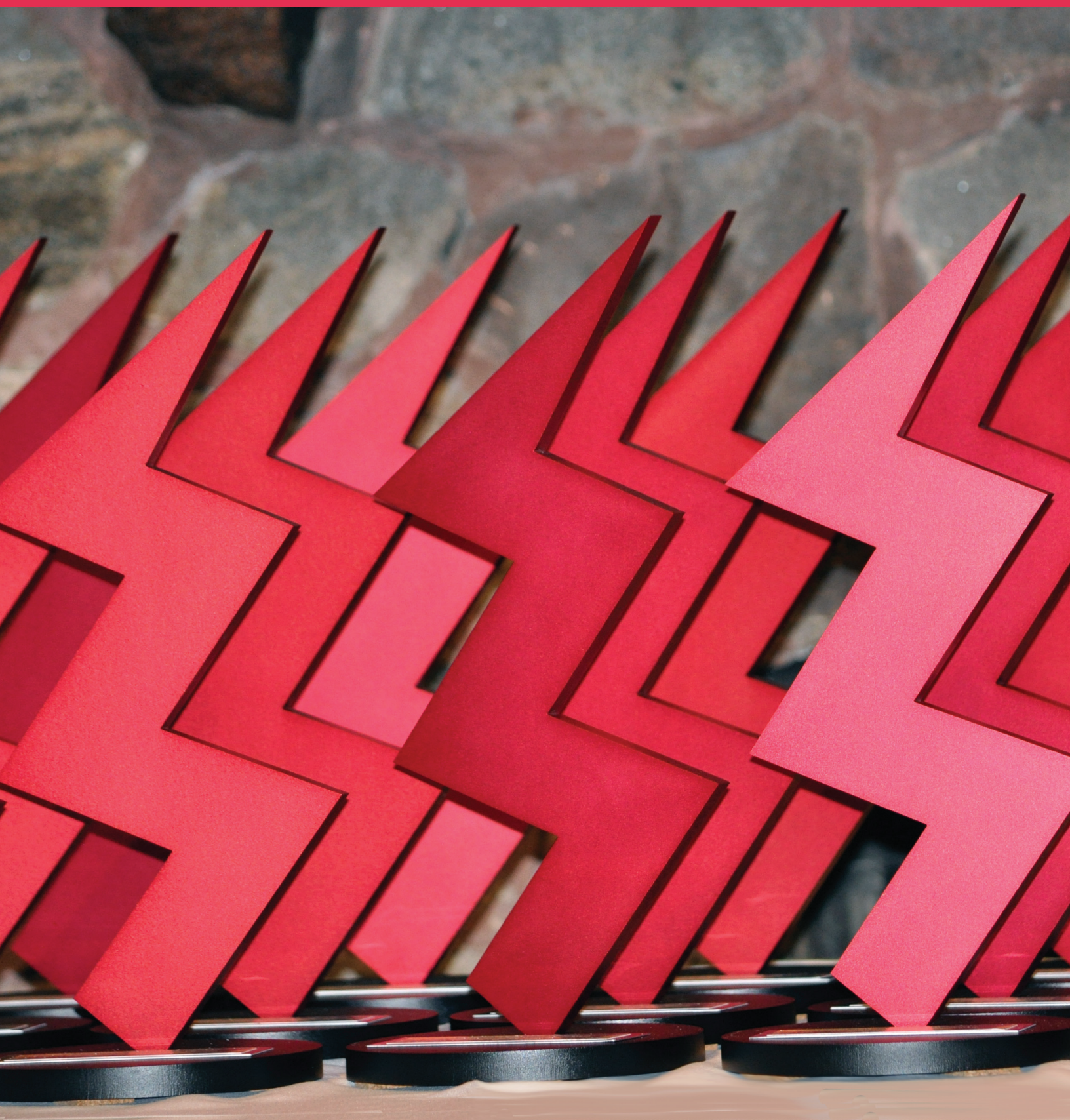

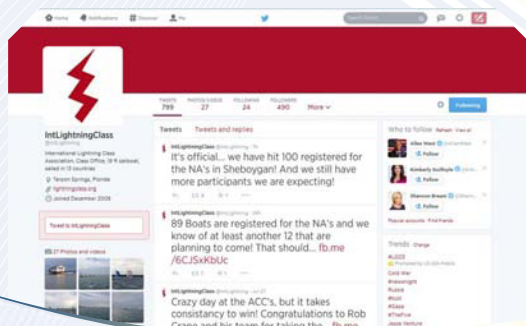
version of Flashes are distributed via e-mail to all ILCA members: Active, Associate, and Crew. Paper copies are available for an additional fee.

Sailing for me started very young, on our family Highlander and progressing through Optimis, Sunfish and Lasers at Cowan Lake in Southwestern Ohio. The fierce competition and camaraderie amongst the juniors on Sunday afternoons was always the highlight of my week. My love for this sport and the people it attracts is deeply rooted in Cowan Lake Sailing Association and the incredible volunteers there.

Junior Sailing led to four years on the University of Michigan Sailing Team and meeting fellow Wolverine Jody Swanson. What followed has been twenty-five years (and counting!) of sitting next to Jody on J-24s, J-22s, and 470s. HOW MAY GIFTS BE MADE DURING YOUR LIFETIME?

Gifts of Cash: A gift of cash during a person's lifetime is the simplest type of gift. These can be made in person or anonymously, directly or on behalf of another person. Gifts within a year are deductible from that year's income taxes. You may send a check to the ILCA at any time or include an extra amount of money in the renewal form when you pay your membership every year.

Gifts of Marketable Securities and Investment Real Estate: Gifts of appreciated securities and real estate held for investment purposes are often more beneficial to the donor than gifts of cash. When such items are donated, the donor receives a contribution deduction equal to the current market value of the security and, generally, the excess of the market value over the donor's cost basis is not taxed. Often it can be advantageous to donate substantially appreciated items than to sell them and pay the capital gains tax.

Gifts through Wills: Remembering The ILCA in your will is another method of giving. Such a gift is deductible in calculating estate taxes. Provisions for the gift may be included in the body of the will or by adding a simple codicil. If you desire to establish a separate memorial gift within either the ILCA Fund or the Limbaugh Fund, or to specify the purpose of the gift, this may be done by so stating in the provisions of the will.

Gifts of Boats and Equipment: You may consider donating your boat and equipment to the ILCA, thereby helping make them available to newcomers. You can deduct the fair market value of your donation from your

income or estate taxes. It may be more advantageous for you to give the boat to the Class than to sell it. The Class has the procedures in place to facilitate making this important gift.

2014 PAST PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE

The teams race hard and are serious on the water, but they are just as serious about cracking smiles and beverages once the racing is over and it's time to share the day's stories. There was no greater pleasure than conversing with former World champions, North American champions, and Olympians while waiting out a wind delay, or having a few bratwursts at the Sheboygan Yacht Club. The Lightning Class treats it's members, whether blue fleet or yellow fleet, with equal respect and we were so impressed by how many members approached our boat daily at the North Americans simply to lend a hand or offer advice to us. We truly look forward to giving back to the class and guiding future boat grant recipients. GAY GAMES 9

The Gay Games was conceived in 1980, a time when organized sporting events were not very welcoming to lesbian, gay, bisexual or transgender (LGBT) athletes. The idea was to make an international sporting event that paralleled the Olympics but was open and welcoming, not only to LGBT athletes, but also those LGBT allies who were willing to compete. The principles behind the games are:

Participation – Inclusion – Personal Best

Like the Olympics, the Gay Games hold its competition every four years. The first was in San Francisco in 1982 (GG1 & GG2). Since then, it's also been held in Vancouver, Canada (GG3); New York City (GG4); Amsterdam, Netherlands (GG5); Sydney, Australia (GG6); Chicago (GG7); and Cologne, Germany (GG8). Sailing has been part of the Gay Games since Sydney in 2002.

GG9 was hosted in Cleveland and Akron, Ohio, in August, 2014. The sailing venue was Edgewater Yacht Club (EYC). The original plan involved racing keelboats with four-person crews in two divisions: Recreational (jib and main) and Competitive (spinnaker). The Recreational Fleet is for people who sail but don't normally race, whereas, the Competitive Fleet is for those who normally do race. The commitment from the supplier of the boats didn't work out, though, so the organizers decided to race the Recreational Fleet using the Tartan Ten Fleet at Edgewater, using jib and main. Finding another boat for the larger Competitive Fleet was a bit more difficult. One of the organizers, Cheri Morabito of EYC, reached out to Bill Buckles, who was able to arrange for twelve Lightnings to be available for the games! Since some teams of four were already registered, the decision was made to race the Lightnings with a crew of four.

I grew up on Clifton Lagoon, across the Rocky River from the Cleveland Yachting Club in Lakewood, a west side suburb of Cleveland. I can remember seeing the Lightning NAs taking place out my front window in 1974 and 1979. Although I lived there, I had a neighbor who raced Tartan Tens out of EYC, beginning in 1978.

I learned to race there. I was away from the sport for a couple of decades with college, then career and family, but found the Corinthian Sailing Club (CSC) in Dallas and Lightning Fleet 35. I bought a Lightning in 2004 and have been racing ever since. I met a lot of you at the Lightning 70th Anniversary Regatta in 2008, where I sailed with my spouse, Teresa Richard, as forward crew and my cousin Suzi Conroy, who crews on keelboats at EYC, as mid.

A chance to race my favorite boat at the place where I learned to race with my family and friends? I Wouldn't Miss It!!!

Sadly, the GG9 schedule conflicted with the first week back to school, so Teresa, who is a teacher, couldn't come with me to Cleveland. I recruited my cousin Suzi and still had two slots to fill. Ando Jones, whose brother is L. James "Jamo" Jones, captain of Lightning Fleet 4 at Delta Lake, New York, answered a post I had put out on the Lightning Class mailing list. I needed one more person to make Team Lightning Bug complete.

Meanwhile, Heather Stewart was trying to put together a team under SFST, the San Francisco Sailing Team. Heather has competed in sailing at every Gay Games since Sydney. With the deadline approaching, we decided to merge teams and became SFST, Team Lightning Bug.

Suzi's only time on a Lightning was in the light winds at 70th. Ando had a little time on Jamo's Lightning. I towed my Lightning from Folsom Lake in Folsom, California, down to Oakland and spent a light air afternoon with Heather and another of the SFST teams. We'd spent a lot of time on email, working out how we'd planned to race a Lightning with four on-board. The first time we had the team of four together was in Cleveland. I'd skipper, Suzi would be tactician/mid, Ando was port forward, and Heather was starboard forward.

The opening ceremonies were on Saturday night, August 9. Unless you've been in an Olympics Parade of Athletes, there's nothing to compare with marching into an NBA arena with 10,000 other athletes from around the globe! There were contingents from all fifty US States and fifty-nine other countries. Some of the biggest cheers were for teams from countries that just being at the games was a courageous act, such as Russia, Malaysia, and a few of the Middle East countries. There were welcoming speeches from the Federation of Gay Games, the Cleveland/Akron organizing committees and politicians, such as U.S. Senator Sherrod Brown, and a video message from President Obama. There were also several entertainers, ending with a full show by the Pointer Sisters.

Sunday brought us to EYC for the skippers' meeting, followed by a blender party. This was the first time all the teams got to meet each other. At the skippers' meeting we learned how we were going to swap boats between the races. There were twelve Lightnings, but thirteen Competitive teams registered, so each race one team would get a bye and wait it out in the RIB that was used for the boat swaps. The score for the bye would be the average of the rest of the races.

At the blender party, I met Greg Wallace, skipper for team Alice is a Princess. He's from CSC in Dallas and normally sails a Laser, but he had gotten a little Lightning time, care of Clarke Newman and a few of my other Lightning friends from my time in Texas. All the Lightnings had arrived from around the Ohio and Michigan area, and Bill Buckles and his team had gotten them all rigged. I got recruited by Cheri Morabito to help label all the controls, as it turns out that I was the only regular Lightning sailor amongst the whole group of competitors.

Bill Buckles was scheduled to host a Lightning Lab on Monday morning, so we all got there early to learn what he had to say about trimming the Lightning and to go over the rigging.

Monday was a grey and breezy day, with winds in the high teens and gusts just over twenty or so. The plan was to get a practice race in then come back to the harbor to do the boat swaps, then back out for a second practice race and the first race of the regatta. We were about a minute out from the first start when we got to exercise the procedures for a boat failure. For some reason, the jibs did not have a wire installed in the luff, so they were just attached by the halyard at the head and the jib cloth control line at the tack. Our jib cloth parted, and the jib shot up the mast! We hauled it onto the deck by the sheets, as the start went off, limped over to the committee boat and were directed back to the dock. We got there about the same time as the rest of the fleet, who had full sails. The weather was getting uglier, so they called the rest of racing for the day.

Tuesday was a little breezier than Monday. The second practice race and the first three qualifying races were scheduled. We got out after some bands of weather blew through and had our second practice race, then the first real race got going. We came in behind the New York Knicks team, led by Geoff McKnight. They'd gotten some Lightning sailing in by borrowing a boat for the spring and racing in the Metropolitan District. Next came the team from Toronto, led by Tomasz Debowski. The Naiads, a team of women who came from the North Coast Women's Sailing Association, led by Betsy Yingling, managed to pass us on the last leg and finished only a couple boat lengths ahead. We were pretty happy about being 4th across the line in our first race! We headed for the docks for lunch and to swap to the next boat. We found out the Australian team, led by Dale Collings, had the bye. Dale was the gold medalist at Sydney and placed well at several previous Gs, so we expected that their average score would be pretty high.

After lunch, we were scheduled to head back out for two more. We got out on Lake Erie and headed for the course. At one point, we tacked and were facing Avon Point fifteen miles west. There was the most beautiful squall line out there heading straight for us! A few minutes later, they blew three horns and flew Abandon, so it was back to the dock with no racing for the rest of the day.

Tuesday night was spent with a screening of 07-07-07, Amorita's Unlucky Day" (see the trailer on YouTube). Amorita is NY-30 number 9, designed by Nat Herreshoff and launched in 1905. It is owned by Jed Pearsall and Bill Doyle, who led Team Newport. We learned of Amorita's Cleveland connection and also of the horrific accident that sunk her, followed by her recovery and restoration. An Amazing Movie!

The Tuesday storms really churned up the lake. We were all directed to launch but wait behind the breakwall until instructed. The committee boat tried to get out, but the Lake Erie chop was running around six feet, so they gave up. We got called back to the dock and it was looking pretty bleak. The organizers were able to work some magic and get permission to run the races in the wide area behind the breakwall off the east end of Burke Lakefront Airport. It was big enough to put in about a half mile course. After lunch on Wednesday, we took a beautiful five-mile reach across the Cleveland city front in about forty-five minutes. We then got in three more races doing, three-lap windward/leeward races. EYC had also made arrangements for us to leave the boats at docks at the Lakeside Yacht Club, near the course area, overnight. We got in a shuttle van to get back to EYC.

We got five more three-lap windward/leeward races in on Thursday to finish the qualifying series. Although I had more Lightning time than any other competitor, it quickly became clear that the true advantage went to the teams that had the most time sailing together with at least half the crew. Dale and Ian, who sail regularly together, added two more to make their team, 2 Aussies, an Israeli, and a Buckeye. They were definitely the rock-stars, with one second place and the rest bullets. Team Newport, the Naiads and Team Honey Badger were all close behind. Honey Badger was Cindy and Tom Einhouse with Anne Nolan and Jay Marshall from EYC who regularly sail together—a group of four amazing allies. We were a lot farther down the list and made it to the finals—but only just barely.

The finals were three more three-lap windward/leeward races on Friday morning. The winds were finally settling down to the mid to low teens with gusts in the upper teens. We were finally in weather we could deal with. We were racing a lot better, but it was too late to really climb the ladder much. Another gorgeous reach back across the city front to EYC, and we were done. We'd done fourteen races in five days, all of it in heavy weather with several more outings that didn't end up in a race. We were tired, but all of us loved the experience.

In the end, the Aussies won the gold, with Newport taking silver. Bronze went to the Naiads, but only after resolving the tied score with the Honey Badgers.

We all had an amazing time and made friends from all over the world—some outstanding sailors among them. This was the first Lightning experience for many of them, and I heard many who thought highly of the boat. I'm hoping to get a chance to see many of these folk again, perhaps at GG10 in 2018 which will be held in Paris!

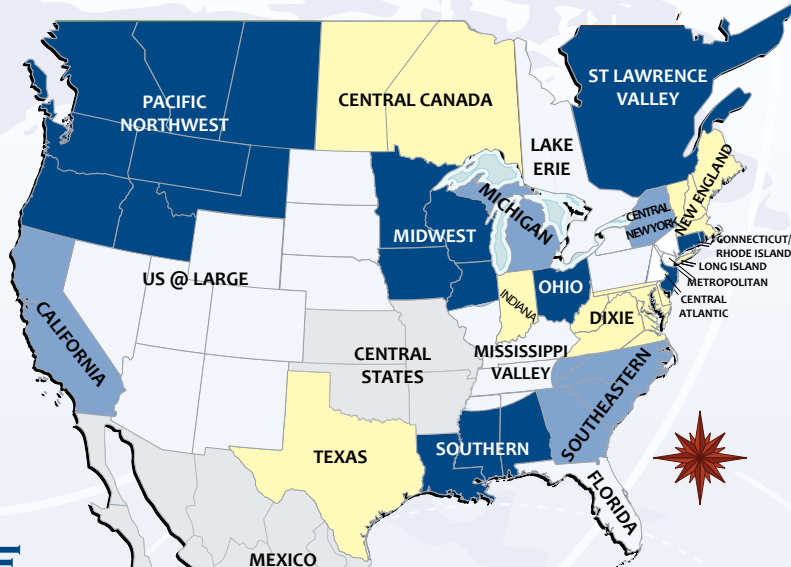

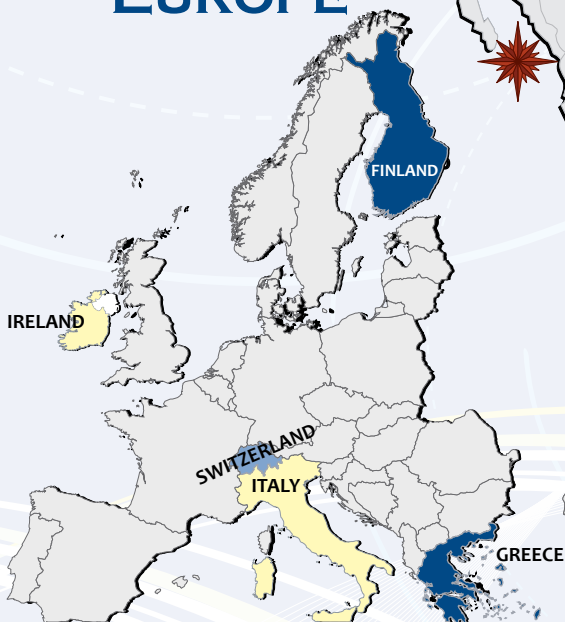

With much desire and effort, competitive boats have begun to assemble. Old and new Allens and Nickels are again competing in the Río de La Plata and lakes inland of Argentina.

In the month of May, the San Isidro Labrador international championship took place in Buenos Aires, which formally began in 2014. Thirteen very competitive boats were at the starting line..

Other championships, including the Armada Argentina, Luis Cerrato and the championship Laguna de Setúbal in the city of Santa Fe, helped significantly in improving the crews and reviving the Class here.

At the end of the year, the National Meeting of the Lightning Class Argentina took place in the city of Córdoba. It was organized by the local Armando Trivero, owner of a wooden constructed Lightning —by himself!

In December, five Argentinean crews took part in the South American championship in Salinas, Ecuador, where Argentina secured a place in the Toronto 2015 Pan American Games. Nicholas Fracchia, Maria Paula Salerno and Gonzalo Pollitzer were second. Twenty-seven boats and seven countries were classified.

A very demanding schedule has been set for 2015 that includes an annual Grand Prix, which will run on inland lakes and the famous Río de La Plata in Buenos Aires.

Racing in shifty breeze with cool temperatures, Metedeconk sailors Keith Taboada, Russ and Chris Schon were 4th and Mitch Hnatt, Ryan Stagaard, and Tara Schon-Rudd finished 6th.

The 30th annual Spring Classic at Pymatuning Yacht Club was sailed on May 17 and 18. With storms on Saturday and lack of breeze on Sunday, only one race was completed, with MRYC's Jonathan Lutz with Nick Sertl and Allie Jones finished 21st in the only race.

Jonathan used the event at Pymatuning and the Lake Erie Districts, where he finished ninth out of thirty-six, to prepare for the 2014 Youth World Championship at the Buffalo Canoe Club. Chris Schon, with Aaron Husak and Haley Kardek, joined Jonathan in Canada for the Championship.

Team Lutz and Team Brazil battled throughout the Youth Worlds. Going into the final race, the Brazilians held a one-point lead over Jonathan. To win the Championship, Jonathan needed to put a boat in between him and the Brazilians or have the Brazilians sail a race worse than their current drop race, an eighth.

At the first windward mark, Team Brazil led, with Jonathan in second. By the leeward mark, Jonathan had taken the lead but still was looking for a boat to finish in between him and the Brazilians. Showing he learned something during his freshman year on the nationally ranked St. Mary's College of Maryland sailing team, Jonathan went into match race mode to try to push the Brazilians as far back as possible.

With the two boats minutes ahead of the other boats in the fleet, Jonathan stalled out Team Brazil for long enough to bring the rest of the fleet back into the race. On leg four of the five-legged race, Jonathan had pushed both himself and the Brazilians into eighth and ninth place, which was nearing the lucky number for Jonathan to give the Brazilians a new, worse drop race.

Unfortunately, it was just not meant to be for Jonathan's team, as the Brazilians escaped Jonathan's trap by the final leg and won the race and the regatta, with Jonathan, Nick and Allie finishing second.

Chris, Aaron and Haley finished 15th in the highly competitive twenty-four-boat fleet.

A historical Metedeconk connection to Jonathan's feat was that his bow woman, Allie Jones, is the granddaughter of lifetime MRYC member, past Commodore and founding member, James Daley. Daley was a former Lightning sailor himself,

whose children grew up sailing in the Metedeconk junior program during the 1970s.

Jonathan was able to become the fourth Lutz family member to finish top three at the Youth World Championship, following in the footsteps of his father Jody, brother Jason, and cousin Taylor. Jody won the event in 1980, while Taylor was victorious in 2008 and Jason finishing third that same year.

At the New Jersey Junior State Championship in July, Chris Schon, Haley Kardek, and Aaron Husak beat out eight other boats to claim the title. The Metedeconk team narrowly beat out Rebecca Huyard's Surf City team by a single point. Chris becomes the fourth Metedeconk sailor to be named New Jersey State Junior Champion in the past five years, joining Timmy Crann (2010), Jason Lutz (2011), and Jonathan Lutz (2012).

The 2014 North American Championships were held in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, at the Sheboygan Yacht Club in August. In the Women's Championship, Laura Jeffers from Tarpon Springs, Florida, with MRYC's Johanna Schon was crowned the champion of the event. Both Chris and Teddy Schon skippered boats in the Junior Championship, finishing seventh and tenth, respectively.

The Open Championship saw more than one hundred boats register, the most since over seventy-five boats sailed in the 2010 New Jersey NAs. In the championship division, Jody Lutz, Jay Lutz and Julianne MacDonald finished fifth overall in the tightly contested fleet. With the entire top ten separated by just twelve points, Team Lutz was only six points from winning the event. Greg Fisher, Jo Ann Fisher, and Zeke Horowitz from Mount Pleasant, South Carolina, took the title. It was Greg's first title since 1990, setting a new record for most years between victories (14 years), previously set by Jody Lutz in 2012 (11 years). Jody's fifth place finish qualifies him for the World Championship, which will be held in July 2015 at the Buffalo Canoe Club.

The New Jersey State Championship was held during the second week in September with Tim Robinson from Surf City winning the event. Mitch Hnatt and Keith Taboada finished second and fourth, respectively.

At the increasingly popular Wild Oyster Regatta in Charleston during late October, Jody Lutz with Jason Lutz and Jo Ann Fisher finished fifth in the sixty-one-boat fleet.

Manuel Gonzalez Barjacoba—1924–2014

Manuel was a longtime Lightning sailor and a key person in the growth of our Class in Chile. Though he has not been active in the Class recently, the family has been well represented by his son Tito Gonzalez and grandchildren, Diego, Alberto,



Jr and Trinidad. Also, his son Manolo sailed Lightnings for twenty-seven years. He was a great teacher, as both of his sons have won at least one World Championship.

Mañungo started to sail on a Lightning around 1960 at a National Championship at Algarrobo Yacht Club, when all the boats were launched in the beach. According to Tito, Lolo Melero won that regatta. His first Lightning was called Pixie, a wooden boat made in Chile. A couple of years later, everybody brought boats made in Argentina. He sailed on his Lightning called “Segundo Aire” (Second Air). He taught his children to sail on a small dam in Champa and then on Aculeo Lake.

Manuel was lucky to participate at the World, European, South American and national levels. He was at the Worlds in Finland, both the 1995 Worlds, Argentina, 1969, Pucon 1982, among others. He later sailed at the Masters Worlds in Miami in 2003 with Tito and Jay Lutz as middle crew. One impressive anecdote is that during the 1991 NAs in Newport, he suffered a heart attack in the middle of a race, he was hospitalized for two weeks in the US. The only nationals he won was in the late 1970s with Manolo and Tito as crew.

The Madison Beach Club enjoyed another fine summer of racing in 2014. Of equal note was the growth in participation by young club members from our Optimist and 420 fleets, who both helmed and crewed in many of our races and speak to MBC's focus as both a competitive and family-oriented fleet.

The summer of 2014 will be remembered as one of significant parity and tight racing. Erin Riley, a past winner of the club's summer series, took ownership of her own Lightning, #14765, and with husband Matt set about a refit that brought a very strong fourth boat to the course on several weekends. Josh Gleason took the helm of the venerable yet ever-fast Rosie,

Nick Chobor, another MBC 420 team graduate, also joined the Fleet and with his father made huge strides in getting performance out of Lightning #11113. Tight starts, frequent lead changes and close finishes were the norm and as the season advanced, no one boat proved dominant, keeping the racing all the more enjoyable.

After a warm first weekend of series racing, a reprise of spring in the form of a blustery, wet northerly, made July 4th a bit of a "shakedown" sail for our first trophy race, the Baylis cup. Tim Millhiser coolly won the day, followed by Farrell then Riley. The crew in Rosie was more than rusty in the unseasonable weather and retired early after taking too many cold waves on the chin.

As July, progressed wins were notched by all three contenders for the series lead, while the hunt for regular, experienced crews also heated up. We were annoyed about the \$25/night parking charges at Breezy Point, and so drove up to Chesapeake Beach but found the ramp there on the wrong side of the bridge over the creek. Back to Breezy Point, we got a bit of a break from the lady at marina.

Stupidly, we did not have the mainsail unrolled and the halyard attached as we motored out of the marina. We were too focused on getting out the channel. The waves were steep and short at the exit, which made rigging the mainsail tough. It was a cloudy morning with nice moderate Southern breeze. We left the marina at 11:00, passed south of Sharp's Island light at 12:00 or so, passed the south entrance to Easton Bay at 1:00, rounded corner into Choptank at 14:00, tacked up Choptank, and arrived Cambridge at 15:30. It was sunny and beautiful now—moderate temp and low humidity.

On the way up the Choptank, we passed La Trappe Creek on the left where large sailboats were anchoring around the point. The locals call it Dividing creek.

Cambridge harbor has few public docks on the water and no sailboats, so we were a bit nervous about finding a place for the night. We found two docks just to the west of Marsh Place city park that had a ramp out on a small point. Jim went ashore and talked to a family, who came down to check us out. He said we could camp on the lawn.

Cocktail hour was gin and tonics and purple passion. Sesame almonds and TJs Wisconsin sharp cheese were popular. Dinner was Joyce's beef stroganoff, rice, and sweet peas. Bill's added marinated shitake mushrooms. All were delicious. Gina's oatmeal cookies for dessert, crispy and yummy. We eat well!

Day 2



Woke at 6:50, left Cambridge at 11:00 arrived Oxford at 13:30. Perked coffee and Gina's quiche for breakfast.

Day was hot and muggy on land. Motored past the yacht club and up the channel into Cambridge. Tied up on a sea-wall next to a private condo complex and walked into town. Stopped and admired an Episcopal church where

the service was just ending. Went in to admire the sun streaming in through the stained glass window.

Had a pleasant sail to Oxford and tied up at the Tred Avon Yacht Club. Highlights from the walk about town:

Highland Creamery: I had Peach, and Chuck also had the Coffee Heathbar. They would only sell bottled water.

Next stop, Schooner's bar: The deck was hot and the Oktoberfest seasonal from Sam Adams went down quickly. Waitress brought us a full pitcher of water!

Then on to Cutts & Case Shipbuilders: Met Ed, 58 years old, who taught Bill a few things about setting the knives on a power planer and reminisced about a couple of parties from the old days.

At the Club the waves from the big boats going up and down the Tred Avon were bad, and the floating docks only partially blocked them. With permission from Rud, the Vice Commodore, we moved out boats to the dinghy area.

Cocktail hour: The club's liquor license prohibits taking alcohol from the dock to the land or vice versa. So we had cocktails and appetizers on the dock. The swimming felt great.

The Club was having a dinner, and we stood at the bar and socialized with the very nice folks, many of whom had sailed Lightnings.

Jim had sailed here for his Labor Day Cruise thirty years ago, and they let him pitch tents on the yacht club lawn, but the new law wouldn't allow that. Day 3

Left Oxford at 9:30, arrived Breezy Point at 14:00. Got home at 17:00. Woke at 7:15. It started to rain again during breakfast. We sat out the rain under the club's veranda.

When it stopped, the SW breeze was light but sailable. We tacked out of the Tred Avon. The wind went very light. We started motors at 11:00 and motored for about fifteen minutes until we reached a wind line of a nice steady SW breeze. We sailed a course of about 270 to 260.

The domes of the Naval Observatory a few miles north of the marina gave us a general reference point, but we did not have a good visual landmark to guide us into Breezy Point itself. It turned out that two shiny roofs just south of the entrance would have been good reference. We used the GPS coordinates off of the chart, and that got us pretty close. GPS had us sailing about six knots.

It rained during the drive home. So we timed our sail very well.

For our newly found Feet, 2014 truly looks like a miracle. Although the Lightning Sailing Academy has been conveying the art and joy of sailing to people of all ages since 2002, it was in the Worlds in Italy in 2013 that things really took off. After a meeting with the board of the Class and the representatives of the European countries, the idea of funding boats to Greece came out. The idea was simple: funding four boats that are going to be send to Lightning Sailing Academy in order to revitalize Lightning activity in Greece.

From this point on, a lot of people gave their best to make it happen! The board of the Class, donators, volunteers from Greece and the USA worked together, and there it was, on March 13, four boats landed at our Yacht club. Needless to say, the boats were sailed almost the next day. Imagine the joy you get after finally having something you want and dreamed for twelve years!

Practice makes perfect, but what if you have someone like Kimmo Aromaa, multiple times Finnish champion and national coach, to teach you? So on April 26–27 we had the first Lightning Clinic at our club. More than twenty athletes attended the seminar, which ended with a short race and Kimmo pointing out where we should focus until the Europeans in the summer time. Thanks, Kimmo, you are the best!

After the Clinic, it was evident that people got excited. They got excited so much that another container with four boats was prepared and sent to our yacht club. One of the boats, the newest in Greece, was donated by Lauri Hemming, VP and VP Europe, so it would be easier for Finnish crews to join us and sail with us. This way Finnish and Greek crews can develop their skills further.

On May 10–11 our Fleet travelled north to Pireaus to participate in the Greek Navy annual regatta, which so far was the only regatta with Lightnings. Twelve boats lined up at the start, and six of them were from our Fleet. Results do not matter so much, but we managed to secure third place, as first and second were “occupied” by Lightning European champions Angelos Vasilas and Dimitris Gerontaris.

In June, the second container arrived, and four more boats joined our Fleet. These boats came just in time, as the preparations for the 58th European Championship were well underway. Our club, the Nautical Athletic Club of Voula, and the Yacht Club of Greece joined forces to make this event a success.

Some weeks past and on July 13, in the bay of Voula, the practice race for the European championship took place, with twenty-one boats at the starting line—a record-breaking number for European standards. Four teams from Finland, one team from Australia (Ian and Lindy Edwards and Laura Jeffers), and one team from Italy. Among the participants were four former Lightning European champions and one Olympic medalist. This event boosted our Fleet and the Lightning

Class in general, as we saw old and new athletes eager to participate and request more events like this.

During the event we had the opportunity to hold the annual European meeting to discuss the development in Europe and in Greece so far. We also talked how other countries, such as Italy, can benefit from the know-how developed. The regatta ended with an offshore fun race that included swimming in the clear blue waters at the nearby island.

After summer vacations, in September we organized our third open weekend named, “Can you describe the feeling of freedom?” which was a big success. Marketed through our Facebook page and with the word of mouth, nearly sixty people came and took a ride with the experienced members of our school. The result was that ten of them joined the beginners group.

On October 28, which is a national holiday, our club traditionally organizes a mini, off-shore race, so we took the opportunity and seven Lightnings with mixed crews of beginners and advanced sailors competed against fifty off shore boats!

There is no better way to end this year other than having a race! So our last event of the year took place on first weekend of December, with sixteen boats, forty-eight athletes of all ages, and five clubs competed in light winds. Lauri Hemming joined us with his family, so it was a good opportunity to meet with the representatives of all Lightning clubs in Greece and get organized for the next Europeans and schedule for more regattas next year.

2014 was another successful year for the Pontiac Yacht Club, located on Cass Lake in southeast Michigan and home to the largest Lightning fleet in the world. We have enjoyed that distinction for many years, but we never rest on our laurels. To create this legacy of success, we have a well-tested recipe. We start with competitive racing twice a week on Sunday mornings/Wednesday evenings, pour in top competition, including past national and Worlds top five finishers, mix in an incredibly well-organized, all-volunteer operation, and swizzle it all together with an idyllic setting and strong bonds of friendship and camaraderie. It's a perfect sailing martini.

I grew up sailing Thistles but had been away from one-design sailing for over twenty years. A relocation to southeast Michigan brought me in contact with PYC. I heard of "25 boats on the starting line" and thought, "yeah, right." I assumed that was a typical sailor's embellishment (the wind was blowing at least 40 knots—the seas were at least fifteen feet high—you get the picture). Less than a month later, I was at the helm of a gently used Lightning and pleasantly surprised to see, yes, twenty-five other Lightnings on the starting line for a normal Wednesday night race. Twenty plus boats is the norm for our Wednesday evening series.

In 2014 PYC scheduled eighty regular series races, plus an additional twenty on our special regatta weekends—Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Club Championship. Even with Mother Nature at times having her own plans, we were able to get off seventy-eight starts. A tip of the hat goes to Geoff Nelson and Rick Dishaw, who both sailed fifty or more of those races in 2014.

We had thirty-nine different boats competing throughout the year. Of those, sixteen different individuals won at least one race. The competition is broad and well developed, and there was plenty of sailing available for all in 2014.

PYC hosted the annual Whitecap Regatta the weekend after Labor Day and welcomed boats from across our District and beyond, including an international entry, David Sprague, who joined us from Toronto. Against stiff competition, Ryan Flack, a PYC member whose young age belies his many years of involvement with PYC and Lightnings, took home the honors. Ryan, whom many of you may know from his active leadership role with Nickels Boat Works, is a tireless supporter of the Lightning Class at PYC, across our District and beyond, and for his efforts was also awarded the PYC Sportsmanship Trophy.



There is an active junior sailing program and an adult sailing lessons program, both supported by a nonprofit sailing foundation. Our junior champion was Sam Monique, followed closely by Brandon Warner. PYC also hosts a successful varsity high school sailing program for Detroit Country Day School, a nearby private high school.

Beyond our shores, the PYC Fleet also supports the broader Lightning Class. We had seventeen PYC boats travel to away regattas this year: PYC boats participated in every Michigan District regatta but one, plus the North Americans and several other "beyond our district" regattas, such as the Nashville Bluenose and Charleston Wild Oyster. PYC was well represented in the Michigan District Hi Point Championship, which combines finishes from all sanctioned Michigan District regattas, where Jim Allen took home 4th and was joined in the top ten by Ryan Flack and his brother Bobby Flack.

From the above narrative and the nearby photos, courtesy of Phil Matora, photographer par excellence, you can see that 2014 was a great year at PYC, and it set yet another brick in the foundation on which rests this great Lightning Fleet.

On a sad note, 2014 saw the passing of Dave Closson, the last of the original members of Fleet 332. Looking at the Fleet's perpetual trophies, Dave's name first appears in 1962, when he tied for the Fleet Championship and shows up for the last time in 1996, when he won the Custance Trophy for the annual, long distance Around the Lake Race. This event was his specialty because his sideline career as a tour boat captain, showing sightseers, bird watchers, and bridal parties around the lake on his beloved inboard woodie, *Puffin*, armed him with inside knowledge that allowed him to slip safely through tight passages between centerboard-killing granite rocks. He won the race one year by tacking through Utopia Passage, which is buoyed as a channel about twenty feet wide. Through all these years, Dave was a consummate sportsman, modest in victory and quick to congratulate others when they prevailed. The photo submitted with this report is a perfect view of the way we will always remember Dave. The *Puffin* is moving fast, bow planing high out of the water, against a back drop of the lake and mountains that Dave knew so well.



Dave would be pleased to know that 2014 was a surprisingly good year for Lightning sailing up in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. Even though Fleet members found that family obligations and work opportunities drew them away as far as China during the summer, Fleet Co-Captains Art Cunningham and Will Abbott organized a full season of racing. We sailed on seven days and completed twenty-one races.

Things started a little slow, with three boats on the water July 6 but quickly gained momentum as more people showed up for the summer. We saw seven to ten boats every weekend after that. A combination of the tricky conditions on Squam Lake and some very good sailing kept most of the fleet in the hunt in every race. Of eleven boats that sailed at some point in the season, five won at least one race, and two others had at least one second place finish.

Garr Corcoran sailed very consistently in all twenty-one races, winning five times and never falling very far off the pace, and won the July Series, the August Series, and the Season Championship. Dwight Gertz won the annual regatta in August and the Pop Closson Bowl, named for Dave's father, which is awarded for the best finish in the last three races of the season. Nathan Cunningham won the award for the best record by a junior skipper.

The Around the Lake Race, always a complicated affair, was nullified by the protest committee as the result of a protest against the Race Committee for altering the course in a confusing manner while the race was underway. There was no rational way to award redress in the light and shifty conditions that prevailed, so the next chance to claim Dave's throne as the master of the Lake's eccentricities will wait until next year.

Although we really focused on our Fleet racing this year, three boats found time to travel. Garr Corcoran went to the Leaf Peeper in Burlington and the Bow Lake regatta. Dan Egan went to the Atlantic Coasts and the New England Districts. Art Cunningham, with fellow skipper Pat MacQueen as crew, also went to the Leaf Peeper.

We finished off the year with our annual dinner at the Squam Lakes Association clubhouse, re-elected our officers in recognition of their stellar performance, and vowed to return to Golden Pond in 2015.

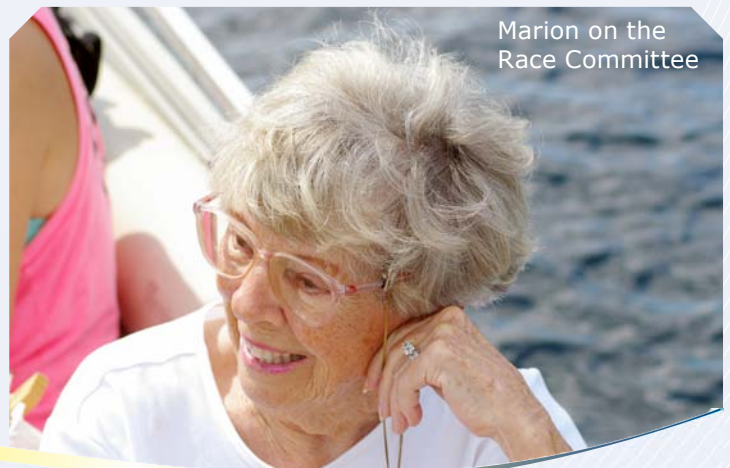

Greetings from Lagos Nigeria. Fleet 510 had a great year, with a few more races scheduled in December. Due to the year-round warm weather and the favorable conditions for sailing, the Fleet, in conjunction with the Lagos Yacht Club, had sixty-five races scheduled in 2014. We did have some rain-outs, but the Fleet sailed nearly sixty races in 2014.

On any given Saturday, there are typically eight to fifteen Lightnings and three to five Tarpons racing in a combined fleet of around thirty boats. Tarpons are very similar to Lightnings, the main difference being they are wood, considerably heavier and have a Genoa instead of a jib.

Participation was highest in the Nigerian Nationals race held at Lagos Yacht Club, with twenty-five Lightnings sailing over two days on May 24 and 25. Mike Barnes, our Lagos Commodore, and his crew won the event, which was sailed inside the Lagos harbor and immediately offshore. As usual for Lagos, winds were moderate in the 10–15 knot range. Mike, one of our more experienced Lightning sailors, proved once again that excellent sailing skills and good reading of tidal currents are key to winning races in the Lagos Harbor Area.

Racing also took place in the waterways, locally referred to as creeks, immediately inland of the beach and west of Lagos. This makes for interesting sailing, with numerous small rural fishing villages along the creeks. The villagers are very friendly, often waving to the racers as they pass by.

The longest race of the year took place in the creek. This race, The Badagry Cup, is a Lagos tradition and a two-day 130-kilometer-long race with the crews sleeping on their boats. Five Lightnings and two Tarpons participated in this grueling but rewarding event. Nolan O'Neal and his crew won the Badagry Cup with the shortest sailing time of less than sixteen hours.

As usual, the Fleet was thankful for the fair weather of the Lagos Area and the excellent support from the Lagos Yacht Club. We were especially thankful for the effective response of

the Nigerian government and community to the small number of Ebola cases present in Lagos in late summer as the result of a traveler from Liberia.

Nigerian based sailors look forward to another busy racing schedule in 2015, and a few teams are planning to represent Nigeria in the Lightning Worlds in Ottawa during July.

Between sunset and moon rise, it got really dark, and once I accidentally sailed off into the weeds until Suzanna aimed the flash light at the compass, and I was heading due north (see middle of map 4). Right before Badagry we saw a dredger with a pipe going underwater towards the shore. I saw it too late and I said, "Hang on, we will probably hit something." BAM! Up popped the center board and rudder, but we were able to keep on sailing and were the first ones to round the mark in Badagry.

Since 1932, the Lagos Yacht Club has held the Badagry race almost every year—except during the civil war. It is one of the longest dingy sail boat races in the world, where competitors sail from Lagos Yacht Club to Badagry and back. My GPS recorded that we traveled almost eighty-five miles in a little over twenty-four hours. Suzanna, Ian and I set sail on our nineteen-foot Lightning named *Kiwi Magic* at 11:00 AM on Saturday morning.

We sailed through Lagos harbor into the wind and very strong current. We ran aground in the harbor when I tried to sail around an ship at anchor. Up the creek, past the Mobil beach house, where I took a wrong turn. Lots of tacking, where I regained the lead. Past Whispering Palms where the sun set, and I sailed into the weeds. Hit the dredger pipe and was the first boat to the turning point.





We hoisted the spinnaker, which is not easy in the dark with an inexperienced crew, and ghosted back towards Lagos for a couple of hours before the wind died and we put out our anchor. The full moon came up, and we enjoyed looking up at the stars. After sleeping for a few hours, a couple of boats passed us, so we picked up anchor and sailed on, until the wind died again. We stopped until the sun came up.

Around 6:30 AM, we raised our sails and continued on to the Lagos Yacht Club, alternating between the spinnaker and jib the whole way back. It was a beautiful morning. As we passed small villages, children came out and waved and sang to us. The winds were light, but that was OK, because I was both helming and flying the spinnaker, often reaching with the spinnaker, for about five hours.

Suzanna got real good at setting the pole and even gybing the spinnaker by the time we reached the harbor. Lagos harbor is pretty, uh... pretty scary...

These are homes in the harbor where you will find children swimming in the water.

We were the fourth boat back to the club, but this is an interesting race. When you anchor, you can stop your race clock. When you pull anchor, you start it again. So the way to win this race is to anchor when the wind is low and wait for it to get strong. We were tired, and since I was helming and flying the spinnaker, we chose to sail when the winds were light.



The winners were announced a week later. Ian won the LYC plate for being the youngest crew member. He was really brave, sailing in the dark through the jungle in a third world country. I don't think I would have been that brave when I was nine. Suzanna received the Rear Commodore's Trophy for best female effort. *Kiwi Magic* came in 3rd over all. Next year I will not make any wrong turns, not hit the dredger pipe, anchor when the wind gets light and wait until the wind picks up. Next year I plan to win!

Of all my experiences here in Nigeria, this race is my favorite by far. Sharing this experience with my wife and son will be one of my most cherished memories. This is not something that Suzanna typically would enjoy, but she did it because I needed a crew member, and Ian really wanted to so. Thanks Suzanna and Ian for the wonderful weekend!

Fleet 488 End-of-2013 Season Banquet, January 25, 2014

Twenty Fleet 488 members and guests met at the Aspen Room of the Heather Gardens clubhouse for a most enjoyable evening of socializing and dining, along with a short business meeting. We particularly appreciated the potluck contributions, especially those from the Cabralls, who brought two kinds of Lasagna, using Bill's mother's favorite recipes, and from the Tabers, who brought an exquisite mushroom sautéed chicken main dish. We gave special thanks to Evan Morris, who helped us arrange use of the Heather Gardens facility.

At the business meeting, Fleet Captain David Thompson gave a presentation listing the highlights of the 2013 season, and Bill Cabrall won the Fleet 488 Championship perpetual trophy. David was re-elected to his third year as Fleet Captain, and Jan Davis was re-elected as Fleet Secretary.

Among the highlights of the 2013 season were the participation of Steve Davis and David Spira in the World Championships in Italy; Bill and Raeyanne's wedding on September 7; and David Spira's participation in the 2013 Championship on Champions, sailed in Lightnings, with Philip Ryan and Rebecca Espinosa on board.

2014 Lightning Southern Circuit

Twelve Fleet 488 members arrived in Florida on March 15 to take part in the 2014 Lightning Southern Circuit. Teams Cabrall (Bill, Raeyane, and Christine) and Thompson (David, Norm Jarvis, and Lori England) brought their boats; Jim England and Rob Merritt crewed for Bill Mauk of the Coral Reef Yacht Club; and Steve Davis helmed a boat brought to Florida by Brian Hayes in Miami, and in turn crewed for Brian in St Pete. Rebecca Bevit crewed on Rochester-based Dick Hallagan's boat. Barb Thompson and Jan Davis provided shore support for the Fleet 488 team.

In Miami, Team Thompson placed 50th out of 53; in St Pete they placed 55th out of 57; and in the Masters in St. Pete they placed 28th out of 30. Overall, for Miami and St. Pete combined, they were 45th out of 46.

They were not last!

In the Circuit overall, Bill Cabrall and crew placed 42nd out of 46;; and Bill Mauk placed 20th out of 46. Dick Hallagan placed 25th. Steve Davis placed 18th out of 53 in the Miami Midwinter Championship.

Team Thompson had some bad luck, ripping their chute in Miami and breaking their main halyard in the last trace in St. Pete. Fortunately they had a spare chute to use for the remainder of the races.

Winds were higher than usual in Miami, in the vicinity of 15–20 knots on days 1 and 2, and 20–24 knots on day 3, the result of a front passing through just prior to racing that day. The rock stars at the front of the pack all described their various tech-

niques for gaining speed as they surfed down the front sides of the four-foot waves; Teams Thompson and Cabrall just focused on keeping their boats from capsizing. They succeeded, even as others went over during downwind gybes.

Winds in St. Pete were as they have been in years past—enough to run the first race on a 10:00 AM start, then dying off for a few hours before a sea breeze filled in. There were three races completed on day one, and only one race completed on days 2 and 3.

As always, it was an enjoyable circuit for the Fleet 488 participants.

2014 DSA Thaw-out Series April 5–May 3

Early spring weather on Cherry Creek Reservoir is not always the best for sailboat racing, and that held true for 2014. With water temperatures in the 40s and sometimes gusty winds, we raced in just three of the five Saturdays in the series. The last race day of the series was the best, weather wise, and four Lightnings came out that day: teams Quest, Blue Two, Dandy Lion, and Quintessence. The weather forecast had called for a high of 82 degrees with westerly winds at 8–11 mph, and that's what we got, except that winds died back considerably in the second race, making for a slow and painful beat up to the finish line after rounding the last mark.

Team Quintessence won the Lightning division in the series, with Bob Stoller at the helm for all the races of the series.

The Thaw-out Series also served as the debut for the relaunch of Norm Jarvis' Lightning #11457, purchased by Evan Morris last fall, and repainted over the winter a bright chili pepper red, and renamed *Lil' Peppa*. Unfortunately, Evan was not able to race her in the series, but he proudly unveiled her on April 5, the first day of the series.

2014 DSA Shootout/Hornblower Regatta, May 17–18

Five Lightnings came out for the regatta and thus were able to fleet. Teams Quest, Blue Two, Dandy Lion, and Davis were joined by Bob Stoller's North Star to make the five. Team Quest sailed with Bill and Raeyanne, and Keith Martenez on Saturday, and with Christine on Sunday; Team Dandy Lion sailed with Lucas and Carter, and with Nate on Saturday and Garrett on Sunday; Team Blue Two sailed with David and Norm, and with Rob on Saturday and Kai Thompson on Sunday. Team North Star sailed with Bob, Brenna Copeland, and Jeff Walsh on both days, and, likewise, team Davis sailed with Steve, Jan, and Francine on both days.



The light winds on Saturday made for enjoyable sailing, although the challenge in getting to the front of the pack was in finding a wind line and staying in it all the way to the next mark. That was especially evident in the last race of the day, when *Blue Two* stayed left on the final run to the 7 mark and kept in the wind, whereas the other Lightnings stayed in the middle of the course and fell into a no-wind hole fully occupied by 7 Buccs. While all boats arrived at the 7 mark at about the same time, *Blue Two* was able to sneak in ahead of *Quest*, round, and get to the finish line ahead of *Quest*, who, unfortunately, hit the mark as they tried to squeeze in between *Blue Two* and the mark (they did not have overlap going in and thus could not request mark room), and had to do a penalty turn, putting them in last place for that race.

On Sunday the winds were stronger than forecasted in the morning, Consequently, team *Blue Two* returned to the dock before the start of the first race, where they joined Team *Quest* who was waiting for their third crew to arrive. Once the missing crew arrived, both boats headed back out to the race course, and on the way out saw Team *Davis* drop Jan at the end of the main dock, then head back out to continue the first race, sailing double handed. In the meantime, Teams *Dandy Lion* and *North Star* were racing, but, unfortunately, the *Dandy Lions* broached in a gybe with chute up and capsized, turning turtle, to end their first race in the first downwind leg. They struggled to get the boat back up, and when it did, they saw their chute had torn a large hole near the top during the recovery. So the first race ended with *North Star* in first place, *Davis* in second, with the other three scored as DNC.

For the remaining two races, the finishes were predictably Team *Davis* in first place, with teams *North Star*, *Quest*, and *Blue Two* in hot pursuit, with *Dandy Lion*, sailing without chute, trailing behind.

For the regatta, Team *Davis* had six bullets and a throw-out for first place, *North Star* a well-deserved second place, *Quest* in third place, *Blue Two* in fourth place, and *Dandy Lion* last.

2014 DSA Spring Series, May 8–July 10

Lightnings sailed on seven out of the ten race days in the 2014 DSA Spring Series, with between four and six Lightnings out each time. Teams *Davis*, *Quest*, *Blue Two*, *Dandy Lion*, *Quintessence*, and *Family Affair* all participated and finished the series in that order. During the series, we welcomed new Lightning crew Dylan Manney, Kirill Businov, junior sailor Elizabeth Lemley, and Ms Ryan McCauley. Ryan had been a collegiate sailor at Cal Berkeley before taking her Master's degree at Stanford and then arriving in Denver to teach in a Denver Charter school. And in a surprising turn of events, Evan Morris sold *Lil' Peppa* to DSA Commodore and Finn Sailor Curtis Rist, who had always wanted to own a Lightning. Curtis did some tune-up and repair work on the boat and renamed her *Loucetios*, the Celtic god of wind. He didn't sail her in the Spring Series but had big plans to come out and make a mark in the Summer Series.

Aspen Open Regatta July 19–20

Three DSA Lightnings, teams *Dandy Lion*, *Dandy Lion 2*, and *North Star*, traveled to Reudi Reservoir, thirty-five miles up the Frying Pan River from Basalt, Colorado, to compete

in the 2014 Aspen Open Regatta. Team North Star had Bob Stoller at the helm, with Jeff Walsh forward and Curtis Rist at middle. Team Dandy Lion had Nate Hostetter at helm with Adam Hostetter forward and Zach Hostetter at middle. Team Dandy Lion 2, actually Steve Davis' Lightning #15256, had Lucas Armstrong at helm, with Carter Spenser forward and Garrett Shields at middle.

The Lightnings sailed in the Portsmouth fleet — it took four of a class to fleet — along with three sunfish and a Mutineer.

Skipper Lucas Armstrong filed this report:

There were three races on Saturday, one of which had a reach with a starboard-rounded G mark. *North Star* and *Dandy Lion 2* fought it out and had a photo finish, however, only *Dandy Lion* and the *Mutineer* sailed the proper course, going to mark 6. There was a protest, after which the *Mutineer*, that had dropped out of racing and was unaware of the protest, observed all the Sunfish round the improper mark 3 at the time that the *Dandy Lion* was making its way out to the correct mark 6.

Needless to say, there was some frustration, but it was good, close racing. Bob Stoller, with his old crafty ways and sharp crew, out sailed the two *Dandy Lions*. *Dandy Lion 2* had a great last race with a bit of luck and excellent wind reading and calls by her crew on Sunday.

North Star was 3rd, the Sunfish went 1, 2.

2014 DSA Summer Series, July 17–September 18

Seven Lightnings sailed on six out of the ten race days in the DSA 2014 Summer Series. Evening thunderstorms kept us off the water on three of the race days, and all of the usual DSA Lighting competitors were traveling to the Lightning North American Championships on one of them, August 7. Teams Davis, Family Affair, Blue Two, Quest, Loucetos, Dandy Lion, and Quintessence all raced in one or more races in the series, finishing the series in that order. The nicest evening of the series was the last one, September 18, with steady light winds, but with encroaching darkness due to the proximity of the autumnal equinox and a 7 :00 PM sunset, there was time for only one race, won in a close finish by *Blue Two*. Team Vargish on *Family Affair* showed strength throughout the series, placing second for the series and finishing in first place in three of the races they sailed.

2014 Lightning WJMs and North American Championships, August 9–15

Team Quest, with Bill, Raeyane, and Christine on board, placed 30th in the Masters Championships, August 9–11, in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, and Bill Mauk, sailing with Fleet 488 crew Jim England and Rob Merritt, placed 16th.

In the North American Championships, Teams Quest, Bill, Raeyane, and local junior sailor Noah Bartelt, and *Blue Two*, David, Norm Jarvis, and Lori England, qualified for and com-

peted in the Governor's Cup Yellow Fleet Division; Jim England crewed for Bill Mauk, with Michele Sumpton, and they qualified for and competed in the Championship Blue Fleet Division. Team Quest finished in 12th place the Yellow Fleet, Team Mauk 32nd in the Blue Fleet. Team *Blue Two* finished last in every race they sailed, although they got noticeably closer to the boats ahead of them by the last race on Friday

It was an interesting regatta. 107 boats registered, better than any NAs in the last twenty years. The weather was sometimes challenging, as follows:

Monday, qualifiers day 1: two races scheduled, with boats organized into three fleets, with assignment of boat-to-fleet by schedule, different assignments for each of the four qualifying races. We waited on the water until 1:00 PM for wind to come up, and got the first two fleets started, although, with three general recalls for each, it took a while. After the first general recall for the third fleet (the one Quest and *Blue Two* were in), we were all sent back to the dock to wait for a thunderstorm to pass. It didn't. That ended day 1.

Tuesday, qualifiers day 2: we needed to finish race 1 and then get in three more races for each of the three fleets. But a cold front had gone through in the middle of the night, bringing heavy rain and 20–25 knot winds, with seven-foot waves flooding over the breakwater. We sat out the morning and early afternoon at the yacht club in an on-shore postponement. We finally went out at 3:00 PM after wind had subsided to 10–15 range, but with big, six-foot rollers on the race course. *Blue Two* and Quest checked in with RC, then decided that it was too dangerous for them rolling in waves that big and came back in. Race 1 for fleet 3 was started and completed. Then race 2 was started for each of the three fleets, but then the wind died, and all boats were TLE after rolling in the six-foot waves with no wind for two hours. The Fleet 488 crews watched from the bar at the yacht club.

Wednesday, qualifiers day 3: (was supposed to be NA races day 1) a beautiful, sunny day with ten-knot breezes. The waves had subsided to almost nothing—much better than Tuesday! We sailed two qualifier races, then went back to the dock to wait for the results, assignment of competitors to their fleets, and then wait the required one-hour period for filing of protests and the subsequent one-hour allotted slot for jury hearings. The RC sent us back out after that, but on the way out to the race course, the wind died.

Thursday, championship series races 1, 2, and 3. Another beautiful, sunny day with eight-knot breezes. Now that's more like it! We started at 9:00 AM instead of 10:00 to make sure we'd get in three races, and we did. Winds occasionally got lighter, but were very steady in direction. Our kind of sailing! We could have done a fourth race, as we had time and the wind.

Friday, championship series races 4, 5, and 6: yet another beautiful sunny day with six-knot breezes that died down to 3–4 mph occasionally in the second race. Then, at 1:00 PM, the legendary southerly sea breeze kicked it, 12–14 knots, we got our third race of the day, hiking hard and surfing downwind in the two-foot waves. It was like a dream to have the opportunity to represent my country in a World Championship. When I found out that we were going to Canada, I felt a little worried. We had one month to prepare ourselves for this tournament, and we had not yet sailed together. Each one of us arrived from a different place and different sailing backgrounds, and it was extremely exciting to be part of this amazing event. It caught our attention how organized everything was, how each team had a wonderful place to stay, how all the boats were in great condition and, especially, how beautiful the Buffalo Canoe Club area is.

One of the most striking things was the cooperation between the athletes and the teams. The level of sportsmanship between each and every competitor was outstanding—which is rare to see, as opposed to people wanting to favor or benefit themselves. We could see that attitude from the small little things, like helping each other put the boat down in the water, to help folding the sails at the end of the day. These small details make a great event like this so unique and unforgettable.

Even though we weren't one of the favorite teams, we approached the Worlds with confidence because of the coaching and preparation for the tournament. Two coaches that played great part in our learning and training, Claudio Biekarc, eight-time Pan-American medalist, and João Hackerott, national champion. It was a great opportunity to put into practice everything we learned from them.

We also really appreciate the work of CBVela (Brazilian Sailing Confederation) who sponsored a clinic for all the Brazilian sailors who were competing internationally, with a National Youth Clinic held at my home club (YCSA) which was essential in our preparation for this championship twenty days prior to the regatta.

Before the first race we felt a bit apprehensive. It is hard to put into words the feeling of representing your country. After tacking right off the start to port tack, we were able to cross the whole fleet, which put us in a more comfortable spot, relieving most of the nervousness and fear and leading us to winning the first race.

All of the races were very exciting, yet the last one was the best! After shifting back and forth between second and first place with team USA (Lutz) at the second weather mark, he had passed us but had to put a boat in between us for the win. So he held us off passed and the windward gate, while more than ten boats passed us. It was a crazy battle, and as soon as I saw all those boats sail right past us, I thought to myself, "We lost the championship, to recover will be almost impossible." We fought to shoot our spinnaker up, and finally we were able to get it flying in clean air. We rounded the leeward mark, and had about ten boats ahead of us, so we thought to ourselves it was all or nothing.

I never adjusted the backstay and traveller so much in my life. We trimmed everything we could in the boat, traveller, backstay, jib wire, jib and main sheet according to every single gust of wind so we could have as much boat speed possible. We hit three or four good puffs, and after an intense battle, we won the race, which put us in first place for the championship.

After crossing the finish line in the last race, we exploded in joy and thanked God for giving us the opportunity to glorify Him and honour us after the six races. The dream finally turned into reality. We want to thank each and everyone who participated in the regatta or helped organize in any way. It was a fantastic event and for the great friendships that we will for sure carry on and keep in touch during the years to come.

I especially want to thank Ian and Monica Jones for hosting me a few days before the regatta and making me feel so

welcomed and part of the family. They made me feel at home and were the best hosts anyone could ever ask for, treating me with so much love and kindness as if I was part of their family. It made such a big difference in my mood, comfort and emotions.

I also would like to thank the Starck/Swanson family for hosting me and my team. It was a blessing to be together at a great home with great loving people. There is nothing better than being inside a house that everywhere you look there are boats, sailboats, portraits of sailboats and all sorts of things that we sailors enjoy. Having the opportunity to be under the same roof of the current world champions and being a part of their beautiful family for the week was a great experience.

After a regatta, which gave all competitors plenty of time to interact on shore as well as on the water, ballots were distributed, and the overwhelming majority chose the team of Maggie MacDonald, Meredith Ryan and Caroline Dunbar. Congratulations, girls!!

NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIP



Anyone who has ever been involved with organizing and managing a major regatta appreciates all the challenges in ensuring that the event is a success. When the fleet is 107 boats with more than 400 sailors and support staff on hand, the task seems pretty challenging.

There is no question that the NAs, hosted by Sail Sheboygan and Sheboygan Yacht Club, was one of the smoothest and seamless major regattas we all have ever enjoyed. From the amazing job of launching and retrieving all 107 boats in usually under an hour, to providing the parties and dinner for the incredible mass of people, managing the typical Lightning measurement process for the huge fleet in just two days, figuring out where all the cars will park, setting up a spectacular kids camp so parents could enjoy all the sailing and parties, thanks Denise Cornell, providing an impressive number of quality races in some exceptionally difficult conditions and all after having run a second batch of regattas just the week before (actually the Thistle Nationals was even hosted by Sheboygan just two weeks before the Masters'/Juniors' and Women's!) is nothing less than incredible. Congratulations and thanks again to Todd Wake, Bill Faude, their committees and their families for all their tremendous and unending efforts. Thanks, too, to Race Committee Chair Rich Reichelsdorfer who was dealt a set of tough conditions with too little and too much wind, and mix in a little current that made just the task of setting a race course a major challenge. In retrospect, managing to hold six races in the Championship and four qualifying races was amaz-

ing—and appreciated by all. Thank you again to Rich's race management team and everyone who made the 2014 North Americans such a great event!

Speaking of teams to thank, it would be my teammates, my wife Jo Ann and Zeke Horowitz, who made our NAs win possible. In my opinion, this regatta demanded the most focus and determination of any I've recently sailed. Boat handling in light, choppy conditions is always tough and places a premium on managing the choreography in the boat. Managing the tactical/strategic game plan was near impossible. The emotional roller coaster, as race positions turn inside out, even on a single leg, are equally tough to handle, but Jo Ann and Zeke did a superb job keeping the races and results in perspective.

Jo Ann and I haven't missed sailing a major championship together in over thirteen years. She is an incredible sailor in her own right—3rd in the NAs in 2003—and monitors our conservative, consistent tactics that we feel are so important. Fortunately, she has an incredible sense of humor that is greatly beneficial to our sailing, as well as our marriage!

Zeke Horowitz is new to our team and, in fact, this was our first regatta together and his first in a Lightning. However, I have long known Zeke's talents, as he I watched him perform on our sailing team as the team captain at the College of Charleston. Under his leadership, the team won the Team Race Nationals in 2012 and the Fowle Trophy for the best all-around team in the country. It was never surprising that Zeke was elected captain by his fellow team mates and, obviously, in the tough, trying conditions in Sheboygan, maintaining the morale when the going got tough was key.

What was really impressive was how Zeke and Jo Ann worked so well together and shared a respect for each other's abilities that led to strong tactical moves based on decision by committee. It was clear we sailed best when I focused on boat speed and relied totally on Jo Ann and Zeke for direction.

This North Americans Fleet had to field the deepest level of talent of any recent one-design class championship. Zeke counted a total of nineteen North American Champions, sixteen World Champions, three Rolex Yachtsmen/Yachtswomen of the year and four Olympians. Armed with that knowledge, it was a little easier to accept some of the trials and tribulations of the tricky sailing since there were always great sailors around wherever you looked!

At the first weather mark in the first race, in some pretty light sailing, we dipped our good friends Jody and Jay Lutz as we approached the starboard lay line. Jody leaned under the boom and said, "Congratulations, you are officially in last

place!” It took all of Jo Ann and Zeke’s humor and morale building to pull us out in that race back to a thirteen, but certainly those types of events underscored the story of the regatta for everyone. It was so easy to fall into “bad luck,” ending up stuck on the wrong corner or on the wrong side of a huge puff or shift. It was all about sailing as consistent as possible and trying, and “trying” is the key word, to avoid the big scores. Frankly, we recognize and appreciate our good fortune in avoiding those pitfalls, and that is what ultimately led to our overall win. It was interesting that our best race was only a 5th but our throw out was a 14th. Consistency was crucial. What really highlights the tough conditions are some of the following statistics:

- The boat who finished last in the first race, won the second race. The boat first in the first race was 21st in the second. Almost everyone had their opportunity it seemed to sail the course in first and last at some point!
- The first boat in the overall standings to post a first place race finish in their results was 7th.
- Our average total race finish was over a ninth, second place finisher Michael Zonnenberg overall average was over a twelve.
- At the start of the last race any one of ten boats could mathematically win the regatta!

For sure one of the heroes of the regatta was Michael Zonnenberg, with his team of Michael Booker and Adam Ceely from University of Vermont, with their impressive second overall. With their first four races in the top ten, they appeared to be unbeatable and the model of consistency. Word was this was their fourth regatta sailing the Lightning. They were popular regatta leaders and well deserved the praise. What a super long-term addition to the Class they’d make!

Dave Starck, with Class President Debbie Probst and Sarah Paisley, took the Phoenix rise-from-ashes route and exploded to third overall after a very tough first three races that left

them in an uncharacteristic 28th. Their last three races were all in the top six!

And, of course, Jody Starck and Tito Gonzales were solid potential overall winners, especially considering the bigger breeze and their apparent finishes in the last race. Unfortunately, both fell victim to the OCS/black flag penalty and had to use the last race as their throw outs.

For us though, this NAs was a great leaning, and relearning, opportunity. There were important situations that for Zeke, Jo Ann and me were game changers and meant a great deal to our overall finish.

First, you can never underestimate the value of good boat speed. We all saw how much difference moving from flat water in five mph breeze to a bit of chop made in speed and pointing ability. A major gear change was called for, and if done smoothly and properly, huge gains were immediately realized. Having a handle on the appropriate set up could only come with speed testing and experimenting “till you have it right.” We were very fortunate to be able to sail and tune up with my brother Matt before the starts of all the races in the qualifying series. We didn’t spend hours, for sure, but we just sailed until both teams were comfortable. We were struggling early on in the week, and my confidence was wiggling a bit. We adjusted some things, like ensuring we had enough pre-bend and jib luff sag, and finally felt we had our gears and regained my confidence. People kid with the saying, “Good speed will send you the wrong direction quicker.” Actually, good speed will help bring you back from the wrong direction quicker and allow you to consolidate a gain easier when its time. For us, spending the time before each race making sure we had our gear box in order was key.

Downwind, when it was light, we took Allan Terhune’s advice of a few years ago and sailed the boat more heeled—actually a fair bit where the windward chine was out almost six inches out of the water—and a slightly higher, hotter angle to build/

maintain speed. This year we tried raising the pole higher than normal too—the windward clew of the spinnaker was slightly higher—which, frankly, still makes no sense sail shape wise but seemed speedier, for sure. We raised the board a bit more, almost seven-eighths, to help neutralize the helm. Jo Ann pointed out that when there's enough breeze to heel back to weather to be sure to make that change. Our guide was when there was enough wind to switch from leeward to weather heel when the boom would stay out against the shroud by itself. In breeze heeling to weather, only to the point that the helm is neutral, will encourage the boat to sail lower.

Zeke had this comment on our tactics and strategy: *We had a great balance of an ultra-conservative mind set from Jo Ann, with a slightly more aggressive focus from me. We quickly recognized our differences in strategy, but instead of arguing, we used them as an asset. We had active conversations, trusted each other and discussed both directions. This way we could hopefully diagnose the situation, weigh the options and figure out if it was time and worthwhile to take a bit of risk, or stay conservative. We tried to avoid a decision that felt like a 'wild guess,' though obviously that was easier said than done. Meanwhile Greg continued to focus on our speed and try not to become distracted. It was all about the teamwork upwind.*

When sailing the first weather leg of a race in tough conditions, we tried to stay super conservative. When a group from a side would be approaching on the opposite tack and crossing, or almost crossing, we'd usually tack below and before them and lead them back to the middle. It was almost a 'reset' button for us and would allow us to start back from the middle. Obviously, we were conceding the group of boats. We were tacking below, but we felt it would keep us in striking distance. If the breeze shifted back, hopefully, we'd tack back lifted on the inside. But on the second, and especially the final beat, when the fleet had spread out a bit, we'd allow ourselves to play a little more risky, working a bit more to a side if we felt it might present an advantage. When the potential of a gain outweighed the numbers we might lose, we allowed ourselves to test an edge a little more. Our coach at Charleston would



preach to our team conservative tactics and that it was impossible to win a race on the first beat—but you could sure lose it!

Jo Ann called the lanes and breeze downwind and thought it was usually wise to stay conservative and near the middle in the first half of the leg. This would allow us to, hopefully, at least get a piece of the big puff or shift that invariably would travel down one side or the other. However, when we got near the bottom of the leg and near the gates, it was important to approach from an edge. Being close to the layline to the gate mark was key to help maintain clear air, a hotter, quicker angle to the mark and the inside when we reached the three-length zone.

Finally, only a former team captain like Zeke could put this into words! *Another major area we have ultimate control of is fun, though sometimes it doesn't feel like it is in our control! This is something we took to heart at the North Americans. We always made it a point to remember how much fun we were having. After all, that is the main reason we do this. Things have a tendency to get a little heated in sailboat racing, especially when conditions are hard, and the racing isn't going so well. If it ever felt like frustration was taking over on board, I would say to Jo Ann and Greg, "I'm having a really good time!" and then we'd have a giggle and re-set the mentality. I truly believe that smiles and a positive attitude help win regattas, and the Lightning NAs, for us, was a prime example.*

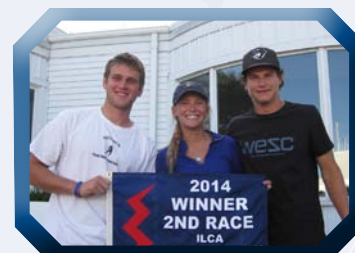

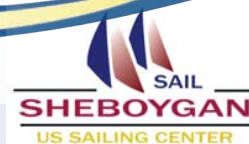

FUN MEMORIES OF SHEBOYGAN'S 2014 NORTH AMERICANS

After many years of not competing in the North American Championship, I decided to make the trip out to Wisconsin last August from my home waters at the Buffalo Canoe Club on Lake Erie. I recalled that both the racing and hospitality were terrific at the 1976 NAs, which was hosted by the Sheboygan Yacht Club. Although I had competed in some of the Masters' NAs in recent years, I hadn't sailed in the main event. This year's NAs was the qualifier for the 2015 World Championship at our home club. Thus, the decision to head out to Sheboygan. Our team included Erin Gregory, who has crewed for me for many years, and Julian Fraize, who had just skippered to 6th place in the Youth Worlds.

We arrived Saturday morning, unhitched the boat in the measurement area, and were welcomed by Bill Faude, Regatta Chairman on water, Todd Wake, Regatta Chairman on shore, and Bill Clausen, the Class's longtime Chief Measurer. The measurement process was superbly organized. We breezed through in forty-five minutes. What a pleasant surprise! This left the rest of the day available for relaxing, doing some boat prep work, tuning, and chatting with old friends, Jim Crane, Jed Dodge, Greg Fisher and others. Tom Allen Jr's van was nearby with a few parts we needed. During the day we became acquainted with a few of the younger members of the Class. The Class hasn't changed. Everyone was friendly and helpful.

Sunday was a fun day, although the wind was too light for the practice race. The Class' schedule now has racing for the Women's, Juniors', and Masters', finishing up on Sunday. We were able to attend the WJM Awards Ceremony as well as the NAs Opening Ceremony. This gave us the chance to catch up with more friends who had sailed in the WJMs. A cookout followed for all the competitors from all the events.

The Regatta organizers had a nice entertainment venue with free refreshments after racing each day, which gave everyone a chance to discuss that day's racing, as well as Greg Fisher's roundtable debriefs on Monday and Wednesday, which allowed

the competitors to pick the brains of the top finishers. The club offered planned dinner events on three evenings.

We took a few minutes to review the flight lists for the qualifying races on Monday and Tuesday. 107 boats! Unbelievable! There were many past champions and regatta winners—what a great turnout.

The big turnout did not affect the launching time off the dry sailing area. The club had two electric hoists, as well as two wide ramps and a bunch of garden tractors to back the boats down the ramps. We elected the latter and were launched and retrieved in a matter of minutes.

The qualifying races were held in light to medium winds. The Race Committee got one race in Monday. On Tuesday there was a strong northerly wind with high Lake Michigan seas, so the RC wisely decided to keep the boats on shore until later in the day. We went out late Tuesday, but the wind subsided with only one flight finishing. The RC did get in two more qualifying races on Wednesday, so the finals for the NAs, President's Cup, and Governor's Cup were set for Thursday and Friday.

Our team qualified for the President's Cup Green Fleet. Thursday's racing was in light air. Our team had an unusual experience, as we finished the last race of the day in third place, approaching the center of the finishing line on starboard gybe for a downwind finish. A large freighter was steaming at high speed, almost directly at us, right through the center of the finishing line. The finishing boat was at the starboard end of the line. We were attempting to finish between the freighter and the port end buoy. At the last half minute or so, we determined we could squeeze in so gybed to port and finished. Whew! We later learned the RC had radioed the freighter's Captain to change course ten degrees, to no avail.

Friday's racing featured two tricky light air races in an off shore westerly and then the wind shifted to the southeast for Sheboygan's usual heavier air thermal.

Congratulations to Greg Fisher for winning the NAs, Will Brown the President's Cup, and Peter Jones, the Governor's Cup, and their teams.

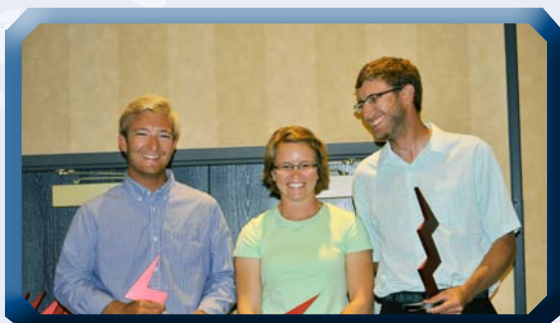

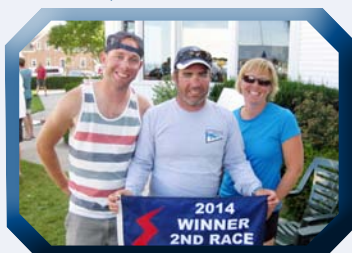

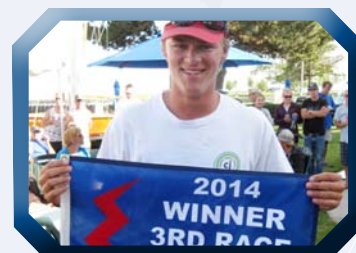

NORTH AMERICAN WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

AUGUST 9–11, 2014

After last year's disappointment of not having enough women competitors to have a fleet in Nyack, we were excited that eight teams come to this year's Women's North Americans to race!

The conditions in Sheboygan were very light and challenging, and my team of Johanna Schon and Pauli Kaiser did a great job of keeping our boat moving and looking for wind! Johanna sailed with me in the Women's in 2012 in Houston and has sailed Lightnings for many years. Pauli is new to Lightning sailing but has been practicing with the well-experienced Hayden family on Lake Monroe in Sanford, Florida. It was fun to have a mix of old and new excitement on the boat. Thank you to Johanna and Pauli for sailing with me and to my husband Will for getting the boat ready and for always being there to help.

It was great to see many of the veteran women's teams come out! It was wonderful to have Katie Werley take the helm and Whitney Kent, one of this year's boat grant recipients out with us. Jacqueline Dieball got her boat out on the line with Mandy Hofmeister at the helm. Next year it's her turn to drive!

The Women's NAs is a great opportunity to take a first step in taking the helm, calling tactics or learning how to use all of the fine tune controls. This regatta is fun, low key, and, even though we are all out to do well, it's not all about winning. This is a unique learning opportunity. It is about sailing against other women's teams and encouraging growth as sailors in a fun and relaxed environment.

Historically, you can see that the Women's NAs has typically has averaged 5.5 women's boats over the past twelve years. The Junior fleet has held pretty steady, averaging about fourteen boats per regatta. The Masters' fleet has averaged about twenty-two boats, but has grown to about thirty boats over the past two years.

The Lightning Class already does a really good job with fielding women sailors in our regular regattas, but that doesn't mean we shouldn't help to cultivate more! Please help encourage at least one women's team from your area to attend next year's Championship in Tawas, Michigan! The timing of the WJM's is slightly different next year. Racing will take place on Friday, August 7 through Sunday, August 9. The regatta is also a stand-alone event and will not be held back to back with the NAs. Hopefully, the shortened format over a long weekend will allow for more participation all around!

NORTH AMERICAN JUNIORS' CHAMPIONSHIP

AUGUST 9–11, 2014

Little was I expecting to be wearing a ski hat with six layers of sweatshirts, spray tops, and dry-fits during a sailing event in the middle of August, but with water temperatures under 55 degrees and winds gusting over twenty mph one day at the 2014 Lightning North Americans in Sheboygan, Wisconsin, it was very cold. This regatta was unique in that the weather was always changing. For example, that same day that the wind was blowing, we got towed in due to no wind. Despite the challenging conditions, the event was a huge success, due to the friendly, family-like attitude of the Lightning Class and the high level of organization that came from hours of work from many volunteers.

The week of North Americans Juniors', the most wind we saw was maybe five knots. Coming from the Buffalo Canoe Club in Ontario, where the wind typically blows quite a bit, this was a challenge. Luckily, the Lightning Class consists of a lot of fantastic sailors that are willing to help out those just getting into the boat and juniors like myself. One of the contributing factors to our win was that we asked a lot of questions and were constantly trying to get better, even at the event.

The current North American champion, Greg Fisher, and his brother Matt, who won Lightning Worlds a couple years ago, were a huge help to us at Juniors' NAs. Both of them gave me advice on tuning, and Greg was able to coach us and the other juniors on the water while we weren't racing. If I had one piece of advice to give to other juniors and those not yet at the top level, it would be to ask questions and talk to the top sailors in the Lightning Class. I've learned everything I know from talking to sailors like Larry MacDonald, David and Jody Starck, and my mom Debbie Probst. You'll find they're very nice and willing to help you.

One thing I learned was that all the little things add up in the light air. We found it helpful to pull the backstay a little more than just taut in the light air with chop in order to stabilize the rig. Also, by sailing the boat a lot flatter than Lightning sailors normally do, we were able to balance the boat to remove helm and point slightly higher. On the downwind legs, we would get the boat tracking, give it a little leeward heel and then pull the board all the way up, leaving nothing in the water. As long as the boat is not side slipping and is still tracking forward, this reduced the drag and made the boat go noticeably faster.

While all these little things matter, without a doubt, the main reason we were able to pull off a victory was the countless hours I spent with Maya Weber and Jenna Probst out on the water this year. In my opinion, no amount of coaching or reading on sailing can compare to time on the water. If you can get around the race course going just as fast as everyone else without letting boat handling mistakes slow you down, you're most of the way there.

The next week at the North American Championship the breeze was a lot windier at times. We managed to string together a decent qualifying series to make it into the championship fleet, and it was fun to race against the best Lightning sailors in the world. I felt our boat speed was pretty good against most of those guys, even though I know a lot less about sailing than most in the top fleet.

We use the Fisher cut from North sails and find them very easy to use and adjust. You never change the shroud tension or the mast blocks after tuning. One thing I found about our sails was that pulling an extreme amount of jib wire when it got windy was beneficial. This allowed me to pull more backstay on and depower the main by flattening it out more. This was especially useful, because my team weighs in at less than 400 pounds. It was a lot of fun sailing in the rare windy races at Sheboygan and was a great experience with long races in a competitive fleet.

The thing that really made this regatta was not the racing, although the RC did a fantastic job of getting so many races in, but the socializing and after-sailing events. The dinners were all delicious as well (I think I finally cut myself off at seven tacos one night)! Everyone in the Lightning Class is so friendly, and everyone knows each other from being together at regattas every few months. They are also welcoming to the new sailors and like making new friends. Big events in our Class are just as much about the time off the water as the time spent racing.

I want to give a huge thank you to all the volunteers and organizers, including Bill Faude and Todd Wake, who helped make this regatta such a success, with 107 boats and very fun competitive racing. The 2015 North Americans are being held in New Orleans, and it sounds like they will be a lot of fun. Everyone should go and help make it another high-quality event.

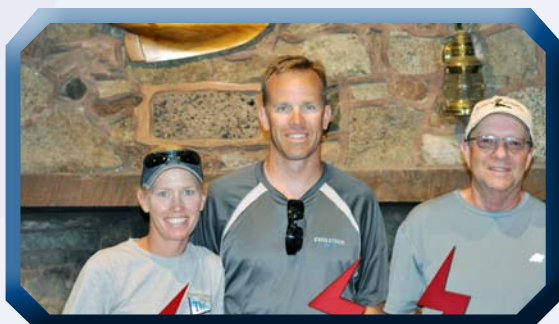

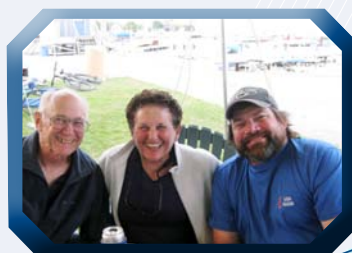

EUROPEAN OPEN & MASTERS' CHAMPIONSHIPS



This regatta was co-hosted by NAOV and YCG. How important was that to the Greek District?

This was very important for the Greek District because it marked the collaboration between the two clubs that have the most activity in the Lightning Class. It is far better to have a team that has joined efforts rather than trying it on your own. Because of this event, there was a lot of interest for the Lightning Class in Greece by members of the two clubs and, generally, in the Greek sailing community. A lot of athletes that have stopped their "Olympic carriers" showed a lot of interest, as they do not sail in dinghies any more. After the event there was a lot of talking about more regattas over the year, as people saw how fun it is to sail the Lightning. I must say that I feel with this event that Lightning Class in Greece changed page in its history and got back on a growing trajectory.



You helped many LSA sailors put together teams for this Championship. Please tell us about some of these competitors. How many first timers? Women skippers? Age range?

From our fleet we had seven boats competing. The general statistics are: age range from thirteen years old to sixty, two woman skippers, and, out of twenty-one athletes, fifteen were first timers! Most of the first timers were off shore sailors that only recently have had their first experience in sailing with Lightnings and dinghies, in general, and it was their first time in one-design racing as well. This shows the trend that off shore sailors have a lot to learn from dinghy sailing and have more fun doing so. This means that a lot of potential Lightning sailors are out there that can join our fleet.



What are some of the next steps to keep this excitement in Lightning sailing growing in Greece?

To keep the excitement in Greece we have a plan that has three pillars:

1. The first pillar is the sailing school. We will continue promoting the Lightning Sailing Academy so we can attract more sailors, novice or experienced, at any age and teach them how to sail with a Lightning. That way we will increase the number of Lightning sailors in our team.
2. The second pillar is organizing, more often, club racing. Having more club racing will keep the interest of the members of our fleet and will attract more. This was not possible last year as we had only two boats available. Now we have nine and that makes us the largest fleet in Greece!
3. The third pillar is organizing regattas with other clubs, and if we manage to overcome some obstacles, we will revive the national championship. Also, it will be very interesting to organize a circuit to keep the interest all year around. It is very important to have more regattas between the clubs to attract experienced sailors that used to sail Lightnings. Evidence of that is their participation in the Europeans this year. I am certain when the sailing community sees activity through racing, the Lightning will be self advertised. To give you an example, in May we had a regatta organized by the Greek Navy where we had twelve boats competing, six of those were in Fleet 525. In October we will have another regatta and our fleet will probably participate with nine boats, a 30% increase, and easily we could have fifteen boats at the starting line—a good way to continue the momentum!





Please tell us about this experience.

Organizing and participating to this event was very interesting to say the least. From the athletic point of view, you would fight till the finish line, as the boats were very close to each other—sometimes times just half boat length apart. Also bear in mind that in this regatta there was a very high level of competitors. We had, if I am not mistaken, at least four former European Champions, thus, former runner ups and second runner ups. From the organizing point of view, our club had organized international regattas in the past, but this was the first time to co-host the Lightning European Championship. We had a lot comments that the regatta was very well organized, and that gives us a lot of confidence for future events. I think that the most important achievement was that the participants, the organizers and the members of the co-hosting clubs really enjoyed it. Now I am contemplating how the next event will be even better.

I have been a Lightning sailor since 1994, and in 2002 I created the Lightning Sailing Academy with a lot of help from many people. This year I realized that team effort, patience and hard work will eventually pay off. If it were not for the ILCA support, our club and our students all of these years wouldn't have made it this far. The numbers speak for themselves. For eleven years most of the time we had only two boats, making it very hard to have club racing and to promote our sailing school, let alone participating in regattas. Now the Lightning Sailing Academy has seven boats plus another two owned by students. Then with the European Championship a lot of people got involved. Subsequently, they got excited and want to contribute so that the Lightning Class will keep growing.

Lastly, I would like to thank again everybody who has played a roll in this joined effort and be sure that the story is just beginning...
