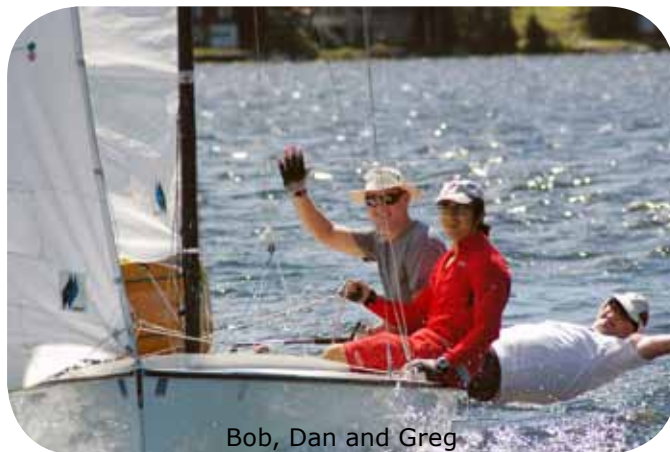

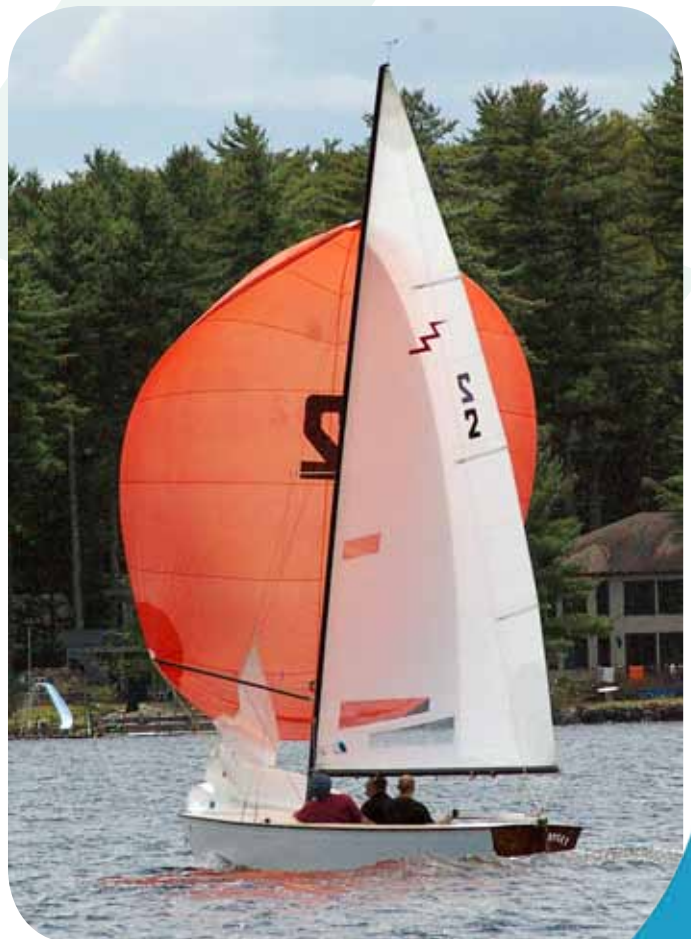

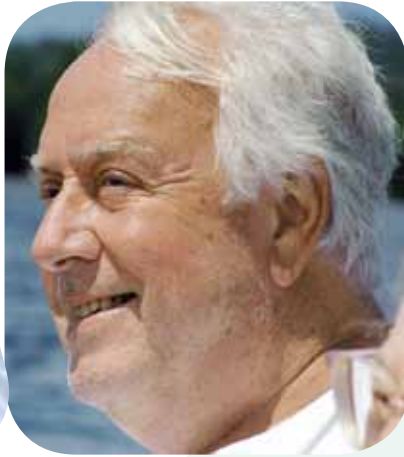

The Nigeria Lightning National Championships were held in May with twenty boats participating in nine races over two days.

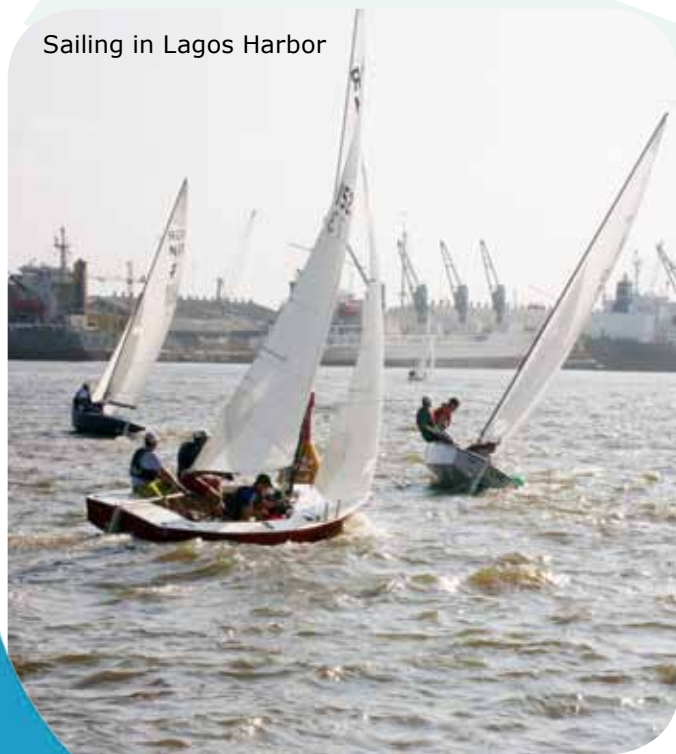
1. Graham Gips, Kristiann Gips and Charles Weller with seventeen points.

We have two active series throughout the season. The Sunday AM Series, comprising short one lap races every Sunday morning, was won by Jon Varley, with Chris Clarke second. The Principal Series comprises one longer race, usually two laps, on Sunday afternoons from the start of the season in May until Labor Day. This year Tom Varley won the series, with Bob Shutt second and Chris Clarke third.

The final event of the season is the Club Championship Sail-off Series in which the qualifying skippers sail as many races as boats qualified, with skippers and crews switching boats for every race. This year Tom Varley regained the championship, beating last year's winner Bob Shutt, who came in second. Dave Samanich came third.

James Taylor from Cowan Lake Sailing Association, near Wilmington, with his crew Carl Taylor and George Auer, won our Seventeenth Annual Bare Bones. Tom Varley, with his crew of Jon Varley and Matt Buchanan, from Mansfield Sailing Club, took second place, and Eric Brandt, with Becky Young and Nick Brandt, from Leatherlips Yacht Club, were third. Bob Shutt, with his crew of Zach Austin and Lisa Meadows, from Mansfield, came in fourth.

Sunny skies and steady westerly breezes of 10–15 mph were perfect sailing conditions, which produced intense

competition between the ten participating boats. Two two-lap races on a windward-leeward course were held on Saturday afternoon. Racing was then abandoned when a severe thunderstorm blew through the area, producing winds in the 20–30 mph range with heavy rain and hail. Racing resumed on Sunday morning under sunny skies and moderate breezes of 5–10 mph, and two more races were completed.

Five boats from Mansfield competed, and visitors came from Cowan Lake, near Wilmington, Indian Lake, near Russells Point, Leatherlips, near Columbus, and Erie, Pennsylvania.

This year Bob Shutt and his crew travelled to several regattas in the District and neighboring states, coming in fifth in the Burl Harmon in Indianapolis and nineteenth in the Spring Classic at Pymatuning. Bob's crew, Lisa, with Dave Samanich, sailed Bob's boat at the Fall In Regatta at Cowan Lake, coming in fifth. Tom Varley went to the Bluenose and came in ninth.

This year, our fifty-ninth, we lost two former commodores, Dave Upham and Jim Bierly. Dave was one of the original group of Lightning sailors who left Mohican Sailing Club in 1953 to set up Mansfield Sailing Club. Fleet 150 has been maintained ever since. 2013 is our sixtieth anniversary.

2013 was an important year for both Mansfield Sailing Club and Lightning Fleet 150 as it was the sixtieth anniversary for both. Mansfield Sailing Club was organized in 1953 shortly after the creation of Clearfork Reservoir. The founders were eight Lightning skippers formerly sailing on Charles Mill Lake as members of Mohican Sailing Club. They were: Woodburn Armstrong, August H. Grotegut, Mabel Huston, C. P. Siegenthaler, Eugene Smart, Glenn Macy, David L. Upham and Harry B. Wilson. Our first commodore was David Upham, who passed away in 2012.

Since 1953 both the club and Fleet 150 have been in continuous operation despite a number of ups and downs. Other sailboat classes came into the club and eventually disappeared; a testament to the appeal of the Lightning class. During its history the club is proud to have had as members Tom McDermott, author of "A Manual of Sailboat Racing" and Tom Varley, a well-known Lightning sailor whose presence has improved the competitiveness of all MSC members through the years.

Membership was down this year as Tom Varley did not sail until late in the season following an injury late in 2012. Despite this setback we had a good, active season.

Fleet 488 enjoyed an active and stimulating season in 2012, starting with the 2011 end-of-season Fleet banquet in January and going through October and into November, at the

Denver Sailing Association Awards banquet November 10, with lots of series racing and regatta action in between.

Team Blue Two, 15228, inaugurated the 2012 Fleet 488 season with their second trip in two years to the MLK birthday and Leukemia Cup Regattas at Lake Pleasant, Arizona, near Phoenix. Winds were light, and the air was a bit cool, but it was still an enjoyable escape from the mid-January winter chill in Denver. Blue Two turned out to be the fastest Lightning on the lake—we'll parenthetically note that she was the only Lightning on the lake.

The following weekend, Steve and Jan Davis hosted the 2011 Fleet 488 end-of-season banquet at their gracious home. Fourteen fleet members met for a most memorable evening of food and camaraderie, staying well past the designated end time to socialize and to get to know each other better. At the business meeting, David Thompson was elected to the post of Fleet Captain for 2012, and Bill Cabrall to the post of Fleet Secretary. A skeletal set of by-laws was adopted, and outgoing Fleet Captain, Bill Cabrall, was presented with a copy of 2011 musings of a Lightning Fleet Captain, a compendium of Bill's much-loved 2011 newsletters.

Things were quiet in Denver until the end of February, when, in March, three Fleet 488 boats sailed the 2012 Lightning Southern Circuit. Teams Thompson and Cabrall, Bill, Raeyane, and Jim England, sailed Savannah in chilly air and gusty winds, then drove on to Miami to race in warm sunshine and nice winds.

Former Fleet 488 member Mariel Yarbrough, on vacation in Miami after moving to the DC area, joined team Thompson and added her expertise as middle crew in Miami. Then it was on to St. Pete where the two Fleet 488 teams were joined by Steve Davis, sailing his boat with Brian Hayes and Maddie Waldron, while grandchildren Kai and Kylie Thompson flew in from Denver to be the crew for Blue Two. The air was warm, skies were sunny, and winds were light, resulting in only three races in three days, but the events were always enjoyable, especially the Saturday night banquet, as well as the Thursday night welcome reception and the Sunday closing ceremonies.

For the three-regatta series, Bill Cabrall placed 20th and David Thompson placed 27th. Steve Davis placed 15th in the St. Pete Winter Championships. At the Winter Championships banquet at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club, Steve Davis was awarded the Carl Smither memorial award for 2012, given each year to one of the ILCA's shining lights for his or her Corinthian spirit, support of the Lightning Class, and Class mentorship. Congratulations, Steve!

The 2012 Denver Sailing Association season kicked off on April 1, a fantastic spring day with sunny skies, temperatures in the 80s, and good



breezes. Unfortunately, only one Lightning, Bill Cabrall's Quest, #15315, came out. It may have been that nobody else thought there could be such a nice day on the first Sunday in April.

Then on April 7, the second race day in the spring Thaw-out Series, we again found only one Lightning, Blue Two, on the race course. Team Cabrall was on Race Committee and, unfortunately, David Thompson, sailing Blue Two, double-handed with Richard Allen, a highly experienced keelboat skipper, found a way to capsize and turtle the boat in only moderate winds and into extremely cold water. That required the full attention of the Race Committee. Racing was abandoned for the day in order to effect a successful rescue of the upside-down Lightning and the wet and cold crew.

The third race day in the Thaw-out Series, on April 15, was too cold and windy for sailboat racing on Cherry Creek Lake, and RC canceled racing for the day. However, on April 22, the fourth race day in the series, we had sunny skies, mild temperatures, and nice winds, and that was enough to get five Lightnings out. Steve Davis was on Race Committee, but his boat was still on the race course, helmed by long-time ILCA member Mark Schneider from Philadelphia, sailing with Cindy Schneider and Jan Davis. Not surprisingly, they took top honors, with three bullets. On April 29, the last race day in the series, we had good sailing conditions, but only two Lightnings were out, teams Quest and Dandy Lion.

The DSA Spring Series of ten race days, with dinghies sailing on Thursday evenings, kicked off on May 3, but no Lightnings went out that evening in the 25 mph winds, gusting to 35. The nine subsequent Spring Series dinghy race days were better, and we averaged five Lightnings on the line, on evenings that varied from having very light winds to one evening with 29 mph winds, gusting to thirty-seven.

We were joined in some of the Spring Series evenings by visitors Andrew Smith from upstate New York, Michelle Gruesbeck from Chicago, and Elaine Leo from Memphis. Also joining us were Pete Horsch from Denver, who became a more-or-less regular crew on Quest, Greg Cox, who moved here along with his keelboat from Missouri, and Jim England, formerly a regular crew on Quest, who purchased Lightning 14681 and started his own team, sailing with spouse Lori, Rebecca Bevrit, and/or Greg Cox. Speaking of purchasing Lightnings, Bill Cabrall went to western Colorado in June to appraise, then purchase 12015, a home-built woodie in museum-quality condition, and is keeping it sheltered in indoor storage until the right purchaser comes along.

The high point of the spring, however, was the annual DSA Shootout/Hornblower Regatta on May 19 and 20. Congratulations to Bill Cabrall, who scored seven bullets in a series of eight races over two

days in variable wind conditions, to take first place in the 2012 Hornblower Regatta! Bill sailed with Raeyane Farrell and Norm Jarvis, and they dominated the dinghy course in all but one race. Congratulations to Bob Stoller, down from Union Sailing Club, with Rebecca Espinosa and Catherine March, who took second. Team Blue Two, with Kai Thompson and Jim England on board, took third, and the Dandy Lions took fourth.



Out on the Colorado Western Slope, Ben Beall in Steamboat Springs announced, on July 2, the successful re-launch of #1477 after a twenty-year restoration project. The boat, built in 1946 in the Hubert Johnson boat yard, was wet sailed on Steamboat Lake all summer and performed very well.

The DSA Summer Series of ten race days, with dinghies sailing on Thursday evenings, kicked off on July 12, and two Lightnings were out, Teams Davis and Gawthrop, while Teams Quest, Blue Two, and Dandy Lion used the evening instead to pack their boats for a trip to the mountains near Bassalt, Colorado, the location of Reudi Reservoir and the 2012 Aspen Open Regatta. More on the Summer Series below, but first, here is the scoop on Fleet 488's participation in the Aspen Open.

Saturday's sailing started with an hour and a half of postponement under flat calm conditions in warm sunshine, prompting several crew members to jump into the lake for a refreshing swim. Then a gentle westerly (and sometimes easterly) breeze filled in, allowing starts for all five divisions. Then towards the end of the first race for the Portsmouth division, that started fifth in the sequence), a passing storm cell brought 40+ mph gusts, knocking several keelboats flat and overturning most of the Lasers and Sunfish. Bill Cabrall at the leeward mark noted all six Sunfish sailing downwind side-by-side suddenly go simultaneously airborne before capsizing. Lightning flashes in the sky subsequently prompted the three Lightnings to finish the race and then retire, but most other boats stayed out for three more races.

Sunday's conditions were a repeat of Saturday's except that the postponement at the beginning was only about fifteen minutes, and the 40+ mph gusts from the passing storm cell waited until many boats were headed in after finishing the last race of the day. That made for some difficult docking scenarios, and a long wait at the clubhouse for the storm to pass before hauling out, but by 6:00 PM the sun was shining, the air was warming, and the last boats were hauling out.

The Aspen Open is always memorable for the Saturday post-racing dinner and entertainment, and the 2012 regatta was no excep-



tion, with an excellent catered dinner

Once the U-20 was removed, the Lightnings

and a very good open bar at the cocktail reception, followed by dancing and camaraderie into the later hours of the evening.

Most of the participants camped on the Aspen Yacht Club grounds, making for easy access to their boats and to the clubhouse facilities.

Three Fleet 488 boats made the trip to Ruedi Reservoir. All three boats survived intact, although there were some tense moments on haul-out on Sunday, when teams Thompson, Dandy Lion and Cabrall, in a plan to avoid the lengthy lines forming for use of the one concrete launch ramp, elected instead to haul out on the adjacent beach. The plan was to rendezvous the boats at the swim platform ten yards off shore, then, in an organized sequence, pull the boats out and stage them for packing right on the beach.

The plan had to be modified when a U-20, sailing for the dock, got hit by a 40+ mph gust, broached, and washed up instead against the weather side of the swim platform, pinning teams Cabrall and Dandy Lion on the leeward side and pushing them rapidly towards shore. Team Thompson, late to the rendezvous, saw what was happening and steered for the docks instead, avoiding the excitement. For twenty minutes, teams Cabrall and Dandy Lion held on, hoping against hope that they would not be crushed by the swim platform being pushed by the U-20, while a cadre of thirty volunteer swimmers held the U-20 as best they could until a rescue powerboat arrived to extricate the nearly beached whale.

Meanwhile, back in Denver, the DSA Summer Series continued on into mid-September, with six Lightnings out on most races days, and weather conditions suitable for racing on all ten. Also, Teams Davis and Cabrall headed for the Lightning North American Masters and Championships, leaving on July 30. On Saturday morning, July 28, Bill Cabrall, Jim England, Raeyane Farrell, Rebecca Bevrit, Steve and Jan Davis, and David and Barb Thompson met at the Cherry Creek Marina to clean and pack three boats for a trip the following week to Houston. Davis' brought two boats, one chartered to a junior sailor from Houston and left on Monday. Jim England towed Bill's boat and left on Sunday. The other Quest team members flew out later in the week. Here are some photos of the packing party:

Both teams had some successes in Houston. Steve and Jan Davis, sailing with Will Brown, took third place in the 2012 Lightning North American Masters' Championships in Houston, with two bullets, a third, and two fourths in a field of sixteen boats. Team Cabrall, with Bill, Jim England, and Rebecca, placed 12th. Then, a week later, fifty five

Lightnings competed in the 2012 North American Championships. From Denver, teams Davis (Steve, Jan and Ian Schillebeeckx) placed 26th and Cabrall (Bill, Raeyane and Jim England) placed 43rd. David Spira registered, but did not race.

At the annual summer meeting of the ILCA, Fleet 488 was awarded the Steketee Trophy for 2012, recognizing the Fleet for outstanding contribution to the Lightning Class, naming the Fleet as ILCA Fleet of the Year. When the teams arrived back in Denver they met for a photo shoot with the trophy:

Back in Denver, for the remainder of the Summer Series, we had four Lightnings out on August 23,

five on August 16 and six on August 30, September 6 and September 13. (See next page)

We concluded the Summer Series just in time for the 2012 Colorado Governors Cup Regatta on the weekend of September 22 and 23. Eight Lightnings were out for the 2012 regatta, on a week-end with beautiful sunshine and gentle winds. Sailing were teams: Davis, Thompson, Gawthrop, Dandy Lion, Cabrall, England, Vargish, and Ostrander. Team Davis, with Fred Gohl at the helm and Steve as crew, double-handed; and skipper Norm Jarvis crewed with Kai, as was David on the Thompson boat.





Saturday gave us a full day of sunshine and temperatures in the mid 70s, with northerly winds that were a bit light at first but that strengthened to the range of 5-10 mph for most of the afternoon, then died out at the conclusion of racing. On the dinghy course, we got in four races; on the keelboat course, RC was able to get off five races. All boats were back at the dock by 5:00 PM, and an outstanding dinner, prepared by Steve and Jan Davis and Francine Hoffman was served at 6:00 PM. Festivities went on well after dinner, for a most enjoyable first day of racing.

The weather forecast for Sunday called for mostly sunny and very warm conditions, a high temperature of 83 degrees, and winds from the northeast at three mph with gusts to seven. And that's what we got, except that starting at 12:15, following the conclusion of the first, and only, race, we got a flat calm until, mercifully, the RC put up the abandon flag at 1:30 PM.

On the dinghy course, the RC started the race promptly at 11:00 AM, on schedule, sending us on a 6 - L - 6 - L course in the then westerly winds that were light but directionally steady for the first two legs. But then, during the third and fourth legs, the winds got lighter and started oscillating to the northeast and back again, and in different directions at different points on the water. At one time on the fourth leg, three Lightnings were making progress with chutes up while four others were catching up from behind while sailing close-hauled. Fortunately, we all were able to finish that race, but, unfortunately, the winds died, and there was not another race. That however did give us the opportunity to get back to the docks, secure our boats, and enjoy the post-racing party and the awards ceremony.

Congratulations to Steve Davis and team who took home the first place trophy; Bill Cabrall and team took second, and Al Gawthrop and team took third.

The DSA Fall Frostbite Series started Saturday, September 29 and concluded on October 27.

The weather was too cold, wet, and windy

for racing on October 6 and 13 but on the other three race days we had four, six, and five Lightnings out, respectively.

The final event of the 2012 season was the Denver Sailing Association banquet on November 10, attended by eighty-four DSA members and guests. Lightnings were there in full force, with teams Davis, Cabrall, Dandy Lion, Gawthrop, and Thompson fully represented. Steve Davis was given the 2012 USSA Sportsmanship award, and Team Davis won the 2012 DSA Lightning Series Racing award. The following Lightning skippers were awarded these series racing trophies:

Five Fleet 488 Lightnings competed in the Denver Sailing Association's Thaw-out Series, April 6 through May 4. Unlike last year, we had sailable weather for all five Saturdays. Not surprisingly, Steve Davis took first place, and Bill Cabrall took second place in this series. More surprisingly, David Thompson took third.

New Lightning skipper Toby Hamer had acquired #12015 last fall and needed to flip the boat over on to sawhorses in his back yard in order to refinish her bottom. So, on Saturday April 27 ten Fleet members and friends appeared at his house at 10:00 AM to flip the boat. It only took about fifteen minutes, and by the time that Bill Cabrall arrived, the job was done.



Spring Series

Seven Fleet 488 boats competed in the Denver Sailing Association Spring Series, May 9 through July 10 in races sailed in light air on some evenings and heavier air on other evenings. Bad weather forced the cancellation of racing on May 9, and high winds kept the Lightnings ashore on May 30. Bill Cabrall took first place in the series, Steve Davis second, and David Thompson third.



Shootout/Hornblower Regatta

In the interim, five Fleet 488 Lightnings, teams Davis, Cabrall, Dandy Lion, Stoller, and Thompson, sailed in the 2013 DSA Shootout/Hornblower Regatta on May 18 and 19. We had light and variable winds on both days, but not so light that we couldn't race and occasionally strong enough in the gusts to cause us to get up on the deck and hike. Sailing on the dinghy course at the southeast end of the lake, we got in three races on Saturday and four on Sunday, all on windward-leeward courses marked by yellow buoys. Finishes were in the order you would expect, except for the last race on Sunday, when the Dandy Lions found their secret inboard engine and flashed by all four other Lightnings on the final leg to take first place. Way to go, Dandy Lions! In that race, team Thompson was second around the windward mark and also at the leeward mark, and had expectations of a second or third place finish, behind Dandy Lion and Davis, but in the twenty seconds or so before the finish line, teams Cabrall and Stoller both inched past Thompson on their windward side. As they say in France, "desolé!" Team Davis took first place, Cabrall came in second, and Dandy Lion took third.

Crew Coordinator Program

We started the Fleet 488 Crew Coordination program on May 27. Following a recommendation by Fleet 488 skipper Jim England, our Fleet Captain filled the role of Crew Co-

dinator, for the purpose of getting more Lightnings on the line for our 2013 Spring and Summer series races.

Crew candidates were listed on the Lightning Crew Connection page on our website to serve as a pool from which to draw for crew positions on specific Thursday nights. Here is how it was designed to work:

- Any skipper knowing on Monday that he will need crew for the upcoming Thursday will contact the Crew Coordinator on Monday to explain his needs;
- The Crew Coordinator will canvas the crew pool and work to make a match;
- Skippers who know on Monday they will not be sailing will contact the Crew Coordinator on Monday to let him know which of his regular crew will be available to sail on other boats the upcoming Thursday.

Over the course of the Spring and Summer Series, we made at least one crew match per racing evening, getting more boats on the water this year.

Lightning Worlds

Also in the interim, two Fleet 488 skippers traveled to Castiglione del Lago, Italy, to compete in the Lightning World Masters' and Lightning World Championships. Congratulations to DSA Lightning skippers Steve Davis and David Spira, who placed 10th and 11th respectively in the International Masters' Championship Regatta! Steve sailed with Laura Jeffers and Amy Linton; David sailed with Todd Whitman and Randy Shore. Subsequently, Steve placed 18th out of a star-studded cast of forty-six in the Lightning World Championships, and David Spira placed 23rd. Well done, Steve and David!

Lake Level Low and Scheduled to go Lower



We experienced a dramatic drop in the level of Cherry Creek Reservoir, due to continuing drought conditions and a need to drop the lake level further to satisfy water-rights holders downstream. By the end of the Spring Series the lake was three feet below its specified recreational level, exposing mud flats in the harbor where we launch and recover for racing, and exposing fixed-keel racing boats to the risk of striking bottom on the race course. This

required a change in launching and docking strategy, basically pulling up centerboards and removing rudders once we entered the marina channel, and then paddling the rest of the distance to the crane dock. That proved to be a difficult challenge when returning on nights when winds were blowing from the west, straight out the channel we were attempting to enter.

On a happier note, on July 6 Fleet 488 members David Spira and Rebecca Bevrit traveled east to sail with Alister Thomson on July 6 around Fishers Island, Connecticut.

Summer Series

Nine Fleet 488 Lightnings competed in the DSA Summer Series, July 18 through September 19. The continuing drought and low water put a crimp in our racing activities, as did a couple of strong thunderstorms.

Then rains of epic portions came the week of September 9–13, alleviating our low water problem, turning it into a high water problem on the lake, and causing catastrophic flooding along the Platte River drainage and the foothills communities north of Denver.

On September 15, all boats in the lower parking lot were removed and sent up the hill to the middle parking lot, where we created a new, if temporary, Lightning row.

In the Summer Series, Team England took first place, Team Davis took second, and Team Dandy Lion took third.

In Summer Series Race #4, on August 8, we noted that in our memory we have never had a race where a thunderstorm passed directly over the lake—until tonight.

As boats were leaving the marina for the race course, some eyes were focused on a dark cloud mass to the south, but it seemed like it was moving away and was not going to be of much concern for racing. A lighter cloud mass to the north was obscured by the dam, and we did not pay attention to it. In hindsight, it might have been a good idea to follow it more closely.

The Race Committee had, in the meantime, set a triangular course and started the Lasers after only a slight postponement. While the next group of boats was setting up for their start, some of the skippers wondered about that lighter cloud to the north that now appeared to be headed over the lake.

New Lightning row



Just as the "P" flag went up for the second start, a bright flash in the sky overhead and a very loud thunderclap focused our attention on the possibility that we might want to head back to the docks. After a second thunderclap, RC signaled to abandon all races and head for shore.

Lightning #15228 was one of the first boats to break away, and as they rounded mark seven heading into the channel, it started to rain—and then almost immediately, to rain harder. And then it was like sailing under a waterfall, with a few hailstones thrown in for good measure. Lightning #15228 had dropped her sails and was drifting down the channel towards the bait shack when winds stated gusting in the 20–30 mph range. They were able to tie up and head for the patio under the Yacht Club deck and take shelter, and although sopping wet, they were unharmed by the ordeal.

Other boats making their way to the crane had to deal with the gusting winds with sails still up. All survived, although Curtis Rist's Finn gybed twice in wild succession, and Kurt Robinson's Laser, still out on the water in the lee of the dam, started planing on a waveless section of the lake.

The rain, thunder, lightning, and wind continued well past 9:00 PM, while skippers and crews secured their boats as best they could, with boats and people all cold and wet. Everyone made it in successfully, although two of the Lightnings opted to sail to the west launch ramp and haul out there.

That's how it sometimes goes in the Mountain West!

North Americans

In the meantime, three DSA skippers and crew headed out to the 2013 North American Masters' and Lightning Championships at Nyack, New York, and Westport, Connecticut.

Bill Cabrall packed up his boat on Sunday, August 11, and hit the road later in the week, meeting up with Raeyane in Cleveland and arriving in Westport on August 16. Christine Merritt, Bill's third crew, flew in on the 17th to complete the team. Jim England flew to Nyack this weekend to meet up with Bill Mauk to crew in the Masters',

along with Fleet 488 crew Rebecca Bevr- Rob Merritt headed out to sail as crew on another boat in the Masters' and with Bill Mauk in the North Americans the following week. Steve Davis flew out on the 17th to meet up with Brian Hayes to helm Brian's boat in the North Americans.

Bill Mauk placed 21st out of a fleet of thirty-two boats in the Masters'. In the North Americans, Bill, Raeyane, and Christine placed 13th out of a fleet of twenty-two boats in the Presidents Cup division, while Rebecca Bevrit and Rob Merritt, sailing on Bill Mauk's Lightning, placed 36th out of thirty-six boats in the Championship fleet.

Day 2 was a slightly cooler day, with clouds moving in gradually over the course of the afternoon, bringing us very nice southerly winds at 10–12 mph, with some lulls, but generally steady in strength and direction. The RC was on station promptly at 11:00 AM, got off four nice races and got competitors back to the dock before 3:00 PM.

As competitors were securing their boats and gathering around the kegs of Dry Dock beer, and while the scorekeeper was scoring and the protest jury was hearing, the clouds overhead thickened, and we knew that a cold front, bringing rain, was on the way. Pizzas arrived promptly at 4:00 PM, and we wolfed down slices of pepperoni and cheese pizzas. We finally gathered for a raffle drawing at 4:30 PM and started the awards presentations at 5:00 PM.

This year the Championship on Champions Regatta was sailed in Lightnings at Lake Murray near Columbia, South Carolina, the four-day weekend of October 24–27. The 2012 Lightning Youth World Championship was hosted by Lightning Fleet 456 at Tuusulanjärvi Lake Sailing Club, and it was an amazing event. It all started with registration and measurement day on Monday, July 23, when the teams all started to show up at the regatta and began to get acquainted with one another. Everyone was very friendly, and the competitors all got to know each other immediately. The teams were all extremely excited, as they were determining their sleeping accommodations for the next week. Some stayed at a hostel up the road from the yacht club, and some of the competitors were lucky enough to be put up in a club member's home.

The teams all arrived at the yacht club at around 10:00 AM, and we found out then which boat we would be sailing the first race. Every race, the boat each of us sailed switched, and we had to sign off on a checklist. Some boats were better than others. The boats' hull numbers ranged from about 14000 to some of the newest boats in the 15300s.

The first day conditions were cold, so people suited up in their foul weather gear. The wind was variable but got up to around fourteen knots, which made for some perfect conditions. The racing area was small, and the races were seven legs, with the start and finish in the middle of the lake. After lunch at the nearby hostel, we went out for our third race at around 5:00 PM. Unfortunately, we had a boat whose tanks had been filled during lunch, so our it was extremely heavy, resulting in a poor performance.





After coming in, we checked the tanks, and they were full of water, which granted us grounds for redress, which would be an average of our scores from the first two days of racing. The results were very close, and with six races left, it was still anybody's regatta.

That evening there was a volleyball tournament scheduled, but since the racing went on for so long, the tournament was moved to the following evening. All of the teams were exhausted from the full day and grabbed dinner before an early bedtime.

The night ended, and with five out of the eight races completed, and the competition was getting very fierce. There were a couple of protests that resulted in some changes to the scores, which altered the results slightly. There were still two days scheduled, but the forecast did not look promising.

The next morning the lake looked very flat, and the races were postponed until around 4:00 PM when the wind came up, and we all went out to the course. There was only one race in very shifty conditions, and we did not fair very well, but it was enough to maintain our lead.

There was a trip to Helsinki scheduled for the night, and that meant that protests were moved to the following morning, allowing for everyone to participate in the outing. The entire group journeyed by coach bus to the hotel, where we enjoyed a delicious buffet before trekking through the streets of Helsinki to our pickup location right in the centre of town. Overall, it was a very fun night, and everyone returned that evening to get a good night sleep in preparation for the final day of racing.

The last day was very similar to the previous and was dead calm upon arrival to the club. They postponed the race for the protests, even though there was no wind. The protests went on for a while, and at around 12:45 we all headed out to the calm lake to be prepared if any wind did filter in.

Our team was very nervous at this time since we held the lead by a small margin of 0.7 points over Timmy Crann. No race could start after 3:00 PM, so we were counting down the minutes. Eventually, in what seemed like forever, they called off the races, and the regatta was concluded.

The awards were fun and the trophies were exquisite. Many dignitaries spoke, as well as Ian Jones representing our club, the Buffalo Canoe Club, which is hosting the next Junior Worlds. After the awards ceremonies, the teams all said their good byes and parted ways.

A big thank-you to everyone who helped makes the regatta a success. To name a few people: Erik Hartman the regatta organizer, Sakari the person in charge of boats and his team, the entire Race Committee, all of the judges. Also thank you to all the competitors for making the event so much fun and very competitive, and congrats to runner-up Timmy Crann and his team.

Finally, a special thank-you to everyone who was supporting us at our club, as well as the people who devoted their time to help us: Debbie Probst, Larry MacDonald, David Stark, Jody Stark, Ian Jones and Kevin Robinson, as well as the rest of Fleet 12. Overall, the regatta was a ton of fun and the friendships that were made and the memories we shared will certainly last a lifetime. This past August the Lightning Class got to travel to Houston, Texas, for the annual North American Championship. It's a venue that has not hosted the North Americans previously, but the effort of the volunteers of Houston Yacht Club showed that not only were they ready for the event but willing and able to pull it off. As many of us who travel to numerous regattas over the years, I find it interesting to see how the locals make you feel during a regatta. To me, it's kind of a litmus test as to how much they really want us there. It's the simple things, like answering a question with a friendly smile or going that extra effort to listen and react to what people might suggest (ie., when Debbie Probst has a hissy fit because the water to the hose at the hoist was turned off—they quickly got it back on!). Houston Yacht Club members and volunteers gave it 100% for two weeks, and, speaking for the competitors, we all really appreciated it.

For us this year, it was a little different work up to the North Americans. Last year we spent a lot of time in the boat racing and practicing for the Pan Am Games last October. Once that event ended, we took some time to recover and recharge. We did not really have a game plan but knew that sailing in Houston was going to be special for us. It gave Jonathan and me a chance to see uncle Jay, aunt Teresa, cousin Taylor and Jill, all the while being able to

stay with them for the two weeks. We were lucky too, as Jill was leaving for college and the early start to the season on the women's soccer team at Boston College, so we got a chance to say good bye to her.

The first week of the North Americans was spent watching the Juniors'—Masters' and Women's teams too sail in their championships. This year it was Jonathan's turn to skipper in the Juniors, as the long line of the Schon/Lutz Lightning children program was nearing the end of the line. We've already had Wade, Matty, Taylor, Jason and now Jonathan skipper the Lightning, and unless my Julianne decides she is not going dance on Broadway, we are probably at the last kid! The conditions for the first week were unbelievably nice. Over the course of four days, I can't remember the last time I saw conditions be so nice for sailing (yes, even on the Jersey Shore!). As we all know, it's probably not a good sign for the second week, and, unfortunately, the conditions of the first week never materialized for the North Americans.

The practice day was a wash out due to storms, preventing me, Jay and Jonathan from even getting any practice time in. Practice? Are we talking about practice? When race day number one rolled around, my biggest concern was how many bottles of water we should bring to avoid dehydration and/or heat stroke! Since the fleet was smaller this year, there were no qualifying races, and every race was going to count from the get go. I know there has been some talk over the past years about including the qualifying races into the final series in some manner, and after sailing the regatta in Houston and getting in ten races for the championship, I have to say I am in favor of it. It seems silly to sail four qualifying races (usually over two days) and then wiping the slate clean and starting over.

Since the regatta was going to be a ten-race series with a throwout, we knew that consistency would win. Get yourself into the top ten, try to pick off some boats and hope for the best. Once we saw the weather pattern for the second week shaping up, we knew there would be some higher scores. Little did we know those high scores would be us in the first race! After rounding the windward mark in second, we gybed away and lost fifteen boats in one leg (Jay's fault by the way). Not a good way to start, but we were able to come back in the second race and win,



which got us in a better mood and stemmed the momentum from going the wrong way. Since Jay and I have been sailing together for a while now, we do often get asked how we handle the onboard dynamics, since Jay has always been a skipper with numerous championships back in the dark ages. Can two skippers (now three, with hot rod Jonathan!) coexist? For us, it's pretty simple. My job is to steer the boat as fast as possible and keep it in the groove longer than the boat next to us. Our advantage, or so I believe, is that I can concentrate 100% of the time on speed and not have to concern myself with looking around. Upwind, Jay looks around and helps position the boat based on fleet set up. Jonathan calls the puffs, both up wind and down and confers with Jay on the big picture scenario. Downwind, Jay flies the chute, and Jonathan and I look for breeze, clear lanes and shifts (except for Race 1—see above when I let Jay have one call downwind!).

As the week progressed, the scores were really close for the overall lead. Todd Wake, Allan Terhune, Matt Fisher were all sailing well and very consistent. Going into the last day it was anybody's regatta, especially since there were three races planned to get to ten races overall. After the dust settled on the first two races of the day, we had a few points on Allan, with Matt Fisher still in the hunt for the championship. As the last race developed, there was definitely some nail-biting time on 15166! Matt jumped out to a lead, with us around tenth and Allan a few behind up. Allan got by us on the run, and at the leeward mark, we had the only crew issue of the whole week—and it was a doozy!! Jonathan's spinnaker halyard got knotted on the drop, and we had to go upwind with the spinnaker about four feet off the deck. Jay did his best to control the sail, while Jonathan worked his butt off trying to get the knot out. What seemed like ten minutes was probably more like a minute, but, man, that was the longest minute of my life! Once we got

it sorted out, we were probably about fifteenth at the next windward mark, with Matt still leading and Allan a few in front of us. The run was more like a reach, and not much changes, so we knew we had to catch a few boats on the last leg to win the Championship. We got in phase to the right and worked hard to pick off boats. With about a quarter of the way to go in the leg, we were around tenth and knew that would be good enough to win. Playing it safe the last part of the beat, we were able to cross the line and win the Championship! Being able to share that moment with both Jay and Jonathan was a highlight I will never forget.

It's been awhile since the Championship in 1991, as Ched very nicely reminded me at the awards! We are far from the first family to sail together, so we can't be a poster child for that, but I can tell you when good things happen and all the stars align themselves and the two weeks turn out the way it did for our family, we are very lucky—lucky to be involved with a wonderful Class like the Lightning and the people that make it special. Lastly, what was my advantage? Simple, I had Jay and Jonathan.

Seeing the wind build was a good sign for our team, but knew we needed to sail fast and make good decisions. We were able to get the job done and couldn't have been happier as we crossed the finish line, finally getting our win as a team.

Lesson #4: There really is no "I" in team and the "me" doesn't count either!

I have come to believe that being a crew on the championship winning boat has similarities to being a crew on the last-place boat. Everyone enters a regatta, or a race for that matter, with a desire to win as a team. Each person there is competing as a team and does not want to let their teammates down. This puts pressure on each of us throughout an event. But the team that comes out on top is the team that is able to control the pressure they feel and focus on the racing. On our boat, we each have a job to do. While the skipper must focus on driving the boat, he/she needs the crews to help call tactics and focus on providing them with the details of the course around them. As a crew, I know that each detail I provide impacts the skipper's decision. This puts

pressure on the crew to make good calls. Having never sailed in Houston, I was continuously learning and hoping that my calls were improving. But we all know one bad call can jeopardize winning a regatta and push tension levels higher. Going into the last race of the event, we formed a plan and executed it well. But as we were sailing to the finish line with a nice lead, I couldn't let go of the feeling that "it's not over until we cross that line." As we crossed that finish line in first place, winning the regatta, I was able to take a big sigh of relief because we had accomplished our goal. Each person on the water feels the pressure, including the crew, because in my book, you win as a team, and you lose as a team.

The Houston Yacht Club did an amazing job hosting both weeks of North Americans. The club really came together to show us the best sailing they could with the conditions and classic southern hospitality. It was a hard-fought week of sailing, and we wouldn't have been able to do it without our competitors, so thank you ladies for coming to compete. I also must thank the Lightning Class as a whole because this Class is really unlike any other. One of my favorite Lightning Class traditions is the special flash for the winners of our biggest events; it was an honor to sail under a pink flash all week and to know we earned one too. Raise your sails with pride as you hoist your special flash—not only does it show your accomplishments, but it makes for really sweet pictures!

Friday

Die Europameisterschaft der Lightningklasse 2012 fand vom 29. Juni – 2. Juli 2012 auf dem Thunersee statt und wurde vom Segelclub Neuhaus-Interlaken trotz sehr kurzer Vorbereitungszeit vorbildlich organisiert. Trotz intensiver Bemühungen konnten nur noch 10 Boote für die Teilnahme mobilisiert werden: 5 Schweizer, 3 Finnen und je 1 Nigerianer und Grieche. So fanden sich doch noch 4 Nationen mit den Europameistern der letzten beiden Jahre am Start.

Nach der Vermessung vom Donnerstag und Freitagmorgen wurde die Meisterschaft mit einem reichhaltigen Aperio bei sonnigem Wetter eröffnet.

Freitag

Am Nachmittag konnte bei leichten Winden die erste Wettfahrt durchgeführt werden. Trotz einem starken Dreher auf der zweiten Kreuzstrecke konnte U Wyler den Vorsprung verteidigen und siegte vor A Perret und S Salminen. Der abflauende Wind liess keine weitere Wettfahrt zu.

Saturday

On Saturday, although the Race Director scheduled an 0800 start, there was no wind and, thus, no race. The afternoon brought a slight breeze and sunny, warm weather. The first race was finished on a shortened course due to shifting winds. Again, Urs Wyler finished ahead of the two Finns, Samppa Salminen and Kimmo Aromaa. After a short time, the wind died again, but we managed to get in two more races. Both were won by Urs Wyler, the first race ahead of Jacques Perret and Alain Perret, and second race before the 2010 European Champion Gary Schwantz.

In the evening, the official dinner was held at the Restaurant Neuhaus. Among other things, we discussed the weather. After beautiful weather with warm temperatures in recent days, a sudden fall in temperature bringing cold weather and high winds were predicted.

Sunday

And so it came about. After a night of severe thunderstorms and large amounts of precipitation, the day began with heavy rain and a strong wind of 4-5. All boats were able leave the port without any problems and sailed to the course. After the first leg, two Finns, Kimmo Aromaa and Samppa Salminen, led the field. Urs Wyler was third on the downwind leg, but was able to regain the lead. Kimmo Aromaa sailed hard but was second across. Samppa Salminen was third.

The second race on Sunday was exciting. This time, Jacques Perret led the field just ahead of Urs Wyler. It was a duel and was only decided at the last mark. Urs Wyler could not reach the center position, and Jacques Perret had a difficult maneuver because of a small error. The door opened and he passed Wyler. Salminen was third again. Because of the approaching storm fronts, a third race could not be run. Markku Paloma capsized but did not sustain any damage, and he prepared the ship for the next use.

By late afternoon, a happy hour held at the clubhouse.

Samstag

Obwohl uns der Wettfahrtleiter am Samstag bereits für 0800 Uhr aufbot, konnte am Morgen bei Oberwind keine Wettfahrt ausgetragen werden. Am Nachmittag konnte dann bei leichtem Unterwind und sonnigem, warmem Wetter gestartet werden. Sonntag

Und so kam es denn auch. Nach einer Nacht mit starken Gewittern und grossen Niederschlagsmengen begann der Tag regnerisch mit starkem Unterwind mit Stärke 4-5. Alle Boote konnten den Hafen problemlos verlassen und stellten sich der Wettfahrtleitung. Nach der ersten Kreuz führten die beiden Finnen K Aromaa und S Salminen das Feld an. U Wyler folgte auf Platz 3. Auf der Vorwindstrecke kam U Wyler an S Salminen vorbei. K Aromaa wehrte sich heftig und lag auch nach der zweiten Kreuz an der Spitze. Am Ende des Vorwindkurses konnte U Wyler die Innenposition geltend machen und den Lauf ganz knapp vor K Aromaa gewinnen. Dritter wurde S Salminen. Auch der zweite Lauf vom Sonntag verlief spannend. Diesmal führte J Perret das Feld knapp vor U Wyler an. Es kam zu einem Zweikampf, der erst bei der letzten Marke entschieden wurde. Monday

Jacques Perret experienced a strong gust which caused him to capsize, damaging the tiller extension. He sailed back to port to repair the damage. The Greek could no longer compete due to a large hole in his boat in the seventh round.

The first race of the day was won by Urs Wyler, who completed the downwind without a spinnaker. Gary Schwantz came in second before Samppa Salminen. We then immediately started the eighth and final round. The decision for the silver medal could still be undecided since Jacques Perret was able to compete again.

Urs Wyler managed a clear start-to-finish victory without a spinnaker. Jacques Perret and Samppa Salminen dueled fiercely. Although Perret came in ahead of Saminen, he had to settle for third place.

The championship was won by Urs Wyler and Gilbert and Walter Dürr with eight bullets.

The regatta ended with a beautiful rainbow over the area.

In the evening there was the final event. After a short trip by boat and cable car, we reached the low horn. The view we could enjoy only very briefly, then the fog enveloped the beautiful surroundings. The award ceremony and the subsequent fondue completed the successful event.

We thank the Sailing Club Neuhaus and Interlaken for the good organization of this event, and thank everyone who helped on land and water for the great work. Neuhaus and Interlaken was worth the trip!

Montag

It was sixteen years ago (June, 1997 in Montreal, Canada) when my team, Ian Jones and Jody Starck (then Swanson), won the Lightning World Championship, sailing with our good friend, Larry MacDonald. It was exciting to watch and witness them win the regatta. I remembered thinking, "gosh, I'd love to feel what they are feeling....winning the world championship." Well, my dream came true last month, June, 2013, on Lake Trasimeno at Club Velico Castiglione in Italy. And I was lucky enough to be on the winning boat with my friend Ian (we call him YA) and my wife, Jody.

We arrived in Italy and had the pleasure of traveling for a few days prior to arriving at the regatta site. Like most week-long regattas, we saw a little bit of everything. What I remember the most, however, were the incredible views of the hilly countryside and surrounding area. Worlds for the ILCA, I had high hopes for a top-notch championship, both on and off the water, and the Italian Lightning sailors and their committees exceeded all expectations. I have appreciated them sailing with me more than I can ever express!!

We have no regrets, just fond memories of Chile, Vermont, and Brazil. Make no mistake—winning the 2013 Lightning World Championship was the best. We will cherish the victory forever. However, spending time with family and friends, especially Lightning friends from around the world, meeting new people, and sharing new memories is what it's really all about.

If you have never been to Italy, I would strongly encourage you to go. It is a beautiful country, rich in world history, fine wine, and incredible people. When you are there, look up our fellow Italian Lightning sailors. They will welcome you with open arms, pour a generous glass of wine, and make you feel at home.

We look forward to welcoming everyone to the 2015 Masters and World Championships at our club, Buffalo Canoe Club. We hosted the 1973 World Championships and can't wait to have everyone back in 2015. See you there!

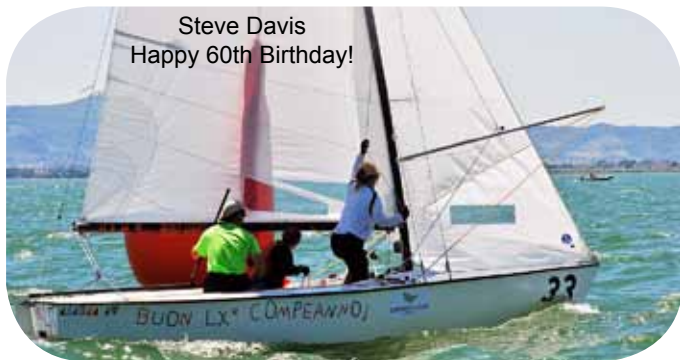

International Masters' & European Championships

Club Velico Castiglione, Castiglione del Lago, Italy

June 3-7, 2013

Champions: Ched Proctor, Jamie Ewing, Jay Lurie



After deciding to compete in the Worlds in Castiglione del Lago, Italian, Jamie and I discussed options for the European and International Master Championships. Since our normal forward team member, Meredith Killion, didn't feel she could take the extra days off work and isn't old enough to get us to the required 130 years total to qualify for the Masters', we had to find an alternate team mate to qualify for that regatta. After a few inquiries to likely candidates, I asked our fellow Cedar Point Yacht Club member Jay Lurie. We were talking summer sailing plans after a cold Sunday of Laser Frostbiting. I asked if he'd be interested in taking a week to go to Italian. He said he'd consider it. I have to say I was surprised when he called Sunday morning and said he had researched the location and timing and was in. So Jamie and I sailed the European and Master Championships with Jay Lurie filling in for Meredith Killion to get us up to age. Jay and I come close to making the age by ourselves!

The practice day set the wind expectations pretty low. There was a bit of a local thermal right off the club that might have reached four knots at most. But out in the Lake where the course needs to be set, it was pretty dead all day. The attempt at a practice race was eventually abandoned. With a noon start time for the first race on Wednesday, we sailed out to the lake in the morning thermal only to see it die and cloud cover move in. We had been trying to figure out what would generate raceable breeze in this beautiful spot.

It took us until the end of the first day to appreciate what generates the wind on Lake Trasimeno. After sitting and waiting for wind for a long time, thunderstorms developed

on two sides of the lake. We saw enough lightning bolts to make us a bit nervous. When it appeared logical that the committee would send us ashore, they hoisted an L (follow me) flag and headed further out into the lake. The thunderstorms skirted the lake and a wind filled in from the north at 6-9 knots, and Race 1 commenced.

We started about a third of the way down the line with a fairly nice hole below us. We sailed most of the way to the left layline before we had a clean lane to tack into. Tito Gonzales had started nicely to weather of us and was moving well. Dave Spira, sailing with Randy Shore, had a nice start to leeward of us. About two thirds of the way out to the left hand layline they tacked on a lefty and ducked us and Tito but were easily across the rest of the fleet to the right. We chose to keep going, as we didn't want to duck Tito.

We seemed to be moving nicely on the boats to our left and felt in danger of losing out to boats on our right if the wind went more right. We saw what looked like nice pressure to the left and decided to use it as reason to continue until we were close to the port tack layline. When we tacked to port, Tito couldn't quite cross us and tacked ahead to leeward. I think he wanted to give us space figuring this was a practice regatta, for the Worlds, and wanted to test speed against us more than he wanted to stuff us. We figured he probably wouldn't be so nice next week.

We were in a little more pressure and worked to weather and gained on Tito. At the starboard tack layline, Tito ducked Dave Spira, and we crossed easily and tacked around the weather mark in the lead. The offset leg was very long for an offset, and we set soon after rounding to sail



pole on the head stay to the offset. The wind seemed to be to the left of the course axis, so we jibed right at the offset. The run was a fetch, and the boats close behind stayed low, and we had a pretty easy time extending our lead to the leeward mark.

On the next beat we tried to cover most of the fleet as best we could. Cristobal Perez rounded the leeward mark probably third to fifth behind Tito and Peter Hall. While Tito and Peter played the middle, Cristobal continued all the way to the left corner. When we came back together at the top, he was bow to bow with us and tacked under, forcing us back to the right. We were able to get him to duck us at the top mark. As it turned out, he had been over at the start and failed to recognize his number called on the radio.

Understanding the recall numbers on the radio was quite difficult in both regattas. The course for this race was the shorter one, with a leg down to the left gate mark, looking downwind, then a short reach to the finish line. We again jibed right at the offset, and no one challenged to weather. We were able to extend our lead and win the race.

Race 2 was held right after Race 1. It was getting late since Race 1 was started sometime around 1600. This was to become the pattern for the two regattas other than the one day of the Worlds when we had three races.

The raceable wind comes around 4:00 PM when the thunderstorms build up. At the time of Race 2 the thunderstorms were moving off to the south and pulling the wind with it. The race started with the leeward end significantly favored. The fleet pretty much tacked right over to port. We were somewhat conservative on the start, being further up the line. We succeeded in getting out on port tack before the left end of the line rolled over us.

Peter Hall seemed to have the best start off the left end and tacked across to lead at the first mark. He was able to lay it without tacking to starboard. There was significant chop in the water that favored being able to keep the bow down, jib eased fully to spreader tip and jib lead forward. We were in about tenth place at the weather mark. Actually, the offset had become the weather mark, as it couldn't be laid with the left shift that occurred right before the start. We picked off a couple on the beam reach with spinaker to the leeward mark by holding a little high early and taking advantage of any inattention to trim and heel angle while reaching.

For the third leg (this was a five leg course with the final leg as a beat to weather with the finish set in the middle of the leg) the weather mark was moved to the left but not nearly enough to make a true beat. We took a move to the left for pressure and ended up over standing the mark

and losing two of the boats we had passed on the reach (run?) leg. The breeze strengthened to about 15 at the start of this leg and pretty much held for the rest of the race. Jamie felt it seemed to be following the thundercloud around. The next fetch leg was good for getting a couple of boats back. Felipe Robles passed Peter Hall by tacking to port tack right around the gate mark and pretty much laying the finish line. We pulled off a fourth, second master, which felt pretty good in such a screwy race. Positions were largely determined by being able to tack right off the line.

Race 3 and Day 2

We had a great day on Thursday. Having taken time to get to writing this, the memory of what happened has become a little fuzzy in my head. I went back and found the internal report Jamie wrote for our team and supporters. I don't think I can add a whole lot of detail, so I will just quote Jamie.

"The left paid today. We did a decent job of collecting, finishing 1-1.

After many hours of onshore postponement, then a couple out on the lake, we started our first race at 4:30 PM in about seven knots out of the ENE (070). The remnants of a thunderstorm to our north-northwest was the only real idea for breeze we could ascertain, so we decided to start well and work left.

As it turned out, there was both real pressure on the left lay line and a slight lift, and it was one of those days where further worked better. With the long tack on port, we found a lane just shy of the layline where Ched was able to really work the boat in the chop. We led at the first mark by about eight boat lengths over Tito Gonzalez and just defended the left for the rest of the four-leg race, winning by about ten boat lengths.





Over the course of the race, the breeze built slightly and worked further left by about ten degrees. More importantly, there was simply more pressure on the left (north) side. In retrospect, and given both the geography and the late hour of the day, it might be worth speculating that we were catching the edge of a local down thermal off the mountains to the north (the right/south side of the course is marsh and plains, with less thermal energy). That they were under cloud and rain for a while abets this thesis.

The second race was more difficult. The left had been established, but the marks had not been moved, meaning one approached the port-tack layline very quickly off the starting line. With a slight boat favor, we decided to work the mid-line to have the ability to tack at will. We started with speed and were soon able to tack at the right moment. Holding until we were about five degrees shy of the layline, we tacked onto port (another 10 degrees higher now—holding 080-090 versus 090-100 in the first race) and ground out through the chop, which was still orientated towards the earlier, more right, breeze.

One Chilean boat (bow 07, Cristobal Perez) got a little further out to the left and rounded a couple of boat lengths in front of us. On the run, we made the mistake of soaking low to cover the boats behind, when the fast path was to stay with the waves. While we held second, the Chileans gained about five boat lengths on us by working the waves. On the second rounding, we followed them in a clear high lane out to the left, tacking about ten degrees shy of the layline. We took advantage of a slight right oscillation to cover most of that remaining left space about 2/3 of the way up the beat, and our boat speed ground us back into contention.

We rounded the third mark about two boat lengths behind them. On the second run, we stayed high and worked the waves, eventually catching them to the outside and rounding right behind, but slightly above, the Chileans. The next pack was about fifteen boat lengths back. With a

short leg and fleet of spinnakers approaching, we tacked immediately to get on the long port tack and, more importantly, hold starboard on the finish approach (the final leg was much shorter than the prior ones, only about 1/3 mile). In the end, we had both better boat speed and a better lane (they got hit by the chutes coming downwind), and we crossed without needing the starboard advantage. We ended with another first, and it felt great to grind into it and apply a little U.S. college tactics to close it out..."

Day 3

With a "No race may start after time of 3:00 PM, it seemed doubtful we'd have wind to race on the last day. With an on shore postponement displayed, we waited at the club while the usual harbor thermal doing the usual tease. At some point the onshore postponement was removed, and we went afloat. The thermal gave us enough to sail to the start area but no more. The cancellation for day's racing was signaled to end the regatta, and tow made up to return to the club. We declined the tow in favor of a leisurely sail around in the harbor thermal and enjoy the beautiful countryside.

The regatta started in very similar conditions that we had in the Q series. We knew we still had a lot of work to do, but if we kept working would be able to get to where we were.

The first beat was very even, and at the weather mark boats from all sides were close. We rounded in 9th, and then we had our first break through of the event. We had a spectacular downwind and rounded the leeward gate in 4th. This was the turning point of the event for us; it seemed to give us confidence back and a little “pep in the step,” so to speak. We finished the race in 3rd with a new outlook and a much better feeling.

The second race of the day was also similar to the Q series. We were heading right and looking OK, and then the left started to work. 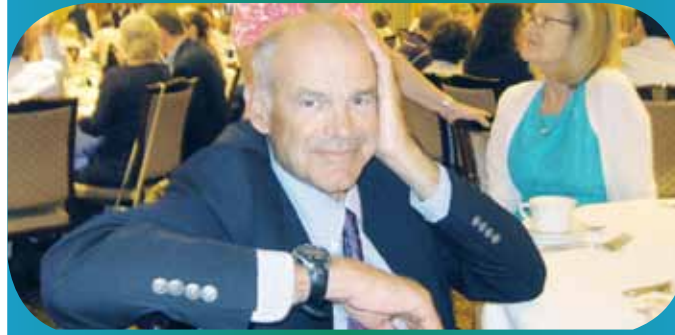

WJM North American Championships

Nyack Boat Club, Nyack, New York

August 14 – 17, 2013

The largest Women's, Juniors' and Masters' Lightning North American Championships in the last ten years took place on several unusually cool, clear, crisp days August 14–17 at Nyack Boat Club. Unfortunately, the Women's division was not sailed due to lack of entries.

With a long history of holding major championships with national caliber racing for Lightnings, Thistles, Sonars and Ensigns, NBC graciously hosted 57 teams: 21 Juniors (under 20), 31 Masters (55+) and 5 Classic teams (wood or glass boats built before 1974). Juniors had strong representation from the Buffalo Canoe Club with twelve teams. The Masters' included many familiar names: Hallagan, Hurban, Proctor. The Classic Rally, held in honor of the 75th Anniversary of the Lightning Class, included hull #2, possibly the oldest actively competing non-keel boat.

Rare for August, there was too much wind, 20 with gusts to 22, for Wednesday's practice race, although PRO Judy Hanlon tried to kick one off. Back on shore, competitors were

welcomed by NBC Commodore Kieran Quinn and co-chairs Bob Sengstacken and Eric Kent, who'd been planning the event for nearly two years.

Three very competitive races took place Thursday afternoon. Conditions tested competitors with lots of position changes on each of the four legs of each race. Several noted how challenging the Hudson River current was. John Boynton, hull #2, remarked, "On our sail to nowhere. We were able to sail our spinnakers for over an hour—but barely travel few miles in the current. It was fantastic!"

The downwind finishes were so close that the Race Committee burned the midnight oil ensuring they got the results correct. Ched Proctor, his son Charlie and Debbie Dudas as crew, led the day with two bullets and a second.

Postponed on shore Friday morning, participants perused 75 years' worth of Class yearbooks and enjoyed other activities organized by International Lightning Class Association Executive Secretary, Laura Jeffers, and NBC's Jan Crittenden. Without winds over four knots, sailing was abandoned for the day. Masters' North American Championship

I had a great time sailing the Master North Americans at the Nyack Boat Club. The Hudson River always produces a challenging combination of current and wind to make the racing interesting. The close proximity of the race course to the club helps to make good use of the time on the water. You don't have to spend a lot of time sailing to and from the starting area. All the racing took place on Thursday. PRO Judy Hanlon was VERY smart to run three races on that day. Although Master's events typically do not race more than two a day she recommended departing from this convention at the Wednesday evening competitors briefing. The master's skippers unanimously concurred. It was very prescient.

My team for this event was Debbie Dudas and my son Charlie Proctor. Charlie starts his senior year at Tufts this fall. He is majoring in Engineering and sails on the Jumbo's Sailing team. The three years of college sailing have helped him to become an accomplished sailor. The scheduling of this regatta allowed for Charlie to participate. It was between the end of his summer employment and return to the busy schedule of academic studies and sailing team activities. Debbie has sailed many infrequent events with me over the last 30 years or so. She claims I only wanted her for her age to get myself and Charlie up the required 130 years. But she is a pleasure to sail with too. They were a perfect team.

The sailing was very similar to a short college course type of racing. The wind was post frontal from the North West. Since it was coming off the shore it was oscillating through about 30 degrees. The Juniors started before us. We had plenty of time before the first race to evaluate the course options. The Juniors had three general recalls. The average wind direction favored the pin end of the line, but the position of the weather mark combined with the ebb tide pushing across the course to the left, made it likely that you could run out of race course on the left very quickly. All three races seemed to have this feature to a degree. Consequently, Charlie advised trying for a start that would have a strong likelihood of enabling an early tack to port.

The first two races we were able to execute this plan fairly well off the middle of the line. We were able to tack fairly soon in the first race. We lead all the way around the course. The first downwind was starboard jibe favored which made it easy to defend our lead. The last downwind to the finish was more challenging. The wind went into a down strength phase and came back with a Northerly component. Jim Crane rounding the weather mark in second, started to eat into our lead as he brought the breeze down with him. The next group of boats held the South breeze and kept Starboard jibe for a large part of the leg. With the feeling of breeze to the left, breeze to the right, the question was how do we get it here in the middle so we could get to the finish before the fleet overruns us? We got a little of the South puff in time and were fortunate to hold on for the win of the first race. The second and third races of the regatta were run right after the first.

Although we won the second race I do not have a good memory of the details. I'm sure it was eventful as the wind shifted several times. In the third race, we started poorly and had a challenge to work back to finish second behind Dick Hallagan. That's the great thing about racing on the river. If the course is set well, there are always opportunities to gain and lose. Friday we never left the dock as we waited all day for breeze. Saturday we had a light west wind. It was only enough to get in part of a race before it was abandoned. The juniors were able to stretch what little wind there was into one race before completely dying.

My hats off to the Race Committee, the Nyack Boat Club and of course my excellent teammates of Debbie and Charlie. It was a great time being able to sail with them both. See you all next year in Sheboygan!

2013 South American Championship

Antofagasta Yacht Club, Nyack, Antofagasta, Chile

October 30 – November 3, 2013

Champion: Tito Gonzalez

Teams began arriving, and the last boats were delivered from central and southern Chile on Tuesday, October 29. By Wednesday all participants were with their boats, armed and ready to compete in the practice race that was scheduled for 14:00. Due to a postponement, the practice race didn't start until 16:00. Twenty-six teams from five countries were happy to be on the water!

Day 1

On Thursday, October 31, racing began for the 2013 South American Championship in Antofagasta, Chile. Racing was scheduled to begin at 13:00 hours. The wind cooperated with gusts around twelve knots and, there was a lot of chop on the water. These conditions succeeded in turning over some boats. The course had to be modified once or twice, delaying the races.

But all this did not stop the racing. The Race Committee succeeded in completing three races. Even with a change of course on the last windward leg of the day bow 28, "Flecha" Robles, Pablo Lorca and Andres Guevara were able to win their second of the day, to end the day on top with six points. Immediately behind them was the team headed by Tito Gonzalez, who ended the day with a 1, 4, 2, for a total of seven points. The Herman brothers and Nadja Horwitz, bow 14, traded with the top three and ended the day in third with eight points. Just two points separated the top three teams. The forecast for Day 2 was calling for winds of ten knots with gusts to fourteen from the southwest with three more races scheduled.

Day 2

The fourth race of the championship, and first day, started promptly at 13:00 as scheduled. Anxiety gripped the fleet, causing two general recalled starts. A third was successful under the yoke of the black flag. The winds were consistent, with gentle breezes of ten knots accompanied by a low tide. The tide was scheduled to come in all afternoon. Francisco Perez and team won the first race of the day. The Colombian team of Gustavo Tamayo won the second race and was followed by the Chilean team lead by junior skipper Gary Castillo, who finished second. As the day wore on, the third and final race of the day brought winds with gusts to fifteen knots. The wind and current generated large waves at the windward mark.

A fierce struggle between the top two places remained. Team "Flecha" Robles remained on top by winning the final race of the day and also posting a 4, 3 earlier in the day. Team Gonzalez remained in second position after posting a 2, 13, 2 for the day. The Herman brothers and Nadja Horwitz remained close with finishes of 3, 4, 8. With six races completed, a drop race was factored in.

One point still separated first and second. Fierce competition was also alive from 4th to 10th place, again with few points between these positions. With only two races remaining, the last day of the championship was sure to be exciting once again. The wind was expected to be lighter at seven knots and the sea still providing chop for the sailors to navigate.

Day 3

The last two races were hand-to-hand combat to see who would take the title between the crew of El Doctorado with Felipe Robles at the helm and Ojo de Lince lead by Tito Gonzalez. The wind took a while to appear and settle. In both races, the race began and had to be modified on the third leg. The waves continued to batter the course, and the wind did not exceed eight knots, making the day especially complicated for some crews.

During the first race tempers were hot. After a general recall, the black flag was raised. But this was not enough to stop the boats and turned to make a general call, this time, without allowing the boats run out ahead. Six boats were caught and scored BFD, the leaders all starting clean. During the first upwind leg, a small pack capitalized with some favorable wind on the right side and then to avoid a cargo ship that was in the middle of the field with the wind shift. These seven boats were able to tack and make the mark with a sufficient advantage to the rest of the fleet. El Doctorado with Felipe Robles led throughout the race. Despite the efforts of Tito Gonzalez and his crew, they finished in second place and needed to put three points on Team Robles to move ahead in the final race.

The second race started after a few mark changes. This time, there were also a few boats over early, but all returned and started properly. The wind shifted and thanks to a good start by Ojo de Lince, they kept extending their lead on the fleet to win the final race. A controversy at the first mark of another boat that was positioned between Gonzalez and Robles definitely influenced the overall positions. Robles and company struggled to stay close enough to Gonzalez and finished fourth in the race, one point shy of taking the cup.

The top three positions went to Chilean boats, first Team Gonzalez with 14 points, second Team Robles with fifteen points and third Team Herman with twenty-six points. The fourth place went to the Brazilian team led by Claudio Biekarck.

Antofagasta Fleet 520 did a wonderful job preparing for this event. It is great to see such strong efforts underway in Chile and South America!
